IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this notice in the Government Gasette, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to, by Proclamation under the Fisheries Acts, order to the following effect:—

That no boat shall be engaged or employed by any person in fishing in Victorian waters unless such boat shall have first been duly registered at the office of the Inspector of Fisheries, Melbourne, and a certificate of such registration issued in accordance with the form marked "C" hereunder. Such certificate shall be signed by the Inspection tor of Fisheries.

IS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and pursuant to the petition of the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Charlton, has, by Order made on the 18th day of March, 1913, under the provisions of section 148 of the Local Government Act 1903 (3 Edw. VII. No. 1893), directed that the provisions of Part IV. of the Electoral Act 1910, applicable and severally referred to in the underwritten Schedules, shall apply to the election of Councillors for the said Municipality, with the alterations of such provisions as shown or indicated in the said Schedules, the same being alterations deemed necessary for the purpose of carrying into effect such provisions as so applied.

No person shall in or by means of a vehicle carry on any Public road situate in the Shire of Flinders and Kangerong a greater weight than the next mentioned (that istosay):—For each wheel of any two-wheeled vehicle a total weight of three hundredweight avoirdupois, and for each wheel of any four-wheeled vehicle a total weight of three and a half hundredweight avoirdupois for each half-inch of width of bearing surface of the tire or felloc. The weight of the vehicle shall in all cases be reckoned as part of the weight which may be so carried.

The coast line from the eastern bank of the Hopkins River to the western bank of Curdie's River, the western bank of Curdie's River from the sea coast to the boundary between the Parishes of Warrnambool and Brucknell, the eastern bank of the Hopkins River from the sea coast to the boundary between the Parishes of Garvoc and Keilambete, and the western bank of the River Hopkins from the boundary line of the Town and Shire of Warrnambool, in the Parishes of Framlingham West and Ballangeich, both banks of the Merri River from the boundary line of the Town and Shire of Warrnambool, in the Parish of Wangoom, to where such river junctions with the Drysdale Creek and Spring Creek at Grasmere.



1. Dress.—No person above the age of twelve years shall bathe unless dressed in a Canadian bathing costume, with kilt, which shall effectually cover the body from

neck to knee, so as to preserve proper decency.

2. No person clothed in bathing costume shall sit, he, or loiter, nor run along the sea shore or river banks, but shall proceed in a direct line to and from the dressing-

3. No person shall dress or undress, or remove any art of his or her bathing costume in any place open to the public view.

No male shall trespass on any bathing-box, dressing-

4. No male shall trespass on any bathing-box, dressing-shed, or latrine reserved for the use of females, and no female shall trespass in any bathing-box, dressing-shed, or latrine reserved for the use of males.

5. No person shall commit any misance in or damage, write on, or disfigure any of the bathing-boxes, dressing-shed, or latrines set apart or authorized by the Council for the use of bathers.
