APPROVAL OF ARRANGEMENT WHEREBY CERTAIN DUTIES ARE TO BE EXECUTED BY OFFICERS OF THE PUBLIC SERVICE OF VICTORIA IN CONNEXION WITH THE HIGH COURT.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, has, by an Order made on the 20th day of July, 1914, approved of the following arrangement made by His Excellency the Governor-General, pursuant to section 36 of the *Commonwealth Public Service Act 1902-1913*, to come into operation as on and from the first day of July, 1914, viz.:—

1. That an officer of the Public Service of the State of Victoria be appointed to execute the duties of the office of Principal Registrar of the High Court of Australia.
2. That an officer of the Public Service of the said State be appointed to execute the duties of the office of Deputy Marshal of the High Court of Australia in the said State.
3. That any officers of the Public Service of the said State may be appointed to be assistant officers to the Principal Registrar and Deputy Marshal respectively.
4. That appointments to be made in pursuance of this arrangement shall be made by the Governor-General on the recommendation of the Attorney-General of the Commonwealth, with the concurrence of the Attorney-General or some other Minister of the said State.

6. That this arrangement is to supersede the previous arrangements between the Governor-General and the Governor of the said State with respect to the said Principal Registry, and any officers appointed in pursuance of such previous arrangements and holding office at the commencement of this arrangement, except the officer holding the office of Deputy Registrar of the High Court, shall be deemed to have been appointed in pursuance of this arrangement.

TOWN OF BALLAARAT EAST.

BY-LAW No. 46.

A By-law of the Town of Ballarat East, under the provisions of, and the powers conferred by, the *Health Act 1890*.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution, the Council of the Town of Ballarat East, in the name of and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses thereof, hereby make the following By-law, being By-law No. 46.

1. This By-law shall come into force after it shall have been confirmed by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the municipal district of the Town of Ballarat East.

INTERPRETATION OF TERMS.

3. In the construction and for the purposes of this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires:—

"House" means and includes dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed victuallers' premises, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging-houses, or other buildings or premises.

"Inspector" includes any acting or assistant inspector.

"Land" means and includes messuages, buildings, lands, and hereditaments of every tenure; also rivers, streams, wells, and waters of every description; also easements of every description in respect of the foregoing particulars.

"Officer" includes inspector.

"Owner" means the person for the time being entitled to receive the rent of the land or premises in connexion with which the word is used, whether on his own account, or as the agent of or as trustee for any person, or who would be entitled to receive the same if the lands or premises were let at a rent.

"Street" means and includes any highway and any public bridge, and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

Words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular to include the plural, and the plural the singular.

WITH RESPECT TO THE DISPOSAL, DEODORIZING, AND REMOVAL OF RUBBISH.

4. *Occupier to provide Receptacle for Refuse and Rubbish.*—The occupier of any house or premises shall provide a covered non-absorbent receptacle for the temporary deposit of house refuse and of rubbish from his house and yard.

5. *To place Refuse and Rubbish in Receptacle.*—He shall without delay place or cause to be placed in such receptacle all such refuse and rubbish.

6. *To Deodorize Same.*—He shall, when necessary, introduce into such receptacle a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant.

7. *Occupier to Keep Receptacle on Premises, for Removal of Contents.*—For the discharge and removal of the contents thereof by the person thereto appointed or employed by the council, he shall place such receptacle in some convenient part of his own premises at such times and at or between such hours as may be specified from time to time by the council. He shall not place such receptacle in any street or lane.

8. *Householder to Keep Receptacle Inoffensive.*—Every householder shall be responsible for keeping such receptacle in an inoffensive condition.

WITH RESPECT TO REMOVAL OF MUD, RUBBISH, FILTH, ETC., FROM STABLES AND COW-YARDS, ETC.

9. *Occupiers of Stables, Cow-yard, Cattle-shed, Sheep-yard; or Cattle-pen to Remove Mud, Rubbish, Filth, &c.*—The occupier of any land in which there shall be any stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, sheep-yard, or cattle-pen shall cause all mud, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil collected, placed or found in or about such stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, sheep-yard, or cattle-pen, to be from time to time removed therefrom as often as the quantity of the same so collected, placed, or found shall amount to one (1) cubic yard, or once at least every week, and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect, or fail to have such mud, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same may be removed by the council.

