PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.; Vice-Admiral of the State of Victoria.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the Prize Courts Act 1894 and of certain Commissions and Warrants issued thereunder, I did, on the nineteenth day of August, One thousand nine hundred and fourteen, proclaim that war had broken out between His Majesty and the German Emperor; and did, on the twenty-first day of August aforesaid, proclaim that war had broken out between His Majesty and the Emperor of Austria, King of Hungary. King of Hungary:

And whereas a state of war now exists between His Majesty the King and the Sultan of Turkey:

Now therefore I, Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, the Vice-Admiral aforesaid, being satisfied thereof by information received by me, do hereby proclaim that war has broken out between His Majesty the King and the Sultan of Turkey.

Given under my Hand and Seal, at Government House, Melbourne, this tenth day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and fourteen, and in the fifth year of the reign of His Majesty King George V.
