NOTE.—Applies only to candidates whose articles or othe similar agreements were entered into prior to 1st March, 1910.

- (b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally em-ployed under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.
- (c) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.
- (d) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at the Melbourne University on examination in which a representative of the Surveyors Board acted as co-examiner, and shall have been at some time professionally employed in the field for a period of eighteen months on work satisfactory to the Board.
- 6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys:—

Note.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Regulations.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road, and also a plan, field notes, and description of a survey of a town lot built upon, as made for the purpose of an application under the provisions of the Real Property Act or Land Transfer Act.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

to examination.

9. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plandrawing, except paper.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

*10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

Mathematics.

(a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

(b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practice of Surveying.

(c) Detail of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, and underground surveying, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundarres, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting by co-ordinates and from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Act, writing descriptions of boundaries.

Candidates may be required to effect surveys under supervision.

Engineering Surveys.

(d) Levelling and contouring; grading; setting-out, and measurement of earthworks, including practical tests.

Use of Instruments.

(e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, tacheometer, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer and steel band.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

(f) Determination (including practical tests) of time, latitude, and azimuth; the use of ephemerides; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

Drawing.

(g) Plan-drawing, drawing of sections and contours, compila-tion of plans, projection of maps and charts.

Miscellancous.

(h) Elementary physics, elementary geology, elementary forestry.

forestry.

[The scope of the examination in elementary physics will be that covered by "Balfour Stewart's Elementary Physics," Fourth Edition, omitting chapters 8, 10, and 11, and the scope of the examination in elementary geology will be that covered by "Getkie's Class-book of Geology," Fourth Edition.]"

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having passed the matriculation or senior examination at a University, or of having completed a course of the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers. Candidates holding satisfactory certificates or diplomas from any University recognised by an Australasian University or from recognised public technical schools may be exempted from working out papers in physics and geology, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates admitted under clause 5(d) may be exempted from working out papers other than those prescribed in clause 10(c), and from such portion of the practical examination as the Board may determine.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPRIENCY.

12. A candidate qualifying and passing the examination held under these regulations shall be entitled to a certificate that he is qualified for the position of a land surveyor in Victoria.

13. A surveyor applying to the Board for a certificate of competency without examination on the grounds of his holding a licence and certificate entitling him to practise in any of the other Australian States or in the Dominion of New Zealand, shall produce such licence or certificate of competency from the Board of the State or Dominion in which he is licensed or authorized to survey, together with satisfactory evidence as to character; provided that, should such licence or certificate have been issued upon examination held prior to September, 1895, he shall further produce a written recommendation or a certificate, dated

not more than twelve months previously, from such Board; provided also, that any surveyor prevented by absence from the State or Dominion in which he obtained his licence or certi-State or Dominion in which he obtained his licence or certificate from obtaining the recommendation of the Board of that State or Dominion, may be granted a certificate on passing such examination under these regulations as the Board may require. Each application shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

14. The Board may grant a certificate of competency or a letter of recommendation to any surveyor holding a Victorian certificate dated prior to September, 1885, and desiring to be registered in another State or the Dominion of New Zealand, either without examination or on such viva voce examination as in the opinion of the Board may be necessary. Application for such certificate shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

REGISTRATION OF ARTICLES OF INDENTURE.

15. Articles of indenture or other similar agreement for the tuition of surveying by a qualified surveyor shall be forwarded to the secretary for registration within three months of the date of commencement of service thereunder. Applications for registration shall be accompanied by evidence of the pupil having passed at any University recognized by an Australasian University the matriculation examination or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto. The fee for each registration shall be Five shillings. Transfers of articles or agreements shall be registered within three months of such transfers.

16. On and after March, 1913 (except as hereinafter provided), no candidate shall be eligible for examination unless he shall have passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause; provided that, subject to his passing a special examination prescribed by the Board which shall include English, arithmetic, geometry, and algebra, a candidate who has not passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause may be admitted to examination if

- (a) He failed at an examination held prior to March, 1913;
- or (b) He produces certificates of six years' satisfactory field service. LICENCES TO SURVEY.

LICENCES TO SURVEY.

17. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 1s.), the declaration as prescribed by the Land Surveyors Act 1895, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

 - (j) Singing Teacher's Certificate Primary Secondary;

and Certificates of Qualification in Science Subjects, in Physical Training, in Swimming, in Voice Production, and in other approved courses.

2. The Minister may, on the recommendation of the Council of Public Education, issue a Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate to any person who has successfully completed the course of training for the registration of primary teachers as issued by the Teachers and Schools Registration Board on the 6th December, 1910.

3. The details of the subjects prescribed for the examinations for any of the certificates mentioned in clause I may from time to time be varied by the Director.

Due notice of all examinations and of changes in the details of the subjects prescribed will be published in The Education Gazette and Teachers' Aid. All candidates must defray their own travelling expenses.
4. This Regulation shall come into force on 1st Janu-

- (i) (a) English, and three other subjects, as prescribed for the Leaving Certificate Examination, the Senior Public or some higher examination of the University of Melbourne, or, (b) alternatively, Drawing, Part III., as prescribed below, English, and two other subjects as prescribed above, or (c) who hold approved equivalent qualifications.
- (ii) Theory of Teaching (Part III.), as prescribed
- (iii) Practice of Teaching as prescribed below.
- 2. Candidates must be at least eighteen years of age. Except with the special permission of the Director, teachers who have not passed fully in the literary work of the Second-class Certificate (drawing for the purposes of this clause not being regarded as part of the literary work) will not be permitted to present themselves at this examination.
- 3. No First-class Certificate will be issued to any teacher until he has satisfactorily performed the duties of a classified teacher or of a registered teacher for not less than two years.
 - D. INFANT TEACHER'S CERTIFCATE.
- 1. The certificates of competency as infant teachers will be termed-
 - (a) Infant Teacher's Certificate, Second Class. (b) Infant Teacher's Certificate, First Class.
- 2. Second-class Certificates or First-class Certificates, as the case may be, will be issued to candidates who complete the prescribed course, and pass the prescribed examinations and teaching tests, and comply with the conditions indicated below.
- 3. Candidates at the commencement of their training course shall be at least seventeen years of age; they shall have passed the Junior Public Examination or some higher examination of the University of Melbourne, or shall have passed in the literary work of the Secondclass Certificate or some higher examination of the Victorian Education Department, or hold some other qualification of approved equivalent value.

Candidates for a Second or for a First-class Infant Teacher's Certificate will not be eligible for examination unless they furnish satisfactory evidence that they have had regular teaching practice, under approved supervision, in the infant department of a State school or other approved school, for a period of at least one year in the case of candidates for a Second-class Certificate. and for a period of at least two years in the case of candidates for a First-class Certificate.

6. At the examination for either the Second-class or the First-class Infant Teacher's Certificate, candidates will be allowed to present themselves for any number of the prescribed subjects, and will be given credit for those subjects in which they pass. inked in, but is not to be coloured or shaded.

(f) An example of elementary craft work, designed and wrought by the candidate. This may and wrought by the candidate. This may take the form of any applied art process in wood, metal, leather, needlework. &c. Preference will be given to complete works, however elementary in construction, but when the complete structure cannot be submitted, sketches must accompany the work sent in to illustrate the position it is designed to occupy.

The works submitted for this certificate must be certified to as the unaided production of the candidate, and will be retained by the Department so long as the candidate remains in Australia.

*Note.—With the exception of the subject marked with an asterisk, the examinations are those prescribed under the Technical Schools' Art Syllabus.

And pass in the following subjects:-

(a) Perspective—advanced stage.

(b) Drawing ornament from a cast. (O.L.2B.)

(c) Drawing in light and shade from a cast—ad-

vanced stage. (O.S.2.)
(d) General design (Advanced stage, Grade I). The subject of this examination must be designed for execution in the same material as that of the work submitted under (f) above

Candidates who have completed the examinations for the Licence to Teach Drawing and the Certificate of Competency to Teach Drawing under the Regulations for 1905, may receive the above certificates on passing the additional examinations and submitting the required.

In addition to passing in the subjects named under I. and II. above, candidates, after due notice, must give a satisfactory class lesson in any one of them selected by the Inspector.

A candidate for a Drawing Teacher's Secondary Certificate must also have passed the examination for a Drawing Teacher's Primary Certificate.