WITH RESPECT TO THE POSITION AND CONSTRUCTION OF PRIVIES AND EARTH CLOSETS AND THE TIME AND MANNER OF CLEANSING, EMPTYING, AND MANAGING SAME, AND DISINFECTING OR DEODORIZING, AND DISPOSAL OF NIGHT-SOIL, ETC.

10. A suitable privy shall be attached to every house, shop, or building erected, or hereafter to be erected, within the town.

11. Every such privy shall have (a) an entrance door; (b) a trap-door for removing the pan; (c) a wooden covering for the seat; (d) proper openings or flues communicating directly with the external air to provide sufficient means of ventilation; (e) a fly-proof ventilated middenstead; (f) a proper and effectual screen from public view. No privy shall have any door or trap in connexion therewith which shall open or abut upon any street, lane, or right-of-way.

No privy shall be deemed a suitable privy unless it complies or is equipped with each of these requirements.

12. Every privy shall be kept in good order and condition.

13. *Privies attached to Schools and Public Privies.*—No person shall construct any privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed victualler's premises, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house, nor any public privy, unless the same is flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half an inch to the foot.

14. *Supply of Deodorizing Material to Earth Closets.*—Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every privy belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, or other material efficient for deodorizing, and shall cause all night-soil or urine which may be deposited in any pan in such privy to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material, sufficient to thoroughly and efficiently deodorize the contents of such pan, and shall not cause or permit any refuse matter, slops, or rubbish of any description or kind whatever, or broken bottles or glass, or anything other than night-soil or urine to be deposited in the pan or in any privy.

WITH RESPECT TO PREVENTION OF PLACING OR DEPOSITING DUST, MUD, OR FILTH, OFFAL, NIGHT-SOIL, ETC., IN CERTAIN PLACES.

15. *No Dust or Rubbish from House, &c., to be Deposited on or in Footpath, Street, or Street Channel.*—No person shall by any means place or deposit, or cause to be placed or deposited, on or in any footpath, street, or street channel any dust, mud, ashes, or rubbish collected, placed, or found in or about any house, yard, shop, or office.

16. *Disposal of Refuse or Offensive Matter.*—No person shall place or deposit any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil, or any night-soil or other offensive matter, in any place where the same would be a nuisance or injurious to health.

17. *Night-soil removed from any Earth Closet, &c., and Deposited anywhere, to be Covered with Earth.*—Every person placing, or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited, or assisting in placing or depositing, on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cess-pool, or place of deposit, shall cause the same to be covered with a layer of earth not less than twelve (12) inches in thickness.

18. *Earth-closets not to be Emptied into Drains or Sewers.*—No person shall empty, cause, or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying any earth-closet, privy, cess-pool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter into any drain or sewer, or so that the contents thereof may find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any drain or sewer.

19. *Prevention of Pollution of Water.*—No person shall place, assist in placing, or cause or permit to be placed in or so that the same may be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or likely to be used in any dairy, any matter or thing likely to endanger the health of any persons using such water for drinks or milk or other produce of such dairy.

20. *Cess-pools not to be Emptied into Water used for Drinking or Domestic Purposes.*—No person shall cause or permit to be emptied or assist in emptying any earth-closet, privy, cess-pool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter, into any water supplied, used, or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for

the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, so that the contents or any portion of the contents thereof may find its way or be likely to find its way into such water.

21. *Offensive Matter not to be Accumulated so as to Pollute Water.*—Every accumulation or deposit of offensive matter so situated as to find its way or to be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or likely to be used in any dairy, shall be deodorized and removed by the occupier of the property upon which such accumulation or deposit is situated within 24 hours of notice given by the council or by one of its officers.

WITH RESPECT TO KEEPING OF ANIMALS.

22. *Keeping of Animals.*—No person shall keep any animal of any kind so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

23. *Animals or Birds not to be Kept so as to Pollute Water.*—No person shall keep any animal or bird in such a manner as to pollute any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used, or likely to be used, in any dairy, so as to endanger the health of any person using such water for drinks or milk or other produce of such dairy.

WITH RESPECT TO FOUNDATIONS AND DRAINAGE OF NEW BUILDINGS.

