I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

- “An Act to sanction the issue and application of certain Sums of Money available under Loan Acts for Irrigation Works Water Supply Works Drainage and Flood Protection Works in Country Districts and for other purposes.”
- “An Act to authorize the Construction by the State of a Line of Railway from Koo-wee-rup to McDonald's Track.”
- “An Act to sanction the issue and application of certain Sums of Money available under Loan Acts for Railways and other purposes.”
- “An Act to provide for the transfer of a sum of not more than Ninety thousand pounds from 'The Developmental Railways Account' to the Consolidated Revenue.”

BOATMEN and others are hereby notified that permission has been granted to the Melbourne Amateur Regatta Association, in connexion with their Annual Regatta, to row races on the Henley course, on the Upper Yarra, on the 24th October, 1914, and that motor and other boats permitted to be on the river during the day must observe the following Regulations, viz.:-

Boat races must not be obstructed, nor public safety or order endangered.

Every motor boat must have a supply of dry sand, and carry a bucket for fire extinguishing purposes, and no inflammable oil or spirit to be exposed.

All non-competing boats must keep off the course during the racing programme.

No boats (except racing boats) are allowed to land or take up passengers at the boat stagings (south bank), or from the bank along the Henley Reserve except at the landing stage.

Any boat overcrowded or incompetently managed may be ordered to disembark its passengers.

No boat deemed by the Port Officer or his Deputy to be too large or deemed to be offensive, dangerous, unsuitable, or unsightly shall remain on the river along the course or adjacent waters.

The direction of the officers in charge of the course must be strictly attended to.

All boats (except racing boats) must move up stream along the right hand (south) bank, and must move down stream along the opposite (north) bank.

No boat will be permitted to show any advertisement or any objectionable device.

No fireworks or firearms are allowed to be discharged from any boat, except such as have permission of the Port Officer or his Deputy.

All motor boats shall hold a permit from the Port Officer to enter or remain on that part of the River Yarra between Prince's-bridge and the Punt-road bridge, between the hours of 12 noon and 12 midnight on Henley Day, provided that all motor boats shall be at their moorings not later than 12.30 p.m., and remain moored until the finish of the racing programme.

Applicant for permit must apply at the office of the Port Officer, Customs House, Flinders-street, Melbourne, and furnish the name and dimensions of the boat for which a permit is required; also the name and address of the owner, and of the person taking charge of the boat on Henley Day. If the boat is unnamed, some identification number must be affixed to each bow of the boat.

All motor boats to be moored in the positions allotted to them by 12.30 p.m.

No permit shall be given to a motor boat exceeding a length of 35 feet from stem to stern, unless the Port Officer shall see fit to do so. It is recommended that row boats shall be in attendance on large motor boats for transporting passengers, also that a gangway be provided for each motor boat to enable passengers to reach the bank.

No permit shall be given for boats burning other than liquid fuel.

After sunset on Henley Day motor boats shall exhibit a red light, and go slow in the centre of the river only. Motor boats shall not tow any boat.

Permit shall not be transferable by holder or in respect of motor boats.

Acceptance of permit shall be a guarantee that its holder and the boat it is issued for will observe the regulations, whether general or special.

A limited number of moorings will be available along Henley Reserve, and early application to the Port Officer for same is invited. Applicant must give name and dimensions of boat, and must provide his own mooring ropes. Pegs will be supplied.

Motor boats not moored along the Henley Reserve must either use the mooring pegs provided on the north or south side of the river, or provide their own mooring pegs at places directed by the officer controlling the course.

On Henley Day the length of oars used by any boat, other than racing boats, between Punt-road bridge and Prince's-bridge, shall not exceed 12 feet.

