ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCH.—POWER TO DISPOSE—LAND, TALBOT.

5. Obtaining Evidence for Foreign Tribunals (19 & 20 Vic. C.113; 33 & 34 Vic., c. 52. S. 24).

39. Where under the Foreign Tribunals Evidence Act 1856, or the Extradition Act 1870, section 24, any civil or commercial matter or any criminal matter is pending before a Court or Tribunal of a foreign country and it is made to appear to the Court or a Judge, by Commission Rogatoire or Letter of Request, or other evidence as hereinafter provided, that such Court or Tribunal is desirous of obtaining the testimony in relation to such matter of any witness or witnesses within the jurisdiction, the Court or a Judge may, on the exparte application of any person shown to be duly authorized to make the application on behalf of such foreign Court or Tribunal, and on production of the Commission Rogatoire or Letter of Request, or of a certificate signed in the manner, and certifying to the effect mentioned in section 2 of the Foreign Tribunals Evidence Act 1856, or such other evidence as the Court or a Judge may require, make such order or orders as may be necessary to give effect to the intention of the Acts abovementioned in conformity with section 1 of the said Foreign Tribunals Evidence Act 1856.

40. An order made under the last preceding rule shall be in Form numbered 1 in the Schedule to these Rules, with such variations as circumstances may require.

41. The examination may be ordered to be taken

to. An order hatte thier state preceding rule sain be in Form. numbered I in the Schedule to these Rules, with such variations as circumstances may require.

41. The examination may be ordered to be taken before any fit and proper person nominated by the person applying, or before any officer of the Court, or such other qualified person as to the Court or a Judge may seem fit.

42. Unless otherwise provided in the order for examination the person before whom the examination is taken shall, on its completion, forward the same to the Prothonotary of the Supreme Court, and on receipt thereof such officer shall append thereto a certificate, in Form numbered 2 in the Schedule to these Rules, with such variations as circumstances may require, duly sealed with the seal of the Supreme Court, and shall forward the depositions so certified, and the Commission Rogatoire or Letter of Request, if any, to the Attorney-General of the State of Victoria for transmission to His Majesty's Secretary of State for the Colonies. The Court or a Judge may in any case and at any time order that the certified depositions and the Commission Rogatoire or Letter of Request (if any) shall be forwarded to the Attorney-General of the State of Victoria for transmission direct to the Foreign Court or Tribunal desirous of obtaining the said testimony.

An order made under Rule 39 of this Order may, if the Court or a Judge think fit, direct the said examination to be taken in such manner as may be directed by the Commission Rogatoire or Letter of Request from the Foreign Court, or therein signified to be in accordance with the practice or requirements of such Court or Tribunal, or which may, for the same reason, be requested by the applicant for such Order. But, in the absence of any su'h special directions, the examination shall be taken in the manner prescribed by the rules and practice of the Court.







# WOODEND WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING BY LAW FOR THE YEAR 1915.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Woodend Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1905, hereby make the following By-law:—

1. The following rates and charges are those respectively which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the boundaries of the Trust District, that is to say: is to say:-

- (1) For every house or tenement used wholly or as a domicile a rate of One shilling in the pound on the Shire assessment. Minimum, as fixed by the Governor in Council, Twenty

- as fixed by the Governor in Council, Twenty shillings.

  (2) For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Twenty shillings per boiler per annum.

  (3) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons.

  (4) Any person who shall obtain water, or may be supplied with water from the public standpipes, or any or either of them, in the said district, shall pay the sum of Ten shillings per annum. per annum.
- 2. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water shall be supplied by measurement shall be:
  - t shall be:—

    (a) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, will be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
    (b) If for other than domestic purposes only 30,000 gallons per half-year.

    Such rate is hereby unde for the year 1915, com-
- 30,000 gallons per nail-year.

  3. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1915, commencing on the 1st January, 1915, as also the charges for every steam boiler and for water supplied from public stand-pipes, and shall be payable by half-yearly instalments on 1st January, 1915, and 1st July, 1915.

  4. All other charges by measurement shall be paid half-yearly, on 1st January, 1915, and 1st July, 1915.

5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the

  3. That every boy under the age of sixteen years and every female shall receive Sixpence teamoney each evening he or she works overtime.

