ADDITION TO ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 1 OF THE 12TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1909, RELATING TO THE CLASSIFICATION OF EXPLOSIVES.

WHEREAS by the 49th section of the *Explosives Act 1890* it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time by Order define for the purposes of the First Part of the said Act the composition, quality, and character of any explosive, and may classify explosives: Now therefore, in pursuance of the above-mentioned provisions of the said Act, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria doth, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, order as follows:—

There shall be added to the list of Explosives defined and classified in the Order in Council No. 1 made on the 12th day of October, 1909, the following explosives, the composition, quality, and character of which are hereby defined:—

CLASS 3.—NITRO-COMPOUND.

Division 1.

Dynobel, consisting of a mixture of nitro-glycerine, nitro-cotton, perchlorate of potassium, wood-meal (dried at 100 deg. C.), and oxalate of ammonium. Provided that the proportions of nitro-glycerine and nitro-cotton shall not exceed 33.5 and 1 per cent. respectively, and that the proportion of wood-meal shall not be less than 8.5 per cent. of the finished explosive.

Super-Excellite, consisting of a mixture of nitro-glycerine, nitrate of ammonium, nitrate of potassium, wood-meal (dried at 100 deg. C.), and oxalate of ammonium. Provided that the proportion of nitro-glycerine does not exceed 5 per cent. of the finished explosive, and that the explosive is contained in thoroughly waterproof cartridge wrappers or cases.

Super-Kolax, consisting of a mixture of nitro-glycerine, nitrate of potassium, nitrate of barium, oxalate of ammonium, wood-meal (dried at 100 deg. C.), and starch (dried at 100 deg. C.). Provided that the proportion of nitro-glycerine does not exceed 26.5 per cent. of the finished explosive, and that the proportions of wood-meal and starch shall not be less than 26 and 6 per cent. respectively.

CLASS 6.—AMMUNITION.

Division 1.

Safety Instantaneous Fuse, consisting of a fuse for blasting which contains meal powder in such quantity as not to exceed 75 grains per yard of fuse, and which does not contain its own means of ignition, and of which the coating is of an approved colour, and of such strength and construction that the burning of such fuse will not communicate laterally with other like fuses.

PROCLAMATION

REGULATION No. 42.

A REGULATION of the City of Ballarat, numbered 42, made under section forty-four (44) of the *Meat Supervision Act 1900*, for—

- (a) Prescribing the conditions on which animals may be received into, or supplied or removed from any abattoirs;
- (b) prescribing the duties of meat inspectors;
- (c) licensing and registering persons engaged in tending and slaughtering animals and in dressing carcasses at abattoirs;
- (d) fixing the rates of slaughtering fees or dues (not exceeding the sums mentioned in the Second Schedule to the *Butchers and Abattoirs Act 1890*) payable to it for the use of abattoirs of which it is the owner;
- (e) for the feeding, watering, and tending, and the preventing of cruelty to, and overcrowding of animals in abattoirs, and for the milking of milch animals at abattoirs;
- (f) for examining animals by meat inspectors before slaughter, and prescribing the mode of dealing with animals at abattoirs when suspected of being affected with communicable disease;
- (g) prescribing the mode of slaughtering animals, of flaying and of dressing carcasses, and for preserving the cleanliness of appliances used therefor;
- (h) examining by meat inspectors the different parts of a carcass after slaughter at abattoirs, and for preventing the parts of one carcass being mixed with those of another prior to examination;
- (i) fixing the fees for examining of animals, and for examining and branding of carcasses;
- (j) prescribing the mode of removing condemned carcasses or meat, and of rendering the same unusable for human consumption, and of disposing of or destroying the same, and prescribing the mode of removing and disposing of blood, offal, garbage, refuse matters, and manure from abattoirs;

- (k) prescribing the nature of the particulars to be entered in the register as to animals examined or slaughtered at, or supplied or removed from, any abattoir, and as to carcasses or meat dealt with thereat;
- (l) maintaining the cleanliness of abattoirs and of appliances used thereat, and the cleanliness of the clothing of persons engaged in slaughtering or in dressing carcasses therein;
- (m) preventing persons affected with dangerous communicable disease being employed in the handling of carcasses or meat;
- (n) generally for carrying into effect the objects of the *Meat Supervision Act 1900*, and for imposing penalties for non-compliance with the regulations.

Penalties.

No such penalty for one offence shall exceed the sum of Twenty pounds, and no penalty for a continuing offence shall exceed the sum of Two pounds for each day during which the offence continues.

(a) Reception or Removal of Animals.