## DECLARATION OF MAIN ROADS IN THE SHIRES OF OMEO AND RUTHERGLEN.

**W**HEREAS by the Resolution set out below and dated the fifth day of October One thousand nine hundred and fourteen the Country Roads Board incorporated under the *Country Roads Act 1912 (Act No. 2415)* being of opinion that the highways in the State of Victoria set out or described in the Schedule to the same were of sufficient importance to be main roads and acting under the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the said Act declared such highways to be main roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the Act aforesaid: And whereas the said Act among other things provides that the Governor in Council might by Order published in the *Government Gazette* confirm such Resolution whereupon any road mentioned in such Resolution should be a main road: And whereas it is deemed desirable to confirm the Resolution so made and passed by the said Country Roads Board: Now therefore I the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the same do hereby confirm such Resolution and declare upon the publication of this Order in the *Government Gazette* the roads mentioned in the Schedule to such Resolution of the Country Roads Board main roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the *Country Roads Act 1912*.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this twelfth day of October, One thousand nine hundred and fourteen, and in the fifth year of His Majesty's reign.

## RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTRY ROADS BOARD ABOVE REFERRED TO.

The Country Roads Board incorporated by the *Country Roads Act 1912 (Act No. 2415)*, at a meeting now holden being of opinion that the highways within the State of Victoria set out or described in the Schedule hereunder written are of sufficient importance to be main roads, acting under the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the said Act, doth by this resolution hereby declare such highways to be main roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the said *Country Roads Act 1912*.

## SCHEDULE.

## Shire of Omeo.

2. *Glen Wills-road*.—Commencing at the bridge over Day's Creek near its junction with the Livingstone Creek; thence northerly generally along the right bank of the creek last named to and across the bridge west of allotment 9, parish of Cobungra; thence along the left bank of the same creek to the most northerly angle of allotment 12A, parish of Bingo Munjie North; thence generally north-westerly and westerly to a point on the western boundary of allotment 2, section 10, nineteen chains, more or less, from its south-eastern angle; thence north-westerly, northerly, and generally north-westerly to a point on the western boundary of allotment 25, fifteen chains, more or less, from its north-western angle; thence

generally westerly by an irregular course to and across the Cobungra River at a point one mile ten chains, more or less, north-east of the north-eastern angle of allotment 13, parish of Bundara Munjie; thence generally north-easterly and north-westerly along the left bank of the Big River to and across the bridge over the same, fourteen chains more or less south of the most southerly angle of allotment 18, parish of Wollonaby; thence generally north-easterly through the township of Glen Wills to its junction with the Sunnyside-Staleyville road; thence north-westerly, south-westerly, and westerly through the township of Sunnyside; thence generally northerly and north-easterly to its intersection with the northern boundary of the shire.

3. *Benambra-road*.—Commencing at its junction with the Glen Wills-road at the most westerly angle of allotment 1, section 3, parish of Cobungra; thence north-easterly to the north-western angle of allotment 5A, section 3; thence generally north-easterly and northerly to the north-eastern angle of allotment 3A, section 1; thence north-easterly through the township of Hinnomunjie; thence continuing north-easterly to the most southern angle of allotment 4, section 10, parish of Hinnomunjie; thence north-westerly and north-easterly to the most easterly angle of allotment 2, section 10; thence north-westerly, northerly, and easterly through the township of Benambra to the north-western angle of allotment 1, section 11; thence south-easterly and north-easterly to the south-eastern angle of allotment 7, section 11, at the western boundary of the Omeo pre-emptive section.

## Shire of Rutherglen.

1. *Sydney-road*.—Commencing at the bridge over the Rocky Water Holes Creek near the most westerly angle of allotment 1, section Z, parish of Chiltern West, on the southern boundary of the shire; thence north-easterly and easterly along the northern boundaries of the allotment aforesaid and allotments 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6, section Z, to the north-eastern angle of the allotment last named on the eastern boundary of the shire.

*Note*.—The route of portion of this road between the Shires of Rutherglen and North Ovens is already set out in the description of road routes in the Shire of North Ovens.

2. *Springhurst-Rutherglen road*.—Commencing at the south-eastern angle of allotment 25, parish of Bontherambo, on the southern boundary of the shire; thence northerly crossing the Doma Munji or Black Dog Creek to the north-eastern angle of allotment 10A, section M, parish of Lilliput; thence north-easterly and northerly running alongside the railway line to the south-western angle of allotment 15, section 45A, parish of Carlyle, on the eastern boundary of the borough of Rutherglen.