F. SINGING.

Certificates of Competency in Class Singing will be granted upon examination in the subjects specified below.

PRIMARY CERTIFICATE

PART I .--- PRACTICAL.

Section I.-Memory of Tune, Voluntaries, and Sight Singing.

- (a) Bring copies of six school songs, and sol-fa from memory, while pointing it on the modulator, one of these songs selected by the examiner.
- (h) Sing, while pointing on the modulator, two short voluntaries adapted to any of the Grades III. to VIII., named by the examiner.

(c) Sol-fa from the examiner's pointing on the modulator a voluntary including transitions of one remove and chromatics easily approached and quitted.

(d) Pitch from a given C and sing at sight, solfaing not more than twice, and afterwards vocalizing, a test including first remove changes of key, and any of the chromatic

(e) In the same manner sing a test in the minor mode with easy modulation.

Section II .- Ear Tests.

- (a) Imitate short phrases sung to laa by the examiner.
- (b) Laa a specimen of an ear test, adapted to any of the Grades, the names of the notes to be dictated by the examiner.
- (c) Write or tell the notes of a simple phrase of six tones, sung twice by the examiner, who will each time first give the Doh chord.
- (d) Give the time names or write the time of simple passages sung on one tone by the examiner while beating the time.

Section III .- Time.

- (a) Sing on one tone a time test. Two attempts allowed. The test may include quarters and triplets in any combination, easy syncopation, and may be in two-, three-four-, six- or ninepulse measure.
- (b) Give the time names of any of the groups of notes in the above test, as required by the examiner.
- (c) Beat time in Two-, Three-, or Four-pulse measure at the rate of M.60.
- (d) Write on a blackboard plainly, as for a large class, a short time and tune exercise.

Section IV .- Staff Notation.

- (a) Point on a blank stave, while singing, a voluntary containing leaps to any tones of the major diatonic scale; the key to be indicated by the examiner.
- (b) Sing, from the examiner's pointing on a prepared stave, a voluntary including the sharpened fourth and the flattened seventh, approached and quitted stepwise, the accidentals necessary to represent these being previously written on the stave.
- (c) Pitch, from a given C, and sol-fa, a test in one of the following keys, viz.:—C, G, D, A, E, F, Bb, Eb, and Ab; two attempts allowed. The test will contain about 32 pulses in #, #, t, or # time, mostly crotchets, with occasional quavers in diatonic melody
- (d) Sing on one tone, a time test of moderate difficulty.

PART II.-THEORETICAL.

The Theory Paper will be divided into sections A, B, and C, as follows:-

Section A will deal with pronunciation, enunciation voice production and training, breathing, and the functions of the various organs, &c., involved in the same.

Section B will deal with methods of teaching.

Section C will consist of a passage for translation from tonic sol-fa to staff notation, and also a passage for translation from staff notation to tonic sol-fa.

PART III .- TEACHING TEST.

The candidate will be required to give a lesson of about forty minutes' duration to a class of children. The lesson must include breathing and voice production exercises, practice from the tonic sol-fa modulator, ear exercises in tune and time, teaching by sight reading of a tune of about eight measures in length, and the conducting of a song known to the class.

The examiner may ask for a special topic to be dealt with in any of the above divisions of the lesson, and will give seven days' notice to the candidate of the same.

Full notes of the lesson must be submitted to the examiner. ,

SECONDARY CERTIFICATE.

Candidates must have previously passed the examination for the Primary Certificate.

PART I .-- PRACTICAL.

Section I .- Memory of Time, Tune, and Pitch.

- (a) Bring a separate copy of each of six tunes or melodies of not less than 24 pulses in length. each of which contains divided pulses and extended transition, and write from memory in the tonic sol-fa notation the time and tune of one selected by the examiner.
- (b) Sol-fa from memory, while pointing them on the modulator, some passage or passages containing transitions of second and third, or third and fourth, removes.
- (c) Pitch C or C1 from memory, not varying from normal diapason pitch more than a major second.

Section 11.—Sight-singing.

- (a) Sing on one tone a test containing syncopation and minute divisions of the pulse. must be sung as nearly as possible at the rate marked. Two attempts allowed.
- (b) Sol-fa at first sight and afterwards sing to laa a test containing transition of the second and third removes, with minor mode or chromatic phrases, but not containing serious difficulties of time.