  4. That none of such females or boys shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.

  5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

#### TIME OF COMPLETION.

That the tramway shall be completed and open for traffic within a period of three years from the date of the Order in Council authorizing the construction of the tramway.

#### TRAFFIC.

That the tramway shall be used for the carriage of passengers and such parcels or packages as they may have in their possession.

NECESSARY PRECAUTIONS FOR SAFETY OF PASSENGERS AND PUBLIC TO BE OBSERVED.

That every precaution necessary to secure the safety of the passengers upon the said tramway, and also to secure the safety of passengers passing along the streets upon the route of such tramway, shall be taken and ordered by the said Council of the said municipality.

STOPPAGES FOR TAKING UP AND SETTING DOWN PASSENGERS.

That for the convenience of the public the cars shall stop for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers at the intersection of such streets as are indicated by notice boards or other sufficient devices creeted at such intersections to be stopping points, and at such other points upon the route of the tramway as may be convenient, and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic of the streets or the safety of the passengers in the cars.

### TOLLS AND CHARGES.

That the charges to be made upon the said tramway shall be One penny for each passenger on each of the following sections, or part thereof:—

- (a) From the corner of Fraser and Patterson streets to corner of Kerferd-road and Richardsonstrect.
- (b) From the corner of Armstrong and Danks streets to the corner of Kerferd-road and
- Canterbury-road.
  (c) From the corner of Wright and Danks streets to the corner of Albert-road and Clarendonstreet.
- ·(d) From the corner of Kerferd-road and Danks-street to corner of Park and Clarendon streets.
- (c) From the corner of Kerferd-road and Canter-
- bury-road to Hanna-street.

  (f) From the corner of Albert-road and Clarendon-street to corner of Sturt-street and Grant-
- (g) From the corner of Park and Clarendon streets to terminus at St. Kilda-road.

For each child under twelve years of age (other than children under four years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free), One penny for any one of the above sections, or for any two continuous sections, provided, however, that for any one or more sections the fare to be charged for two children travelling together under the age of twelve years shall not exceed the fare charged for one adult.

### THROUGH FARES.

That the charges to be made upon the said tramway for each passenger from St. Kilda-road to Fraser-street shall be Threepence, and for each child under twelve years of age (other than children under four years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free), Twopence.

With power also to run cars at minimum or through farcs upon the said tramway for any specified distance, provided that the amount of such minimum or through fare shall not exceed the total sum of the sectional farcs upon such tramway, or such parts of such tramway over which the cars shall be run. Every such car shall have a notice or notices plainly exhibited on the outside of such car indicating its destination and the minimum fare chargeable thereon. fare chargeable thereon.

SPECIAL CARS.

That the charge to be made-

- (1) For the hire of a special car, with a seating capacity not exceeding thirty-six persons, 1s. 6d. per car mile between the hours of 6 a.m. and midnight, and 2s. 6d. per car mile after midnight.
- (2) For the hire of a special car, with a scating capacity exceeding thirty-six persons, 2s. 6d. per car mile between 6 a.m. and midnight, and 3s. 6d. per car mile after midnight. The car mileage shall be the mileage run by the car from the time of its leaving the depôt until its return thereto. Provided always, however, that a minimum charge of £1 ls. may be made for the hiring of any special car between 6.30 a.m. and midnight, and £2 2s. between midnight and 1 a.m., and the sum of 5s. per hour per car for detention during the journey for which such special car is hired. hired.

#### SPECIAL TICKETS TO SCHOOL CHILDREN.

That the charge to be made for return tickets to school children under the age of eighteen years over any two sections shall be One Penny, and for any four sections Twopence, subject to such conditions as to the days on and the hours between which such return tickets shall be available as the Council may by regulations determine, also in such regulations to limit the right of travel in respect of such return tickets to a portion only of the

ELECTRIC WIRES CROSSING LINES OF RAILWAYS COM-MISSIONERS TO BE CONSTRUCTED SO AS NOT TO INTERFERE.

Any electric line or lines in connexion with the said tramway which would cross under or over any wire of the Commissioners, or which would, in the opinion of the Commissioners, be in a position likely, if special precautions be not taken, to prejudicially affect the operation of the trains when electrified, or the maintenance of telegraphic or telephonic communication, or the transmission of signals on adjacent wires of the Commissioners, shall, to the satisfaction of and without any expense to the Commissioners, be so placed, constructed, guarded, and maintained as not to be capable, in the opinion of the Commissioners, of injuring or coming into contact with any wire of the Commissioners, or of prejudicially affecting or interfering, either mechanically or electrically with the proper use of any such wire.