1. Animals intended for slaughter may be received into the public abattoirs on any day from the hour of Seven o'clock a.m. to the hour of Five o'clock p.m. from the first day of October to the thirtieth day of April, and between the hours of Seven o'clock a.m. and Five o'clock p.m. from the first day of May until the thirtieth day of September in each year, provided always that animals shall not be received into the public abattoirs on any Sunday, Christmas Day, or Good Friday.

2. All animals received or placed into the public abattoirs, if not slaughtered or otherwise dealt with as by law provided, must be removed from the public abattoirs by the owner, or the person in charge thereof, within a period of not more than 72 hours in all from the time such animals were first received into the public abattoirs, otherwise the said animals shall be removed by order of the Inspector, at the expense and risk of the owner thereof.

(b) Duties of Chief Meat Inspector.

3. The following shall be included in the duties of the Chief Meat Inspector:—

- To direct the care and management of animals during the time they are at the public abattoirs pending slaughter or removal.
- To direct the removal of all animals that have been longer than 72 hours in the public abattoirs.
- To keep register of, and to visit and inspect, all private abattoirs, butchers' shops, small-goods factories, meat markets, and such other places as the Council may direct, and to examine all carcasses, meat, offal, small goods, fittings, implements, and appliances at these places, and to take such action in regard to these as the Council may direct, or as may be authorized by this or other regulations, or by the provisions of the Act.
- To superintend and direct the carrying out of all cleansing methods and sanitary measures and requirements in and about the abattoirs.
- To keep a register of all butchers, salesmen, slaughtermen, and others engaged in doing business at the public abattoirs, and to control and direct the operations and enforce propriety of conduct of all such persons.
- To compel observance of the Meat Supervision Acts, and all by-laws and regulations relating to public abattoirs, and generally to carry out the duties of Meat Inspector in accordance with the provisions of the Meat Supervision Acts.

(c) Duties of Meat Inspectors.

4. The following shall be included in the duties of Meat Inspectors:—

- To keep a register of all animals received into, or placed in, or slaughtered, or condemned in, or removed from the public abattoirs, and to keep such books, accounts, registers, and records, and furnish such reports, as the Council may from time to time direct or require.
- To inspect all animals received or placed into the public abattoirs before the same are slaughtered.
- To examine all carcasses, organs, viscera, and offal, and other parts of animals, immediately upon being slaughtered, and to brand, or cause to be branded under his direction, in accordance with the Meat Supervision Acts and regulations made by the Board of Public Health and the Council under the Meat Supervision Acts, all such carcasses, organs, viscera, offal, and parts that are intended to be exposed for sale for human consumption.

To demand and receive the fees hereinafter appointed to be paid in respect to such examination and branding; also to collect the rates of slaughtering fees or dues payable to the Council for the use of the public abattoirs, or for the slaughtering of animals.

To prevent summarily any unnecessary suffering in slaughtering or cruelty to any animals in the public abattoirs, and to report to the Council the names of every person guilty of such cruelty.

To compel observance of the Meat Supervision Acts and all by-laws and regulations relating to public abattoirs, and generally to act under instructions received from the Chief Meat Inspector.

(d) Slaughtering Fees.

5. The sums stated hereunder shall be the rates of slaughtering fees or dues payable to the Council for the use of the public abattoirs, viz.:—

- For every ox, cow, bull, heifer, or steer, 2s. (Two shillings).
- For every sheep, or lamb, or goat, 3d. (Threepence).
- For every head of swine, 1s. (One shilling).
- For every calf under 300 lbs., 1s. (One shilling).

And such sums shall be paid to the Inspector by the owner of all animals which may be brought into the public abattoirs, whether or not such animals have been examined, slaughtered, or branded.

(e) Feeding, Watering, &c.; Cruelty to Animals.

6. Every person who shall bring animals to the public abattoirs shall cause them to be provided with a sufficient quantity of wholesome water, and, if the same remain in the public abattoirs for a longer period than twenty-four hours, shall also provide such animals with sufficient food, provided always that no animals shall be allowed to remain in the public abattoirs after three hours' notice shall have been given by the Chief Meat Inspector to the owner or person in charge thereof to remove same, and such owner or person in charge shall remove same accordingly.

7. Animals shall be placed in such numbers only as the Chief Meat Inspector may direct in any of the pens, stalls, yards, or standings in the public abattoirs, and every person failing to observe the directions of the Chief Meat Inspector in this respect shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations.

