RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT OF VICTORIA.

UNDER the powers conferred by the *Service and Execution of Process Act 1901-12* it is ordered as follows:—

FEES.

The fees to be paid in connexion with the service of the process of the Courts of this State under the above Act and the execution and enforcement by such Courts of the process and Judgments of the Courts of other States and parts of the Commonwealth shall be those set forth in the Schedule hereto.

COSTS.

Where proceedings are taken to enforce any Judgment, a certificate of which has been registered under the above Act, in any Court of this State the same costs shall be allowed as upon similar proceedings to enforce a like Judgment of such Court.

SCHEDULE.

A. Fees to be paid in connexion with the service of process of the Courts of this State.

For service of any process issued out of the Courts of Victoria and served in any of the other States the following fees shall be allowed:—

- (a) If served by an officer of any Court the same amount as would be paid in accordance with the scale of fees in force for the time being, in the Court whereof such person is an officer, for the service of process issued out of such Court.
- (b) If there is no such scale of fees, or if the process is served by any other person, the amount actually paid to such person in respect of—
 - (i) The fee paid for swearing the affidavit of service;
 - (ii) Reasonable and necessary expenses of travelling and sustenance; and
 - (iii) A fee of 7s. 6d., with an additional 7s. 6d. for each day necessarily occupied after the first day.

When more than one attendance is necessary but can be made on the same day, no additional allowance is to be made. Where it is necessary to employ a solicitor to effect such service, in addition to the above allowances a sum of 21s.

B. Fees to be paid in connexion with the execution and enforcement by Courts of this State of the process and judgments of the Courts of other States and parts of the Commonwealth.

The same fees of Court shall be charged in connexion with the execution and enforcement of such process and judgments as are charged for the like or analogous proceedings to execute and enforce the process and judgments of Courts of this State; and in addition thereto the following fees:—

AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE EXAMINATION OF ENGINEERS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the *Marine Act 1890*, the Marine Board of Victoria, with the consent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

1. These Regulations shall form portion of "The Regulations for the Examination of Engineers" made by the Board on the 11th day of July, 1902, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 29th day of July, 1902 (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations), and shall be read in connexion therewith, and shall take effect from the date of publication hereof in the *Government Gazette*, on which date subdivision (h) of paragraph 24 of the aforesaid Regulations and the amending Regulations made by the Board on the 5th day of May, 1905, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 31st day of May, 1905, shall be repealed.

2. After subdivision (2) of paragraph 24 (a) of the Principal Regulations there shall be added the following additional alternative qualification, namely:—

(2a) Have served 2½ years with a second-class certificate of competency or service as third engineer of a home-trade steam-ship of not less than 99 nominal horse-power, if, during the whole of that period, he has been the senior engineer in charge of a watch on the main engines and boilers; or

3. For paragraph 13 of the Principal Regulations there shall be substituted the following, namely:—

13. If the candidate fails in practical knowledge he may not present himself for re-examination until he can produce proofs of three months further service at sea as engineer on watch on the main engines or boilers of a foreign-going steam-ship, or its equivalent in a steam-ship trading between ports on the coast of Victoria (four and a half months) subsequent to the date of failure. If he fails in arithmetic, elementary questions, or drawing only, he may come up again at any time, but in all cases of failure any re-examination must be entirely afresh.

4. For subdivision (h) of paragraph 24 of the Principal Regulations there shall be substituted the following, namely:—

(h) His knowledge of arithmetic must include the mensuration of superficies and solids and the extraction of the square and cube roots, and the application of these rules to questions relating to the power, duty, and economy of engines and boilers, and to the stresses in rods, shafts, and levers of the engine. He should also be able to calculate the effect of the application of the lever, pulley, inclined plane, and other mechanical powers.

5. Before paragraph 28 of the Principal Regulations the following paragraph is inserted:—

(28A) Workshop service must have been performed in works where steam engines, boilers, &c., are made or repaired, but no time served before the age of 15 will be counted.

Not less than two years of the apprentice time must have been spent at fitting, erecting, or repairing engines and machinery either in the works or outside. The remaining two years may be made up of time spent in engine works at fitting, erecting, or repairing engines and machinery, or at one of the other branches of the trade given below, or at an approved technical day school; the time so spent to count as follows:—

Fitting, erecting, repairing, or turning.—Full time.