24. *Foundations of New Buildings to be Rendered Dry.*—Every person erecting or causing to be erected any new building shall cause the foundations thereof, and the ground over which such building is to be placed, to be rendered dry, sound, and well drained, so that no water, soakage, or damp shall lodge there.

25. *Drainage of Buildings.*—Every owner or occupier of a building within the town shall cause the same to be provided with spouting, down-pipes, and drains sufficient to carry off all storm or rain water and all refuse water.

WITH RESPECT TO CARRYING, CONVEYING, OR EXPOSING FOR SALE VEGETABLES, ETC., IN WAGGONS, CARTS, ETC., NOT THOROUGHLY CLEANSED.

26. *Vegetables, Fruit, or Perishables not to be Carried, Conveyed, or Exposed for Sale in Carts, &c., in which Manure, &c., has been Carried.*—No person shall carry, convey, vend, or expose for sale any vegetables, fruit, or perishable products, in or on any waggon, cart, conveyance, or stand in or on which any manure, refuse, blood, offal, or other matter injurious to health is or has been carried, conveyed, or deposited, unless such waggon, cart, conveyance, or stand has been previously thoroughly and effectively scoured and cleansed.

WITH RESPECT TO DISCHARGE OF WATER FROM CELLARS, ETC.

27. *Discharge of Water from Cellars.*—No person shall pour, run, deliver, or discharge any offensive water or other contents of or from any cellar, underground tank, sink, trap, pit, or excavation upon, over, into, or along any footpath, road, channel, drain, or water-course within the town, save between the hours of Six and Eight o'clock in the morning, and Nine and Twelve o'clock in the evening of any week-day, and then only after the water or other contents shall have been thoroughly disinfected and deodorized to the approval of the Health Officer and Inspector.

WITH RESPECT TO FOWL-YARDS AND THEIR POSITION.

28. If, in the opinion of the council, the removal of a fowl-yard, any part of which is within 25 feet of a dwelling-house, be possible, and be necessary for the health of any of the residents in the vicinity, the council may order the owner or occupier of it, or of the premises of which such fowl-yard forms part, to remove or alter it so that no part thereof shall be within 25 feet of any dwelling-house.

29. No person shall within 25 feet of a dwelling-house establish or construct a fowl-yard, or cause one to be established or constructed, or within such distance permit any land or place to be used afresh or for the first time as a fowl-yard without the written permission of the council, and any such permission may, if deemed necessary, be revoked by the council.

WITH RESPECT TO PREMISES GENERALLY.

30. Every occupier or person having the management or control of any house or premises shall cause the same to be kept in such a state as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

REPEAL OF FORMER BY-LAWS, ETC.

31. All former by-laws on the matters and things herein provided for, or any of them, including By-law No. 1 of the Local Board of Health, confirmed on the 18th day

of December, 1885, and By-law No. 12 of the town, confirmed on the 8th day of August, 1890, are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of the coming into force of this By-law.

32. *Penalties.*—Every person who shall, by any act or default, be guilty of any breach of this By-law, shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such portion not being less than Five shillings, to be paid; and any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the council may be empowered by this By-law or otherwise, to remedy such breach, and whether such council has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

Resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council on the eighteenth day of May, 1914, and confirmed on the fifteenth day of June, 1914.

- (b) To the best of his power knowledge and ability teach and instruct or cause to be taught and instructed the said apprentice in the process trade or business of bread-making or baking and in all things incident or relating thereto.
- (c) Pay to the said apprentice (during such time as he shall observe and perform the terms of this indenture) wages at the rate following (that is to say):—