8. Every person who shall cause any unnecessary suffering in slaughtering any animal, or be guilty of any cruelty to any animal in the public abattoirs, shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations. All milch animals in the public abattoirs shall be milked by the owner or person in charge thereof at such time and place as the Chief Meat Inspector may direct, either verbally or in writing.

(f) Examination of Animals before Slaughtering, and Communicable Disease.

9. Every animal received into or placed in the public abattoirs shall be examined by the Inspector before any such animal shall be slaughtered, and every owner or person in charge of any animal who shall permit the same to be slaughtered before being so examined shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations.

10. No animal shall be removed from the public abattoirs if affected with, or if, in the opinion of the Inspector, there are reasonable grounds for believing it to be affected with, any of the following diseases, viz.:—Tuberculosis, anthrax, quarterill, pleuro-pneumonia, swine fever (hog cholera), swine erysipelas, lymphatic abscess, actinomycosis (lumpy jaw), or any communicable, contagious, or infectious disease, and no animal so affected shall be received into the public abattoirs except by the direct permission of the Chief Meat Inspector, and, when so ordered by the said Inspector, either verbally or in writing, the owner or person in charge of any diseased animal shall forthwith destroy such animal in the manner directed by the said Inspector, whereupon the carcass of such animal shall be forthwith dealt with by the said Inspector so as to render it unfit for human consumption, and the carcass shall be disposed of (at the expense and risk of the owner thereof) in such manner as the Inspector may direct.

(g) Mode of Slaughtering, &c.; Cleanliness of Appliances.

11. The owner or person in charge of any animal brought into the public abattoirs may slaughter such animal, and flay and dress the carcass thereof, in such manner, at such time, and in such place or portion of the public abattoirs as the Inspector may direct.

12. Every person engaged in slaughtering, dressing, or tending or caring for any animal or carcass in the public abattoirs shall take all means and precautions so as to secure perfect cleanliness of his person, dress, and of all appliances of every kind used or to be used by him in the public abattoirs, and the Chief Meat Inspector shall decide whether all such means and precautions have been taken; and the Chief Meat Inspector shall have the authority to forthwith order, either verbally or in writing, any person to at once leave the public abattoirs who shall not have so complied in regard to the cleanliness of his person or the appliances used or to be used by him, and every person who has not so complied shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations.

13. Every person engaged in slaughtering at these abattoirs who may observe during his operations any disease in any animal being slaughtered shall forthwith draw the attention of the Meat Inspector thereto.

(h) *Examination of Carcass after Slaughter, &c.*

14. The carcass, organs, viscera, and offal of any animal shall, immediately upon being slaughtered in the public abattoirs, be examined by the Meat Inspector, and no person shall cut away or remove from any portion of the carcass or the organs, viscera, or offal thereof, except in such manner as the Meat Inspector may direct.

(i) *Fees for Examining and Branding Carcasses.*

15. The fees hereunder mentioned shall be paid to the Inspector for examining and branding of carcasses of meat slaughtered at the public abattoirs, viz.:—

For every ox, cow, bull, heifer, or steer, 1s. (One shilling).

For every sheep, lamb, or goat, 2d. (Twopence).

For every head of swine, 3d. (Threepence).

For every calf, 3d. (Threepence).

(j) 16. Fee for examining and branding any carcass of meat of animals fattened and slaughtered by any person on his own premises, the said premises being without the Meat Area, and brought to a place appointed as provided by section 27 of the Meat Supervision Act:—

For every ox, cow, bull, heifer, or steer, 3s. (Three shillings).

For every calf under 300 lbs., 1s. 3d. (One shilling and threepence).

For every sheep, lamb, or goat, 5d. (Fivepence).

For every head of swine, 1s. 3d. (One shilling and threepence).

(k) *Removal of Condemned Carcasses, Offal, &c.*

17. Upon the carcass of any animal being condemned by the Meat Inspector as unfit for human consumption, it shall be destroyed or dealt with as the Inspector may direct, provided always that such carcass shall not be removed or retained by the owner thereof, or by any person acting for such owner; but the proceeds, or any portion thereof of the disposal of the carcass, may, if the Inspector so determines, be given to the owner of such carcass, and the expenses of removing and disposing of such carcass, if any, shall be paid by the owner of such carcass.

18. Upon any animal being slaughtered in the public abattoirs, the owner of such animal, or the person acting for him, shall forthwith cleanse thoroughly of all offal, blood, garbage, refuse matters, or manure, as the Inspector shall direct, the stall or place in which such animal was slaughtered.