Working in drawing office.—Full time up to one year, and beyond one year one-half time.

Pattern-making.—One-half time, with a maximum allowance of one year.

Planing, slotting, shaping, and milling.—One-third time.

Boiler-making or repairing.—One-half time.

Smith work.—One-half time, with a maximum allowance of one year.

Coppersmith work.—One-third time, with a maximum allowance of six months.

In the event of the apprentice time being extended to five years or more, four years at turning, followed by one year at fitting or erecting, may be accepted as qualifying.

6. For paragraph 28 of the Principal Regulations there shall be substituted the following, namely:—

28. When the workshop service has been performed in a place where engines are made, but not in the manner specified in paragraph 28A, the case must be referred to the Board with a report upon the service performed. If the service be such as is useful training for an engineer, the Board may accept the service; but in every such case the applicant must prove additional engine-room or marine engine workshop service, as required in the succeeding paragraph.

7. For paragraph 29 of the Principal Regulations there shall be substituted the following, namely:—

29. When the workshop service has been performed in a place where steam engines are not made or repaired, and the class of work done is similar to that required in engine making, the service may be accepted with an additional year of qualifying service; that is, four years' workshop service, and either two years at sea on regular watch, or one year at engine fitting in a suitable marine engine workshop, and one year at sea in the engine-room. The approval of the Board must be obtained in every such case before the candidate is examined.

The foregoing amended Regulations and additional Regulation were made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria, held this fourteenth day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and fourteen.

Land Surveyors Act 1895.

REGULATIONS FOR EXAMINATIONS FOR LAND SURVEYORS AND ISSUE OF LICENCES TO SURVEY.

REGULATIONS approved by the Governor in Council, 8th November, 1910, are hereby rescinded, and the following Regulations are substituted therefor:—

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.

(b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

NOTE.—Applies only to candidates whose articles or other similar agreements were entered into prior to 1st March, 1910.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

(d) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at the Melbourne University on examination in which a representative of the Surveyors Board acted as co-examiner, and shall have been at some time professionally employed in the field for a period of eighteen months on work satisfactory to the Board.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys:—

Form of Certificate for presentation to the Board of Examiners.

I, A.B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed by me as _____, in the practice of land surveying, for the period of _____, viz., from _____ to _____, or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of _____ years (_____ of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

[Here describe the survey work on which C.D. was engaged.]

(Signed) A.B.

(Date.)

NOTE.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Regulations.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road, and also a plan, field notes, and description of a survey of a town lot built upon, as made for the purpose of an application under the provisions of the Real Property Act or Land Transfer Act.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

9. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

Mathematics.

(a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

(b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practice of Surveying.

(c) Detail of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, and underground surveying, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting by co-ordinates and from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Act, writing descriptions of boundaries.

Candidates may be required to effect surveys under supervision.

Engineering Surveys.

(d) Levelling and contouring; grading; setting-out, and measurement of earthworks, including practical tests.

Use of Instruments.

(e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, tachometer, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer and steel band.

Field Astronomy, Godesy, &c.

(f) Determination (including practical tests) of time, latitude, and azimuth; the use of ephemerides; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

Drawing.

(g) Plan-drawing, drawing of sections and contours, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

Miscellaneous.

(h) Elementary physics, elementary geology, elementary forestry.

[The scope of the examination in elementary physics will be that covered by "Balfour Stewart's Elementary Physics," Fourth Edition, omitting chapters 8, 10, and 11, and the scope of the examination in elementary geology will be that covered by "Geikie's Class-book of Geology," Fourth Edition.]

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having passed the matriculation or senior examination at a University, or of having completed a course of the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers. Candidates holding satisfactory certificates or diplomas from any University recognised by an Australasian University or from recognised public technical schools may be exempted from working out papers in physics and geology, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates admitted under clause 5(d) may be exempted from working out papers other than those prescribed in clause 10(e), and from such portion of the practical examination as the Board may determine.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate qualifying and passing the examination held under these regulations shall be entitled to a certificate that he is qualified for the position of a land surveyor in Victoria.

