## ACT OF PARLIAMENT.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of the said State, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to amend Section Eleven and Section Thirteen of the *Wire Netting Act 1909*."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria, at Melbourne, this third day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and fourteen, and in the fifth year of the reign of His Majesty King George V.

ORDER APPROVING OF A DEVIATION FROM A MAIN ROAD IN THE SHIRE OF PHILLIP ISLAND AND WOOLAMAI.

TOWN OF KEW.

BY-LAW No. 51.

A By-law of the Town of Kew, made under the *Health Act 1890*, and numbered 51, for regulating the times and manner of cleansing, emptying, and managing of earth closets within the town.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, the Council of the Municipality of the Town of Kew, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Kew, do hereby order and direct as follows, that is to say:—

1. By-law No. 30, made and passed by the Council of the Municipality of Kew under the *Health Act 1890*, shall be and is hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Town of Kew.

3. Every closet in every unsewered tenement shall be furnished with a double pan service.

4. The pans for such service shall be supplied by the Council, and every occupier of every unsewered tenement and every builder or contractor engaged in the erection of any building, shall permit such pans to be placed in every such closet where directed by the Inspector of Nuisances for the Town of Kew.

5. At least once a week, or as much more frequently as the Council may from time to time direct, the pan in use in every closet shall be closed with a tight fitting lid and removed in a suitable cart, and a pan cleansed by superheated steam or some equally efficient means approved by the Council left in its place.

6. The Council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate for the removal of night-soil, to make a charge on each such occupier, builder, or contractor for such double-pan service as specified in this By-law and for pans supplied, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

7. The occupier of every such tenement within the Town of Kew shall daily place in each pan in use at such tenement a quantity of a suitable disinfectant and deodorant sufficient to efficiently deodorize and disinfect such pan and the contents thereof.

8. No person, unless authorized in writing in that behalf by the Council of the Town of Kew, shall remove any night-soil pan or the contents thereof, and no person shall remove any such pan or the contents thereof except between the hours which may from time to time be fixed by the Council.

9. Every person committing a breach of any one of the provisions contained in this By-law No. 51, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or if such breach be a continuing act or default, shall pay a penalty or sum not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

Provided however that the said employer may cancel this deed of apprenticeship on or before the \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_ 191\_\_\_\_ by giving the § \_\_\_\_\_ and the apprentice notice in writing of his intention so to do. Provided also that the § \_\_\_\_\_ may cancel this deed of apprenticeship on or before the date lastly mentioned by giving the employer notice in writing of his intention so to do.

(b) That he will pay to the apprentice weekly during the said term wages as follows:—

3. The \_\_\_\_\_ covenants with the employer—
  - (a) That the apprentice shall truly and faithfully during the term serve the employer as his apprentice as aforesaid and shall diligently attend to the business and at all times willingly obey the lawful commands of the employer and shall not absent himself from the employer's service without leave of the employer or in accordance with law.
  - (b) That in case the apprentice be at any time during the term wilfully disobedient to the commands of the employer or be habitually slothful or negligent or otherwise grossly misbehave himself towards the employer the employer may discharge the apprentice from his service.
  - (c) That the employer may deduct from time to time of the wages to be paid to the apprentice such sums as may be reasonable for any loss of time occasioned by the absence of the apprentice from his employment for any cause other than the acts defaults or commands of the employer or as the result of statutory enactment.

These presents shall be handed over to the said apprentice on the completion of the term of service herein with a certificate of the apprentice's due service indorsed thereon.

And for the true performance of all and every of the said covenants and agreements each of the said parties bindeth himself to the other by these presents.

A copy of this indenture shall be supplied to the said apprentice at the time of signing same.