Provided that this shall be conditional on the said apprentice serving the said term and observing and fulfilling the covenants herein.
 - (g) If at any time during the said term he shall die or cease to carry on the business aforesaid in all its branches as now carried on by him either altogether or within a radius of three miles from his present place of business he or his executors administrators or assigns or one of them will within one month thereafter find and provide some other employer or employers carrying on the business aforesaid in all its branches within such radius if any there be or if there be none such if the apprentice so require provide some employer carrying on business beyond that radius and will assign and transfer at his own expense and cost the said apprentice to such employer or employers upon and subject to the same or the like conditions and stipulations as are hereinbefore provided.
 - (h) If from any cause whatever he is unable to find work for the said apprentice he will transfer such apprentice for a period not exceeding three months to some other employer or employers carrying on the same business within one mile of the original employer's place of business he being held responsible for the due performance of all obligations imposed by this indenture.
- And that the said _____ apprentice and _____ parent or guardian covenant with the said employer that he the said apprentice during the said term (unless the employer shall remove his business to some place beyond the radius of three miles from his present place of business in which case the apprentice may if he so elect claim to have his indenture assigned to some other employer within the radius if any there be or if there be none such to be released from this agreement) will—
- (a) Well faithfully and honestly serve the said employer as an apprentice in his trade or business aforesaid
 - (b) Willingly obey the lawful orders and commands of the said employer or of such of his representatives as he the said apprentice shall be placed under in the said business
 - (c) Not do or commit nor suffer to be done or committed any waste damage or other injury to the property or goods of the said employer or any firm or company of which he may be a member or lend them to any person without the consent of the said employer
 - (d) Not unlawfully absent himself from the service of the said employer during business hours.
 - (e) Not by word or action induce other apprentices to disobedience.

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

BY-LAW No. 436.—FOR THE SALE AND DISTRIBUTION OF WATER FOR IRRIGATION.—MERBEIN IRRIGATION AREA.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by Part II. of the *Murray Settlements Act 1907*, No. 2123, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. This By-law shall apply to and have force in Merbein Irrigation Area.

2. All previous By-laws and Regulations relating to the subject-matter herein shall be, and the same are hereby revoked; but not so as to relieve, discharge, or absolve any person from liability to pay any charges made in accordance with the provisions of the revoked By-laws or Regulations for payment of which charges such person may have become liable prior to or at the date of this By-law coming into operation; or to abrogate or diminish the power of the Commission to recover and enforce payment of any such charges; or to annul or stay any proceedings taken or business initiated, as in conformity with the provisions of the By-laws or Regulations hereby revoked, prior to the date of this By-law coming into operation, but the same respectively may be continued and carried to completion.

3. All water supplied for irrigation from the works of the Commission shall be paid for by measure; all gauges or appliances for measurement shall be of a form and pattern approved by the Commission, and shall be constructed by, and fixed under the supervision of, the Commission; and all quantities of water supplied shall be computed by the Water Bailiff or such other officer as may be appointed by the Commission for that purpose.

4. In the absence of any specific means of measurement, the quantity of water supplied shall be ascertained by accounting a watering as being a volume of water one-half foot in depth over any area watered, and for the purposes of this By-law or any By-law making an Irrigation Charge, a watering shall mean the application of

water to land for the purpose of irrigation, and a watering shall be and is hereby deemed to be a volume of water one-half foot in depth over any area watered.

5. The charge for the supply of water for irrigation of lands to which Water Rights have been apportioned during the period from the 1st day of August in every year (beginning with the year 1914) to the 30th day of April in each succeeding year shall be as set out in the By-law making the Irrigation Charge for such period, and if a supply is obtained in excess of any Water Rights apportioned to any lands during such period the charge for such excess shall be at the same rate of payment per unit of volume as that imposed in respect of the water apportioned to the lands as rights.

6. The charge for the supply of water for irrigation of lands other than those to which Water Rights have been apportioned during the period from the 1st day of August in every year (beginning with the year 1914) to the 30th day of April in each succeeding year, and the charge for the supply of water for irrigation of all lands during any period other than the period herein specified, shall be as agreed upon between the Commission and the persons requiring the water.

7. An acre foot of water shall be and is for the purposes of this By-law and any By-law making an Irrigation Charge deemed to be such quantity of water as would cover an area of one acre to a depth of one foot.

8. Applications for the supply of water for irrigation shall be made in writing to the Water Bailiff in charge of that portion of the Area in which the land to be irrigated is situated, or to such other officer as may be authorized by the Commission to receive applications.

9. Charges for water supplied for irrigation, other than water supplied under a Water Right, shall be payable at the office of the Commission at Merbein fourteen days after the date such water is supplied.

10. Such person or persons as the Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said charges.

11. All persons taking water from the works of the Commission shall take delivery thereof through their respective outlets at such times, in such order, and in such manner, as the Commission may direct.

12. The outlets for the delivery of water shall be operated only by the Water Bailiffs of the Area, or such other officers as may be authorized by the Commission.