13. A surveyor applying to the Board for a certificate of competency without examination on the grounds of his holding a licence and certificate entitling him to practise in any of the other Australian States or in the Dominion of New Zealand, shall produce such licence or certificate of competency from the Board of the State or Dominion in which he is licensed or authorized to survey, together with satisfactory evidence as to character; provided that, should such licence or certificate have been issued upon examination held prior to September, 1895, or in virtue of a certificate issued prior to September, 1895, he shall further produce a written recommendation or a certificate, dated

not more than twelve months previously, from such Board; provided also, that any surveyor prevented by absence from the State or Dominion in which he obtained his licence or certificate from obtaining the recommendation of the Board of that State or Dominion, may be granted a certificate on passing such examination under these regulations as the Board may require. Each application shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

14. The Board may grant a certificate of competency or a letter of recommendation to any surveyor holding a Victorian certificate (dated prior to September, 1895, and desiring to be registered in another State or the Dominion of New Zealand, either without examination or on such *viva voce* examination as in the opinion of the Board may be necessary. Application for such certificate shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

REGISTRATION OF ARTICLES OF INDENTURE.

15. Articles of indenture or other similar agreement for the tuition of surveying by a qualified surveyor shall be forwarded to the secretary for registration within three months of the date of commencement of service thereunder. Applications for registration shall be accompanied by evidence of the pupil having passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto. The fee for each registration shall be Five shillings. Transfers of articles or agreements shall be registered within three months of such transfers.

16. On and after March, 1913 (except as hereinafter provided), no candidate shall be eligible for examination unless he shall have passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause; provided that, subject to his passing a special examination prescribed by the Board which shall include English, arithmetic, geometry, and algebra, a candidate who has not passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause may be admitted to examination if—

- (a) He failed at an examination held prior to March, 1913; or
- (b) He produces certificates of six years' satisfactory field service.

LICENCES TO SURVEY.

17. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 1s.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act 1895*, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

MURTOA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW No. 8.

THE Commissioners of the Murtoa Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, do make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements situated within the Waterworks District of the Murtoa Waterworks Trust shall pay for the year 1915, in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said district:—

1. For any house or tenement fronting any street wherein a pipe for the supply of water shall have been laid, or where houses or tenements, if not fronting such a street, are supplied with water by reticulation, and being of an annual value of Ten pounds (£10) or under, the sum of Twenty-five shillings (25s.).

2. For every house or tenement so situated of an annual value of above Ten pounds (£10), the sum of Two shillings and sixpence in the pound sterling on the annual value of such property.

3. For every house or tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds (£10) or under situated in streets with no pipes, and if not supplied with water, the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence.

4. For every house or tenement above the annual value of £10, in streets with no pipes, and if not supplied with water, the sum of One shilling and threepence in the £1 on the annual value of such property.

5. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based upon the municipal valuation of the several houses or tenements.

6. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1915, and shall be payable on 1st January, 1915.

7. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

8. Water supplied to Government Departments, religious denominations, and to persons outside the Trust district shall be by measurement or by special agreement.

9. In cases of large consumers of water by meter the Trust may make a special agreement and may make a reduction to not less than 9d. per 1,000 gallons.

10. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in previous clauses the minimum charge for water supplied by measurement or under special agreement must not be less than the charge would be if the property was rated in the usual way according to the shire valuation.

This By-law also refers to the freezing works.

11. Excess water shall be charged at the rate of 9d. per 1,000 gallons.

12. On properties where the officers consider it necessary a meter will be ordered to be put on, and in case of non-compliance the water will be cut off according to the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905*.

The foregoing By-law (No. 8) was made by the Commissioners of the Murtoa Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of the provisions of the *Water Act 1905*, this 30th day of July, 1914.

REGULATIONS FOR THE EMPLOYMENT OF TRAINEES FOR THE PURPOSE OF UNDERGOING A COURSE OF TRAINING IN FORESTRY.

All applications must be addressed to the Minister of Forests, in writing, on the authorized form.

Applicants must be not less than 14 years of age.

