## IN THE SUPREME COURT.

THE following Rules shall be added to Order 37:—

5. Obtaining Evidence for Foreign Tribunals (19 & 20 Vic. C.113; 33 & 34 Vic., c. 52. S. 24).

39. Where under the *Foreign Tribunals Evidence Act 1856*, or the *Extradition Act 1870*, section 24, any civil or commercial matter or any criminal matter is pending before a Court or Tribunal of a foreign country and it is made to appear to the Court or a Judge, by Commission Rogatoire or Letter of Request, or other evidence as hereinafter provided, that such Court or Tribunal is desirous of obtaining the testimony in relation to such matter of any witness or witnesses within the jurisdiction, the Court or a Judge may, on the *ex parte* application of any person shown to be duly authorized to make the application on behalf of such foreign Court or Tribunal, and on production of the Commission Rogatoire or Letter of Request, or of a certificate signed in the manner, and certifying to the effect mentioned in section 2 of the *Foreign Tribunals Evidence Act 1856*, or such other evidence as the Court or a Judge may require, make such order or orders as may be necessary to give effect to the intention of the Acts abovementioned in conformity with section 1 of the said *Foreign Tribunals Evidence Act 1856*.

40. An order made under the last preceding rule shall be in Form numbered 1 in the Schedule to these Rules, with such variations as circumstances may require.

41. The examination may be ordered to be taken before any fit and proper person nominated by the person applying, or before any officer of the Court, or such other qualified person as to the Court or a Judge may seem fit.

42. Unless otherwise provided in the order for examination the person before whom the examination is taken shall, on its completion, forward the same to the Prothonotary of the Supreme Court, and on receipt thereof such officer shall append thereto a certificate, in Form numbered 2 in the Schedule to these Rules, with such variations as circumstances may require, duly sealed with the seal of the Supreme Court, and shall forward the depositions so certified, and the Commission Rogatoire or Letter of Request, if any, to the Attorney-General of the State of Victoria for transmission to His Majesty's Secretary of State for the Colonies.

43. The Court or a Judge may in any case and at any time order that the certified depositions and the Commission Rogatoire or Letter of Request (if any) shall be forwarded to the Attorney-General of the State of Victoria for transmission direct to the Foreign Court or Tribunal desirous of obtaining the said testimony.

44. An order made under Rule 39 of this Order may, if the Court or a Judge think fit, direct the said examination to be taken in such manner as may be directed by the Commission Rogatoire or Letter of Request from the Foreign Court, or therein signified to be in accordance with the practice or requirements of such Court or Tribunal, or which may, for the same reason, be requested by the applicant for such Order. But, in the absence of any such special directions, the examination shall be taken in the manner prescribed by the rules and practice of the Court.

45. Where a Commission Rogatoire or Letter of Request, as mentioned in Rule 39 of this Order, is transmitted to the Supreme Court by His Excellency the Governor, with an intimation that it is desirable that effect should be given to the same without requiring an application to be made to the Court by the agent in Victoria or any of the parties to the action or matter in the foreign country, the Prothonotary shall transmit the same to the Crown Solicitor, who may thereupon,

with the consent of the Attorney-General, make such applications and take such steps as may be necessary to give effect to such Commission Rogatoire or Letter of Request, in accordance with these Rules.

WOODEND WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING  
BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1915.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Woodend Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, hereby make the following By-law:—

1. The following rates and charges are those respectively which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the boundaries of the Trust District, that is to say:—

- (1) For every house or tenement used wholly or as a domicile a rate of One shilling in the pound on the Shire assessment. Minimum, as fixed by the Governor in Council, Twenty shillings.
- (2) For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Twenty shillings per boiler per annum.
- (3) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons.
- (4) Any person who shall obtain water, or may be supplied with water from the public stand-pipes, or any or either of them, in the said district, shall pay the sum of Ten shillings per annum.

2. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water shall be supplied by measurement shall be:—

- (a) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, will be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (b) If for other than domestic purposes only 30,000 gallons per half-year.

3. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1915, commencing on the 1st January, 1915, as also the charges for every steam boiler and for water supplied from public stand-pipes, and shall be payable by half-yearly instalments on 1st January, 1915, and 1st July, 1915.