1. This By-law shall apply to and have force in Nyah Irrigation Area.

2. All previous By-laws and Regulations relating to the subject-matter herein shall be, and the same are hereby revoked; but not so as to relieve, discharge, or absolve any person from liability to pay any charges made in accordance with the provisions of the revoked By-laws or Regulations for payment of which charges such person may have become liable prior to or at the date of this By-law coming into operation; or to abrogate or diminish the power of the Commission to recover and enforce payment of any such charges, or to annul or stay any proceedings taken or business initiated, as in conformity with the provisions of the By-laws or Regulations hereby revoked, prior to the date of this By-law coming into operation, but the same respectively may be continued and carried to completion.

3. All water supplied for irrigation from the works of the Commission shall be paid for by measure; all gauges or appliances for measurement shall be of a form and pattern approved by the Commission, and shall be constructed by, and fixed under the supervision of, the Commission; and all quantities of water supplied shall be computed by the Water Bailiff or such other officer as may be appointed by the Commission for that purpose.

4. In the absence of any specific means of measurement the quantity of water supplied shall be ascertained by accounting a watering as being a volume of water one-half foot in depth over any area watered, and for the purposes of this By-law or any By-law making an Irrigation Charge, a watering shall mean the application of water to and for the purpose of irrigation, and a watering shall be and is hereby deemed to be a volume of water one-half foot in depth over any area watered.

5. The charge for the supply of water for irrigation of lands to which Water Rights have been apportioned during the period from the 1st day of August in every year (beginning with the year 1914) to the 30th day of April in each succeeding year shall be as set out in the By-law making the Irrigation Charge for such period, and if a supply is obtained in excess of any Water Rights apportioned to any lands during such period the charge for such excess shall be at the same rate of payment per unit of volume as that imposed in respect of the water apportioned to the lands as rights.

6. The charge for the supply of water for irrigation of lands other than those to which Water Rights have been apportioned during the period from the 1st day of August in every year (beginning with the year 1914) to the 30th day of April in each succeeding year, and the charge for the supply of water for irrigation of all lands during any period other than the period herein specified, shall be as agreed upon between the Commission and the persons requiring the water.

7. An acre foot of water shall be and is for the purposes of this By-law and any By-law making an Irrigation Charge deemed to be such quantity of water as would cover an area of one acre to a depth of one foot.

8. Applications for the supply of water for irrigation shall be made in writing to the Water Bailiff in charge of that portion of the Area in which the land to be irrigated is situated, or to such other officer as may be authorized by the Commission to receive applications.

9. Charges for water supplied for irrigation, other than water supplied under a Water Right, shall be payable at the office of the Commission at Swan Hill fourteen days after the date such water is supplied.

10. Such person or persons as the Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said charges.

11. All persons taking water from the works of the Commission shall take delivery thereof through their respective outlets at such times, in such order, and in such manner as the Commission may direct.

12. The outlets for the delivery of water shall be operated only by the Water Bailiffs of the Area, or such other officers as may be authorized by the Commission.

The Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Acts.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE ISSUE OF INSCRIBED STOCK.

INTERPRETATION.

1. *Interpretation.*—In these Regulations, unless there be something in the subject-matter or context inconsistent therewith, the following terms shall have the meanings set against them respectively, that is to say:—

"The Trust"—The Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Trust.

"The Secretary"—The secretary, acting secretary, or assistant secretary for the time being of the Trust.

"The office"—The offices of the Trust, at Geelong.

"The chairman"—The chairman for the time being of the Trust.

"The bank"—The Commercial Bank of Australia Limited or other the bank for the time being of the Trust.

"The manager"—The manager for the time being at Geelong of the bank.

"Stock"—Inscribed stock created or issued by the Trust under the provisions of the Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Acts.

"Stock ledger"—The ledger or ledgers of the Trust in which the stock held is recorded or inscribed.

"Stock-holder"—The person or persons whose name or names is or are inscribed in the stock ledger of the Trust in respect of any stock.

Words importing the singular shall include the plural and *vice versa*.

Words importing the masculine shall include the feminine and *vice versa*.

"Schedule"—The schedule to these Regulations.

INSCRIPTION OF STOCK.

2. *Application for Stock.*—Persons who are desirous of purchasing stock shall transmit to the secretary an application in the Form 1 contained in the Schedule, duly filled in and signed, together with a banker's cheque for the price (as determined by tender or fixed by the Trust) of the amount of stock applied for, or for the balance of such price where portion thereof has already been paid by way of deposit with a tender, but where the tenderer has, in his tender, intimated his desire to take stock the Trust may, if it deems fit, inscribe and issue the stock from such tender without any further or other application, and the price shall be paid in manner provided by such tender.

