Candidates must state at which place they desire to present themselves for examination—which must be that nearest their residence—and must forward, either with their application, or on or before Tuesday, the 15th July, 1913, a crossed postal note payable to the Secretary to the Public Service Commissioner (Victoria), for Ten shillings (10s.) in the case of candidates for the Clerical Examinations, and Five shillings (5s.) in the case of candidates for the General Division Examinations, being the fees for such examinations.

At the Clerical Examination fifty (50) candidates will be selected for registration for appointment as Clerks. Candidates must at the date of examination be between the ages of sixteen and twenty-one years at last birthday; but no person twenty-two years of age or over can be appointed. The commencing salary is £60, rising to a maximum of £204 a year by increments, which may be granted at intervals of not less than one year if recommended by the Permanent Head of the Department and the Public Service Commissioner.

For the position of Penal Warder applicants must be between the ages of twenty-five and thirty-five years, and must furnish a certificate of fitness from the Deputy Inspector-General of Penal Establishments, Melbourne, not later than Friday, the 4th July, 1913. No applicant shall be registered as a candidate for such position if he be less than 5 feet 8 inches in height, or measure round his chest less than 36 inches, or weigh less than 11 stone.

For the position of Junior Attendant, Public Library, or Junior Messenger applicants must be between the ages of sixteen and twenty years. After attainment of the age of twenty-one years and completion of three years' service an officer may be granted a salary of £108 a year.

SHIRE OF KARKAROOC.

BY-LAW No. 9.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Act 1890 and all other powers thereunto enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Karkaroc, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, for the purpose of carrying the provisions of the said Act with regard to the subject dealt with into execution within its jurisdiction, makes the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. If in the opinion of the Council the removal of a fowl-yard, stable, or privy, any part of which is within twenty-five (25) feet of a dwelling-house or public building, or fifteen (15) feet of a main street is possible and is necessary for the health of any of the residents in its vicinity, the Council may order the owner or occupier of it, or of the premises of which it forms a part, to remove or alter it so that no part of it shall be within twenty-five (25) feet of any dwelling-house or public building, or fifteen (15) feet of a main street.

2. No person shall within twenty-five (25) feet of a dwelling-house or public building, or fifteen (15) feet of a main street, establish or construct a fowl-yard, stable, or privy, or cause one to be established or constructed, or within such distance permit any land or place to be so used afresh or for the first time as a fowl-yard, stable, or privy.

3. Every person who shall disobey such an order of the Council, or who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this By-law, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10), and not less than Five shillings (5s.) for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

This By-law shall apply to have operation within the townships of Hopetoun, Beulah, Woomelang, Lascelles, Speed, Rosebery, Turriff, Goyura, Tempy, Kenmare, and that part of Rainbow within the boundaries of the Shire of Karkaroc, of the municipal district of the Shire of Karkaroc.

- (f) On completion of the term herein named hand over to the said apprentice this copy of agreement with a certificate thereon to the effect that the said term has been served. Provided that this shall be conditional on the said apprentice serving the said term and observing and fulfilling the covenants herein.
- (g) If at any time during the said term he shall die or cease to carry on the business aforesaid in all its branches as now carried on by him either altogether or within a radius of three miles from his present place of business he or his executors administrators or assigns or one of them will within one month thereafter find and provide some other employer or employers carrying on the business aforesaid in all its branches

within such radius if any there be or if there be none such if the apprentice so require provide some employer carrying on business beyond that radius and will assign and transfer at his own expense and cost the said apprentice to such employer or employers upon and subject to the same or the like conditions and stipulations as are hereinbefore provided.

No. 1125) it is provided that the Governor in Council may, on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria, from time to time make Regulations as to (among other things) the sale or custody of any poisons or otherwise as to carrying into effect the objects of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and pursuant to the powers conferred by the Poisons Acts, doth by this Order make the following additional Regulation, which has been duly recommended by the Pharmacy Board of Victoria (that is to say):—

- (1) This Regulation shall be read and construed with the Regulations under the Poisons Acts approved by the Governor in Council respectively on the 15th day of October, 1877, and the 18th day of June, 1907.

- (2) The following poisons, namely:—

Chloral Hydrate and solutions and preparations thereof;
Cocaine and its salts and all preparations;
Diethyl Barbituric acid and other alkyl, aryl, and metallic derivative of barbituric acid, whether described as Veronal, Proponal, Medinal, or by any other trade name, mark, or designation, and all poisonous Urethanes and Ureides;
Heroin and its salts;
Morphine and its salts;
Paraldehyde;
Sulphonal and its homologues, whether described as Trional, Tetronal, or by any other trade name, mark, or designation, shall not be delivered (whether in pursuance of a sale or otherwise) except on the written prescription or order of a duly qualified medical practitioner.

- (3) The provisions of these Regulations shall not apply to the sale or delivery of liniments, ointments, or other preparations which are prepared for external use only, or any of the enumerated poisons used as ingredients in veterinary medicines, provided that such liniments, ointments, preparations, or medicines are delivered (in pursuance of a sale or otherwise) in good faith and not in evasions or attempted evasions of these Regulations.

