### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

#### LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

##### TRIENNIAL GENERAL RENEWAL OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

##### Important Notice to Electors.

IT is hereby notified that all persons who are holders of electors' rights issued before or on the 1st December, 1913, must, not later than the 1st December next, obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names retained upon the new General Electoral Lists, which will be made up forthwith after that date.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from such Lists.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the Registrar, but the renewed right will be equally available for any election that may take place before the coming into force of the new rolls in February, 1915.

Intending applicants for electors' rights are cautioned to apply early to the Registrar. If application be postponed until the last day allowed for the purpose, the Registrar may be unable to issue rights to all applicants, and those to whom rights are not issued will not be enrolled, and will lose their title to vote.

No person whose name is on, or entitled to be on, any roll of ratepaying electors for any division of a province may obtain an elector's right for such province.

Persons of foreign birth who desire to obtain electors' rights must, if not already naturalized, obtain letters of naturalization, without which they are not qualified.

Each applicant for an elector's right for the Legislative Council should provide himself with a Sixpenny duty stamp necessary for payment for the right.

ORDER APPROVING OF MAKING DEVIATION FROM A MAIN ROAD IN THE SHIRE OF FLINDERS.

WHEREAS the Country Roads Board constituted under the *Country Roads Act 1912* (Act No. 2415) has represented to the Governor in Council that it appears to it desirable that the deviation hereinafter referred to from the existing Flinders-Mornington road (declared to be a main road under the said Act which declaration was confirmed by the Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* of the 14th day of January, 1914, page 92) should be made by the Board: And whereas the said Board in accordance with the requirements of section 19 of the said cited Act has caused to be prepared a map plan and estimate showing the points between which and on and through what land the said deviation is proposed to be made and the cost of acquiring the land and of constructing the said deviation: And whereas on an inspection of the said map and plan and a consideration of the said estimate the Governor in Council is satisfied that there are funds legally available for acquiring the land and constructing

the said deviation: Now therefore be it known by this present Order that the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby approve of the said road being made, that is to say:—

A road 1 chain wide: Commencing at a point on the western boundary of an unnumbered allotment south of the Dromana Race-course allotment, parish of Kangerong, distant about 10 chains south of the south-west corner of the said race-course allotment; thence north-easterly through the unnumbered allotment and race-course allotment for a distance of about 17 chains; thence north-westerly to the western boundary of the race-course allotment to a point 15 chains south-easterly from the north-western angle of the said allotment.

And the Honorable F. Hagelthorn, His Majesty's Minister of Public Works for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

## TRARALGON WATERWORKS TRUST.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1915.

A By-law for making a rate for the year 1915 on the rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Traralgon Waterworks Trust, which District has, for the purposes of the Water Act 1905, been proclaimed an Urban District; also for dealing with the charges for the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust.

A RATE of One shilling and threepence in the pound shall be paid on the annual value of all rateable property in the Waterworks District, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate for the Shire of Traralgon; but no such rate for tenements shall be less than One pound two shillings and sixpence (£1 2s. 6d.).

2. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land, the municipal value of which does not exceed Three pounds per annum, the sum of Seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.). When such value is over Three pounds and under Eight pounds, the sum of Ten shillings (10s.). When such value is Eight pounds or over, a rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound.

3. When water is supplied by measure for domestic or other than domestic purposes, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at the price named, would be equal to the rate payable in respect of such property if the water were supplied otherwise than by measure.

4. When water is supplied solely for other than domestic purposes, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be supplied during each year ending on the 31st December shall be 15,000 gallons. The charge hereby made shall be payable on demand by the Trust.

5. The Trust may, by notice in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier using water for other than domestic purposes solely, that the water supplied is to be charged for by measure, and may by such notice require such owner or occupier to provide a meter within one month after the receipt of such notice, and thereupon such owner or occupier shall, within the time specified, at his own expense, provide a meter.

6. In all cases not herein provided for, the Trust shall make such special provision as may be deemed necessary.

7. The foregoing rates are made payable on the 1st March, 1915.

8. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

## ROCHESTER WATERWORKS TRUST.

By-law of the Rochester Waterworks Trust for determining, making, and levying rates and charges payable in respect of the supply of water within the Urban District of the said Trust, and for preventing the undue waste of water.

