Names of Trustees.—The Roman Catholic Trusts Corporation for the Diocese of Melbourne.

Power of Disposition.—To sell, transfer, mortgage, charge, lease, exchange, give, grant, or dispose of the whole or any part of the said land.

Purposes to which Proceeds of Disposition are to be Applied.—To such purposes of the Roman Catholic Church in the Diocese of Melbourne as a Council of such Diocese under the provisions of an Act of the Parliament of Victoria No. 2100 may from time to time by resolution direct.

WARRAGUL WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW.

THE Commissioners of the Warragul Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act* 1905, pursuant to and in the exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, do hereby make the following By-law:—

By-law No. 4.

1. The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Waterworks District of the Warragul Waterworks Trust shall pay for water supplied by the said Trust, that is to say:—

- (a) For every house, building, or tenement, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the £1 sterling upon the municipal valuation for the year 1912-13, subject to any amendments thereof, of such house, building, or tenement shall be paid. Provided that such rates shall not be less than One pound two shillings and sixpence per annum; and provided, further, that the maximum quantity of water to be used by any ratepayer owning or occupying one house, building, or tenement only, shall be 1,000 gallons for every £1 sterling of such municipal valuation.
- (b) For every piece of land occupied or unoccupied upon which there is no house or building erected, a rate of Eighteenpence in the £1 sterling upon the municipal valuation for the time being thereof shall be paid. Provided that such rate shall not be less than Ten shillings and sixpence per annum.
- (c) And for every ratepayer owning or occupying two or more houses, buildings, or tenements within the Waterworks District, to each of which water meters have been and are attached, such maximum quantity to be consumed either wholly at any one or partly at one and partly at any other or others of said houses, buildings, or tenements (and in all such cases to be ascertained and paid for by measure) shall, for that part or the whole of the year, as the case may be, during which such ratepayer shall own or occupy such two or more houses, buildings, or tenements, but for no longer period, be 1,000 gallons for every £1 sterling of the total municipal valuations of all the said houses, buildings, or tenements owned or occupied by him. If such maximum quantities be exceeded the excess shall be paid for by measure, at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.
- (d) For water supplied by measure, a rate of One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be paid; and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 15,000 gallons.

2. The rates herein are made for the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1913, and shall be payable in one sum, on the 1st day of April, 1913.

Such persons as the Commissioners shall appoint from time to time for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover such rates.

No. 1086) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind clauses 4 (a) and 6 of Regulation III.—Inspection and Examination—of the Regulations under the Education Act 1890, and doth make the following Regulation in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

REGULATION III.—INSPECTION AND EXAMINATION.

4 (a). The Head Teacher will examine his school fully at least twice each year—before the end of May and in December—and will record the results in detail, with his comments, in the Examination Register.

6. Before the end of the first week in February each year, the Head Teacher will prepare a statement showing the number of pupils promoted to each grade upon the results of the previous December examination, or at any other time of the previous year, the number of pupils not promoted during the previous year, and of those not promoted, the names of the pupils who have spent more than one year in any grade without promotion. In the case of pupils who have attended two or more schools during the year, and have not been promoted, the attendance and the classification of such pupils at each of the schools should be shown. An explanation as to the causes of retarded promotion in each case must be attached to the list of pupils who have been more than one year in a grade without securing promotion. The promotion statement should be preserved in the Examination Register for the perusal of the Inspector at his next visit.

WHEREAS by section 23 of the Education Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1086) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind Regulation IV.—The Standard of Education, the Certificate of Exemption from compulsory attendance, and the Certificate of Merit—of the Regulations under the Education Act 1890, and doth make the following Regulation in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

REGULATION II.—THE STANDARD OF EDUCATION AND THE CERTIFICATE OF MERIT.

1. The standard of education for exemption from compulsory attendance shall be that of the Certificate of Merit, provided that the holder is at least thirteen years of age.

2. No child is to be regarded as receiving efficient and regular instruction unless the following conditions are complied with:—

(t) Except as hereinafter provided, children of the ages shown in the following table must be learning the subjects prescribed by Regulation I., as the course of free instruction for the respective Grades I., II., III., IV., V., VI., and VII. of State elementary schools—

- (i) Children under 8 years of age, the work prescribed for Grade I. or Grade II.
- (ii) Children over 8 years of age and not exceeding 9½ years of age, the work prescribed for Grade III.
- (iii) Children over 9½ years of age and not exceeding 10½ years of age, the work prescribed for Grade IV.
- (iv) Children over 10½ years of age and not exceeding 11½ years of age, the work prescribed for Grade V.
- (v) Children over 11½ years of age and not exceeding 12½ years of age, the work prescribed for Grade VI.
- (vi) Children over 12½ years of age, the work prescribed for Grade VII., or that prescribed for Grade VIII.