19. Immediately after the cleansing of any stall or place, as set forth in the last preceding clause, the owner of any animal, or the person acting for him, shall forthwith remove from the public abattoirs, in such a manner as shall be approved by the Meat Inspector, all offal, blood, garbage, refuse matters, or manure that may have arisen from such slaughtering of any animal (unless the Council elect to retain the offal, blood, garbage, refuse matter, or manure), and shall dispose of the same at such place and in such manner as shall be approved by the Council and the Inspector.

20. Offal and skins are to be removed within four hours of their production at the abattoirs, and every one employed at the abattoirs is to prevent offal or scrap meat being put into the paunch-contents' bin.

(l) *Register, &c., of Animals.*

21. The Meat Inspector shall enter in a book to be kept in the public abattoirs a description of all animals brought into the public abattoirs, including the particulars of the class of each animal, the colours, brands, and sex of every head of the same, the date on which such animals were received, examined, slaughtered, or condemned in, or removed from, the public abattoirs, and the amount of fees paid for examining, slaughtering, and branding of all such animals, together with the names of the persons who are the owners of such animals.

22. The Inspector shall enter in a book to be kept in the public abattoirs a complete description of all diseases of animals which he inspects, either before or after slaughter, and in such description there shall be included the names of the owners of the animals, the sex and age and kind of animals, also the particulars of the manner in which all such animals have been disposed of.

(m) *Carriage of Meat.*

23. No person shall carry or convey, or cause to be carried or conveyed, in any kind of vehicle, to or from the public abattoirs or any butcher's shop or premises in or along any of the roads or streets of the City of Ballarat any meat unless such meat in any such vehicle is properly covered and surrounded by a thoroughly clean canvas or wooden covering.

24. No person shall carry or convey, or cause to be carried or conveyed, any meat in any kind of vehicle to or from the public abattoirs or butcher's shop or premises in or along any road or street in the city of Ballarat unless any such vehicle is in a proper, clean, and sanitary condition.

25. Every person who shall offend against any of the provisions of these regulations shall, upon conviction thereof, be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

26. Every one wasting water at the abattoirs will be infringing this regulation, and will be subject to the penalties provided.

27. Every one using the roads, lanes, paddocks, yards, hairages, buildings, or any area or thing on the abattoirs' premises shall observe the directions issued by the Superintendent from time to time on such matters, and any omission to carry out his instructions will render the person concerned liable to the penalties provided.

Every such occupier shall cause all refuse or garbage receptacles in use on his premises, and covers thereof, to be kept as clean as possible, and shall cause such receptacles to be sufficiently disinfected with some efficient disinfectant and deodorant when necessary, and shall also cause such receptacles to be maintained in good order and condition, and all refuse or garbage arising from or upon such premises from time to time to be deposited in such receptacles, and shall cause such receptacles to be continuously covered save when garbage or refuse is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom.

3. Every person who shall by any wilful act or default be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of the foregoing By-law shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds nor less than Five shillings for each such breach.

4. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

5. This By-law shall come into operation and commence to have effect immediately upon its publication as provided by the *Local Government Act 1903* in the *Government Gazette*.

CITY OF ST. KILDA.

BY-LAW No. 84.

A By-law of the City of St. Kilda, made under the provisions of section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 84, for regulating the keeping of birds and providing for the health of the residents in the said city.

Whereas the keeping of the birds (hereinafter mentioned) in houses, yards, or runs, within the said City of St. Kilda is, in the opinion of the Council, offensive and injurious to health, unless the same be in accordance with the provisions hereinafter contained.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of St. Kilda order as follows:—

1. In the interpretation of this By-law the word "poultry" shall mean and include the following birds, namely:—Fowls, ducks, geese, and turkeys, or any one or more of them, and whether of the male or female gender.

2. No person shall keep, or cause to be kept, or allow to run, any poultry except in houses, yards, or runs having a total area of not less than one hundred square feet. Provided further that such yards and runs shall be securely enclosed by a poultry proof fence, and every poultry house, yard, or run shall be kept in a clean, wholesome, and sanitary state and condition.

3. For every fowl there shall be provided at least ten square feet of ground space, and for every head of other poultry at least twenty square feet, provided that when fowls are continuously kept in effectively closed-in sheds or coops it shall be sufficient if a minimum floor space of six square feet be provided for each fowl so kept in any such shed or coop.

4. No part of any poultry house, poultry yard, or run shall be within fifteen feet of any part of any dwelling other than outbuildings, and the Council may, upon reasonable notice to the occupier of any premises upon which there is a poultry house, poultry yard, or run given by leaving same at such premises, require such occupier to remove or alter such house, yard, or run, so that same shall comply with this By-law, and such occupier shall forthwith carry out the required alteration or removal.

