CITY OF CAULFIELD.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1903* (3 Edw. VII No. 1893) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make Orders exercising certain powers therein set forth, amongst others, to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight; and that every such Order shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition signed by more than one-fourth of the ratepayers whose names are on the municipal roll of the Borough of Oakleigh has been presented to the

Governor in Council, notice of which was duly published in the *Government Gazette* of the 23rd April, 1913, and no counter petition received: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby subdivide the said Borough into three (3) separate Wards, to be named the North Ward, South Ward, West Ward, the several boundaries of which are herein set forth and described, that is to say:—

BOROUGH OF OAKLEIGH.—SUBDIVISION INTO THREE WARDS. *North Ward.*

Commencing at the intersection of the Warrigal and Waverly roads; thence easterly by Waverly-road to Box Hill-road; thence southerly by Box Hill-road to Tramway-road; thence westerly by Tramway-road and Burlington-street to Burlington-square; thence northerly, westerly, and southerly by Burlington-square to Burlington-street; thence westerly by Burlington-street to Hanover-street; thence northerly by Hanover-street to Atherton-road; thence westerly by Atherton-road to Warrigal-road; thence northerly by Warrigal-road to the commencing point.

South Ward.

Commencing at the intersection of the Warrigal and Atherton roads; thence easterly by Atherton-road to Hanover-street; thence southerly by Hanover-street to Burlington-street; thence easterly by Burlington-street to Burlington-square; thence northerly, easterly, and southerly by Burlington-square to Burlington-street; thence easterly by Burlington-street and Tramway-road to Box Hill-road; thence southerly by the eastern boundary of the borough to Centre-road; thence westerly by Centre-road to Warrigal-road; thence northerly by Warrigal-road to the commencing point.

West Ward.

Commencing at the intersection of Poath and Dandenong roads; thence south-easterly by Dandenong-road to Warrigal-road; thence southerly by Warrigal-road to North-road; thence westerly by North-road to Poath-road; thence northerly by Poath-road to the commencing point.

The borough boundary above referred to is that described in the *Government Gazette* dated the 16th April, 1913.

SEVERANCE OF AREA FROM THE SHIRE OF WIMMERA, AND ANNEXATION TO THE SHIRE OF ARAPILES.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1903* (3 Edw. VII No. 1803) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make Orders exercising certain powers therein set forth, amongst others, to sever any portion of Victoria forming part of a municipal district from such municipal district, and annex the same to any other municipal district with which the portion so severed forms one continuous area, and from time to time make any apportionment of property rights and liabilities, and give any direction as to any matters and things that may be necessary to do justice as between the municipalities concerned; and that every such Order shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall take effect as from the day of such publication; And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the said Act are now exercised upon a petition signed by a majority of the ratepayers of a portion of the Shire of Wimmera with regard to a certain area therein described, notice of such petition having been published in the *Gazette* of the 16th April, 1913: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in compliance with the prayer of the said petition, doth by this present Order sever from the said Shire a certain area described in such petition, being part of the South Riding, and doth annex the portion so severed from such Shire to the South Riding of the Shire of Arapiles; and with the advice aforesaid doth re-define the boundaries of the said Shire of Wimmera with its South Riding as reduced, and of the said Shire of Arapiles with the South Riding as enlarged, in the manner set forth hereunder, that is to say:—

Severance of a portion of the Shire of Wimmera and its annexation to the Shire of Arapiles.

SHIRE OF WIMMERA (REDUCED AND RE-DEFINED).

