Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE LIVERY STABLE BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person employed—

- (1) Driving horse-drawn passenger vehicles hired or plying for hire;
- (2) in the business of a livery stable-keeper or in a stable where cabs or cab horses are kept,

has made the following Determination, namely:—

1. That this Determination shall come into force and be operative on and after the 1st day of August, 1914.

WAGES.

2. That the lowest rates which may be paid to the following persons shall be—

Adults	£2 6s. 6d. per week of 65 hours.
Persons under 21 years of age (not being apprentices or improvers) engaged solely in driving commercial travellers' buggies:—	
17 years of age and under	15s. per week of 48 hours.
Over 17 years of age	31s. „ „

APPRENTICES AND IMPROVERS.

“Apprentice” means any person under 21 years of age bound by indentures of apprenticeship, or any person over 21 years of age who, with the sanction of the Minister, is bound by indentures of apprenticeship. (Act 2386, section 5.)

“Improver” means any person (other than an apprentice) who does not receive a piece-work price or a wages rate fixed by any Special Board for persons other than apprentices or improvers, and who is not over 21 years of age, or who, being over 21 years of age, holds a licence from the Minister to be paid as an improver. (Act 2386, section 5.)

3. That the wages and number of apprentices and improvers shall be—

			IMPROVERS. One improver to every three or fraction of three employes receiving not less than 46s. 6d. per week of 65 hours.

TIME OF BEGINNING AND ENDING WORK.

4. That the time of beginning and ending work shall be—

Time of Beginning.		Time of Ending.	
6.30 a.m.	12.30 p.m.	on Sunday.
6.30 a.m.	12 midnight	on the other days of the week.

OVERTIME.

5. That the following rates shall be paid for work done during the times specified hereunder, viz:—

Outside the hours specified in clause 4 as the times of beginning and ending work	} Time and a-half.
Within the hours specified as the times of beginning and ending work, in excess of the number of hours fixed for a week's work	

CASUAL HANDS.

6. That any person employed for less than one week's continuous work shall be paid at the rate of 1s. per hour.

SPECIAL RATES FOR PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.

7. That time and a quarter shall be the special rate for all work done on—

Good Friday, and
Christmas Day,

but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
