By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of the said State, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to amend Section Eleven and Section Thirteen of the Wire Netting Act 1909."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria, at Melbourne, this third day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and fourteen, and in the fifth year of the reign of His Majesty King George V.

A By-law of the Town of Kew, made under the Health Act 1890, and numbered 51, for regulating the times and manner of cleansing, emptying, and managing of earth closets within the town.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1890, the Council of the Municipality of the Town of Kew, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Kew, do hereby order and direct as follows, that is to say:—

1. By-law No: 30, made and passed by the Council of the Municipality of Kew under the Health Act 1890, shall be and is hereby repealed.

2. This—By-law—shall—apply—to—and—have operation throughout the whole of the Town of Kew.

3. Every closet in every unsewered tenement shall be familished—with a double pan Service.——,

4. The pans for such service shall be supplied by the

4. The pans for such service shall be supplied by the Council, and every occupier of every unsewered tenement and every builder or contractor engaged in the erection of any building, shall permit such pans to be placed in every such closet where directed by the Inspector of Nuisances for the Town of Kew.

5. At least once a week, or as much more frequently as the Council may from time to time direct, the pan in use in every closet shall be closed with a tight fitting lid and removed in a suitable cart, and a pan cleansed by superheated steam or some equally efficient means approved by the Council left in its place.

6. The Council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate for the removal of night-soil, to make a charge on each such occupier, builder, or contractor for such double-pan service as specified in this By-law and for pans supplied, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

7. The occupier of every such tenement within the Town of Kew shall daily place in each pan in use at such tenement a quantity of a suitable disinfectant and deodorant sufficient to efficiently deorodize and disinfect such pan and the contents thereof......

8. No person, unless authorized in writing in that behalf by the Council of the Town of Kew, shall remove any night-soil pan or the contents thereof, and no person shall remove any such pan or the contents thereof except between the hours which may from time to time be fixed by the Council.

9. Every person committing a breach of any one of the provisions contained in this By-law No. 51, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or if such breach be a continuing act or default, shall pay a penalty or sum not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

And for the true performance of all and every of the said covenants and agreements each of the said parties bindeth himself to the other by these presents.



AMENDMENT OF THE REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF MASTERS AND MATES.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the Marine Act 1890, the Marine Board of Victoria, with the consent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say :-

- 1. These Regulations shall form portion of "The Regulations for the Examination of Masters and Mates" made by the Board on the 28th day of August, 1903, and published in the Government Gazette on the 16th day of September, 1903, and shall be read in connexion therewith, and shall take effect on and from the date of publication hereof in the Government Gazette, on which date paragraphs 11 and 123 of the aforesaid Regulations shall be repealed.
- 2. For paragraph 11 of the aforesaid Regulations there shall be substituted the following, namely:-
 - 11. Every candidate for a certificate of competency must pass the prescribed sight tests before a certificate can be issued to him. If circumstances render it necessary for him to proceed with the examination in navigation and seamanship before undergoing the sight tests, he should be informed that the examination in navigation and seamanship will be cancelled in the event of his failure to pass either of the sight tests.
 - (1) Form Vision Test.—Every candidate for a certificate must pass the form vision test. A candidate who obtained a certificate before the lst January, 1914, will be allowed to obtain his higher certificates on showing that he possesses half-normal vision using both eyes together.

Any candidate may, and every candidate presenting himself for examination for his first certificate on or after the date on which these Regulations take effect, must pass a higher standard, viz., normal vision, using both eyes or either eye separately.

Any candidate who has obtained his first certificate under these conditions may obtain his higher certificates, provided that he has normal vision using both eyes or either eye separately.

(2) Colour Vision Tests.—These tests comprise a wool test and a lantern test.

Every candidate must undergo the colour vision tests on the first occasion on which he presents himself for examination for a certificate of competency; but if he then passes he will not be required by the Board to undergo the colour vision tests on any subsequent occasion: No person who holds a certificate of competency should be allowed to be examined in colour vision. vision.

should be allowed to be examined in colour vision.