Section III .- Musical Dictation.

- (a) Write the time and tune of the melody of a double chant, containing a transition of one remove, or a cadence in the minor mode, the reciting tone being reckoned as two pulses. The examiner may sing to laa. or play the test three times, but must not tell the candidate either the key-tone or the first note.
- (b) Write the time and tune of the soprano and bass the four parts being heard together) of a single chant. The test will contain only common chords of the scale, and one or more of the following dissonances:-7S, 4S, and 7R. The key chord to be given, and the test to be sung to laa or played, but not more than three times.
- (c) Write down from ear in correct time a test in two-, three-, or four-pulse measure, not more than four measures in length, and containing notes of the following length, but not necessarily all of them, viz., 2-pulse, 12-pulse, r-pulse, \(\frac{2}{4}\)-pulse, \(\frac{1}{2}\)-pulse, and triplets, the examiner giving the test not more than three times.

Section IV .- Voice Cultivation.

Mark for phrasing and expression all the songs printed in the School Paper for Grades VII. and VIII. during the twelve months prior to the date of the examination. and sing with good tone and with clear and distinct enunciation one of them selected by the examiner.

Section V.-Staff Notation.

- (a) Sol-fa not more than three times, and afterwards sing to laa a six- or eight-line hymn-tune not seen before, in the major mode, containing extended transition to the dominant (first sharp) or subdominant (first flat) key, and half-pulse notes.
- (b) Sol-fa not more than three times, and afterwards sing to laa a tune in the minor mode, not seen before, containing the sharpened sixth and leading note (ba and se).

PART II .- THEORETICAL. Section I .- Translation.

Translate from the tonic sol-fa notation to the staff notation a test containing various divisions of the pulse and transitions of three or more removes. The test will be in four parts, and the translation must be in short

Translate a similar exercise from the staff notation to the tonic sol-fa notation.

Re-write from short to full vocal score, using the C clef for alto and tenor parts, a short test containing transitions of one remove or a modulation to the relative

Section II .- Harmony.

Common chords and triads in the diatonic scales with their inversions; the dominant seventh, the supertonic seventh, and the dominant fourth, with their inversions; transitions to dominant and sub-dominant keys; the sharpened fourth of the scale used chromatically; the minor scale and its chords; modulations and transitions to related keys; cadences—perfect, imperfect, plagal and interrupted; sequences; by-tones and passing tones; threepart and two-part writing.

Figuring the bass of a given passage and correcting

errors in simple four-part writing.

Adding two or three parts above a given figured bass, using the chords mentioned above.

Harmonizing simple melodies and melodic phrases in four parts, using the chords mentioned above.

Arranging a given four-part song for one or two sopranos and alto.

Notes.—I. A pass in Theory, Grade II., of the Examinations held by the Melbourne University Music Examination Board will be accepted in lieu of a pass in this section.

2. This section may be worked in either notation. A pass in Theory, Grade II., of the examination held by The University Music Examination Board will be accepted in lieu of a pass in this section.

PART III. TEACHING TEST.

To teach a class efficiently.

To present a senior class showing satisfactory attainments in music, and taught by the candidate for a period of not less than six months.

*G. Science Certificates.

· Science certificates will be issued to candidates who pass examinations in Science subjects conducted by the Department.

H. CERTIFICATE OF COMPETENCY IN PHYSICAL TRAINING.

A Certificate of Competency in Physical Training will be granted upon examination in the following subjects:-Physical Exercises, Marching Drill, Swimming, Running Exercises, in Organized Games, First Aid, Hygiene, and (for male teachers only) Miniature Rifle Shooting.

I. CERTIFICATE OF COMPETENCY IN SWIMMING AND LIFE SAVING.

A Certificate of Competency in Swimming and Life Saving will be granted upon examination in the following . subjects:—Swimming, Diving, Rescue Work, Resuscitation, Physiology and Hygiene, Teaching of Swimming and Life Saving.

J. CERTIFICATE OF COMPETENCY IN VOICE PRODUCTION.

A certificate of Competency in Voice Production will be granted upon examination in the subjects specified below:-

1. Theoretical—

(a) Physiology of voice production.(b) Sounds of English.