**AMENDMENT OF THE REGULATIONS FOR THE**  
**EXAMINATION OF MASTERS AND MATES.**

**IN** pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the *Marine Act 1890*, the Marine Board of Victoria, with the consent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

1. These Regulations shall form portion of "The Regulations for the Examination of Masters and Mates" made by the Board on the 28th day of August, 1903, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 16th day of September, 1903, and shall be read in connexion therewith, and shall take effect on and from the date of publication hereof in the *Government Gazette*, on which date paragraphs 11 and 123 of the aforesaid Regulations shall be repealed.

2. For paragraph 11 of the aforesaid Regulations there shall be substituted the following, namely:—

11. Every candidate for a certificate of competency must pass the prescribed sight tests before a certificate can be issued to him. If circumstances render it necessary for him to proceed with the examination in navigation and seamanship before undergoing the sight tests, he should be informed that the examination in navigation and seamanship will be cancelled in the event of his failure to pass either of the sight tests.

(1) *Form Vision Test.*—Every candidate for a certificate must pass the form vision test. A candidate who obtained a certificate before the 1st January, 1914, will be allowed to obtain his higher certificates on showing that he possesses half-normal vision using both eyes together.

Any candidate may, and every candidate presenting himself for examination for his first certificate on or after the date on which these Regulations take effect, must pass a higher standard, viz., normal vision, using both eyes or either eye separately.

Any candidate who has obtained his first certificate under these conditions may obtain his higher certificates, provided that he has normal vision using both eyes or either eye separately.

(2) *Colour Vision Tests.*—These tests comprise a wool test and a lantern test.



Every candidate must undergo the colour vision tests on the first occasion on which he presents himself for examination for a certificate of competency; but if he then passes he will not be required by the Board to undergo the colour vision tests on any subsequent occasion: No person who holds a certificate of competency should be allowed to be examined in colour vision.

(3) A candidate who fails to pass the prescribed form vision test may present himself for re-examination at intervals of three months, but a candidate who fails to pass the colour vision test cannot be re-examined; it is open, however, to any candidate who has failed to pass the colour vision test to appeal to the Board, who may, if they think fit, remit the case to a special examiner, or body of examiners, for final decision.

(4) The expenses of candidates who are examined by such special examiner or body of examiners, and are reported by him or them to have passed, will, under certain circumstances, be paid by the Board, at a rate which will be notified to the candidate, but no payment whatever will be made towards the expenses of candidates who, upon their own application, are examined by the special examiner or examiners, and are reported by him or them to have failed, unless the Board consider that the particular circumstances of the case justify such payment. The special examinations will be held in Melbourne only.

(5) When a candidate fails to pass the colour vision test, the examiner will point out to him the conditions under which he can appeal. Appeals are to be made through the examiner, and forwarded to the Board with the examiner's remarks.

(6) Only examiners who have themselves passed the colour vision test are to undertake these examinations.

(7) The fee paid for examination for a certificate of competency includes the fee of One shilling for examination in form vision and colour vision, and if the candidate fails to pass those tests this fee will, with the exception of One shilling, be returned to him.

(8) No additional fee will be charged to any candidate for examination on appeal against failure. If, however, a candidate who has been reported by the special examiner or body of examiners as having failed, is still dissatisfied, he may, if he so desires, present himself for a second special examination on payment of a fee of five guineas, provided that he brings with him a friend to witness the examination; this second examination will, however, be entirely voluntary, and will form no part of the Board's examination for a certificate of competency. The Board will, however, give consideration to the result of such examination in determining whether a certificate shall be granted.

(9) Any person serving or intending to serve in the Mercantile Marine, if desirous of undergoing the form vision and colour vision tests *only*, must make application to the Secretary to the Marine Board on form to be obtained therefrom, and must pay a fee of One shilling. This fee will be payable on each occasion upon which a candidate is examined in form vision and colour tests *only*.