5. The occupier of any premises on which a poultry house is erected or placed shall cause the floor and interior thereof to be thoroughly cleansed from time to time as often as may be necessary for the purpose of keeping such floor and interior in a clean, wholesome, and sanitary state and condition.

6. The occupier of any premises upon which there is a poultry house, poultry yard, or run, shall at all reasonable times afford free access to every part thereof respectively to the Officer of Health and Inspector of Nuisances of the said city, or either of them, or to any person or persons specially appointed by the Council in that behalf, for the purpose of inspecting any such poultry house, poultry yard, or run, or the poultry therein or thereon.

7. No person shall keep any poultry which, in the opinion of the Officer of Health, Inspector of Nuisances, or such specially appointed person, has developed diphtheria, tubercle, or other contagious or infectious disease injurious to human beings, and such poultry may, without prejudice to any procedure against such person under this By-law, be destroyed by such officer, inspector, or specially appointed person.

8. Every person who shall by any wilful act or default be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of the foregoing By-law shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Ten shillings for each such breach.

9. This By-law shall apply and have force and effect throughout the said City of St. Kilda.

10. This By-law shall come into operation and commence to have effect immediately upon its publication, as provided by the *Local Government Act 1903*, in the *Government Gazette*.

3. *Manner in which the Name of Municipality, &c., shall be Displayed.*—The owner of every hackney carriage shall cause to be painted legibly thereon, in a conspicuous position on the outside thereof, the name of the Shire of Rutherglen and the number of such carriage corresponding with the number of its licence.

4. *Manner in which Number of Passengers is to be Shown.*—The number of persons which may be carried in each hackney carriage shall be legibly painted in a conspicuous position on the outside thereof in letters at least one inch in length and of proportionate breadth.

No procession of persons (either on foot or on horseback) or vehicles, or both, for other than funeral purposes, shall parade or pass through any of the streets or roads of the Borough of Horsham without having first obtained the written consent thereto of the Mayor, or, in his absence, of the Town Clerk, of the said Borough, and then only by the route and between the hours specified in such consent, nor unless and until the recipient of such consent shall have given at least twenty-four hours' notice thereof, in writing, with particulars of such consent and route to the officer in charge of the police of the said Borough. Penalty, £5.

3. Every person walking along any footway shall, when passing any other person on such footway, pass such last-mentioned person on the right-hand side of such footway. Penalty, 20s.

4. No person shall obstruct any public place within the said Borough by standing or loitering thereon or therein without first having obtained the written consent of the Mayor, or, in his absence, the Town Clerk of the said Borough. Any such consent may be general or limited to any particular occasion, and may at any time be revoked. Penalty, £3.

5. No person shall continue to obstruct any public place within the said Borough by standing or loitering thereon or therein after being required by any member of the Police Force to discontinue such standing or loitering.

6. No camels, elephants, or wild animals of a savage nature shall be brought into that portion of the said Borough within the following boundaries:—Commencing at the south-east angle of the intersection of Wawunna-road and Railway-avenue south; thence easterly along the southern side of the said avenue to Urquhart-street; thence southerly along the western side of Urquhart-street to the southern side of Searle-street; thence easterly along the southern side of Searle-street to the eastern boundary of Urquhart-street; thence southerly along the eastern boundary of Urquhart-street to the

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southern boundary of Wilson-street; thence westerly along the southern boundary of Wilson-street to the eastern boundary of Darlot-street; thence northerly along the eastern boundary of Darlot-street to the northern boundary of Baillie-street; thence westerly along the northern boundary of Baillie-street to the eastern boundary of Wawunna-road; thence northerly along the eastern boundary of Wawunna-road to the commencing point.

7. For the purposes of this By-law, "Public place" shall mean, include, and apply to every public highway, road, street, footway, footpath, court, alley, passage, or thoroughfare, notwithstanding that such public highway, road, street, footway, footpath, court, alley, passage, or thoroughfare may be formed, made, or constructed on private property. And without prejudice to the generality of this definition it shall particularly mean, include, and apply to the footways surrounding the Borough Chambers in Wilson-street within the said Borough.

8. The penalties provided in this By-law for breach thereof shall in each case be the maximum for a first offence.

9. In the case of any conviction for a second or subsequent offence the maximum penalty shall be double the amount provided for a first offence.

10. This By-law shall come into force upon the twenty-fourth day of January, One thousand nine hundred and fourteen, and shall apply and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

The resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council the second day of December, One thousand nine hundred and thirteen.
