Candidates must at the date of examination be between the ages of sixteen and twenty-one years at last birthday; but no person twenty-two years of age or over can be appointed. The commencing salary is £60, rising to a maximum of £204 a year by increments, which may be granted at intervals of not less than one year if recommended by the Permanent Head of the Department and the Public Service Commissioner.

Every person who shall disobey such an order of the Council, or who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this By-law, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10), and not less than Five shillings (5s.) for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF YARRA PARK

PARK.

WHEREAS by the Crown grant issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Melbourne, and their successors in respect of Yarra Park, it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted, and the buildings for the time being thereon, shall be maintained and used as and for a public park and offices and conveniences connected therewith, under and in accordance with such Regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Governor or other officer for the time being administering the Government of the Colony inow State) of Victoria, with the consent of the Executive Council thereof; and in the meantime, under and in accordance with such Regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the said City of Melbourne, and for no other purpose whatsoever. Now, therefore, the Board of Land and Works and the Council of the City of Melbourne do hereby make the following Supplementary Regulations in respect of Yarra Fark:—

### REGULATIONS.

- (1) No person shall ride or drive any bicycle or tri-cycle in any part of the Park, except upon the track specially made and set apart for such purpose
- (2) Every person who shall ride or drive any bicycle or tricycle on such track, shall dismount when reaching the pathway through the Park which crosses such track, and shall not ride or drive

across such pathway.

(3) No motor cycle, motor car, or other motor vehicle, shall, under any circumstances, be ridden or driven in any part of the Park.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 200 of the Land Act 1901, on conviction before any Justice, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence, and every person who so offends, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or officer or servant of the trustees, or by any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer, or servant, or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

Improvements to the value of at least two instillments of the purchase money must be effected on each firm allotment before the end of the first year from the date of the lease, and 10 per cent. of the purchase money before the end of the third year, and a further 10 per cent. before the end of the sixth year.

No conditional purchase lease of an Agricultural Lubourer's allotment can be granted to any person who is already the holder of land of the value of £350, or who would thereby become the holder of land exceeding such value.

Leases will be subject to a condition providing for resumption of land required for necessary drains or channels through any allotment.

Lesses are not permitted to destroy or remove timber from the land unless by written consent of the Commission.

The amount of deposit (less £1 5s.) will be deducted from the capital value, and the half-yearly instalments calculated on the balance of purchase money.

Payments in advance may be made at any time at the option of the lessee, and proportionate reduction of interest control thereby.

The bilance of purchase money, with interest at 4½ per cent., must be paid by 63 or a lesser number of half-yearly instalments calculated according to any of the tables under Division 3 of Part I. of the Savings Banks Act 1800 Amendment Act 1893, the first of such instalments being payable six months after the date of the lease.

Each instalment will include interest upon the balance of the purchase money remaining unpaid.

The Grown grant may be issued to the lessee at the end of any half-year after the first twelve years have expired, on payment of the balance of purchase money, and will be subject to a condition that the owner for the time being of the land, or a member of his family over eighteen years of age, or any person approved by the Governor in Council, shall reside thereon for at least eight months in every year, and that a breach of this condition may lead to the forfeiture of the land to the Grown.
