At the Clerical Examination fifty (50) candidates will be selected for registration for appointment as Clerks. Candidates must at the date of examination be between the ages of sixteen and twenty-one years at last birthday; but no person twenty-two years of age or over can be appointed. The commencing salary is £60, rising 10 a maximum of £204 a year by increments, which may be granted at intervals of not less than one year if recommended by the Permanent Head of the Department and the Public Service Commissioner.

Registration of Teachers and Schools Act 1905. .
Education Act 1910.

THE COUNCIL OF PUBLIC EDUCATION

In pursuance of the powers conferred by section 16, sub-section (1) of the Registration of Teachers and Schools Act 1905, and by section 6, sub-section (2) of the Education Act 1910, upon the Council of Public Education (enabling the Council to make Regulations with the approval of the Governor-in-Council) "for determining the courses of study and training and the examinations entitling persons to be registered as teachers, and generally for carrying this Act into effect." the Council doth hèreby, subject to the approval of the Governor in Council, make the following regulations:—

XI .- TRAINING INSTITUTIONS FOR TEACHERS OF PHYSICAL TRAINING.

- 1. The Council may, under conditions hereinafter provided, recognize as a Training Institution for Teachers of Physical Training any institution, or the training department of any institution, which is organized for the purpose of giving instruction in the principles and practice of teaching to candidates for registration as teachers of physical training.
- 2. (t) Before recognition is granted to any Training Institution, the proprietor or head teacher of such institution must produce evidence satisfactory to the Council that the buildings and premises, the equipment, the courses of instruction and tests of proficiency, the practice of teaching and the practising schools connected with such institution, and the general management and arrangement are suitable for the purpose of training persons as teachers of physical training. of physical training.
- (2) If at any time the Council is satisfied that in any Training Institution any of the above requirements are not maintained up to an efficient standard, the recognition by the Council of such Training Institution may be withdrawn after six months' notice has been given.
- 3. The maximum number of students (whether preparing for the examinations of the Council or not) who may be in training at any one time may be fixed for each Training Institution by the Council after consideration of the premises, staff, equipment, and course of study in the Institution, and the provision made for the instruction and supervision of students in approved practising schools associated with such institution.

- 4. Every recognised Training Institution shall have a Master or Mistress of Method in charge of the training department who possesses the following qualifications:—
  - (i) holds a certificate of having attended at least a two years' course at some institution for the training of teachers of physical training approved by the Council; and

    (ii) has had at least two years' experience in the practical teaching of a physical training class in schools; and

    (iii) produces satisfactory evidence of having attended an approved course of study in the principles.

- an approved course of study in the principles of education, and also produces evidence of having a sound knowledge of anatomy, physiology, elementary science, and hygiene.
- 5. Every teacher in a recognized Training Institution, who undertakes any part of the duties of the training of teachers, must first be approved by the Council.
- 6. The teaching stuff of every recognized Training Institution shall be such as to provide adequately for the courses undertaken by such institution in the subjects pre-
- 7. Unless otherwise approved by the Council, in every recognized Training Institution for Teachers of Physical Training at least twenty hours during the first year and forty hours during the second year shall be devoted to the training of students in the practice of teaching, and the remainder of the time of the training course shall be devoted to the study of the other subjects prescribed.
- 8. Every recognized Training Institution shall be open at all reasonable times to the inspection of any inspector authorized by the Council.
- o. In every recognized Training Institution the following records shall be kept and shall be available for inspection at the time of his visit by any inspector authorized by the Council:—

- (i) Syllabus of work for the year;
  (ii) Time-table of arrangements for lectures, criticism lessons, observation, and teaching practice;
  (iii) Roll showing attendance of students at lectures, and demonstration and teaching practice;
  (iv) Statement of arrangements for teaching practice of each student for the current term, showing
- classes and supervisors;
  (v) Report of each student's capability and progress;
- (vi) Examination tests and results.

10. Practice in teaching under this regulation may be had only under the immediate supervision of teachers approved for this purpose by the Council.

- 11. The responsibility for the arrangements for, and the conduct of, the practice of teaching shall rest upon the Master or Mistress of Method in charge of the Training Institution with which the Practising School is associated; and the amount and character of the supervision of the teaching of each student must be saitsfactory to the
- teachers of physical training will be conducted annually, and only those candidates who have undergone a full course of training as laid down in the Regulations of the Council will be admitted to these examinations. The whole record of the candidate in the training institution or institutions will be taken into account in adjudging the pass or failure at the annual examination.