(3) A candidate who fails to pass the prescribed form vision test may present himself for re-examination at intervals of three months, but a candidate who fails to pass the colour vision test cannot be re-examined; it is open, however, to any candidate who has failed to pass the colour vision test to appeal to the Board, who may, if they think fit, remit the case to a special examiner, or body of examiners, for final decision.

(4) The expenses of candidates who are examined by such special examiner or body of examiners, and are reported by him or them to have passed, will, under certain circumstances, be paid by the Board, at a rate which will be notified to the candidate, but no payment whatever will be made towards the expenses of candidates who, upon their own application, are examined by the special examiner or examiners, and are reported by him or them to have failed, unless the Board consider that the particular circumstances of the case justify such payment. The special examinations will be held in Melbourne only.

(5) When a candidate fails to pass the colour.

(5) When a candidate fails to pass the colour vision test, the examiner will point out to him the conditions under which, he can appeal. Appeals are to be made through the examiner, and forwarded to the Board with the examiner's remarks.

(6) Only examiners who have themselves passed the colour vision test are to undertake these examinations.

(7) The fee paid for examination for a certificate of competency includes the fee of One shilling for examination in form vision and colour vision, and if the candidate fails to pass those tests this fee will, with the exception of One shilling, be returned to him.

(8) No additional fee will be charged to any candidate for examination on appeal against failure. If, however, a candidate who has been reported by the special examiner or body of examiners as having failed, is still dissatisfied, he may, if he so desires, present himself for a second special examination on payment of a fee of five guineas, provided that he brings with him a friend to witness the examination; this second examination will, however, be entirely voluntary, and will form no part of the Board's examination for a certificate of competency. The Board will, however, give consideration to the result of such examination in determining whether a certificate shall be granted.

(9) Any person serving or intending to serve in the Mercantile Marine, if desirous of undergoing the form vision and colour vision tests only, must make application to the Secretary to the Marine Board on form to be obtained therefrom, and must pay a fee of One shilling. This fee will be payable on each occasion upon which a candidate is examined in form vision and colour tests only.

3. For paragraph 123 of the aforesaid Regulations there shall be substituted the following, namely:—

123. When service in charge of a watch in either the foreign or home trade is specified in the Regulations, candidates for certificates of competency as First Mate must be able to prove that during eight months of such full service, service performed in cases where watches were accounted that the sa

Bars, Spikes, Grips, or other, Projections on Wheels.

1. No person shall use or cause or procure any other person to use on any public highway any traction engine or other vehicle having on its wheels any bars, spikes, grips, or other projections.


This prohibition, however, shall not apply to:—

(a) Any traction engine used only for hauling agricultural machinery or hauling a vehicle containing such machinery only, if the projections on the driving wheels of such machine consist only of bars at least two and three-quarter inches in width and not more than one and one-sixteenth of an inch-in thickness, and the space intervening between such bars does not exceed five inches; or

(b) Any-traction engine, the driving wheels of which are cylindrical and smooth soled, and having no projections thereon other than diagonal bars of not less than three inches in width nor more than three-quarters of an inch in thickness, and extending the full width of the tire, and the space intervening between such crossbars not exceeding three inches, provided in 'such last-mentioned case:—

I. That the owner of such engine has previously obtained from the Council, or an officer of, the Council duly authorized in that behalf, a permit, in writing, specifying such public high ways on which, it may be used, and that the engine is being used on one of the highways so specified.

II. That the owner has agreed, in writing, to pay to the Council the cost of making good any damage done to any roadway, bridge, or culvert by such engine or any vehicle drawn by it.

Weight of Engine to be Painted thereon.

2. Every owner of a traction engine shall cause to be painted in legible letters not less than one inch long on a plate attached to the engine, or on a conspicuous place on the engine, the exact and true weight thereof, and the maximum weight of water and fuel necessary for its propulsion for its propulsion.