(c) Phonetics.

(d) Mechanics of reading.

* To hold two of the Department's Science Certificates is one of the literary qualifications prescribed in Schedule r of Act No. 2006, for promotion to Class III.

2. Practical—(1) Preparing notes of and giving lessons in any of the subjects in 1 above. (2) Reading and reciting of prepared and unprepared passages.

K. Classification in Honors.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE BOROUGH OF CASTLE-MAINE.

WHEREAS by section 200 of the Land Act 1901 it is enacted that where, under the provisions of any Act relating to Crown lands, the Governor in Council has reserved from sale permanently any Crown lands for any public purpose whatsoever, or for any of the purposes specified in section 10 of such Act, and has vested such land in trustees, or jointly in the Board of Land and Works and trustees, it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council, to make rules and regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sub-section 1 of section 200, Land Act 1901: And whereas a Crown grant has issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Castlemaine: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Castlemaine do hereby make the following regulations in respect of the said Reserve for Public Recreation:—

REGULATIONS.

- 1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.
- 2. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.
- 3. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- 4. No person shall jump or climp over or upon or get under any fence around or within the Reserve.
- 5. No person shall offer, make, or pay any wager for money within the Reserve, without the permission, in writing, of the trustees first obtained, or play therein any unlawful game.
- 6. No person shall interfere with or damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers or any property or effects in the Reserve, or walk on the beds or borders therein, or, without the permission, in writing, of the trustees first obtained, light in the Reserve any fire.
- 7. No person shall play or engage in cricket, football, tennis, or any game whatever in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the trustees first obtained, unless such person at the time of playing is a member of any club which has been duly authorized to play therein or is a member of a visiting team engaged in competition with any such club as aforesaid.
- 8. No person shall ride a bicycle on the cycling track or arena of the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the trustees first obtained.
- 9. No person shall put in the Reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the trustees first obtained: Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
- 10. No person shall remain within the Reserve at any time when lawfully directed by any officer or employé of the trustees, or any person duly authorized in that behalf, to leave the Reserve.
- 11. No person shall sell, or offer for sale, in the Reserve any article of food or drink or other commodity, or operate any money-making amusement, without the pernission, in writing, of the trustees first obtained.

12. The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the Reserve on such days as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements, shall be as follows:—

- a For the admission of every person over the age of fourteen years, such sum as the trustees may from time to time determine, not exceeding
- b. For the admission of every person over the age of nine years, and not over the age of fourteen years, such sum as the trustees may from time to time determine, not exceeding

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 200 of the Land Act 1901, on conviction before any justice, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who so offends, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands. or officer or servant of the trustees, or by any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer, or servant, or constable, and taken before some justice, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

- 1. As the exact quantity of firewood which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.
- 2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must be split out of large timber, and must be perfectly sound, dry, and of the kind or kinds specified in the tender; neither burnt wood, heartwood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. The billets must be not less than 4 inches nor more than 6 inches in diameter. The long wood to be not less than 9 inches nor more than 18 inches in diameter. Delivery to be made on the written order of the chief officer of the Department requiring the supply. The ton of firewood consists of 40 cubic feet. If the firewood is obtained from a State forest timber reserve, or ordinary Crown lands, persons cutting or removing same must be provided with a licence or permit from the State Forests Department.
- 3. Orders will be issued half-yearly (except in cases where the storage is small, when they will be issued quarterly); but the contractor must have 24 hours' notice before purchases are made at his risk.
- 4. The contractor will be bound to place the firewood in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. The stacks are to be 2 feet wide (or 4 feet 6 inches for long wood) by 5 feet high, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets (or lengths) are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. In the event of any inconvenience being felt, either through delay in delivery or of stacking the wood, the Department concerned will purchase the same or re-stack that delivered, at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense incurred thereby will be deducted.
- 5. SHIRE OF MULGRAVE.

By-law No. 12 of the Shire of Mulgrave, made under the provisions of section 198 of the Local Government Act 1903, and numbered 12, for regulating and restrain-ing the erection of removed wooden buildings in the Shire of Mulgrave.