3. For paragraph 123 of the aforesaid Regulations there shall be substituted the following, namely:—

123. When service in charge of a watch in either the foreign or home trade is specified in the Regulations, candidates for certificates of competency as First Mate must be able to prove that during eight months at least of their service they have kept regular watch *during the whole voyage, i.e., from port to port*, which, if in the foreign trade, must amount to not less than eight hours of each twenty-four hours' service. Where a candidate can prove eight months of such full service, service performed in cases where watches were doubled at any time during the voyage will be accepted as equivalent to half the same period of full watch-keeping service. No amount of occasional service will, by itself, be accepted as qualifying service. Candidates for certificates of competency as Master will be required to have served during the whole of the time specified by the Regulations, in full charge of a watch, and no service performed under the system of double watches, except as the senior officer, will be accepted as qualifying service for a certificate of this grade; unless the candidate produces a clear and satisfactory testimonial, specially setting forth the above facts, from the master or owner of the vessel in which the service was performed, it will not be accepted.

The foregoing amended Regulations were made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria, held this twenty-fourth day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and fourteen.

That the Rochester Irrigation and Water Supply District be extended by adding to the same the lands set out and described in the Schedule hereto, and as on and from the 1st day of July, 1914, such district shall be deemed to be so extended.

BY-LAW No. 9.

A By-law of the Borough of Sebastopol, made under Part VII. of the *Local Government Act 1903* for the purpose of adopting Part VII. of the *Local Government Act 1903*.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Sebastopol order as follows, that is to say:—

No person shall drive, ride, or impel a bicycle or machine upon or along any footpath, provided however that the bicycle or machine may be taken across any footpath direct to or from any premises abutting thereon.

Every person who drives, rides, or impels a bicycle or other machine along any street, public road, or highway in the Borough of Sebastopol during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall carry a lighted lamp attached to such bicycle or machine, which lamp shall be so constructed and placed as to exhibit a light in the direction in which such person is proceeding, and such lamp shall be so lighted and kept lighted as to afford adequate means of signalling the approach and position of such bicycle or machine.

BY-LAW No. 13.

REGULATION OF TRACTION ENGINE TRAFFIC.

A By-law of the Shire of Kowree, made under subsection 29 of section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, for prohibiting or regulating the use on any public highway of traction engines or other vehicles having projections on their wheels, and under section 594 of the said Act for regulating the conditions on which traction engines may proceed over any public highway.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Kowree order as follows:—

*Bars, Spikes, Grips, or other Projections on Wheels.*  
1. No person shall use or cause or procure any other person to use on any public highway any traction engine or other vehicle having on its wheels any bars, spikes, grips, or other projections.

This prohibition, however, shall not apply to:—

(a) Any traction engine used only for hauling agricultural machinery or hauling a vehicle containing such machinery only, if the projections on the driving wheels of such machine consist only of bars at least two and three-quarter inches in width and not more than one and one-sixteenth of an inch in thickness, and the space intervening between such bars does not exceed five inches; or

(b) Any traction engine, the driving wheels of which are cylindrical and smooth soled, and having no projections thereon other than diagonal bars of not less than three inches in width nor more than three-quarters of an inch in thickness, and extending the full width of the tire, and the space intervening between such crossbars not exceeding three inches, provided in such last-mentioned case:—

I. That the owner of such engine has previously obtained from the Council, or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf, a permit, in writing, specifying such public highways on which it may be used, and that the engine is being used on one of the highways so specified.

II. That the owner has agreed, in writing, to pay to the Council the cost of making good any damage done to any roadway, bridge, or culvert by such engine or any vehicle drawn by it.

- III. That such engine is not being used (unless with the written consent of the Council, or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf) to haul more than two vehicles, exclusive of any vehicle solely used for carrying water for such engine.
- IV. That the loading of such vehicle drawn by such engine does not exceed nine tons twelve hundredweight including the weight of such vehicle.
- V. That the weight carried by any vehicle drawn by such engine (including the weight of such vehicle) does not exceed three hundredweight for each half-inch of bearing surface of the tire or felloe of each wheel of such vehicle.