3. *Rutherglen-Wahgunyah road*.—Commencing at the western boundary of the borough of Rutherglen on the southern boundary of allotment 5, section 17, parish of Carlyle; thence westerly to the south-western angle of allotment 4, section 10; thence northerly and north-westerly to the south-eastern angle of allotment 2, section 4; thence westerly and northerly through the township of Wahgunyah to the left bank of the Murray River at the Wahgunyah Bridge.

4. *Shepparton-road*.—Commencing at the western boundary of the borough of Rutherglen, on the northern boundary of the parish of Lilliput; thence westerly, south-westerly, and southerly to the south-eastern angle of allotment 4, section B, parish of Norong; thence westerly and south-westerly to the south-eastern angle of allotment 3B, section K; thence westerly to the north-western angle of allotment 6, parish of Boorhaman; thence continuing westerly along the boundary between the Shires of Rutherglen and North Ovens, to the bridge over the Ovens River, on the western boundary of the shire.

5. *Wodonga-road*.—Commencing at the eastern boundary of the borough of Rutherglen at the north-western angle of allotment 2, section 45A, parish of Carlyle; thence north-easterly to the north-western angle of allotment 4, section L, parish of Gooramadda; thence easterly to the north-eastern angle of allotment 18A, section A; thence southerly to the north-western angle of allotment 19, section A; thence easterly to the Indigo Creek on the eastern boundary of the shire.

6. *Chiltern-Howlong road*.—Commencing at the south-eastern angle of allotment 32A, section B, parish of Gooramadda, on the boundary of the shire; thence northerly and north-westerly to the north-western angle of allotment 5, section B; thence generally northerly to the left bank of the Murray River at the Howlong Bridge on the northern boundary of the shire.

## BOROUGH OF DAYLESFORD WATERWORKS TRUST.

## RATING BY-LAW, 1915.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities contained by the *Water Act 1905*, make the following By-law:—

## By-law numbered 34.

Fixing the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied within the Trust district, such rate being made for the year commencing on the first day of January, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1915.

The rates and charges which shall be payable by the occupiers or owners of the lands or tenements within the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust district who are supplied with water by the Trust shall be as follows:—

1. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel or wine shop, of the annual value of £20 or under, the sum of One pound one shilling per annum.
2. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel or wine shop, above the annual value of £20, and not exceeding the annual value of £200, the sum of £5 per cent. on the valuation.

3. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel or wine shop, above the annual value of £200, the sum of £4 10s. per cent. on valuation.

4. On every hotel or wine shop of the annual value of £30 or under, a minimum rate of £2 per annum.

5. On every hotel or wine shop above the annual value of £30, the sum of Six per cent. per annum on the valuation, provided that the charge shall not in any case be less than £2.

6. On unoccupied lands and lands on which no tenements are erected, nor water laid on, the sum of £5 per cent. on the annual valuation. Should water be laid on, the charge to be in accordance with the rates fixed in this By-law for tenements.

7. On livery, coach, and hotel stables, at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for the first stall and 7s. 6d. per annum for each additional stall. In open sheds used for stabling, each six feet is to be considered one stall. For horses kept on private premises, Ten shillings per annum for the first horse kept, and Seven shillings and sixpence for each additional horse kept.

Cows to be paid for at the rate of One shilling each per annum.

Water-troughs, Ten shillings each per annum.

8. Water supplied by meter to be at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, except to manufacturers, aerated water makers, &c., to whom the charge shall be One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons, provided that not less than 60,000 gallons per annum is consumed, failing which the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

9. Water supplied for irrigation of gardens, nurseries, cricket grounds, &c., to be charged for at the rate of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum quantity charged for shall be 20,000 gallons per annum.

10. For water supplied to buildings in course of erection, the charge shall be Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of the contract for brickwork, stonework, or plastering, or should the Trust require a meter to be put on, the rate shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

11. For water supplied to steam boilers, the charge shall be at the rate of Ten shillings per horse-power per annum.

12. The charge for water supplied for mining purposes shall be as per agreement.

13. The rates and charges shall be payable by equal half-yearly instalments, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1915, except in cases where the Trust has made especial agreement regarding the times of payment for water supplied by measure, or for mining purposes.

