- (a) Take and receive the said apprentice as his apprentice for the full term of _____ years from the _____ day of _____ 1914
- (b) To the best of his power knowledge and ability teach and instruct or cause to be taught and instructed the said apprentice in the business of a grocer and in all things incident or relating thereto.
- (c) Pay to the said apprentice (during such time as he shall observe and perform the terms of this indenture) wages at the rate following (that is to say):—

- (d) Pay to the said apprentice such further rates for overtime worked as may be fixed by the Determination of the Grocers Board.
- (e) Provide all materials necessary to enable the said apprentice during the term of his indenture to perform his work.
- (f) On completion of the term herein named hand over to the said apprentice this copy of agreement with a certificate thereon to the effect that the said term has been served Provided that this shall be conditional on the said apprentice serving the said term and observing and fulfilling the covenants herein.
- (g) If at any time during the said term he shall die or cease to carry on the business aforesaid in all its branches as now carried on by him either altogether or within a radius of three miles from his present place of business he or his executors administrators or assigns or one of them will within one month thereafter find and provide some other employer or employers carrying on the business aforesaid in all its branches within such radius if any there be or if there be none such if the apprentice so require provide some employer carrying on business beyond that radius and will assign and transfer at his own expense and cost the said apprentice to such employer or employers upon and subject to the same or the like conditions and stipulations as are hereinbefore provided.

- (h) If from any cause whatever he is unable to find work for the said apprentice he will transfer such apprentice for a period not exceeding three months to some other employer or employers carrying on the same business within one mile of the original employer's place of business he being held responsible for the due performance of all obligations imposed by this indenture.

And that the said apprentice and parent or guardian covenant with the said employer that he the said apprentice during the said term (unless the employer shall remove his business to some place beyond the radius of three miles from his present place of business in which case the apprentice may if he so elect claim to have his indenture assigned to some other employer within the radius if any there be or if there be none such to be released from this agreement) will—

- (a) Well faithfully and honestly serve the said employer as an apprentice in his business aforesaid
- (b) Willingly obey the lawful orders and commands of the said employer or of such of his representatives as he the said apprentice shall be placed under in the said business

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Footscray hereby make the following Regulation:—

1. Regulation No. 29 of the said city, and clause No. 1 of Regulation No. 20 hereinbefore referred to shall be and are hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following clause is hereby enacted, namely:—

This Regulation shall have force and effect throughout the whole of the municipal district of Footscray.

2. Clause No. 32 of Regulation No. 20 hereinbefore referred to shall be and is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following clause is hereby enacted, namely:—

Buildings of the first or dwelling house class and shops of not more than one story may be built of wood if at a distance of 12 feet from the building line of any road or street not less than 60 feet in width, or at a distance of 8 feet from the building line of any road or street less than 60 feet in width, or from any right-of-way, or if already built either of wood or any other material may be added to in wood subject to the following limitations and provisions:—

- All external walls hereafter to be built, and which are not at least 3 feet distant from land not in the same occupation, must be of brick or stone at least 8½ inches in thickness, built on a proper foundation, and projecting at least 1 inch beyond the face of the woodwork.
- In case the external walls of such building which are nearest to any land not in the same occupation shall exceed 12 feet in height, then the distance from such land within which it shall not be lawful to erect the external walls of wood shall be increased by a distance equal to such excess.
- That if more than one house be erected in one block, a party wall must be built in manner as required by these Regulations between each of such houses, and be carried quite through, and project at least 1 inch beyond the face of the wood work, provided that not more than two houses shall be erected on one block.
- No floor of any dwelling house shall be lower than the level of the footpath unless a written permit or licence has first been obtained from the Council.
- Where any allotment is less than 33 feet in frontage and less than 80 feet in depth, wooden buildings may be built if at a distance of 8 feet from the front building line, and at least 3 feet from one side alignment. (The verandah is not to be more than 5 feet wide, i.e., not to be nearer street than 3 feet.)
- Where a corner block is built on, the building to be either 12 feet or 8 feet (as hereinbefore referred to) from front building line, and not less than 1 foot from side street or right-of-way.
- Wooden buildings transported or removed either in whole or in part into the municipality, or from one part of the municipality to another part thereof, shall, when completed, comply with all the provisions of this by-law in regard to the erection of new buildings, and such buildings, either wholly or in sections, shall not be brought into the municipality until the same shall have been inspected and approved by the Surveyor, and the fees for such inspection shall have been paid.