*Weight of Engine to be Painted thereon.*

2. Every owner of a traction engine shall cause to be painted in legible letters not less than one inch long on a plate attached to the engine, or on a conspicuous place on the engine, the exact and true weight thereof, and the maximum weight of water and fuel necessary for its propulsion.

*Persons to be in Attendance whilst Engine Contains Sufficient Motive Power to Move it.*

3. So long as the fires of a traction engine are alight, or the traction engine contains in itself sufficient motive power to use it, one person shall remain in attendance while it is on any public highway, although it is stationary.

*Taking Engines Across or Along Bridges, Embankments, &c.*

4. No person shall take any traction engine across or along any bridge or culvert or embankment so as to meet or pass thereon any other traction engine or any person with a horse or vehicle drawn by a horse.

*Engines not to Halt on Certain Parts of Highway.*

5. No person shall halt (unless through unforeseen circumstances, or unless actually engaged in loading or unloading) in any part of a road where the traffic is narrowed by fences, excavations, dangerous depressions, or such like, but shall draw off at least twenty feet from the middle of the formation in the case of a made road, or the middle of the surveyed road if unmade.

*Engines not to Halt on Bridges or Culverts.*

6. No person shall permit any traction engine or any vehicle attached to or drawn thereby to stop on any bridge or culvert for the purpose of drawing water, or for any other purpose whatever.

*Driving Engines between Sunset and Sunrise.*

7. No person shall drive any traction engine between sunset and sunrise, unless by written permission of the Council or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf, defining the route to be travelled and the extended hours during which such travelling is permissible, such permission to be withdrawable at any time upon written notice to that effect being served on the owner or driver of the engine, or being forwarded to him by registered letter. No person who has received such written permission shall drive any traction engine between sunset and sunrise, unless there shall be exhibited on such engine proper and sufficient carriage or other approved lights, one at each side of the front and on the rear, or when a vehicle or vehicles are being drawn by such engine, then in the rear of the last vehicle.

*Wooden Planks to be Carried on Engine, &c.*

8. No person shall use or cause or procure to be used on any public highway any traction engine unless there is carried on such engine, or some vehicle drawn by the same, at least four wooden planks at least twelve inches in width, four inches in thickness, and at least twelve feet in length, and when crossing any bridge or culvert the driver or the person in charge of any engine shall lay down such planks, and no engine shall be permitted to cross any bridge or culvert except on such planks.

*Skidding of Engine Wheels.*

9. The driver of a traction engine shall shut off steam immediately the driving wheels of the engine commence to skid, and he shall not start the engine again until he has taken all the necessary and proper means to prevent damage being done to highway by the skidding of the wheels.

*Penalties.*

10. Any person shall, for any wilful act or default contrary to this By-law, be liable to the following penalty:—

- (a) For a first offence, a fine not exceeding Three pounds.
- (b) For a second offence, a fine not exceeding Five pounds.
- (c) For any subsequent offence, a fine not exceeding Ten pounds.

*Extent of Operation of By-law.*

This By-law shall apply to, and have operation throughout, the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Kowree.

Local Government Act 1903.

SHIRE OF WARRNAMBOOL.

BY-LAW No. 42.

A By-law of the Shire of Warrnambool, made under sections 197 and 498 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 42, for regulating the conditions under which "cattle" may be driven on to roads or reserves within the municipality for the purpose of grazing thereon with the Council's consent.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Warrnambool order as follows:—

1. That any ratepayer may apply to the Council of the municipality for their consent to graze cattle and horses upon any roads or reserves vested in or under the control or management of the municipality.

2. That such application shall be in writing signed by the applicant, and shall state the number, description, and brands of the cattle and horses in respect of which the consent is required, and the road or reserve on which it is desired to graze the same.

3. The charges or fees, subject to increase or decrease by an ordinary resolution of the said Council from time to time for grazing, shall be:—

(a) For each horse above the age of six months, Seven shillings per quarter.

(b) For each head of cattle above the age of six months, Three shillings and threepence per quarter.