14. Such person or persons as the Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover such rates and charges.

15. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure, except in the case of special agreement with the Trust, shall be the quantity for which the charge at One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate if the water was supplied otherwise than by measure.

The foregoing By-law, numbered 34, was made and adopted by the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust this Twenty-first day of September, 1914.

#### REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES IN THE PARISH OF TERANG.

WE, William Kucks, Alfred William Reardon, Walwin Williams Nicholls, Robert Deverell, John Ramage Murfett, Maurice Thomas Doyle, Peter Laurence Norris, Henry Percy Bennett, Charles Edward Moon, Henry Samuel Tippett, and Hewlett Breton, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 20th January, 1914, as a site for Public purposes in the parish of Terang, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 109 of the *Land Act 1901*.

#### REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates in or around the reserve, or cut names on the fences, gates, trees, or seats, or stick bills thereon, or roll or throw stones in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
5. No person shall put into the Reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
9. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sunday.
10. No person shall shoot, trap, or otherwise destroy any wild fowl or birds of any description in the Reserve, or discharge any firearms therein.
11. No person shall engage in any band or other musical performance in the Reserve, or any part thereof, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

The issue of this licence shall not prevent the land comprised therein, or any part or parts thereof, being sold, leased, licensed, alienated, or dealt with under any of the provisions of the *Land Acts*, except, under the 187th section of the *Land Act* 1901, or being resumed by order of the Governor or Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, for any of the purposes for which land may be reserved under section 10 of the *Land Act* 1901, or for mining purposes.

2. In case the said land, or any part thereof, should be sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid, the licensee shall not be entitled to any compensation other than that which the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the *Land Acts* may think fit.

3. This licence is subject to the rights of the holders of miners' rights or of mining leases now issued or hereafter to be issued to enter upon the allotment hereby licensed, and to search for gold, and to mine thereon, and to erect and occupy mining plant and machinery, without making any compensation to the licensee, his executors, administrators, or assigns, for surface or other damage.

4. Subject to these conditions, the licensee shall be entitled to use the land for the purpose for which this licence has been granted, until such land, or any part thereof, has been sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid, and thereupon all the interest of the licensee therein shall cease and be determined.

5. No land comprised in roads from time to time surveyed and marked out within the boundaries of the land comprised in this licence shall be deemed within its operation.

6. 6. No tree shall be felled so as to fall into any water-course, or so as to obstruct any road or track.

7. No tree of less than 5 inches diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground shall be stripped when of the black or feather-leaved variety, or less than 2½ inches in diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground, when of the broad-leaved species, unless otherwise stated herein, and wherever a size limit is mentioned it shall be at a height of 2 feet from the ground. ## SHIRE OF UPPER YARRA.

## BY-LAW No. 15.

A By-law of the Municipality of the Shire of Upper Yarra, numbered 15, and made under the provisions of the *Municipal Grounds Act 1905* and the *Local Government Act 1903*, for the purpose of regulating charges of admission to and the conduct of persons at or within the Recreation Reserves of Warburton and Yarra Junction within the said Shire.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Municipal Grounds Act 1905* and the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Upper Yarra do hereby order as follows:—

1. That the Reserves shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.

2. The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the Reserves on such days (not exceeding 12 in any one year) as the Reserves may be set apart for sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements, shall be as follows:—

For admission of every adult, such sum as the Council may determine, not exceeding 1s.

For admission of every saddle horse, exclusive of rider, such sum as the Council may determine, not exceeding 1s.

For admission of every carriage, cart, or other vehicle drawn by one horse, such sum as the Council may determine, not exceeding 2s.

For the admission of every additional horse, such sum as the Council may determine, not exceeding 6d.

3. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency, as regards dress, language, or conduct.

4. No society, club, picnic party, or other combined body shall use the Reserve without the consent, in writing, of the Council.

5. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or in any way damage any of the buildings, gates, fences, or other property in or around the Reserves, or pollute any water thereon, or remove therefrom any soil, sand, or manure.

6. No person shall interfere with the trees, shrubs, or other property in the Reserve, or roll or throw any stones or other missiles thereon, or commit any nuisance, or leave in the Reserves any bottles, orange peel, paper, cast-off clothing, or other litter.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserves, or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, or hawk or offer for sale therein any goods or articles of any description, without the permission of the Council in writing.

8. No person shall light any fire in the Reserves without the permission, in writing, of the Council.

9. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserves, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

10. No person shall bring into the Reserves any dog, unless led by a cord or chain, without the authority in writing of the Council; and all dogs, goats, and poultry found wandering in the Reserves shall be liable to be destroyed.

11. No person shall place in the Reserves any horses, cattle, sheep, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Council. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserves, and an account thereof be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

12. No person shall engage in any game or sport, or in dancing, in the Reserves, or use the bicycle track therein on Sundays.

13. Every person hiring or erecting in the Reserve any booth, tent, table, or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, or for the purpose of any game or amusement, shall pay such fee as the Council may from time to time determine.

14. No person shall play any unlawful game or make any wager for money, or by unseemly conduct interfere with the comfort and enjoyment of others within the said Reserves.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding five pounds (£5) for each offence; and every person who, knowingly and wilfully, offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such constable and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

Resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council on the 7th September, 1914, and confirmed on the 5th October, 1914.

## SHIRE OF WINCHELSEA.

## BY-LAW No. 20.

A By-law to prevent the danger from the driving of vehicles at night without light in the Shire of Winchelsea.

WHEREAS by section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903* power is given to any Municipality to make By-laws for the suppression of nuisances. And whereas the driving of vehicles and machines at night without light is a nuisance, by reason of the danger thereby caused to wayfarers, and it is necessary to prevent and suppress the same. Now therefore we, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Winchelsea, order as follows:—

1. The By-law made and passed by the Council of the Shire of Winchelsea on the 2nd day of August, 1872, and numbered 6, intituled "By-law made under the provisions of Part XII. of the Shires Statute No. 358, to prevent and suppress the driving of vehicles along the Geelong to Warrnambool main road, in the Shire of Winchelsea, at night without lights, by reason of the danger caused to wayfarers thereby," shall be and is hereby repealed.

2. Any person who during the hours between any sunset and the following sunrise shall in, upon, or along any road, street, thoroughfare, or place used as such within the limits of the Shire of Winchelsea, drive any vehicle constructed for the conveyance of persons, shall have a good and serviceable carriage lamp securely fixed and properly lighted on the off or each side of the front of such vehicle.

3. The driver of any waggon, cart, or dray (whether such waggon, cart, or dray be upon springs or otherwise), who shall drive the same, whether for hire or otherwise, in, upon, or along any street, road, thoroughfare, or place used as such within the limits of the Shire of Winchelsea during the hours between any sunset and the following sunrise, shall carry a lamp or lantern properly and sufficiently lighted and attached to or suspended from the off-side of such waggon, cart, or dray in such manner as to be plainly visible to the driver of any vehicle proceeding along the same street, thoroughfare, or place in a contrary direction to that in which such waggon, cart, or dray shall be proceeding.

4. No machine carrying any person shall be propelled in, upon, or along any road, street, thoroughfare, or place used as such within the limits of the Shire of Winchelsea during the hours between any sunset and the following sunrise unless a lamp shall be attached to the same, so constructed and placed as to exhibit a light in the direction in which the machine is proceeding, and such lamp shall be so lighted and kept

lighted as to afford adequate means of indicating the approach and position of such machine.

5. The expression "machine" appearing in this By-law shall mean any vehicle used for locomotion or carriage, whether driven by manual or pedal power or by any mechanical means, but shall not include perambulators. The expression "driver" shall mean the person in charge of or propelling the machine.

6. The driver of any vehicle or machine offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, on conviction thereof before one or more Justices of the Peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings.