NOTE.—The work of any grade above Grade I. will be held to include that of any lower grade.

(2) In the case of any registered school in which the course of free instruction as set out in Regulation I. is not adopted, the head teacher may be required to submit, for the approval of the Director, the full course of study provided. Approval of such courses of study will not be given unless the courses provide that children of the ages given in the table in clause 2 (1) above are receiving instruction of the standard of the corresponding grades as set out therein in English (including reading, writing, spelling, composition, and grammar), arithmetic, geography, and physical training.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in clause 2 above, a child of any age who is not attending a State school may, considering the mental capacity of the child and other similar circumstances affecting his progress, be regarded as receiving efficient and regular instruction, provided that, on the report of an inspector of schools or other officer deputed to report on the matter, the Director is satisfied that such child is complying with the like conditions of attendance as are prescribed in subsection (1) of section 42 of Act No. 2301 with regard to attendance at State schools.

4. In the case of children attending registered schools, the books to be used by such children in connexion with their instruction in the subjects mentioned in clause 2 (2) above shall either be those specified for the several grades named in the Course of Free Instruction (Regulation I.) or others of at least equivalent difficulty.

5. The Certificate of Merit will be awarded to candidates who pass fully in the subjects prescribed for Grade VIII. of State schools, Regulation I., under such conditions as may be approved by the Director.

6. Candidates from registered schools will be afforded an opportunity, at the annual examination at the nearest center, of being examined for the Certificate of Merit, provided that due notice has been given to the district inspector.

in force as regards such State; and by the said Act it is further provided that when in any State (other than Victoria) an Act is in force containing provisions substantially similar to those contained in or for carrying out objects substantially similar to the objects of Part III. and sections 21 to 23, both inclusive, of the said Act, the Governor may, by Proclamation published as aforesaid, declare that Part III. of the said Act shall be in force as regards such State; and that such Proclamations as aforesaid may be in the same or separate documents: And whereas in the State of South Australia an Act (to wit, an Act No. 1008 of 1910, intitled the *Inter-State Destitute Persons Relief Act 1910*) is now in force containing provisions substantially similar to those contained in the said section 6 and provisions substantially similar to those contained in the said Part III., and the said sections 21 to 23, both inclusive: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State of Victoria, do hereby, by virtue of the power conferred by the said Act of Victoria, intitled the *Inter-State Destitute Persons Relief Act 1912*, declare that Part II. of the last-mentioned Act shall be in force as regards the said State of South Australia, and do also hereby, by virtue of the said power, declare that Part III. of the said last-mentioned Act shall be in force as regards the said State of South Australia.

4. A By-law of the Town of Caulfield, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 27, for Regulating Places of Improvement and Recreation, &c.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Caulfield order as follows:—

1. Subdivision (2) of By-law No. 9, Public Gardens, heretofore in force in the municipality for regulating places of improvement and recreation, &c., shall be, and the same is hereby repealed.

2. The gardens and reserves under the management or control of the Council and grounds appertaining thereto, herein called the gardens, shall be open from sunrise to sunset on each day of the week.

3. No person shall pluck any of the flowers, or walk on the beds or borders, or climb upon or get over any of the fences, or remove any of the tallies or name plates, or disturb, damage, or destroy any property or thing in the gardens.

4. No cart or other vehicle used for the conveyance of goods shall, without the authority of the proper officer of the Council, be driven through the gardens.

5. Such plants, seeds, or cuttings as are commonly purchaseable at nurseries in Victoria shall not be supplied from the gardens to any person, unless in exchange, or for public institutions, or for benevolent purposes.

6. No visitor shall interrupt the gardeners or labourers by conversation or otherwise.

7. Children under the age of ten years, not being under the control of some competent person, shall be removed from the gardens.

8. All dogs and goats, and all poultry found within the gardens, shall be destroyed, and the owner shall make compensation, to be recovered before any justice, for any damage done.

9. In addition to the provisions herein contained, it shall be lawful for the Council from time to time to make such regulations for the proper maintenance and management of the gardens as shall seem to them fit.