4. Such charges or fees shall be payable quarterly, in advance, to the secretary of the Council of the said Shire, and the quarters shall begin on the first days of the months of January, April, July, and October in each year.

5. The said Council shall have a discretion as to the number of cattle and horses which each applicant shall be entitled to graze upon such roads or reserves from time to time, and the Council may regulate the increase or diminish the number to be grazed in any quarter.

6. No person shall be permitted to graze any sheep, entire horse, or bull on any road or reserve within the municipality, and any such sheep, entire horse, or bull found upon any such road or reserve will be impounded, and the owner thereof will be prosecuted.

7. The said Council shall not be responsible or liable for any loss or theft, or death, or for any injury or damage to, or straying, of any cattle or horses grazing under the aforesaid consent, nor for the supply of a sufficiency of grass or water.

8. Calves and foals under six months of age, the progeny of the registered cows or mares, may run with their mothers free of charge up to that limit of age.

9. Nothing in this By-law shall prevent the operation of section 17 of the *Police Offences Act 1912*, nor shall the said Council be responsible or accountable in any way to the owner of any cattle or horses for any penalty incurred by such owner under such section, or for the impounding of any animal by the owner or occupier of property abutting upon any road, or by any other person, nor for any damages, costs, or expenses whatsoever, to be incurred or recovered by any person by reason of such cattle being upon such road or reserve.

10. The said Council may issue a tag, or badge, for all cattle and horses mentioned in the said consent, and the owner of such cattle and horses shall keep the same affixed thereto, but such tag or badge shall at all times remain the absolute property of the Council.

11. The Council shall have power to withdraw their consent on the owner of such cattle and horses failing to pay the fees and charges or to comply with this By-law, or if any of the cattle and horses mentioned in such consent shall be found to be suffering from any form of complaint or disease, or if grass or water on such road or reserve becomes scarce or insufficient, or for any other reason which may appear sufficient to the said Council in their absolute discretion, and thereupon the secretary of the said Council shall forthwith post a notice of such withdrawal to the owner of such cattle and horses, to the address contained in such owner's application, and such owner shall remove such cattle and horses from the said road or reserve within seven days after the posting of such notice, and on his failing to do so the said cattle and horses may be impounded and the owner prosecuted.

12. All cattle and horses in respect of which any consent is granted shall be removed from the said roads or reserves before sunset, and shall be kept removed therefrom until sunrise on the following day, and should any such cattle or horses be found on the said roads or reserves after sunset or before sunrise on the following day the owner thereof shall be liable to prosecution.

13. "Cattle" in this By-law shall not include bulls, entire horses, or sheep.

14. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district, save and except the following roads, that is to say:—

- (a) The main road from Warrnambool to Geelong extending from the south-west angle of allotment 67, parish of Tallangatta, to Warrnambool town boundary.
- (b) The main Barren Plains-road, extending from the south-west corner of allotment 3, parish of Tallangatta, eastward to the south-east corner of said allotment.
- (c) The main road from Warrnambool to Port Fairy extending from the Warrnambool town boundary to the western boundary of the Shire of Warrnambool.
- (d) The road known as Cassidy's-lane, extending from the south-east corner of allotment 67, parish of Wangoom, to the north-east corner of allotment 19, parish of Yangery.
- (e) The main road from Warrnambool to Woolsthorpe, extending from the south-east corner of allotment 147, parish of Wangoom, northerly and westerly through Bushfield, Woodford, Mailor's Flat, and Winslow to the south-western angle of allotment 10 of section A, parish of Meerai.
- (f) The main road from Bushfield to Purnim, extending from the southern angle of section 3, parish of Purnim, being the junction of the Purnim and Bushfield roads, north-easterly to the south-west corner of Bryan O'Lynn pre-emptive section.
- (g) The road to Grasmere and Cooramook, extending from the south-west corner of allotment 11, parish of Purnim, to the south-east corner of allotment 19a, parish of Cooramook.
