PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of One million two hundred and forty-four thousand nine hundred and nineteen pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and fourteen and One thousand nine hundred and fifteen."

"An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Three hundred and eighty thousand four hundred and sixty-one pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and thirteen and One thousand nine hundred and fourteen."

"An Act to revoke the Permanent Reservation of portion of certain Land in the City of Caulfield as a Site for Public Recreation."

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, has, by an Order made on the 7th day of September, 1914, authorized the Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust to obtain for its temporary accommodation, in pursuance of section 271 of the *Water Act 1905*, an advance from the Commercial Bank of Australia Limited, Warracknabeal, by overdraft of the Trust's current account thereat, such overdraft not to exceed at any one time the sum of Five hundred pounds (£500).

THE GEELONG WATERWORKS AND SEWERAGE TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 35.

A By-law for the Making and Levying of Rates for the Year commencing the 1st day of July, 1914.

THE Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Trust (hereinafter called the "Trust"), in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on such Trust by the *Water Acts* and of any other powers and authorities in any wise enabling the said Trust in that behalf, doth hereby make the By-law following for the area supplied with water by the Geelong Water Supply Works, or any extension of such works:—

1. The following rates are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the said area, and supplied with water for domestic purposes other than by measure:—

- (I.) On any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) the annual valuation whereof does not exceed £16—Twenty shillings per annum.
- (II.) On any such tenement the annual valuation whereof exceeds £16—Six pounds five shillings per centum on the amount of the annual valuation up to £300; Five pounds per centum on the amount of the annual valuation exceeding £300 and up to £700; and Three pounds fifteen shillings per centum on the amount of the annual valuation exceeding £700.
- (III.) On lands on which there is no building—Six pounds five shillings per centum on the amount of the annual valuation.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the 1st day of July, 1914, and ending with the 30th day of June, 1915, and shall be payable in two equal instalments, on the 12th day of September, 1914, and the 2nd day of January, 1915.

3. Such persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates.

4. For making and levying such rates within the said area, the valuation for the time being for all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all the purposes for such rate be determined by a Police Magistrate.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE MERBEIN CEMETERY.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the Trustees of the Merbein Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*.
2. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below the ordinary level of the ground, and a layer of earth at least six inches thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.
3. The Trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person having paid the fee for a private grave, and requiring a brick grave or vault, shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the Trustees; but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron securely cemented.
4. The Cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from Seven a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.
5. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the Cemetery unless with the previous authority of the Trustees.
6. No dogs shall be allowed in the Cemetery.