3. *Interim Receipt Allotment and Inscription of Stock—Form 2—Form 3.*—On receipt of the said application the secretary shall transmit to the applicant an interim receipt in Form 2, contained in the Schedule, and thereupon the Trust shall proceed to allot the stock applied for in accordance with the application and the name of the allottee, together with the amount of stock allotted, and such other matters and particulars as the secretary may deem necessary, shall be inscribed in the stock ledger. After such inscription a certificate of inscription in Form 3, contained in the Schedule, shall be transmitted by the secretary to the allottee or his agent or attorney, duly authorized in writing to receive the same, for which an attested receipt shall be given by the allottee or his said agent or attorney. Stock shall not be inscribed, issued, or transferred except in sums of not less than Fifty pounds or a multiple thereof.

4. *Conversion of Debentures into Stock—Form 4.*—Where any person desires to convert debentures of the trust held by him into stock or *vice versa*, he shall transmit to the secretary an application in Form 4 contained in the Schedule, and shall lodge therewith the debentures or (as the case may be) the certificate of inscription of the stock held by him, and thereupon the Trust will issue and allot stock (or as the case may be) debentures in accordance with such application and the debentures or certificate of inscription lodged with such application shall be cancelled, and every such debenture shall thereupon be forwarded by the secretary to the Auditor-General, who shall destroy the same and certify to the Trust accordingly. For the purpose of conversion as aforesaid the value of the stock and debentures shall be taken as par and the conversion effected on that basis, and on every such conversion the appropriate entries shall be made in the stock ledger and duly attested under Regulation 9 hereof.

5. *Stock Certificate Lost or Destroyed may be Replaced.*—If any certificate of inscription is lost, mislaid, or destroyed, the secretary shall, on being satisfied by such evidence thereof, and on such indemnity being given as he may reasonably require, issue a duplicate certificate in place of the certificate so lost,

misaid, or destroyed, and such duplicate certificate shall be delivered only to the person whose name is inscribed in the register as the holder of the stock, or to the attorney or agent appointed in writing of such person. Such duplicate certificate shall be as valid to all intents and purposes as the original would have been if produced, and such original, if subsequently produced, shall be to all intents and purposes absolutely void.

6. *Stock not to be Inscribed in more than Four Names.*—Stock may be inscribed in the name or names of one or more persons, not exceeding four, or in the name of a corporation, but the secretary must first be furnished with a copy of the certificate of incorporation or special Act of Parliament under which such incorporation is established, together with a certified specimen of the seal of the incorporation, and a duly verified copy of any regulations governing the mode of affixing the seal.

7. *Inscription in the Name of a Minor.*—Stock shall not be inscribed in the name of a minor unless jointly with one or more persons of mature age, and when so inscribed it shall not be transferred until the maturity or decease of the minor.

8. *Change of Address.*—Any change of address of a stock-holder shall be at once notified in writing to the secretary.

9. *Inscription to be by Chairman and Manager.*—Every entry in the stock ledger shall be attested by the chairman and the manager, and such ledger shall be audited from time to time by the auditors of the Trust.

10. *Persons whose Names are Inscribed alone recognised as Owners.*—The secretary shall, for all purposes, be entitled to regard the person or persons whose name or names are inscribed in the stock register as the true and lawful owners and holders of the stock in relation to which such name or names is or are so inscribed, and all receipts, acquittances, discharges, releases, and documents whatsoever executed by such person or persons in relation to such stock, or the interest thereon, shall be deemed for all purposes and against all persons as documents duly executed by the person or persons entitled to such stock or interest, as the case may be.

11. *Trusts not Recognised.*—Save as herein or by statute otherwise provided no entry of any Trust shall be made in the stock ledger, and the Trust shall be entitled to treat the person or persons whose name or names are inscribed in the stock ledger in respect of any stock as the absolute owner or owners thereof, and accordingly shall not, except as ordered by a court of competent jurisdiction, or as by Statute required, be bound to recognise any equitable or other claim to or interest in such stock on the part of any other person.