Every applicant shall attach to his application—

- (a) satisfactory proof of his age;
- (b) a certificate, signed by some reliable person, that he is of good moral character;
- (c) a certificate, on an approved form, from a duly qualified medical practitioner, that he is in good health, physically sound, and fit for forest work.

Every applicant will be required to pass an examination before the Examiners under the Forests Act 1907, and must be recommended by them to the Minister as a suitable person for employment as a trainee. He must also undergo an examination by the Government Medical Officer, and before being eligible for such employment must receive a certificate from such medical officer that he is physically fit for the Forest Service.

Every trainee shall—

- (a) reside at the Forest School, Creswick;
- (b) be subject to a course of instruction in botany, chemistry, geology, mathematics, surveying, plants and animals injurious to forests, and practical and theoretical forestry;
- (c) present himself at and pass such annual or supplementary examinations as may be authorized.

During their term of employment trainees will be paid—for their services in the nurseries and plantations, the sum of £48 in the first year, £52 in the second year, and £56 in the third year. From these amounts there shall be deducted in each year the sum of £45 to cover board, lodging, and attendance.

Every accepted candidate for employment as a trainee will be required to find two approved sureties, who will enter into bonds for £50 each for the faithful performance of his duties, and for his remaining in his employment as a trainee for the full term of three years.

The Minister may, at any time, dispense with the services of a trainee who, in the opinion of the Conservator of Forests, is wanting in application or aptitude, or in the careful performance of his work, or whose conduct may be unsatisfactory.

And the Honorable James Drysdale Brown, His Majesty's Minister of Forests for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

ALTERATION OF CLOSE SEASON FOR NETTING AT SYDENHAM, TAMBOON, WINGAN, AND MALLACOOTA INLETS, AND RESTRICTIONS ON THE USE OF NETS IN SUCH INLETS.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts, do by this Proclamation revoke the Proclamation dated the sixteenth day of May, 1911, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of the twenty-fourth day of May, 1911, *re* Netting in Sydenham, Tamboon, Wingan, and Mallacoota Inlets, and in lieu thereof do order and provide as follows:—

(1) The use of trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing, shall be prohibited in Sydenham Inlet, Tamboon Inlet, Wingan Inlet, and Mallacoota (sometimes called Mallagoota) Inlet, within in each case an imaginary line running from the extreme seaward or outward point of either bank or side to the opposite extreme seaward or outward point where the waters of such inlets enter the ocean, from the first day of October in each year to the thirty-first day of March in the following year.

(2) The use of nets, to be used in fishing, shall be restricted in the above-mentioned inlets as follows:—

- (a) No person shall use a "seine" or "hauling" net exceeding in length 400 fathoms.
- (b) No person shall use at the same time a total length of more than 700 fathoms of "mesh" or "set" net (or nets); provided that, in the case of "mesh" or "set" nets, every mesh of which measures 4½ inches or over, the total length of net (or nets) permissible under this condition shall be 1,200 fathoms. Provided further that in case of two or more persons working together in a boat each shall be allowed to use his complement of "mesh" or "set" net as prescribed herein.
- (c) No person shall use at the same time a "seine" or "hauling" net and a "mesh" or "set" net.

RESTRICTIONS OF NETTING IN THE GIPPSLAND LAKES.

1913, *re* Restrictions on Netting, &c., in the Gippsland Lakes, and in lieu thereof do order and provide as follows regarding the waters known as the Gippsland Lakes:—

(1) That the use of any trammel, trawl, or other net or engine, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing, shall be prohibited between Ten o'clock in the morning of any Friday and sunrise on the following Sunday.

(2) That the use by any person of a "seine" or "hauling" net exceeding in length 400 fathoms, shall be prohibited; provided that eastward of a line running through Ludrick or Tyers Point and the Tambo Bluff the process of hauling nets known as "fireballing" may be carried on with a net up to 700 fathoms in length.

(3) That the use, at the same time, by any person of a total length of more than 700 fathoms of "mesh" or "set" net (or nets), shall be prohibited; provided that in the case of "mesh" or "set" nets, every mesh of which measures 4½ inches or over, the total length of net (or nets) permissible under this condition shall be 1,200 fathoms. Provided further that in each case of two or more persons working together in a boat each shall be allowed to use his complement of "mesh" or "set" net as prescribed herein.