4. All other charges by measurement shall be paid half-yearly, on 1st January, 1915, and 1st July, 1915.

5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rate and charges.

The foregoing By-law was made by the Commissioners of the Woodend Waterworks Trust on the 27th day of October, 1914.

DECLARATION OF MAIN ROADS IN THE SHIRES OF GLENELG, GLENLYON, GOULBURN, HAMPDEN, HOWQUA, KEILOR, KILMORE, KYNETON, MANSFIELD, MELTON, MERRIANG, METCALFE, MINHAMITE, MOUNT ALEXANDER, MOUNT ROUSE, NEWHAM AND WOODEND, NORTH OVENS, OXLEY, PORTLAND, SEYMOUR, TOWONG, VIOLET TOWN, WANNON, AND WODONGA.

WHEREAS by the Resolution set out below and dated the second day of November One thousand nine hundred and fourteen the Country Roads Board incorporated under the *Country Roads Act 1912* (Act No. 2415) being of opinion that the highways in the State of Victoria set out or described in the Schedule to the same were of sufficient importance to be main roads and acting under the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the said Act declared such highways to be main roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the Act aforesaid And whereas the said Act among other things provides that the Governor in Council might by order published in the *Government Gazette* confirm such Resolution whereupon any road mentioned in such Resolution should be a main road And whereas it is deemed desirable to confirm the Resolution so made and passed by the said Country Roads Board Now therefore I the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the same do hereby confirm such Resolution and declare upon the publication of this Order in the *Government Gazette* the roads mentioned in the Schedule to such Resolution of the Country Roads Board main roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the *Country Roads Act 1912*.

## RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTRY ROADS BOARD ABOVE REFERRED TO.

## Shire of Kilmore.

1. *Sydney-road*.—Commencing at the south-western angle of allotment 9, section D, parish of Lowry, on the southern boundary of the Shire, thence north-easterly through the town of Tallarook, crossing the North-Eastern railway line near the Tallarook Station, thence generally northerly to and across the bridge over the Sunday Creek, thence generally northerly, easterly, and southerly to and across the bridge over the Goulburn River, thence generally easterly and north-easterly through the township of Seymour, to the north-eastern angle of allotment 3, section 10, parish of Seymour, thence crossing the railway line and continuing north-easterly alongside the said railway through the township of Mangalore, to the north-western angle of allotment 1n, section E, parish of Avenel, thence easterly, northerly and north-easterly to the most northerly angle of allotment 11, section 30, township of Avenel, thence south-easterly, north-easterly and south-easterly to the most easterly angle of section 10, thence north-easterly across Hughes Creek to the most southerly angle of section 7, thence north-westerly and westerly to the north-western angle of section 24, thence northerly to the north-western angle of allotment 23, section C, parish of Avenel, thence north-easterly alongside the North-Eastern railway line to the north-eastern angle of allotment 38, section G, on the northern boundary of the Shire.

2. *Goulburn Valley-road*.—Commencing at its intersection with the Sydney-road at the most southerly angle of allotment 4, section X, parish of Seymour, thence north-westerly and northerly to the north-eastern angle of allotment 3, section 4, thence continuing northerly to and across the bridge over Hughes Creek, near the south-eastern angle of allotment 9c, section F, parish of Avenel, on the northern boundary of the Shire.

3. *Upper Goulburn-road*.—Commencing at its intersection with the Sydney-road at the most westerly angle of allotment 48, section C, parish of Lowry, thence north-easterly, south-easterly, and north-easterly to the most northerly angle of allotment 3n, parish of Traawool, thence south-easterly, southerly and south-easterly generally alongside the Tallarook-Yea railway line to the most northerly angle of allotment 122A, parish of Windham, thence continuing south-easterly, north-easterly, and southerly along the boundary between the Shires of Seymour and Broadford to and across the bridge over the King Parrot Creek east of the south-eastern angle of allotment 132, on the southern boundary of the Shire.

#### Shire of Towong.

1. *Omco-road*.—Commencing at the township of Tallangatta thence south-easterly and generally southerly following the course of the Mitta Mitta River, and crossing the said river at the north-eastern angle of allotment 2A, parish of Yabba, thence south-westerly to and again crossing the aforesaid river, thence south-westerly and generally south-easterly following the course of the said river through the township of Eskdale, to the township of Mitta Mitta, thence south-easterly following the course of the Snowy Creek, through the township of Granite Flat, thence southerly and south-easterly to the southern boundary of the Shire near the Mt. Wills.

