Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE COUNTRY FLOUR BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons (other than persons subject to the Determination of the Flour Board) employed in the process, trade, or business of a flour-miller has made the following Determination, namely:—

1. That the previous Determinations of this Board are hereby amended, and such amendments shall come into force and be operative on and after the 31st August, 1914.

2. That the lowest rate of wages to be paid to the following persons shall be:—

APPRENTICES AND IMPROVERS.