4th. On warehouses and wholesale stores, not being domiciles or used in retail business, the sum of One shilling and sixpence in the pound (L1) on the amount of municipal valuation, provided that in no case shall a less rate than One pound sterling be paid.

5th. A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound (L1) on the municipal valuation shall be levied on all vacant land fronting such streets as are reticulated.

6th. Water supplied by measure to be used in private domiciles or other premises for domestic or other than domestic use shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons. The minimum quantity to be charged for yearly shall be that which at One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount which her Trust would be entitled to receive under the current rating upon the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons in addition to a supply of domestic or other purposes beyond such an amount as aforesaid.

7th. The charge for water supplied for manufacturing and other purposes, and to buildings, lands, and institutions for gardens or irrigation purposes, Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

oth. For water supplied for cricket or bowling grounds, the charge shall be subject to arrangement with the Trust.

10th. For water supplied to gardens or nurscries cultivated for trade purposes, One shilling per 1,000 gal-

17th. For water supplied to private fountains, Twenty shillings each, or as may be decided upon by the Trust, in addition to a charge for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

12th. For water supplied and used solely as a motive power for hydraulic lifts, water blasts, turbines, water wheels, electric and other motors (subject to the supply being refused or discontinued at any time). One shifting per 1,000 gallons, or as may be agreed upon, in addition to the rating upon the assessment of the premises for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

13th, For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stone, brick work, or plastering.

- r. The members of the Teachers' College shall be a Principal, two Vice-Principals. Masters and Mistresses of Method, lecturers, and students. The students in attendance at the College shall be—
  - (a) Studentship holders—those to whom the course of instruction is free.
     (b) Students who pay the fees hereinafter prescribed.

- 2. Training will be conducted in the College and at the University and in such other institutions as the Director may determine. Practising schools for the training of students in teaching shall be associated with the College, and training therein shall be conducted under the supervision of the Principal and such officers of the College as he may annoint. as he may appoint.
- 3. The duration of the courses of training at the College shall be:--
  - (a) Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate—3 years.
    (b) Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate—2 years.
    (c) Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate—2 years.
- Studentships will be awarded under the conditions set out hereinafter as follow :-

  (f) To candidates who have passed the Senior Public Examination or who hold an approved equivalent qualification.

- 5. Candidates applying for admission under clause 4 above must forward their applications to the Director not later than 1st November in each year, stating in order of preference the course at the Training College they desire to undertake.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided, studentship holders under clause 4 above who desire to enter upon the course for the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate must, before entering upon such a course, be at least eighteen years of age, must hold the Leaving Certificate or must have passed the Senior Public Examination, or must hold an approved equivalent qualification, and must have served for at least one year as junior teachers on the staff of a school staff of a school.
- (b) Studentship holders under clause 4 above who desire to enter upon the course for the Trained Primary Tencher's Certificate must, before entering upon the second year of the course, be at least nineteen years of age, must have qualified for matriculation at the Melbourne University, and must have served for at least two years as junior teachers on the staff of a school.

Those who receive from the district inspector satisfactory reports as to their conduct and efficiency as teachers may be then admitted to the second year of the course for the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate.
- (d) Persons awarded studentships under clause 4 (f) and 4 (g) above who enter upon the course for the Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate shall before entering upon such course spend at least two years in practical teaching on the staff of a school, and shall during such period be paid an allowance at the rate of £30 per annum.
- 8. Excepting persons awarded studentships under clauses 4 (e) and 4 (h) above no studentship holder shall be admitted to the course for a Trained Teacher's Certificate unless he has obtained from a district inspector or from the Principal of the College satisfactory reports as to conduct and efficiency as a teacher.
- 9. No person shall be allowed to enter upon a course of training for any certificate mentioned in clause 3 above until he has submitted a certificate from a School Medical until he has submitted a certificate from a School Medical Officer or qualified medical practitioner approved for this purpose by the Director, certifying that he is of sound constitution and is free from any physical defect likely to impair his usefulness as a teacher. When the medical examination of such person discloses minor defects of a remediable character, such as unsound teeth, postnasal growths, or defects in eyesight or hearing, such student may, at the discretion of the Director, be allowed to enter upon his studentship for a period of three months on probation. At the end of such probationary period the studentship may be withdrawn from such student if satisfactory treatment of the defects referred to has not been carried out.
- 10. The number and kind of studentships to be awarded under each sub-section of clause 4 will be determined by the Director on or before 1st December in each year.

