Qualified persons, women as well as men, who are not already enrolled and who have not obtained Electors' Rights will be entitled to have their names entered on such Lists by obtaining Rights from the Registrars for their respective Divisions before or on that date.

No person whose name is on, or entitled to be on, any Roll of Ratepaying Elector's Right for such Province may obtain an Elector's Right for such Province. Each applicant for an Elector's Right for the Legislative Council should provide himself with the duty stamp (6d.) necessary for payment for the Right.

The Public Service Commissioner, in pursuance of the powers vested in him, hereby repeals Chapter VI. of the Regulations made on the 28th June, 1909, and all amendments thereof, and makes the following Regulations, and submits the same for the approval of the Governor in Council:—[to take effect from the 1st January, 1913.]

REGULATIONS.—CLASSIFICATION OF GENERAL DIVISION. CHAPTER VI.

- 1. When it is necessary to fill an office in the General Division, it shall, unless it be found absolutely necessary to appoint to such vacancy a duly qualified person from outside the Service, be filled by the promotion thereto of the officer who in the opinion of the Commissioner possesses the particular qualifications required for the vacant office, and is next entitled by merit, good and diligent conduct, length of service, relative seniority, and the nature of the work performed by him.
- 2. In the case of appointments, transfers, or promotions to any office in the General Division, the scale or amount of salary assigned to the several offices mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall be that respectively entered opposite the name of the office in such Schedule.
- 3. In cases where no minimum salary is entered opposite the name of his office in the Schedule, every officer shall be entitled to receive pay at the maximum rate without addition thereto.
- 4. In cases where there is a minimum rate and a maximum rate every officer shall be entitled to receive salary at a rate, within the minimum and maximum limits, to be approved by the Governor in Council on the recommendation of the Commissioner, provided that an officer on his first appointment to the Service shall be paid at the minimum rate of his office, except in the cases of persons appointed under the provisions of Section 9 of Act No. 2383, who shall be entitled to be appointed at a salary not less than that they were in receipt of immediately prior to their appointment permanently to the Public Service.
- 5. Any officer transferred or promoted to any office or grade in the General Division shall thereupon be junior to any officer already in such office or grade, but notwithstanding anything in the Schedule he shall be paid an amount not less than that he was receiving immediately before such transfer or promotion provided it be not greater than the maximum rate for such office or grade.
- 6. Increments of Twelve pounds each—at intervals of not less than twelve months—may be granted to officers appointed to the offices mentioned in the Schedule
- 7. Every increment shall be discretionary, and no increment shall be payable except on the certificate of the Permanent Head of the Department that such increment has been earned by good conduct and efficient service, and the recommendation (after independent inquiry) of the Commissioner.
- 8. Where an officer has, previously to his transfer, been paid the same salary as in his new office; time served in such former office may, at the discretion of the Commissioner, be counted in reckoning the interval for the first increment.

Talbot Borough Water Supply.—Rating By-law for the Year 1913.

THE Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Talbot, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Act 1905, do hereby make the following By-law for the purpose of levying a water rate for the year 1913 upon all lands and tenements liable to be rated within that portion of the municipality of the Borough of Talbot, which has been proclaimed a Water Supply District; also for the purpose of determining the charges to be made for the sale of water within such district:—

The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1013 in respect of water, supplied within the aforesaid district:—

- 1. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds municipal value and under, the sum of One pound (£1).
- 2. For every house or tenement of above Twenty pounds (£20) annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling in the pound.

- 4. Government Departments, railways, and other properties supplied by meter, a charge of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons shall be made.
- 5. Government offices supplied with water by special arrangement with the Trust, the following charges shall

Post office, Two shillings (2s.) per 1,000 gallons, minimum, 20,000 gallons per annum.

Police station, Two shillings (2s.) per 1,000 gallons: minimum, 30,000 gallons per annum.

State-school, Two shillings (2s.) per 1,000 gallons; minimum, 15,000 gallons per annum.

