In case of dispute or doubt a $\frac{1}{2}$ -lb. weight shall be slung or attached to one knot of the mesh, in order to produce a fair strain or extension, and the space between the top and bottom knots of the mesh shall be measured forthwith while the mesh remains extended. If the net to be measured is dry the part to be measured shall be soaked either in fresh or salt water for not less than ten minutes, and the mesh so soaked shall then be measured.

KORUMBURRA WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW NO. 2.

THE Commissioners of the Korumburra Waterworks Trust (a portion of the Waterworks District of which Trust has been proclaimed an Urban District, being an area comprised within lines parallel to and forty chains distant from the boundaries of the Township of Korumburra, as described in the *Government Gazette* of the sixteenth day of December, 1887, page 3804), for the purpose of the *Water Act 1890*, as amended by the *Water Act 1900* and the *Water Act 1905*, and pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said last-mentioned Act, do hereby make the following By-law:—

The By-law, No. 1, of the said the Korumburra Waterworks Trust, passed on the second day of August, 1906, and approved by the Administrator of the Government in Council on the twenty-eighth day of August, 1906, is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following By-law is hereby made, which shall be read and construed as clause eleven of Regulation No. 7 of the said Trust:—

Defective Service-pipes: Penalty for Neglect to Repair.—If the occupier (if any), or if none, the owner, shall neglect for twenty-four hours to have repaired any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such occupier or owner after such occupier or owner shall have received notice in writing from an officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires to be repaired, the Trust (except as hereinafter provided) may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The occupier (if any), and if none, the owner, shall in every instance (except as hereinafter provided) in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence after notice, to a further penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every day after such offence is continued after notice in writing thereof from the Trust.

Provided that neither the occupier nor owner shall be liable to any penalty as hereinbefore mentioned if the damage complained of shall have been caused by reason of that portion of the service-pipe which shall be upon a public street or road being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, when the condition of such portion of such pipe has been caused by the act, neglect, or default of the Municipal Council or of the Trust, or of any contractor under the said Council or Trust, or of the servants of the said Council, Trust, or contractor; nor in such case shall it be lawful for the Trust to stop the

water from flowing into the premises of such occupier or owner except for the purpose of effecting repairs to such portion of such pipe.

**REGULATION FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION,
AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR
PUBLIC RECREATION AND FOR AFFORDING
ACCESS TO WATER IN THE PARISH OF NEW-
HAM, KNOWN AS THE HANGING ROCK WATER
AND RECREATION RESERVE.**

WHEREAS by section 200 of the *Land Act* 1901 it is enacted that where under the provisions of any Act relating to Crown Lands the Governor in Council has reserved from sale permanently any Crown Lands for any public purpose whatsoever, or for any of the purposes specified in section 10 of such Act, and has vested such land in trustees or jointly in the Board of Land and Works and trustees, it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council, to make rules and regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sub-section 1 of the section specified: And whereas a Crown grant has issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works and the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Newham (now designated the Shire of Newham and Woodend) in respect of the Reserve for Public Recreation and for affording access to Water in the parish of Newham, known as the "Hanging Rock Water and Recreation Reserve": Now therefore the Board of Land and Works and the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Newham and Woodend do hereby make, in lieu of the Regulation made on the 21st January, 1902, in respect to the said Reserve, the following Regulation for the care, protection, and management thereof:—

REGULATION.

The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on every New Year's Day and every Easter Monday, or any day substituted for either of them, on any of which occasions a fee of Sixpence (6d.) may be charged and taken for the admission of every person not under the age of sixteen (16) years to the Reserve.

Every person offending against this Regulation shall, in accordance with section 200 of the *Land Act* 1901, on conviction before any Justice, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who so offends, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands, or officer or servant of the trustees, or by any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer or servant, or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

**RESERVE FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES IN THE
PARISH OF TERANG.**

ADDITIONAL REGULATION.

WHEREAS by the 190th section of the *Land Act* 1901 power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulation in addition to the Regulations made by the Board of Land and Works on the 13th August, 1906, in respect of the land permanently reserved by Order in Council of 8th November, 1880, as a site for Public purposes in the parish of Terang:—

REGULATION.

11. No person shall engage in any Band or other Musical performance in the Reserve or any part thereof on Sunday without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

Every person offending against the foregoing Regulation shall, in accordance with section 100 of the *Land Act* 1901, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against such Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

**ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE,
PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF YARRA
PARK.**

WHEREAS by the Crown grant issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works, and the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Melbourne and their successors in respect of Yarra Park, it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted, and the buildings for the time being thereon, shall be maintained and used as and for a public park and offices and conveniences connected therewith, under and in accordance with such Regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Governor or other officer for the time being administering the Government of the Colony (now State) of Victoria, with the consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in the meantime under and in accordance with such Regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Board of Land and Works, and the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the said City of Melbourne, and for no other purpose whatsoever: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works and the Council of the City of Melbourne do hereby make the following Supplementary Regulations in respect of Yarra Park:—

REGULATIONS.

- (1) No person shall ride or drive any bicycle or tricycle in any part of the Park except upon the track specially made and set apart for such purpose.
- (2) Every person who shall ride or drive any bicycle or tricycle on such track shall dismount when reaching the pathway through the Park which crosses such track, and shall not ride or drive across such pathway.
- (3) No motor cycle, motor car, or other motor vehicle shall under any circumstances be ridden or driven in any part of the Park.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 200 of the *Land Act* 1901, on conviction before any Justice, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who

so offends, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or officer or servant of the Trustees, or by any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer, or servant, or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

Improvements to the value of at least two instalments of the purchase money must be effected on each farm allotment before the end of the first year from the date of the lease, and 10 per cent. of the purchase money before the end of the third year, and a further 10 per cent. before the end of the sixth year.

The lessee must reside on the estate. (Personal residence by the lessee's wife, or any child not less than eighteen years of age of lessee, may be considered personal residence by the lessee, with the approval of the Commission.) In special cases the Commission has power to allow persons other than those above mentioned to reside for a limited period in lieu of lessee.

The lessee cannot transfer, assign, mortgage, or sublet the whole or any part of his allotment within the first six years of the lease.

Leases will be subject to a condition providing for resumption of land required for necessary drains or channels through any allotment.

Lessees are not permitted to destroy or remove timber from the land unless by written consent of the Commission.

The amount of deposit (less £1 5s.) will be deducted from the capital value, and the half-yearly instalments calculated on the balance of purchase money.

Payments in advance may be made at any time at the option of the lessee, and proportionate reduction of interest secured thereby.

The balance of purchase money, with interest at 4½ per cent., must be paid by 63 or a lesser number of half-yearly instalments calculated according to any of the tables under Division 3 of Part I. of the *Savings Banks Act 1890 Amendment Act 1896*, the first of such instalments being payable six months after the date of the lease. Each instalment will include interest upon the balance of the purchase money remaining unpaid.

The Crown grant may be issued to the lessee, at the end of any half-year after the first twelve years have expired, on payment of the balance of purchase money, and will be subject to a condition that the owner for the time being of the land, or a member of his family over eighteen years of age, or any person approved by the Governor in Council, shall reside thereon for at least eight months in every year, and that a breach of this condition may lead to the forfeiture of the land to the Crown.