2. *Murray Valley-road*.—Commencing at the western boundary of the Shire at the bridge over the Ovens River east of the Bethanga Railway Station, thence north-easterly through Bethanga and Talgarno to the north-eastern angle of allotment 15, parish of Talgarno, thence generally easterly and north-easterly following the course of the Murray River to Burrowby.

3. *Tintaldra-road*.—Commencing at the bridge over the Murray River at Tintaldra on the southern bank of the river, thence southerly and south-westerly following the course of the Cudgewa Creek, to its junction with the Corryong-road near the south-western angle of allotment 6a, parish of Cudgewa.

4. *Corryong-road*.—Commencing at the bridge over the Murray River at Bringenbrong on the western bank of the river, thence westerly and south-westerly through the township of Corryong, thence further south-westerly crossing the Nariel Creek thence further westerly and north-westerly to its junction with the Tintaldra-road near the south-western angle of allotment 6a, parish of Cudgewa.

5. *Wodonga-road*.—Commencing at the north-western angle of allotment 3, section 6A, parish of Beethang, on the western boundary of the Shire, thence easterly following the Tallangatta railway line to the township of Tallangatta.

#### Shire of Violet Town.

1. *Sydney-road*.—Commencing at the most easterly angle of allotment 2, parish of Balmattum, on the south-western boundary of the Shire, thence north-easterly to the north-western angle of allotment 123, thence continuing north-easterly through the town of Violet Town, and generally alongside the North-Eastern railway line to the most northerly angle of allotment 42n, parish of Warrenbayne, on the eastern boundary of the Shire.

2. *Violet Town-Dookie road*.—Commencing at the Violet Town Railway Station Reserve, thence north-easterly to the north-eastern angle of allotment 15, parish of Shadforth, thence northerly to the most southerly angle of allotment 6, parish of Gowangardie, thence north-westerly and northerly to the Nalinga Bridge over the Broken River on the northern boundary of the Shire.

3. *Shepparton-road*.—Commencing at its intersection with the Violet Town-Dookie road, in the township of Violet Town, thence north-westerly to the north-western angle of allotment 8, parish of Shadforth, thence westerly to its junction with the Murchison-road at the south-western angle of allotment 62.

#### Shire of Wannon.

1. *Hamilton-Coleraine-Casterton road*.—Commencing at the most northerly angle of allotment 1A, section 15, parish of Redruth, on the eastern boundary of the Shire, thence north-westerly through the parish of Coleraine, and westerly through the township of Coleraine, to the south-western angle of allotment 7, parish of Konong Wootong, thence south-westerly and generally westerly through the parish of Muntham to the north-eastern angle of allotment 3, section 8, parish of Carapook, on the western boundary of the Shire.

3. *Wannon Bridge-road*.—Commencing at its junction with the Hamilton-Casterton road in the township of Coleraine, thence southerly, south-westerly, and southerly to and including the bridge over the Wannon River, at the southern boundary of the Shire.

#### Shire of Wodonga.

1. *Sydney-road*.—Commencing at the south-eastern angle of allotment D, parish of Barnawartha North, on the western boundary of the Shire, thence easterly, south-easterly, and easterly to the north-eastern angle of allotment 9, section 15, parish of Wodonga, thence south-easterly, easterly and north-easterly through the town of Wodonga to the bridge over the Murray River, east of allotment B3, of the township aforesaid, on the northern boundary of the Shire.

2. *Tallangatta-road*.—Commencing at its intersection with the Sydney-road at the north-eastern angle of section P, town of Wodonga, thence southerly, and south-easterly to the north-western angle of the East Wodonga Station Reserve thence easterly and north-easterly to and across the bridge over the Kiewa River, near the most northerly angle of allotment 4, section 25, parish of Wodonga, thence generally easterly to the north-eastern angle of allotment 33, parish of Bonegilla, thence south-easterly to the south-western angle of allotment

72A, parish of Bonegilla, to the north-eastern angle of allotment 3, section 2, parish of Beethang, on the southern boundary of the Shire.