Persons to be in Attendance whilst Engine Contains
Sufficient Motive Power to Move it.
3. So long as the fires of a traction engine are alight,
or the traction engine contains in itself sufficient motive
power to use it, one person shall remain in attendance
while it is on any public highway, although it is stationary.

Taking Engines Across or Along Bridges, Embankments, &c.

4. No person shall take any traction engine across or along any bridge or culvert or embankment so as to meet or pass thereon any other traction engine or any person with a horse or vehicle drawn by a horse.

Engines not to Halt on Certain Parts of Highway.

5. No person shall halt (unless through unforeseen b. No person shall halt (unless through unforeseen circumstances, or unless actually engaged in loading or unloading) in any part of a road where the traffic is narrowed by fences, excavations, dangerous depressions, or such like, but shall draw off at least twenty feet from the middle of the formation in the case of a made road, or the middle of the surveyed road if unmade.

Engines not to Halt on Bridges or Culverts.

6. No person shall permit any traction engine or any vehicle attached to or drawn thereby to stop on any bridge or culvert for the purpose of drawing water, or for any other purpose whatever.

Driving Engines between Sunset and Sunrise.

7. No person shall drive any traction engine between sunset and sunrise, unless by written permission of the Council or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf, defining the route to be travelled and the extended hours during which such travelling is permissible, such permission to be withdrawable at any time upon written notice to that effect being served on the owner or driver of the engine, or being forwarded to him by registered letter. No person who has received such written permission shall drive any traction engine between sunset and sunrise, unless there shall be exhibited on such engine proper and sufficient carriage or other approved lights, one at each side of the front and on the rear, or when a vehicle or vehicles are being drawn by such engine, then in the rear of the last vehicle.

8. No person shall use or cause or procure to be used on any public highway any traction engine unless there is carried on such engine, or some vehicle drawn by the same, at least four wooden planks at least twelve inches in width, four inches in thickness, and at least twelve feet in length, and when crossing any bridge or culvert the driver or the person in charge of any engine shall lay down such planks, and no engine shall be permitted to cross any bridge or culvert except on such planks.

Stidding of Engine Wheels

Skidding of Engine Wheels.

9. The driver of a traction engine shall shut off steam immediately the driving wheels of the engine commence to skid, and he shall not start the engine again until he has taken all the necessary and proper means to prevent damage being done to highway by the skidding of the wheels.

10. Any person shall, for any wilful act or default contrary to this By-law, be liable to the following penalty:—

(a) For a first offence, a fine not exceeding Three pounds.

(b) For a second offence, a fine not exceeding Five

pounds. (c) For any subsequent offence, a fine not exceeding Ten pounds. Extent of Operation of By-law.

BY-LAW NO. 42.

A By-law of the Shire of Warrnambool, made under sections 197 and 498 of the Local Government Act 1903, and numbered 42, for regulating the conditions under which "cattle" may be driven on to roads or reserves within the municipality for the purpose of grazing thereon with the Council's consent.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1903, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Warrnambool order as

1. That any ratepayer may apply to the Council of the municipality for their consent to graze cattle and horses upon any roads or reserves vested in or under the control or management of the municipality.

2. That such application shall be in writing signed by the applicant, and shall state the number, description, and brands of the cattle and horses in respect of which the consent is required, and the road or reserve on which it is desired to graze the same.

3. The charges or fees, subject to increase or decrease by an ordinary resolution of the said Council from time to time for grazing, shall be:

(a) For each horse above the age of six months, Seven shillings per quarter.

(b) For each head of cattle above the age of six months, Three shillings and threepence per quarter.

4. Such charges or fees shall be payable quarterly,

quarter.

4. Such charges or fees shall be payable quarterly, in advance, to the secretary of the Council of the said Shire, and the quarters shall begin on the first days of the months of January, April, July, and October in

of the months of saluesty, april, out, out the each year.

