SHIRE OF BROADFORD.

BY-LAW NO. 9.

A By-law of the Shire of Broadford, made under the provisions of the *Health Act* 1890, and numbered nine, for the prevention of the pollution of the Sunday Creek or its tributaries within the limits of the Shire of Broadford.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1890 and of any other power enabling it on that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Broadford, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the said Shire, doth hereby order and direct as follows:—

1. No person shall discharge, or cause or allow to be discharged, any offensive matter or drainage into any part of that creek known as the Sunday Creek, and included within the limits of the district of the Council of the Shire of Broadford, nor within those limits into any tributary of the aforesaid Sunday Creek.

2. Any person who, by any act or default, shall be guilty of any breach of this By-liw shall be liable to a penalty of Five pounds for every such breach, or if such breach be a continuing act or default, he shall be liable to a penalty of One pound for every day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the Justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order portion only of either of the said penalties (such portion not to be less than Five shillings) to be paid.
