Factories and Shops Acts.

# DETERMINATION OF THE SLATERS AND TILERS BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a slater, roof-tiler, ridger, shingler, or cement tiler (other than a tiler laying verandah or flooring tiles) has made the following Determination, namely:—

1. That the previous Determination of this Board is hereby amended, and such amendments shall come into force and be operative on and after the third day of May, 1913.

The Determination and amendments are printed hereunder.

### WAGES.

2. That the lowest rates of wages to be paid to the following shall be— All adult workers, other than those employed striking roofs, carrying, or mixing, 1s. 7½d. per hour, or 71s. 6d. per week of 44 hours.

### APPRENTICES.

## PROPORTION.

3. That the number of apprentices who may be employed by any employer shall be one apprentice to every three or fraction of three workers engaged by him in the aforesaid process, trade, or business, and receiving at wages rates or piecework prices not less than 71s. 6d. per week of 44 hours.

4. That the number of improvers who may be employed by any employer shall be one improver to every twelve workers engaged by him in the aforesaid process, trade, or business, and receiving not less than 71s. 6d. per week of 44 hours.

#### TIME OF BEGINNING AND ENDING WORK.

5. That the time of beginning and ending work shall be—

- 6. That the following rates shall be paid for all work done :--

#### SPECIAL RATES FOR SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.

- 7. That the special price or rate of payment payable to any person for all work done on-
  - (a) Sundays;
  - (b) on the undermentioned public holidays (that is to say):—

Good Friday;
Easter Monday;
21st day of April
Christmas Day
Boxing Day
New Year's Day

Or such other day as may be observed as a Public Holiday in lieu thereof,

shall be at the rate of double time.

# PIECEWORK.

8. That the lowest piecework prices to be paid to persons for doing work of the kinds specified in the following schedule shall be:—

## SCHEDULE.

For buildings of more than one storey, 6d. per 100 square feet extra for each storey after the first.

For buildings of more than one storey, 1d. per foot extra for each storey after the first.

" nailed, 6d. per foot.

screwed, 8d. per foot.