#### TRAMWAY WHERE PASSING UNDER THE ST. KILDA RAILWAY LINE AT KERFERD-ROAD.

That in respect of the tramway passing under the St. Kilda railway line at Kerferd-road, the Council shall defray the actual cost, whether more or less than the estimated cost of £3.216, which will be necessary in providing an additional opening and raising the railway line at Kerferd-road, and that the wires and other attachments be fixed to the bridge, and subsequently maintained to the satisfaction of the Railways Commissioners, and that, in addition, the Council shall also pay to the Railways Commissioners the sum of £10 per annum to cover the cost of the future maintenance of the additional opening referred to. additional opening referred to.

Cost of Alteration to Postal Wires Incidental to use of Electricity.

In the event of the Postal Department demanding any special alteration of its wires in consequence of the introduction of a high-tension or other electrical current in connexion with the transway, the cost of any special arrangement of or provision for the wires because of such current shall be paid and borne by the Council.

#### FARES IN CASE OF COMBINED TRAM AND RAILWAY Passengers.

Nothing herein contained shall prevent the Council from entering into any arrangement with the Railways Commissioners to sell through tickets to travel over both tramway and railway, and in that case charging or providing for the payment of fares at a lower rate than those specified in this Order in respect of passengers travelling over both tramway and railway.

COUNCIL NOT TO ENTER INTO CERTAIN ARRANGEMENTS WITH MELBOURNE TRAMWAY AND OMNIBUS COMPANY

It is a condition of this Order that the Council shall not enter into any arrangement with the Melbourne Tramway and Omnibus Company Limited, or other, the authority for the time being concerned in the tramways now controlled by that company, nor be a party, directly or indirectly, to any arrangement whereby through passengers, that is, passengers travelling over both the tramway now so controlled as aforesaid (hereinafter called the "Melbourne Tramway"), and the Council's tramway, may travel for lower fares than the sum of the local fares on both tramways, nor shall the Council sell Melbourne tramway tickets or furnish passengers intending to travel by the Melbourne tramway with transfer tickets, or any means of identification or in any way assist or facilitate passengers travelling over both tramways to travel for lower fares than the sum of the local fares on both tramways. of the local fares on both tramways.

COUNCIL NOT TO RUN OVER LINES CONTROLLED BY MEL-BOURNE TRAMWAY AND OMNIBUS COMPANY LIMITED.

It is a further condition of this Order that the Council It is a further condition of this Order that the Council shall not acquire the right to run, nor shall it run any of its cars or other vehicles on or along any or any part of the lines now controlled by the Melbourne Tramway and Omnibus Company Limited, or on or along any extension of any such lines, or any part of the same, nor give a better service in connexion with the trams of the Melbourne Tramway and Omnibus Company Limited than the service connecting with the trains of the Commissioners, nor shall the Council permit the cars or other vehicles of the Melbourne Tramway and Omnibus Company Limited or other, the authority for the time being concerned in the tramways now controlled by that company, to run over the tramways of the Council, nor shall pany, to run over the tramways of the Council, nor shall such cars be so run.

GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL TO BE SOLE JUDGE OF BREACH OF ORDER,

That the Governor in Council shall be sole judge of the compliance with, or of the breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order, and for the purpose of enabling the Governor in Council to arrive at a just decision, an inquiry into the facts of each case shall be conducted in the manner provided in clause 25 of the regulations contained in the second schedule to the said Act, before an officer to be appointed in that behalf by the Governor in Council, as provided in the regulations in the said schedule. in the said schedule.

If upon report to the Governor in Council by the If upon report to the Governor in Council by the referee, made under the said clause 25 of the regulations in the second schedule of the said Act, the Governor in Council shall, as such sole judge, determine that there has been any failure of or non-compliance with, or that any breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order has occurred by way either of commission or omission, then the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall cease and determine, or shall be suspended, as the Governor in Council shall direct, and in the case of the Governor in Council ordering a suspension only of such powers, then the Governor in Council shall, in his adjudication, state for what period such suspension shall take effect. period such suspension shall take effect.