**T**HE Rochester Waterworks Trust, pursuant to and by virtue of the provisions of the *Water Act 1905* and of every other power enabling the said Trust in this behalf, doth hereby make the following By-laws, that is to say:—

No. 1. The following rates and charges are those which all occupiers or owners of lands and tenements situated within the Urban District of the Rochester Waterworks Trust shall pay in respect of the supply of water by the said Trust for the year 1915:—

- (a) For every house or tenement of Eleven pounds annual municipal valuation and under, a rate of One pound seven shillings and sixpence sterling per annum.
- (b) For every house or tenement of more than Eleven pounds and not exceeding Twenty pounds annual municipal valuation, a rate of One pound ten shillings sterling per annum.
- (c) For every house or tenement of more than Twenty pounds and not exceeding Twenty-four pounds annual municipal valuation, a rate of One pound twelve shillings and sixpence sterling per annum.
- (d) For every house or tenement of the annual municipal valuation of Twenty-five pounds and upwards, an annual rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling on the amount of such valuation.
- (e) For each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before mentioned separately from any building, a rate of Three shillings in the pound sterling on the amount of the annual municipal valuation of the same.
- (f) A minimum rate of One pound five shillings sterling, and a maximum rate of Four pounds sterling, as the Commissioners may determine, shall be charged every person using a hose for gardening or stabling watering during the year, in addition to the rate on the annual municipal valuation.
- (g) For every trough or other receptacle used for watering horses or other stock, a rate of One pound sterling per annum. Provided that the trough or other receptacle is situated within the Trust District, a rate of Fifteen shillings per annum will be charged.
- (h) The charge for water supplied by meter shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons up to the maximum quantity covered by the rate payable in respect of the property in connexion with which the meter is affixed, and One shilling per 1,000 gallons for all water used in excess of such quantity for garden or stable purposes, and Sixpence per 1,000 gallons for manufacturing purposes.
- (i) For a temporary supply of water during the erection of new buildings, a sum of Ten shillings per centum on the amount of the contract for brickwork and plastering shall be made, or, if there be no contract, then upon the value or on the amount charged or paid for brickwork and plastering. All persons about to build must notify the Trust of their intentions to do so.
- (j) In any case where rates, meter charges, or other charges are not paid when due, the water may be cut off until such amounts are paid.
- (k) The charge for water supplied from the Trust standpipe shall be Threepence for each 100 gallons.

No. 2. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties, half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1915, and 1st day of July, 1915.

No. 3. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates and charges.

## BOORT WATERWORKS TRUST.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR 1915.

By virtue of the *Water Act 1905*, By-law for Imposing, Levying, and Receiving Water Rates and Charges within the Boort Waterworks Trust District.

**T**HE following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Boort Waterworks Trust District shall pay for the year 1915, namely:—

2. On every house or tenement abutting or fronting every street within which the Trust shall have laid a main pipe for the purpose of supplying water, and such house or tenement, being of the annual value of Twenty pounds or less, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement for the said year, the sum of One pound fifteen shillings.

3. On every house or tenement abutting or fronting any street within which the Trust shall have laid a main pipe for the purpose of supplying water, and such house or tenement, being above the annual value of Twenty pounds, according to the municipal valuation for the said year, the sum of One shilling and ninepence (1s. 9d.) in the pound of such valuation.

4. On every house or tenement not abutting or fronting a street within which the Trust shall have laid a main pipe for the supply of water, and to which house or tenement the water shall not have been laid on, a rate of Thirteen shillings and sixpence shall be paid where the municipal valuation of such house or tenement does not exceed Eighteen pounds. Where such valuation exceeds Eighteen pounds, a rate of Ninepence in the pound shall be paid, provided that in no case shall a rate of less than Thirteen shillings and sixpence be paid.

5. In every case where the water shall have been laid on to a house or tenement not abutting or fronting a street within which the Trust shall have laid down a pipe for the purpose of supplying water, the rates provided by clauses 2 and 3 of this By-law shall be paid.

6. Every consumer of water must provide meters; all excess water over allotment covered by the valuation rate to be charged for at the rate of 10½d. per 1,000 gallons.

The above rates shall be due and payable on the first day of February, 1915.

Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates.

