QUARTERLY STATISTICAL ABSTRACT

TO, 30TH JUNE, 1914.

QUARTERLY STATISTICAL ABSTRACT, 30TH JUNE, 1914.

Population.—The estimated population on 31st March, 1914, was 1,417,972; on 30th June, 1914, it was 1,421,985—thus showing an increase of 4,013 persons. The natural increase in the population was 5,056, but the excess of emigration was 1,013. New South Wales gained from this State 3,573 persons, Queensland 1,546, and Western Australia 587, whereas this State gained from Tasmania 2,421 persons, from New Zealand 252, and from the United Kingdom 2,444 persons.

Vital Statistics of the State.—The marriages—3,253—were 309 more, the births—9,036—were 83 fewer, the deaths—4,030—were 352 more, and the excess of births over deaths was less by 435 than in the corresponding quarter of the previous year. Of the total number of deaths, 256 were due to phthisis, and 56 to other tubercular diseases, 277 to cancer, 31 to typhoid fever, and 69 to diphtheria and croup.

Vital Statistics of Melbourne, &c.—The births during the quarter numbered 4,324. This includes 41 cases of twins, and 367 illegitimate births. The deaths numbered 2,100, and the excess of births over deaths was 2,224. The deaths from diphtheria and croup numbered 35, from typhoid fever 3, and from tubercular diseases 181, as against 36, 5, and 165 respectively in the corresponding quarter of the previous year. The total deaths in Melbourne were 2,100, of whom 320 were under twelve months of age. In Ballarat, of 178 deaths, 21 were of infants; in Bendigo, of 180 deaths, 27 were of infants; and in Geelong, of 102 deaths, 16 were of infants. In the four towns mentioned there were 881 deaths of people aged 65 years and upwards—or 34 per cent. of the total.

Victorian Banking Returns.—On the 30th June the liabilities to the public of the Associated and Commonwealth Banks were £52,649,425, and the assets £50,130,985, as against £48,220,999 and £48,744,916 on the 30th June, 1913. The reserves of the associated banks amounted to £10,444,392, and paid-up capital to £17,814,321. The ratio of coin, bullion, and notes to liabilities of all the banks was 19·90.

State Savings Banks.—On the 30th June the amount at credit of the 718,281 depositors in the State Savings Banks was £23,266,826. During the quarter 33,212 accounts were opened, and 25,991 were closed; the deposits made were £4,783,105, and the withdrawals £4,627,015.

Gold Yield.—The total yield of gold up to the end of June, 1914, is 73,744,637 ounces.

Imports and Exports.—The total value of oversea imports into Victoria during the quarter under review was £6,084,497, and the total oversea exports during the same period were valued at £2,387,845, as compared with £5,505,188 and £2,425,629 respectively in the corresponding quarter of the previous year.

Exports of Frozen, Preserved, and Perishable Products.—For the second quarter in 1914, the total value of these exports oversea through Cool Stores was £199,062, of which £82,303 went to the United Kingdom, £13,205 to South Africa, and £103,554 to Eastern and other ports. The principal exports were—Beef, valued at £80,336; Fruit, £45,845; Butter, £44,628; and Mutton and Lamb, £10,768.