I N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1903, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Mulgrave order as fol-

- 1. In this By-law the word "building" means wooden building, and includes an erection.
- 2. No person shall remove or cause to be removed into the Shire of Mulgrave, or from any one part of the Shire to another part of the same, and erect and permit to remain for any longer period than seven days, any building which does not comply with the provisions of the By-laws and Regulations of the Shire.
- 3. Before any building intended to be so erected is removed into the Shire, or from one part of the Shire to another part, the owner or the person carrying out the removal shall give to the Council, its secretary or engineer, not less than ten clear days' notice in writing of his intention to remove and re-erect such building in the Shire, and shall, accompanying such notice, supply the following particulars:—
 - (a) The situation of the building which it is proposed to remove;
 (b) The situation of the land on which it is proposed to re-erect or place such building.

And shall at the same time produce to the Council, its secretary or engineer, such information as will enable it or him to satisfy itself or himself whether or not such building has been condemned as dilapidated, insanitary, or unfit for human habitation. On receipt of such notice particulars, and information, and the proper fee, the Shire Secretary shall inspect such building before removal, and shall report to the Council whether, in his opinion, such building, when removed and re-erected, will be in compliance with the provisions of the Shire Secretary reports that such building, when removed and re-erected, will be in accordance with such By-laws and Regulations, then the Shire Secretary may grant a permit for its removal and re-erection in the Shire, but not otherwise.

4. No building which has been condemned as dilapi-And shall at the same time produce to the Council,

- 4. No building which has been condemned as dilapidated, insanitary, or unfit for human habitation shall be removed and re-erected within the Shire unless the requirements of section 5 be complied with.
- 5. No building in which any case of infectious or contagious disease has occurred, and which is intended to be wholly or partly used as a dwelling-house shall be removed into and erected within the Shire, or removed from one part of the Shire to another, and erected there

unless the same has been thoroughly fumigated and dis-infected to the satisfaction of some duly qualified medical practitioner, or of the health inspector of any municipal council, as testified by a certificate signed by either (r both of such authorities, and produced to and retained by the Council by the Council.

by the Council.

All timber and material which, in the opinion of the Shire Secretary, is unsound or defective shall be removed and replaced with sound material. Such building, when completed, shall also comply with the By-laws and Regulations of the Shire (the conditions in this section shall not apply to buildings to be used as stables or sheds, provided the same comply in all other respects with the By-laws and Regulations of the Shire).

6. Nothing herein contained shall prevent the alteration of the position of any building within boundaries of the land on which the same stands.

7. If any building shall be removed into and created.

- 7. If any building shall be removed into and erected within the Shire, or removed from one part of the Shire to another, and erected there contrary in either case to any of the provisions of this By-law, or if any building which shall have been so removed shall be in such a dilapidated, ruinous, or unsafe condition as to be dangerous to the public safety, the owners of such building, upon receiving from the Council or its Shire Secretary, a notice in writing requiring him to pull down and reupon receiving from the Council or its Shire Secretary, a notice in writing requiring him to pull down and remove the said building, shall comply with such notice within the time limited by such notice. And, if default shall be made in complying with such notice, the Council may, on the expiration of the time therein limited, pull down and remove such building, and may sell any of the materials thereof, and apply the proceeds of such sale in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such building, and paying into the Municipal Fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.
- 8. The following fees shall be payable to the Shire by the owner or person removing any building upon giving the notice mentioned in section 3 of this By-law:
 - notice mentioned in section 3 of this By-law:—

 (a) For examining any building which it is proposed to remove into and erect within the the Shire of Mulgrave, or to remove from any one part of the Shire to another part and crect there, whether the same is approved or not—Within a radius of 5 miles, 10s.; any greater distance, fee to be fixed by the council, and after approval;

9. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Shire of Mulgrave, but shall not apply to any Government railway or municipal building, nor to any building in course of removal through and beyond the shire.

REGULATION OF TRACTION ENGINE TRAFFIC.

A By-law of the Shire of Wannon, made under sub-section 29 of section 1917 of the Local Government Act 1903, and numbered 16, for prohibiting or regulating for use on any public highway of traction engines or other vehicles having projections on their wheels, and under section 594 of the said Act for regulating the conditions on which traction engines may proceed over any public highway. public highway.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1903, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Wannon order as follows:—

Bars, Spikes, Grips, or other Projections on Wheels.