WHEREAS the construction of a line of railway, to be called the Tallangatta and Cudgewa Railway, has been authorized by the *Tallangatta to Cudgewa Railway Construction Act 1912*, subject to the provisions of the Railway Lands Acquisition Acts: And whereas it is necessary that the requirements of section 8 of the *Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1893* be now complied with: Now therefore I, Sir John Michael Fleetwood Fuller, Baronet, Governor in and over the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c., under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon me by the *Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1893* and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, hereby announce that unless I receive within the period by the *Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1893* mentioned a petition signed as therein required, praying that such Railway Construction District be not constituted, and that the said Tallangatta and Cudgewa Railway be not constructed, it is my intention to constitute, after the expiration of one month from the date of the publication in the *Government Gazette* of this Order, the lands hereinafter described a Railway Construction District, under the name, style, or title of the Tallangatta and Cudgewa Railway Construction District, that is to say all the land included within the following boundaries:—

ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF YARRA PARK.

WHEREAS by the Crown grant issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Melbourne, and their successors in respect of Yarra Park, it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted, and the buildings for the time being thereon, shall be maintained and used as and for a public park and offices and conveniences connected therewith, under and in accordance with such Regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Governor or other officer for the time being administering the Government of the Colony (now State) of Victoria, with the consent of the Executive Council thereof; and in the meantime, under and in accordance with such Regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the said City of Melbourne, and for no other purpose whatsoever. Now, therefore, the Board of Land and Works and the Council of the City of Melbourne do hereby make the following Supplementary Regulations in respect of Yarra Park:—

REGULATIONS.

- (1) No person shall ride or drive any bicycle or tricycle in any part of the Park, except upon the track specially made and set apart for such purpose.
- (2) Every person who shall ride or drive any bicycle or tricycle on such track, shall dismount when reaching the pathway through the Park which crosses such track, and shall not ride or drive across such pathway.
- (3) No motor cycle, motor car, or other motor vehicle, shall, under any circumstances, be ridden or driven in any part of the Park.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 200 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any Justice, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence, and every person who so offends, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or officer or servant of the trustees, or by any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer, or servant, or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

Closer Settlement Acts.

WERRIBEE ESTATE (IRRIGABLE AREA).

ALLOTMENTS IN THE WERRIBEE ESTATE AVAILABLE FOR APPLICATION UNDER CONDITIONAL PURCHASE LEASE.

THE several allotments included in the schedule hereunder are declared available as Farm Allotments and Agricultural Labourer's Allotments until Thursday, 10th July, 1913. Applications must be made on the prescribed forms, and lodged with the Secretary, Closer Settlement Branch, Lands Department, accompanied by the deposit, as shown in Schedule hereunder, for the most valuable allotment applied for. The deposit includes registration fee of 5s. and lease fee of £1. A Local Land Board to deal with the applications will be held at the Board Room, Public Offices, Melbourne, on Friday, 18th July, 1913, at 10 a.m.

Terms, Conditions, &c.

The leases issued to successful applicants may be for such a term of years, not exceeding 31½, as may be agreed upon between the lessee and the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission.

An applicant may apply for more than one allotment, but will only be required to lodge one deposit, being the amount chargeable on the most valuable allotment applied for. Applicants must be at least 18 years of age.

No conditional purchase lease of a Farm Allotment can be granted to any person who is already the holder of land of the value of £2,500 (township land excepted), or who would thereby become the holder of land exceeding such value. This does not apply to Homestead Allotments.

Improvements to the value of at least two instalments of the purchase money must be effected on each farm allotment before the end of the first year from the date of the lease, and 10 per cent. of the purchase money before the end of the third year, and a further 10 per cent. before the end of the sixth year.

No conditional purchase lease of an Agricultural Labourer's allotment can be granted to any person who is already the holder of land of the value of £350, or who would thereby become the holder of land exceeding such value.

The lessee must enclose his allotment with a substantial and sufficient fence within two years from the date of his lease unless sooner called upon under the provisions of the Fences Act 1890, and erect a house to the value of at least £30.

The lessee must reside on the estate. (Personal residence by the lessee's wife, or any child not less than eighteen years of age of lessee, may be considered personal residence by the lessee, with the approval of the Commission.) In special cases the Commission has power to allow persons other than those above mentioned to reside for a limited period in lieu of lessee.

The lessee cannot transfer, assign, mortgage, or sublet the whole or any part of his allotment within the first six years of the lease.

Leases will be subject to a condition providing for resumption of land required for necessary drains or channels through any allotment.

Lessees are not permitted to destroy or remove timber from the land unless by written consent of the Commission.

The amount of deposit (less £1 5s.) will be deducted from the capital value, and the half-yearly instalments calculated on the balance of purchase money.

Payments in advance may be made at any time at the option of the lessee, and proportionate reduction of interest secured thereby.

The balance of purchase money, with interest at 4½ per cent., must be paid by 63 or a lesser number of half-yearly instalments calculated according to any of the tables under Division 3 of Part I. of the Savings Banks Act 1890 Amendment Act 1895, the first of such instalments being payable six months after the date of the lease. Each instalment will include interest upon the balance of the purchase money remaining unpaid.

The Crown grant may be issued to the lessee at the end of any half-year after the first twelve years have expired, on payment of the balance of purchase money, and will be subject to a condition that the owner for the time being of the land, or a member of his family over eighteen years of age, or any person approved by the Governor in Council, shall reside thereon for at least eight months in every year, and that a breach of this condition may lead to the forfeiture of the land to the Crown.