5. The said Council shall have a discretion as to the number of cattle and horses which each applicant shall be entitled to graze upon such roads or reserves from time to time, and the Council may regulate the increase or diminish the number to be grazed in any quarter.

quarter.

6. No person shall be permitted to graze any sheep, entire horse, or bull on any road or reserve within the municipality, and any such sheep, entire horse, or bull found upon any such road or reserve will be impounded, and the owner thereof will be prosecuted.



- 7. The said Council shall not be responsible or liable for any loss or theft, or death, or for any injury or damage to, or straying, of any cattle or horses grazing under the aforesaid consent, nor for the supply of a sufficiency of grass or water.
- 8. Calves and foals under six months of age, the progeny of the registered cows or mares, may run with their mothers free of charge up to that limit of age.
- 9. Nothing in this By-law shall prevent the operation of section 17 of the Police Offences Act 1912, nor shall the said Council be responsible or accountable in any way to the owner of any cattle or horses for any penalty incurred by such owner under such section, or for the impounding of any animal by the owner or occupier of property abutting upon any road, or by any other person, nor for any damages, costs, or expenses whatsoever, to be incurred or recovered by any person by reason of such cattle being upon such road or reserve.
- 10. The said Council may issue a tag, or badge, for all cattle and horses mentioned in the said consent, and the owner of such cattle and horses shall keep the same affixed thereto, but such tag or badge shall at all times remain the absolute property of the Council.
- remain the absolute property of the Council.

 11. The Council shall have power to withdraw their consent on the owner of such cattle and horses failing to pay the fees and charges or to comply with this By-law, or if any of the cattle and horses mentioned in such consent shall be found to be suffering from any form of complaint or disease, or if grass or water on such road or reserve becomes scarce on insufficient, or for any other reason which may appear sufficient to the said Council in their absolute discretion, and thereupon the secretary of the said Council shal forthwith post a notice of such withdrawal to the owner of such cattle and horses, to the address contained in such owner's application, and such owner shall remove such cattle and horses from the said road or reserve within seven days after the posting of such notice, and on his failing to do so the said cattle and horses may be impounded and the owner prosecuted.
- 12. All cattle and horses in respect of which any consent is granted shall be removed from the said roads or reserves before sunset, and shall be kept removed therefrom until sunrise on the following day, and should any such cattle or horses be found on the said roads or reserves after sunset or before sunrise on the following day the owner thereof shall be liable to prosecution.
- 13. "Cattle" in this By-law shall not include bulls, entire horses, or sheep.
- 14. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district, save and except the following roads, that is to say:—
 - (a) The main road from Warrnambool to Geelong extending from the south-west angle of allotment 67, parish of Tallangatta, to Warrnambool town boundary.
 - (b) The main Barren Plains-road, extending from the south-west corner of allotment 3, parish of Tallangatta, eastward to the south-east corner of said allotment.
 - (c) The main road from Warrnambool to Port Fairy extending from the Warrnambool town boun-dary to the western boundary of the Shire of Warrnambool.
 - (d) The road known as Cassady's lane, extending from the south-east corner of allotment 67, parish of Wangoom, to the north-east corner of allotment 19, parish of Yangery.
 - (e) The main road from Warrnambool to Wools he main road from warrnamood to wous-thorpe, extending from the south-east corner of allotment 147, parish of Wangoom, northerly and westerly through Bushfield, Woodford, Mailor's Flat, and Winslow to the south-western angle of allotment 10 of section A, parish of Meerai.
 - (f) The main road from Bushfield to Purnim, extending from the southern angle of section 3, parish of Purnim, being the junction of the Purnim and Bushfield roads, north-easterly to the south-west corner of Bryan O'Lyan preemptive section.
 - (g) The road to Grasmere and Cooramook, extending from the south-west corner of allotment 11, parish of Purnim, to the south-east corner of allotment 19n, parish of Cooramook.