1. No person shall use or cause or procure any other or other vehicle having on its wheels any bars, spikes,

grips, or other projections.

This prohibition, however, shall not apply to—

- (a) Any traction engine used only for hauling agriy traction eight used only for hadding agri-cultural machinery or hauling a vehicle con-taining such machinery only, if the projections on the driving wheels of such machine consist only of bars at least two and three-quarter inches in width, and not more than one and one-sixteenth of an inch in thickness, and the space intervening between such bars does not exceed five inches; or
- (b) Any traction engine, the driving wheels of which are cylindrical and smooth-soled, and having no projections thereon other than diagonal bars of not less than three inches in width nor more than three-quarters of an inch in thick-ness, and extending the full width of the tire, and the space intervening between such bars not exceeding three inches, provided in such last-mentioned case-
 - (1) That the owner of such engine has previously obtained from the Council, or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf, a permit, in writing, specifying the public highways on which it may be used, and that the engine is being used on one of the highways so specified.
 - (2) That the owner has agreed, in writing, to pay to the Council the cost of making good any damage done to any roadway, bridge, or culvert by such engine, or any vehicle drawn by it.
 - (3) That such engine is not being used (unless with the written consent of the Council, or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf) to haul more than two vehicles, exclusive of any vehicle solely used for carrying water for such engine.
 - (4) That the loading of any vehicle drawn by such engine does not exceed nine tons twelve hundredweights in weight, including the weight of such vehicle.
 - (5) That the weight carried by any vehicle drawn by such engine (including the weight of such vehicle) does not exceed three hundredweight for each laft-inch of bearing surface of the tire or felloe of each wheel of such

Weight of Engine, &c., to be Painted thereon.

2. Every owner of a traction engine shall cause to be painted in legible letters not less than one inch long, on a plate attached to the engine, or on a conspicuous place on the engine, the exact and true weight thereof, and the maximum weight of water and fuel necessary for its pro-

Person to be in Attendance whilst Engine contains in itself sufficient Motive Power to move it.

So long as the fires of a traction engine are alight, or the traction engine contains, in itself sufficient motive power to use it, one person shall remain in attendance whilst it is on any public highway, although it is stationary.

Taking Engine across or along Bridges, Embankments, &c.

4. No person shall take any traction engine across or along any bridge, culvert, or embankment so as to meet or pass thereon any other traction engine or any person with a horse or vehicle drawn by a horse.

5. No person shall halt (unless through unforeseen circumstances, or unless actually engaged in loading or unloading) in any part of a road where the traffic is narrowed by fences, excavations, embankments, dangerous depressions, or such like, but shall draw off at least twenty feet from the middle of the formation in the case of a made road, or the middle of the surveyed road, if unmade.

Engines not to Halt on Bridges or Culverts.

6. No person shall permit any traction engine or any vehicle attached to or drawn thereby, to stop on any bridge or culvert for the purpose of drawing water, or for any other purpose whatever.

Driving Engine between Sunset and Sunrise.

Driving Engine between Sunset and Sunrise.

7. No person shall drive any traction engine between sunset and sunrise, unless by written permission of the Council or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf, defining the route to be travelled and the extended hours during which such travelling is permissible. Such permission to be withdrawable at any time upon written notice to that effect being served on the owner or driver of the engine, or being forwarded to him by registered letter. No person who has received such written permission shall drive any traction engine between sunset and sunrise, unless there shall be exhibited between sunset and sunrise, unless there shall be exhibited on such engine proper and sufficient carriage or other approved lights, one at each side on the front, and one on the rear, or when a vehicle or vehicles are being drawn by such engine, then in the rear of the last vehicle.

Skidding of Wheels of Engine.

8. The driver of a traction engine shall shut off steam immediately the driving wheels of the engine commence to skid, and he shall not start the engine again until he has taken all the necessary and proper means to prevent damage being done to the highway by the skidding of the wheels ding of the wheels.

Penalties.

Any person shall, for any wilful act or default contrary to this By-law, be liable to the following penalty:—

 (a) For the first offence, a fine not exceeding Three

pounds.
(b) For the second offence, a fine not exceeding Five

pounds.
(c) For any subsequent offence, a fine not exceeding Ten pounds.