Commencing at a point on the Wimmera River where the south boundary of the parish of Dimboola abuts thereon; thence easterly by the said boundary to the south-west angle of the parish of Kewell West; thence northerly by the western boundary of that parish and the parish of Wallup to the north-west angle of the parish last named; thence easterly by a road along the northern boundary of allotment 145 to the west boundary of allotment 146; thence by a road northerly, easterly, and southerly to the north-west corner of allotment 148; thence east by a road along the north boundary of that allotment to the west boundary of allotment 84; thence north by a road to the north-west corner of the said allotment; thence easterly by the northern boundary of the parish of Wallup and a road being the north boundary of allotments 67A, 67B, 67C, 67D, 63A, 63, and 60, parish of Werrigar, to the Yarriambiack Creek; thence southerly by that creek to the Wimmera River aforesaid; thence south-easterly by that river to the north boundary of the parish of Ledcourt; thence west by a road to the north-east angle of allotment 16 in the last-named parish; thence south by a road to the east angle of allotment 202; thence south-westerly by a 2-chain road to the south-west boundary of the last-named parish; thence south-easterly by that boundary to a point bearing north-east (magnetic) from Brigg's Bluff, Grampians Range; thence south-west by a line to the said bluff; thence southerly by the Grampians Range to the head of the Glenelg River; thence north-westerly by that river to the west boundary of the parish of Knaawing; thence north by a road to the north-west angle of allotment 43 in the last-named parish; thence easterly and north-easterly by a road to the north-west angle of allotment 57, parish of Wartook; thence south by a road to the south-west angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence north-easterly by a road to the west angle of allotment 13, parish of Wing Wing; thence south-easterly by that allotment and east by that allotment, allotment 17, parish of Burrong, and a line to the McKenzie Creek; thence north-westerly by that creek to the road immediately west of the Tramway reserve, in the parish of Bungallilly; thence north-easterly by that road to the south-east corner of allotment 8, section 9, parish of Horsham; thence west by a road to the south-west corner of allotment 5, section 10; thence north by a road along the west boundary of that allotment to the Wimmera River; thence south-westerly, north-westerly, and northerly by that river to the commencing point, excepting the municipal district of the borough of Horsham.

SOUTH RIDING (REDUCED AND RE-DEFINED).

Commencing at a point on the eastern boundary of the borough of Horsham where it is intersected by the Wimmera River; thence easterly by that river to its junction with the Yarriambiack Creek, being the eastern boundary of the shire; thence following the said shire boundary southerly, north-westerly, easterly, and, again north-westerly to the road immediately west of the Tramway reserve in the parish of Bungallilly; thence north-easterly by that road to the south-east corner of allotment 8, section 9, parish of Horsham, being the southern boundary of the borough of Horsham; thence east along the south boundary and north along the east boundary of the said borough to the commencing point.

SHIRE OF ARAPILES (ENLARGED AND RE-DEFINED).

Commencing at a point on the Glenelg River where the west boundary of the parish of Knaawing abuts thereon; thence westerly and southerly by the said river to the north boundary of the parish of Daahli; thence west by that boundary to the south-east angle of the parish of Toolondo; thence north by the east boundary of that parish and west by the north boundaries of that parish and the parish of Toolongrook to the south-east angle of the parish of Turandurey; thence north and west by the east and north boundaries of that parish to the south-west angle of the parish of Kalingur; thence north and easterly by the west and north boundaries of that parish to the north-east angle thereof; thence north by the west boundaries of the parishes of Toon and Arapiles and east by the north boundary of the latter parish to the south-west angle of mallee allotment 208B, county of Lowan; thence north and east by the west and north boundaries of that allotment, north by the west boundaries of mallee allotments 210 and 209, and east by the north boundary of the last-mentioned allotment to the Wimmera River; thence southerly and north-easterly by that river to the north-west corner of allotment 5, section 10, parish of Horsham; thence south by a road to the south-west corner of said allotment; thence east by a road to the south-east corner of allotment 8, section 9; thence south-westerly by a road immediately west of the Tramway reserve to McKenzie's Creek; thence easterly and south-easterly by that creek to a point in line with the south boundary of allotment 17, parish of Burrong; thence west by a line, the south boundary of the said allotment, and the south boundary of allotment 13, parish of Wing Wing, and north-westerly by the south-west boundary of the last-mentioned allotment to the west angle thereof; thence south-westerly by a road to the south-west angle of allotment 57, parish of Wartook; thence north by a road to the north-west angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence south-westerly and westerly by a road to the south-west angle of allotment 20, parish of Knaawing; and thence south by a road to the commencing point.

SOUTH RIDING (ENLARGED AND RE-DEFINED).

Commencing at a point on the shire boundary at the junction of the Wimmera River with the Norton Creek; thence easterly by that creek to the road between allotments 60 and 63, parish of Darragan, being the road from Horsham to Balmoral; thence south-westerly by that road to its intersection with the shire boundary at the northern boundary of the parish of Toolondo; thence following the shire boundary in an easterly, southerly, easterly, north-westerly, north-easterly, and south-westerly direction to the commencing point.