6. The charge to be made for loads of water from stand-pipes shall be One shilling for each load of 400 gallons, or less.

- 7. For every water trough connected with hotels, Ten shillings (10s.) per annum; the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons.
- 8. For every factory, mill, or other tenement where machinery is attached and working, the rate shall be Two shillings in the pound on the annual municipal value of such property, or the water may be supplied and charged for by measure at Sixpence (6d.) per 1,000 gallons; and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the engine cyclinder. of the engine cylinder.
- o. For market gardens where water is supplied by meter, the charge shall be Twopence (2d.) per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 100,000 gallons per half-acre and 200,000 gallons per acre.

It must be distinctly understood, however, that the contractor will have a right of appeal to the Treasurer of the State for the time being; but, pending such appeal, he must take back the rejected articles and at once supply others of approved quality; failing which, the supplies required or any like supplies suitable for the service may be obtained by the officer concerned, and the expense charged to the contractor.

I N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1903, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Mansfield order as follows:—

Ratepayers of the Shire of Mansfield order as follows:

1. The market shall be known as the Mansfield Corporation Sale Yards, and shall be held at the place and in the buildings and yards appointed to be used for the purposes of such market situated in the Shire of Mansfield, and the said market shall be used for the sale of cattle.

2. The said market shall be open daily for the reception, delivery, and sale of cattle on every lawful day from sunrise to sunset. A "fortnightly market" shall be held, commencing on Friday, 30th May, 1013, and subsequently on every alternate Friday, provided that in the event of any "fortnightly market" day falling on Christmas Day or a public holiday, or in the event of any special cause rendering it necessary or desirable, the Council may substitute and appoint some other day in lieu thereof for the holding of the said "fortnightly market."

3. The sales of cattle shall be commenced not earlier than Eleven o'clock a.m. during May, June, July, and August, and Ten o'clock a.m. for the rest of the year, and shall be conducted in the order following:—

6. No person shall obstruct the market inspector in the performance of his duty, or release or remove any cattle from the said market or remove any cattle from one part of the said market or remove any cattle from one part of the said market to any other part of the said market without the consent of the market inspector; nor shall any person wilfully break down or damage any of the gates, fences, buildings, or appurtenances of the said market, or cause any riot'or disturbance, or curse or swear, or use any indecent language, or be guilty of any indecent conduct within the said market, or upon the immediate approaches thereto.

7. Every person placing cattle in the market for sale shall be responsible for all tolls and dues accruing thereon, and in no case shall any cattle be taken out of the market until all tolls or dues payable in respect thereof shall have been first paid and satisfied; and if any cattle be not removed within 48 hours after the close of the market another toll shall become due in respect of the cattle so omitted to be removed.

8. The fat and store cattle shall be offered by the auctioneers, who shall draw lots for precedence of selling, and no two auctioneers will be allowed to sell in the vards at the same time without first obtaining the permission of the yard inspector, and no auctioneer shall be allowed to occupy more than five (s) minutes in offering any one pen of cattle for sale, or occupy more than one (r) hour in disposing of all similar stock in his hands for sale. In case any auctioneer has not disposed of the whole of the cattle in his hands not disposed of shall not again be offered by auction until all similar stock that day in the market for disposal by auction have been offered for sale.

9. No auctioneer or his agents shall tout or otherwise solicit stock for sale in the precincts of the market yards in sale days.

10. All auctioneers who have horses to dispose of by auction shall offer the stock placed in their hands in turn, and no auctioneer shall be permitted to occupy more than ten (10) minutes in offering any horse or horses by auction while any other auctioneers who have horses to dispose of while any other auctioneers who have horses to dispose of by auction are present, except with the consent of the whole of such other auctioneers, and in no case shall more than one auctioneer be permitted to offer horses for sale by auction at the same time.

11. In case of any dispute arising as to priority of right to offer by auction the market inspector's decision shall be final.

12. All horses for disposal by auction shall be paraded in the shed or ring provided for the purpose.