THE land is situated on the South Australian Border, between Pinnaroo and Panitya, and was formerly known as the "Disputed Territory." It is from 4 to 11 miles from Pinnaroo Railway Station, and from 10 to 15 miles from Murrayville Railway Station.

The Murrayville-Pinnaroo railway line, now in course of construction, passes through the centre of the sub-division.

That the lessee shall not transfer, assign, mortgage, or sublet, or part with the possession or grant the use of the whole or any part of the allotment during the first six years of the term of the lease, and that after the first six years of the term of the lease the lessee shall not sell, transfer, assign, mortgage, or sublet the whole or

any part of the allotment unless and until the lease has been indorsed under the seal of the Board to the effect that all the conditions and covenants of the lease during the first six years thereof have been complied with.

No person who already holds or has previously selected the area of Mallee land allowed by classification will be eligible to apply.

The total area of Mallee land which may be selected is 640 acres if in the first class, or 1,000 acres if in the second class, or 1,280 acres if in the third class. Any further area {limited as by the next succeeding paragraph) can be obtained only by purchase from other persons.

That a special condition shall be inserted in the lease and the Crown Grant, providing that the land referred to therein shall at all times be maintained and used for the purpose of residence or agriculture and grazing, and that no person will be permitted to subsequently acquire or hold, or have an interest in, more than 1,000 acres, if the land be in the first class, or more than 1,600 acres, if the land be in any other class.

That the lessee or grantee or owner shall preserve the timber on, or plant an area of, not less than 3 per cent. of the total extent of his holding. (N.B.—Along the exposed boundary lines, viz., the western and southern, would be preferable.)

No person, unless specially authorized, will be permitted to clear timber from any portion of areas retained for the purposes of roads and windbreaks.

- 16. The licensee shall keep the land free from vermin, and, should he fail to do so, the licence shall be liable to forfeiture.
- 17. This licence is issued subject to the right of sawmillers to graze on this area such horses and bullocks as are actually used in connexion with their licensed operations on this land.
- 18. In the event of the area being damaged by fire, the licence may be forfeited unless the licensee satisfy the Minister that neither he, directly or indirectly, nor his workmen or servants were in any way responsible therefor

### Special Conditions.

- 1. The period of occupation will, except where otherwise specified, be for nine months from 1st January, 1915, to 30th September, 1915.
- 2. The fee for the period as shown in the head-lines—for which the licence will be issued, and fee for licence—must accompany the tender, otherwise the offer of the next highest tenderer who complies with this condition may be accepted.
  - 3. Separate tenders must be lodged for each block.



Tenders for sup ly of forage to more than five separate stations in any one district must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit of 10s. for each and every station tendered for except in the case of the Melbourne District, the preliminary deposit for which shall be £25 with each tender, irrespective of the number of stations tendered for, and the State Plantation at Wait, the preliminary deposit for which shall be £10. Deposits must be in bank notes, or bank drafts payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application; such deposit will be forfeited in the event of the tenderer, after the lime fixed for the closing of tenders, withdrawing or attempting to withdraw his tender, or of the successful tenderer failing to complete the necessary bond within a reasonable time after the acceptance is notified.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to hold contracts for Government supplies for a period of two years.

The price must include delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

For police stations, excepting the depôt and institutions other than police, the successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for the sum of £5 per horse per station, and for the depôt and other institutions a bond based on one-quarter of the total amount of the tender accepted, such bonds to be entered into within a reasonable time after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts where the sum stated in the bond is £50 and upwards, and one surety where the sum stated is under £50.

### CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

- 1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or caten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; cats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description, full kernel, clean, and free from wild cats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from caten hay of the best quality. As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.
- 2. The quantities stated in the schedule are only approximate, and the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned. Should new telegraph stations be formed or additional horses be required at any station, the contractor will be required to supply the extra forage. Unless otherwise specified in the tender form the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station, should the additional number of permanent horses exceed two.
- 3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depôt may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six niles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, and also forage for any extra horses that may be at any time stabled at the depôt for police purposes, at the same rates. The contract for the supply of forage to the Military Barracks may be terminated by three months' notice being given by the Secretary to the Tender Board to the contractor of such determination.
- 4. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.
- 5.
