## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor in and over the State of Victoria and its dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS by the Price of Goods Act 1914 (Act No. 2516) it is among other things provided that the Governor in Council may by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette add to the Schedule to the said Act any kind or kinds of goods and it has been decided to add thereto Pollard and Bran Now therefore I the Governor aforesaid acting with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State do by this Proclamation add to the Schedule to the Price of Goods Act 1914 the kinds of goods following (that is to say):—

(a) Pollard.

(b) Bran.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria, at Melbourne, this fourteenth day of October, One thousand nine hundred and four-teen, and in the fifth year of the reign of His Majesty King George V.

Infectious Diseases Hospital Act 1914. REGULATIONS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fourteenth day of October, 1914.

## PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria. Mr. Brown l Mr. Hutchinson.

UNDER the powers by section 34 of the Infectious Diseases Hospital Act 1914 in that behalf conferred to make Regulations for or with respect to the infectious or contagious diseases which may be treated in the Queen's Memorial Infectious Diseases Hospital at Fairfield, His Excellency the Governor of the State

of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth make the Regulation following (that is to say):—

- 1. The infectious or contagious diseases which may
  be treated in the Queen's Memorial Infectious
  Diseases Hospital at Fairfield shall be the
  following, namely:—

  - (a) Diphtheria.
    (b) Measles.
    (c) Scarlet Fever.
    (d) Whooping Cough.

And the Honorable James Drysdale Brown, His Majesty's Minister of Public Health for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