10. Any person offending against this by-law, or any such regulation, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

BY-LAW No. 28.

A By-law of the Town of Caulfield, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 28, for suppressing Nuisances, Regulating Traffic, and generally for maintaining the good rule and government of the Municipality.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Caulfield order as follows:—

1. Clause 1 of By-law No. 1 of the Town of Caulfield is hereby repealed.

2. No person shall permit or allow any horse or any horse and vehicle, or any motor car to remain in or on any street, road, lane, or right-of-way within that part of the Town of Caulfield hereinafter described in clause 9 hereof for a longer time than is necessary to allow of dismounting from or mounting such horse or alighting from or entering such vehicle or such motor car.

3. No person shall permit or allow any cart, carriage, motor car or other vehicle to remain in or on any street, road, lane, or right-of-way within the said part of the Town of Caulfield so as to obstruct any such street, road, lane or right-of-way or so as to impede or interfere with the traffic therein or thereon.

4. No person shall tie, secure or fasten any horse to any tree or tree-guard in or on any street, road, lane, or right-of-way within the said part of the Town of Caulfield, nor to any fence abutting on any such street, road, lane, or right-of-way.

5. Every person driving controlling or using any dray, lorry, or other vehicle whatsoever (all of which shall be deemed to be included in the word "dray" when used in this by-law) which shall contain or be used for cartage or carriage of any metal, stone, bricks, or any building or road material of any description, or any material used for garden purposes, all of which shall be deemed included in the word "material" when used in this by-law, shall load or cause to be loaded his dray in such manner that the material or any part thereof will not spill or fall from the said dray whilst the said material is being carted or carried along the streets or roads of the municipality.

6. No person shall spill or permit material to be spilled or to fall from any such dray on or upon any of the streets or roads of the municipality or to be deposited on any such streets or roads in any manner whatsoever, except in terms of any contract which any such person aforesaid shall have with the said Council or with the written consent of such Council.

7. No person shall throw down, place, or leave any bottle or broken glass or nails, tacks, pieces of iron, tin, zinc, or metal work, or wire, whether barbed, netted or plain, or other matter of a similar nature, on or in any street, road, lane, or right-of-way within the Town of Caulfield in such a position as to be likely to cause injury to persons or animals or damage to property.

8. No person shall throw down, place, or leave in any street, road, lane, or right-of-way within the Town of Caulfield, any paper, filth, dirt, rubbish, offal, skins, shavings, vegetable matter, feathers, or refuse of any kind.

9. Clauses numbered 2, 3, and 4 hereof shall apply to that part of the Town of Caulfield being within the following boundaries, viz.:—Commencing at the north-west corner of Balaclava and Kambrook roads, thence going east along Balaclava-road and Normanby-road, along the south side of the Caulfield railway line to Queen's-avenue; thence along the western fence of the Mordialloc railway

line to Neerim-road; thence along the south side of Neerim-road to Booran-road; thence along the south-western side of Booran-road to Kambrook-road; and thence along the west side of Kambrook-road to the commencing point.

10. Clauses numbered 1, 5, 6, 7, and 8 hereof shall apply to the whole of the municipal district of the Town of Caulfield.

11. Any person who shall by any wilful act of default be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

A By-law of the Town of Caulfield, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 30, for Regulating Traffic and Processions.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Caulfield order as follows:—

1. Throughout this by-law the expression "machine" shall mean a bicycle, tricycle or velocipede.

2. No person shall drive, ride, or impel a machine upon any footway made or set apart for the use of foot passengers.

3. Every person who drives, rides, or impels a machine during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall carry a lamp which shall be attached to the machine, and shall be so constructed and placed as to exhibit a light in the direction in which he is proceeding.

4. Every person who drives, rides, or impels a machine shall keep the same upon the near or left-hand side of the carriage way, and whenever he shall overtake any vehicle, horse, or foot passenger he shall, within a reasonable distance from, before passing the same give audible and sufficient warning by sounding a bell or whistle, and shall keep such machine to the right or off-side of such vehicle, horse, or foot passenger.

5. In every case where a person driving, riding, or impelling a machine meets or overtakes any vehicle, if the animal or animals drawing such vehicle becomes restive or alarmed, he shall at once dismount, and shall continue dismounted so long as may be reasonably necessary.

6. This by-law shall apply to, and have operation throughout, the whole of the municipal district.

7. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this by-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).