8. TIMBERS, ETC., USED IN CONSTRUCTION.—

The blocks and sole plates shall be of red gum or jarrah wood, and the minimum scantlings and the maximum spacings shall be as follows:—

Blocks 4 in. x 4 in., 6 in. out of ground at highest point of ground, 16 in. in ground, and 4 feet centres. Sole plates, 9 in. x 6 in. x 1½ in. Bearers, 4 in. x 3 in., 6 ft. 6 in. centres. Joists, 4 in. x 2 in., 1 ft. 6 in. centres. Plates, 4 in. x 2 in., top and bottom. Vermin plate, 4 in. x 2 in. Door, window, and angle studs, 4 in. x 2 in., others not less than 11 ft. long mortised and tenoned, 4 in. x 1½ in., into plates,

1 ft. 6 in. centres. Ceiling joints, 4 in. x 1 1/4 in. Oregon for full width of building hung to 9 in. x 1 1/4 in. Oregon hangers 5 ft. centres. Two tie beams. Rafters up to 12 ft. long, 4 in. x 1 1/2 in., 3 ft. centres, over 12 ft. long, 4 in. x 2 in. Rafters for slates or tiles, 1 ft. 6 in. centres. All rafters over 15 ft. long, to have 4 in. x 3 in. purlins, with 4 in. x 2 in. struts from wall plates. Collar ties, 4 in. x 1 1/2 in. to every second rafter. Battens, 3 in. x 1 1/2 in., 2 ft. 9 in. centres. Ridge, 8 in. x 1 in. Door jambs, 6 in. x 1 1/2 in. Flooring, not less than 3/4 in. T. & G. Iron roof to have 2 corrugations, side lap and 6 in. end lap, and not less than 20 gauge. In the construction of all wooden buildings except sheds, vermin plates shall be used.

9. In every dwelling house hereafter built or rebuilt there shall be at least three rooms thereof which shall each contain not less than 140 square feet of floor space.

3. In clause No. 51, sub-clauses 1 and 2 of Regulation No. 20 hereinbefore referred to, the word "one" wherever it occurs shall be and is hereby repealed and in lieu thereof the word "two" shall be and is hereby substituted.

4. In clause No. 59 of Regulation No. 20, hereinbefore referred to, the words commencing with the word "provided" and ending with the word "building," both inclusive, shall be and are hereby repealed.

5. In clause No. 74 of Regulation No. 20 hereinbefore referred to the words "or reinforced concrete" shall be and are hereby inserted after the word "stone-work" in line three thereof; and the words "four feet and 6 in." shall be and are hereby substituted for the figure and word "3 feet" in line four thereof.

6. In clause No. 87 of Regulation No. 20 hereinbefore referred to the figure "8" shall be and is hereby substituted for the figure "7" in line five thereof, and the words "four feet" shall be and are hereby substituted for the figures and words "3 feet 6 in." in line seven thereof.

7. In clause No. 88 of Regulation No. 20, hereinbefore referred to the word "eleven" shall be and is hereby substituted for the figure "8" in line four thereof; and the following words shall be and are hereby added after the word "ceiling," namely, every room over which there is to be a skillion roof must be of at the least 10 feet and 6 inches from the floor to the ceiling at its maximum height, and 9 feet at its minimum height.

8. In clause No. 89 of Regulation No. 20 hereinbefore referred to, the words "two and a half" shall be and are hereby substituted for the word "two" in line four thereof; and the following words shall be and are hereby added after the word "way," namely, in new subdivisions the back yard or open space previously referred to shall be at least 4 squares.

9. In clause No. 91 of Regulation No. 20 hereinbefore referred to the words "or the dividing line of the adjoining properties" shall be and are hereby added after the words "rights-of-way" in line three thereof.