12. *Receipts of Joint Holders.*—The receipt of any one stock-holder or of his attorney or agent in the case of stock inscribed in more than one name for any interest or for any document relating to such stock shall be a sufficient discharge to the Trust in respect thereof.

14. *Notice of Transfer or Transmission to be given.*—When any stock-holder shall desire to transfer the stock held by him or any part thereof, and when the party to whom any stock shall have been transmitted as hereinafter provided shall desire to deal with such stock he or his authorized agent shall give to the secretary seven clear days' written notice to that effect in such of the Forms numbers 6 or 7, as may be applicable, setting forth the amount of such stock and the names (in full), addresses, and occupations of the persons from whom and to whom the said stock is to be transferred and has become transmitted.

15. *Transfers to be lodged on a Transfer Day—Form 8.*—Every transfer of stock accompanied by the certificate of inscription thereof shall be lodged at the office on a

transfer day, and on receipt thereof a certificate of inscription in Form No. 8 contained in the Schedule for the amount of stock transferred will, on or after the next transfer day, be delivered to the transferee or to his duly authorized agent or attorney, or if the transferee so requires in writing, will be transmitted by post to the transferee or his nominee.

22. *Documents to be Lodged on Transmission.*—If such transmission shall have taken place by virtue of any testamentary instrument or by intestacy, the probate of the will or the letters of administration or an office copy thereof shall, together with such declaration, be produced to the secretary, and if such transmission shall have taken place by virtue of any bankruptcy or insolvency, the adjudication or order of sequestration or an office copy thereof respectively shall, together with such declaration, be produced to the secretary.

23. *Persons Entitled to be Registered on Transmission.*—The person becoming entitled on transmission in manner aforesaid may either himself be registered as the holder of the stock so transmitted or instead of being himself registered may make such transfer of the stock as the stock-holder from whom the same was transmitted could have made, and any such transfer shall be accompanied by such evidence in proof of the title of

No form of any such power of attorney shall be supplied by any person except on the written request of the registered holder of the stock to be affected thereby.

26. *Power of Attorney, &c.—When to be Lodged.*—All powers of attorney, probates, and letters of administration, certificates of adjudication, or orders of sequestration, or declarations, must be lodged at the office at least two clear days before the same can be acted upon.

WHEREAS the Governor in Council, by Order dated the 24th day of January, 1911, appointed the Hotel Employés Board to consider and determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons wheresoever employed in a restaurant, coffee palace, hotel, eating-house, fish shop, or oyster shop, or any premises for which a colonial wine licence or billiard table licence is in force, or which are occupied as a club: And whereas it is expedient to appoint a Special Board to exercise certain of the powers conferred upon the said Hotel Employés Board: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the powers conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, doth hereby—

(1) Deprive the Hotel Employés Board of the power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the business of—

- (a) killing, plucking, dressing poultry or game,
- (b) preparing fish for sale uncooked,
- (c) selling by retail uncooked poultry, uncooked game or uncooked fish,

and confer such power exclusively on the undermentioned Special Board which is hereby constituted and appointed, such Special Board to consist of ten members and a chairman, five of such members being appointed as representatives of employers and five as representatives of employes; and the area or locality within which the determination of such Special Board shall be operative shall be the metropolitan district as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, all cities and towns, and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Geelong West, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol; also that such Special Board may in any regulation, determination, order or instrument or legal proceedings be described for all purposes as the Fish and Poultry Board.

(2) Extend the powers of the Fish and Poultry Board so that it may fix the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons wheresoever employed in the business of—

- (a) killing, plucking, dressing poultry or game,
- (b) preparing fish for sale uncooked or for canning, drying or smoking,
- (c) selling by wholesale or retail uncooked poultry, uncooked game or uncooked fish,
- (d) marketing (in fish or poultry markets) poultry, game or fish,

such business being a business which, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, is of a similar class or character to the business for which the said Fish and Poultry Board was appointed.

MALLEE LANDS AVAILABLE FOR APPLICATION AS SELECTION PURCHASE ALLOTMENTS.

THE land is situated west of Mildura railway line and north of Hopetoun Railway Station. It is from 2½ to 10 miles west of Gama Railway Station, 2½ to 14 miles south-west of Turriff Railway Station, 8½ to 16 miles west of Minapre Railway Station, and 9 to 17 miles north of Hopetoun Railway Station.
