- The owner of every piece of vacant or unoccupied land supplied with water must provide a trough, with approved self-acting ball tap to prevent overflow.

The charge for water supplied from and after the 1st day of January, 1915, from the works of the Trust shall be as follows:—

1. For street water troughs, Twenty shillings per year; all water troughs to be fitted with approved self-acting ball taps, to prevent overflow.

2. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Fifteen shillings per annum for each horse-power of such boiler.
3. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement for manufacturing purposes, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, Sixpence for every 1,000 gallons.
4. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement for domestic and other than domestic purposes, One shilling for every 1,000 gallons.

On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Fourteen pounds and not exceeding the annual municipal value of Nineteen pounds, the sum of One pound fifteen shillings per annum.

On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Nineteen pounds and not exceeding the annual municipal value of Twenty-six pounds, the sum of One pound seventeen shillings and sixpence per annum.

On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Twenty-six pounds, the sum of One shilling and fivepence in the pound sterling upon the amount of the annual municipal valuation.

On each unoccupied allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District separately from any buildings, the sum of Two shillings and sixpence in the pound sterling upon the amount of the annual municipal valuation.

On every house, tenement, or land situate otherwise than in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down, and which house, tenement, or land is not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such house, tenement, or land is over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half a mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

2. For every house and tenement over Twelve (12) pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling and ninepence (1s. 9d.) in the pound sterling.

3. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land, a rate of One shilling and ninepence (1s. 9d.) in the pound sterling shall be paid up to One pound maximum.

4. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for when used for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which, at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure. Where water is used solely for other than domestic purposes it shall be charged for half-yearly, and the minimum quantity to be charged for during each half-year shall be 10,000 gallons.

5. The Trust reserve the right of putting on a meter and supplying water by measure.

6. For the right to use a hose for watering ornamental plots or gardens not exceeding one square chain, Ten shillings shall be charged, and Eight shillings for every additional chain, such right not to be exercised between the hours of Nine p.m. and Six a.m. Any person who transgresses this provision, or wastes or misuses the water of the Trust, or interferes with any property vested in or controlled by the Trust, shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

7. For a temporary supply during the erection of a building or repairs, One pound per cent. shall be charged on the cost of the brickwork, stonework, and plastering; or the Trust may cause a meter to be fixed and a charge made by measure; or a special agreement may be made for the supply.

8. For every water-trough, a charge of Twenty (20) shillings shall be made; but on unoccupied lands, if the owner or occupier desires a trough, his rate payment shall be reckoned part of that One pound (£1).

9. For every steam boiler supplied, except by special agreement, a charge of Thirty shillings per each horse-power shall be made.

10. For a supply to livery or carriers' stables, a charge of Five (5) shillings per each stall shall be made.

11. The fee to be paid for a plumber's licence shall be One pound per annum.

12. Provided that where persons within the Waterworks Trust District desire to have the service-pipes of the Trust extended to their properties, and are willing to pay the cost of such extension, the Trust shall have power to make a special arrangement with them regarding the payment for water supplied so as to cover their outlay.

13. The rates and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1915, provided that the charge for a temporary supply shall be paid in advance, or as may be agreed upon.

14. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover such rates and charges.

The foregoing By-law was passed by the Commissioners of the Mansfield Waterworks Trust this first day of October, 1914, and the seal of the said Trust was affixed hereto in the presence of—

WHEREAS by the 49th section of the *Explosives Act 1890* it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time by Order define for the purposes of the First Part of the said Act the composition, quality, and character of any explosive, and may classify explosives: Now therefore, in pursuance of the above-mentioned provisions of the said Act, His Excellency the Governor of Victoria doth, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, order as follows:—

There shall be added to the list of Explosives defined and classified in the Order in Council No. 1 made on the 12th day of October, 1909, the following explosives, the composition, quality, and character of which are hereby defined:—

CLASS 3.—NITRO-COMPOUND.

Division 1.

Ammon-Ligdyn, consisting of a mixture of nitro-glycerine, nitrate of ammonium, oxalate of ammonium, nitrate of soda, and woodmeal; provided that the proportions of nitro-glycerine, oxalate of ammonium, and nitrate of soda do not amount to more than 10 per cent., 15 per cent., and 15 per cent. respectively, or the woodmeal to less than 4 per cent. of the finished explosive; and provided that the explosive is contained in cartridge wrappers or cases made thoroughly waterproof with melted paraffin or other suitable waterproofing material.

Kynarkite, consisting of a mixture of nitro-glycerine, nitrate of potassium, nitrate of barium, oxalate of ammonium, and woodmeal; provided that the proportions of nitro-glycerine and oxalate of ammonium do not amount to more than 26 per cent. and 15 per cent. respectively, and that the proportion of woodmeal (dry) does not amount to less than 31.5 per cent. of the finished explosive.

Winter Gelignite, consisting of gelignite as already defined with the addition of not more than 10 per cent. di-nitro-toluene, and provided that the percentage of nitro-glycerine does not exceed 58 per cent.

Super Excellite No. 3, consisting of a mixture of nitro-glycerine, nitro-cotton, nitrate of ammonium, chloride of sodium, oxalate of ammonium, starch, and castor oil; provided that the proportions of nitro-glycerine, nitro-cotton, and castor oil do not exceed 13 per cent., 1 per cent., and 2 per cent. respectively of the finished explosive, and that the proportion of chloride of sodium and oxalate of ammonium together does not exceed 30 per cent. of the finished explosive; provided that the explosive is kept in thoroughly waterproof cartridge wrappers or cases.

4. Melbourne District will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office. The Williamstown District will include the Borough.

5. The contractor will be bound to place the firewood in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. 10. Any infringement of these conditions, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from any accounts which are or may be due to the contractor, and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement, and all other respects.