(4) That the use, at the same time, by any person of a "seine" or "hauling" net and a "mesh" or "set" net, shall be prohibited.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION,
AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR
PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWNSHIP OF
SEA LAKE.

WE, Robert William Hannon, Herbert John Cox, and James Mudge, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 3rd May, 1898, as a site for Public Recreation in the township of Sea Lake, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act 1901* :—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the Reserve.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs.
6. No person shall ride or drive in the Reserve, or lead or exercise any horse therein without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
7. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.
9. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
10. No person shall play or engage in cricket, football, tennis or any game whatever in the Reserve, without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained, unless such person, at the time of playing, is a member of any club which has been duly authorized to play in the Reserve or is a member of a visiting team engaged in competition with any such club.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

Printed forms of tender, showing estimates of requirements and conditions of contract, may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge of police at any of the above-mentioned places, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per ton of 40 cubic feet for firewood, including delivery at the offices and all charges. Prices should only be quoted for requirements where estimates are shown above.

Tenders, which must be upon the printed form, will be received for either one or more of the above-mentioned places, and tenders for such places may be accepted or rejected separately; but if all lengths of firewood be included in one tender it may be accepted for one length only, if advisable.

Where the kind or kinds of wood is not mentioned in the tender form, tenderers must specify the kind or kinds of firewood they offer to supply.

Telegrams, or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement, will not be entertained. The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for £10, with two approved sureties for the due performance of the contract, within ten days after the acceptance is notified.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Firewood at ..." as the case may be, and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender. The decision of the Government will be made known by Gazette notice and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of firewood which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.
2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must be split out of large timber, and must be perfectly sound, dry, and of the kind or kinds specified in the tender; neither burnt wood, heartwood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. The billets must be not less than 4 inches nor more than 6 inches in diameter. The long wood to be not less than 9 inches nor more than 18 inches in diameter. Delivery to be made on the written order of the chief officer of the Department requiring the supply. The ton of firewood consists of 40 cubic feet. If the firewood is obtained from a State forest timber reserve, or ordinary Crown lands, persons cutting or removing same must be provided with a licence or permit from the State Forests Department.
3. Orders will be issued half-yearly (except in cases where the storage is small, when they will be issued quarterly); but the contractor must have 24 hours' notice before purchases are made at his risk.
4. The contractor will be bound to place the firewood in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. The stacks are to be 2 feet wide (or 4 feet 6 inches for long wood) by 3 feet high, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets (or lengths) are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. In the event of any inconvenience being felt, either through delay in delivery or of stacking the wood, the Department concerned will purchase the same or re-stack that delivered, at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense incurred thereby will be deducted.
5. The officer receiving the supply shall have full power to reject any wood which he may consider not in accordance with the contract, notice of which will be given to the contractor in writing, stating the reason. The contractor may, however, claim a survey; but in that case he must, within 48 hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the wood.
6. The board of survey will be composed of persons appointed by the Honorable the Treasurer, and the decision of the board of survey is to be considered as final.
7. If the board of survey shall decide that the supply is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.
8. Accounts for firewood to be rendered to the Department receiving the supply immediately upon completion of the order, which must be attached to the account. Payment will be made at the receipt and pay office of the district, or at the Treasury, Melbourne, as the contractor may desire.
9. In the event of any irregularity on the part of the contractor being repeated, it will be competent for the Government, in case such irregularity should be established to the satisfaction of the Tender Board, to cancel the contract forthwith.
10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.
11. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract.
12. No subletting will be allowed; all work must be carried out by the contractor, and the hours of employment of any person engaged in any business or occupation connected with the preparation of the firewood for sale or connected with the sale or distribution of the firewood tendered for in this schedule shall not exceed 48 per week, and every such person shall be paid such wages and employed subject to such conditions as are or may be determined by the Wood, Hay, Chaff, and Coal Board under the Factories and Shops Acts; and a copy of these conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, on the premises of the contractor. Any infringement of these conditions, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from any accounts which are or may be due to the contractor, and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.
13.