**T**HE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

172. 14. In addition to their salaries, head teachers of day primary schools will, from 1st July, 1914, be paid monthly allowances for maintenance expenses, according to the following scale, subject to an equitable deduction in the case of schools that become connected with a sewerage system. *Special payments will be made in the case of schools held in orphanages or charitable institutions.* The head teacher of any school may, with the sanction of the Minister, be granted a special allowance to meet any extra cost of maintenance. The difference between the scale in force immediately prior to 1st July, 1914, and the subjoined scale, and any increase in any special allowance that may be made in consequence of the amended scale of payments shall be and shall continue to be paid to the cleaner in addition to the amount he was in receipt of prior to such increase being granted and no reduction shall be made in the total amount payable to the cleaner in the event of a change of cleaners being made.

7. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs with the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall play or engage in cricket, football, tennis, or any game whatever in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, unless such person at the time of playing is a member of any club which has been duly authorized to play in the Reserve or is a member of a visiting team engaged in competition with any such club.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

#### REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR BOTANIC GARDENS PURPOSES AT CASTLEMAINE.

WHEREAS by section 200 of the *Land Act* 1901 it is enacted that where, under the provisions of any Act relating to Crown lands, the Governor in Council has reserved from sale permanently any Crown lands for any public purpose whatsoever, or for any of the purposes specified in section 10 of such Act, and has vested such land in trustees or jointly in the Board of Land and Works and trustees, it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council, to make Rules and Regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sub-section (1) of the section specified. And whereas a Crown grant has issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Castlemaine in respect of the reserve for Botanic Gardens purposes at Castlemaine. Now therefore the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Castlemaine, do hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the reserve for Botanic Gardens as aforesaid:—

#### REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset.

2. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

3. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

4. No person shall in any way interfere with the trees, shrubs, flowers, statuary, fountains, or other property in the Reserve, or with the birds therein, or throw stones, or bird-nest, or commit any nuisance in the Reserve, or leave any bottle or any orange or

banana peel, paper, cast-off clothing, or other litter, or light fires therein, or smoke in the nursery or any other reserved place in the Reserve.

5. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates in or around the Reserve, or cut names on the fences, gates, trees, or seats, or stick bills thereon, or roll or throw stones in the Reserve.

6. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve, or any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained.

7. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained, and all dogs otherwise found within the Reserve shall be liable to be destroyed.

8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any nurseries or any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

9. No person shall put in the Reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

10. No person shall remain within the Reserve at any time when lawfully directed by any officer or employé of the Trustees, or any person duly authorized in that behalf, to leave the Reserve.

11. No person shall sell or offer for sale in the Reserve any article of food or drink or other commodity, or operate any money-making amusement without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 200 of the *Land Act* 1901, on conviction before any justice be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who so offends and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or officer or servant of the Trustees, or by any constable, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer, or servant, or constable, and taken before some justice, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

## CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of firewood or charcoal which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

All the firewood supplied under these contracts must be split out of large timber, and of the kind or kinds specified in the

schedule, and must be dry, perfectly sound, and of good burning quality, and cut into billets of the lengths stated in the schedule, such billets to be not less than four inches nor more than six inches in any diameter. The long wood to be not less than nine inches nor more than eighteen inches in any diameter. Neither burnt wood, heart wood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. If the firewood is obtained from a State forest timber reserve or ordinary Crown lands, persons cutting and removing same must be provided with a licence or permit from the State Forests Department. Charcoal must be of the very best description for the purpose for which it is required, and subject to approval of the officer ordering.

3. The orders will be issued by the departments requiring the supplies, and the firewood or charcoal shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. Should an order not be complied with within forty-eight hours it will be competent for the department concerned to purchase the firewood or charcoal at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense (if any) over and above the contract price will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

4. Melbourne District will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office. The Williamstown District will include the Borough.

5. The contractor will be bound to place the firewood in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. The stacks are to be five feet high, and of the width of the length of the firewood specified in the various schedules, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets or lengths are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack, and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. 7. As soon as the orders shall have been completed the contractor will be required to furnish to the department supplied his account in the prescribed form, with the receipted delivery order attached thereto. Accounts will be payable at any Receipt and Pay Office that the contractor may desire.

8. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the firewood or charcoal as to the quality, the same shall be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final.

9. If the board shall decide that the firewood or charcoal is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere and the extra expense (if any) will be deducted as in condition 3.

10. If from any cause injury would accrue to the public service by waiting for a board of survey, the head of the department or officer in charge will have the power to reject such firewood or charcoal as is obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected article, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 3.

11. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quality or quantity of the firewood or charcoal, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct; and the amount may be deducted as in condition 3.