Every person awarded a studentship under clause 4 will be required as a condition of such studentship to enter into an agreement by himself and an approved surety, not to relinquish his course of training without the permission of the Minister, and, for four years after the termination of his studentship, to teach in any school to which he may be appointed. Women students may, in the event of their marriage, be permitted to resign at the expiration of there years' service after the termination of their studentships.

(c) Students, not exceeding four in number in each year, who have qualified for the Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate, and are recommended by the Principal as exhibiting special merit and aptitude for further training, will be appointed as teachers to act for this purpose for one year upon the staffs of practising and observation schools connected with the Teachers' College, or to assist in the work of the College. Students who have paid the prescribed fees, and who have attended a course of instruction and training specified under clauses 17, 18, 19, and 29 above, and who have compiled with the conditions prescribed, will be admitted to the final examination for the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate or Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate or Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate, as the case may be, without further payment.

Students who have paid the prescribed fees, and who qualify for the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate or Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate, or for the Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate, will be awarded certificates, but such certificates shall not necessarily entitle the holders to employment in State Schools, Such title the holders to employment in State Schools, Such persons, however, are eligible to be recorded on the Employment Register for appointment to positions in State Schools as classified teachers.

Studentship holders under clause 4 (h) above, must during the year of their studentship attend the University in the subject of Education and pay the fees for that course, but they will be required to attend such additional classes at the Training College as the Principal may

On satisfactorily completing the above course, such students shall be entitled to the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate, and shall be eligible to be recorded on the Employment Register for appointment to positions as classified teachers under the Education Department.

- 31. Students will be required to attend such lectures, courses of instruction, criticism lessons and teaching practice as the Principal may direct.
- 32. (a) Students will be liable to dismissal from the College for idleness, misconduct, unpunctuality, absence from lectures, or breach of the rules of the College.
- (b) Students who at any perjod of their course fail to show satisfactory progress may, on the recommendation of the Principal, have their studentships withdrawn.

  (c) Students will be examined from time to time by a medical officer, and if the medical report is not satisfactory a student may have his studentship withdrawn.
- 33. The Principal will furnish an annual report to the Minister, and he will also twice each year furnish to the Director a report on the conduct, efficiency, and aptitude of each student, and for purposes of classification will assign to each a numerical estimate.

W HERPAS by the Local Government Act 1903 (3 Edw. 2. No person over the age of ten years shall bathe in the open sea at that part of the seashore which lies—
(a) Between the south side of Park-street and to a distance 55 feet northerly from the Middle Brighton Pier.
(b) Between the north-west side of the Brighton Beach Pier and the north-west side of the Brighton Beach Baths.
(c) Between the north-west side of the Brighton Beach

(c) Between the north-west side of the Brighton Beach Pier and to a distance 50 yards north-westerly.

3. No person shall bathe in the open sea at any part of the seashore within the municipal district of Brighton or within 300 yards of the boundary thereof, and not within any borough unless effectively and decently clothed from neck to knee in a bathing costume killed cr similar to that known as the Canadian costume, and any constable or officer or the Council may require any person contravening this provision to at once resume his ordinary dress.

4. No person clothed in bathing costume shall sit, he, loiter on, play games on, or run along the beach or senshore, but shall proceed in a direct line to and from the dressing place; and no person clothed in bathing costume shall be on any part of the foreshore reserves other than the beach.

5. No person shall dress or undress, or remove any part of his bathing costume, in any place open to the public view.

of his bathing costume, in any place open to the public view.

6. No male over the age of 10 years shall trespass in any dressing shed, bathing box, baths, or latrines reserved for the use of females, and no female shall trespass in any dressing shed, bathing box, baths, or latrines reserved for males except for the purpose of rendering assistance in case of accident.

7. No person shall loiter, misconduct himself, commit a nuisance, bring any rubbish, filth, or other offensive matter into, or damage, disfigure, or write upon any of the bathing boxes, dressing sheds, or enclosures set apart or authorized by the Council for bathing purposes.

8. No person shall behave in an unseemly, improper, riotous, or noisy manner, to the annoyance of the public, or shall blaspheme, use profane or obscene language, or behave in an indecent manner in or on any part of the beach, foreshore, or water set apart or used by the public for bathing purposes, or in connexion with such purposes.

9. No person shall ride, drive, or lead any horse of other animal upon or along any part of the seashore at any other than a walking pace,