3. *Murray Valley-road*.—Commencing at its junction with the Tallangatta-road, at the south-western angle of allotment 72A, parish of Bonegilla, near the Beethanga Railway Station, thence easterly to the bridge over the Ovens River, on the eastern boundary of the Shire.

4. *Wodonga-Yackandandah road*.—Commencing at its junction with the Tallangatta-road near the East Wodonga Railway Station, thence south-easterly to the north-western angle of allotment 4, section 22, parish of Baranduda, on the southern boundary of the Shire.

DECLARATION OF MAIN ROADS IN THE SHIRES OF YACKANDANDAH AND YEA, AND THE BOROUGHES OF CASTLEMAINE, CHEWTON, HAMILTON, MALMSBURY, AND PORT FAIRY.

WHEREAS by the Resolution set out below and dated the second day of November One thousand nine hundred and fourteen the Country Roads Board incorporated under the *Country Roads Act 1912* (Act No. 2415) being of opinion that the highways in the State of Victoria set out or described in the Schedule to the same were of sufficient importance to be main roads and acting under the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the said Act declared such highways to be main roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the Act aforesaid And whereas the said Act among other things provides that the Governor in Council might by Order published in the *Government Gazette* confirm such Resolution whereupon any road mentioned in such resolution should be a main road And whereas it is deemed desirable to confirm the Resolution so made and passed by the said Country Roads Board Now therefore I the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the same do hereby confirm such Resolution and declare upon the publication of this Order in the *Government Gazette* the roads mentioned in the Schedule to such Resolution of the Country Roads Board main roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the *Country Roads Act 1912*.

#### RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTRY ROADS BOARD ABOVE REFERRED TO.

1. *Melbourne-Bendigo road*.—Commencing at the north-eastern angle of allotment 163, section B, parish of Castlemaine, on the eastern boundary of the borough, thence north-westerly and south-westerly to and across the bridge over Forest Creek, thence north-westerly, westerly and northerly to the north-eastern angle of section 20, town of Castlemaine, thence westerly to the south-western angle of section 15, thence northerly, and north-easterly to the intersection of the eastern boundary of allotment 3, section 2, parish of Castlemaine, and the northern boundary of the borough.

#### Borough of Hamilton.

**W**HEREAS by the *Tramways Act 1890* it is provided that tramways may be constructed in any municipal district (except in the municipal districts of Fitzroy, Collingwood, Prahran, Richmond, South Melbourne, Hotham, St. Kilda, Brunswick, Kew, Hawthorn, and Sandridge), when authorized by an Order of the Governor in Council made in that behalf, upon the application of the Council of the municipality, in compliance with the provisions of the said Act, and of the rules and regulations to be from time to time made by the Governor in Council: And whereas the *Tramways Act 1890* was amended by the *South Melbourne Tramways Act 1914*, No. 2497, extending the powers contained in the *Tramways Act 1890* so as to allow of a tramway being constructed within the City of South Melbourne: And whereas the Council of the municipality of the City of South Melbourne has made an application under the common seal of the said municipality in accordance with the said Acts and of the rules and regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder for an Order by the Governor in Council authorizing the construction of a tramway in the municipal district of the municipality of the said City of South Melbourne: And whereas the Governor in Council, being satisfied that the requirements of the said Acts and of the rules and regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder, have been duly complied with by the said Council of the said municipality, and that notice of the intention of the said Council to make the said application, in which notice the route proposed to be followed was described, and persons objecting to the same were called on to lodge their objections within the time required by the regulations, has been duly published as required by the rules and regulations made by the Governor in Council, in pursuance of the said Acts in that behalf, and that no objection to the said application has been lodged within the time provided in the said rules, and being satisfied also that it is expedient and proper that the said application should be granted, has determined to grant the same subject to the restrictions and conditions hereinafter contained: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Acts, doth for the purpose aforesaid make the Order following (that is to say):—

That the Council of the municipality of the City of South Melbourne shall be and is hereby authorized to construct a tramway in the municipal district of the City of South Melbourne.

##### ROUTE.

That the route of such tramway shall be as follows:— Commencing at a point in Patterson-street near the corner of Fraser-street at the south-eastern boundary of the City of South Melbourne, thence north-westerly along Patterson and Danks streets to Kerferd-road, along Kerferd-road and Albert-road north-easterly to Clarendon-street, along Clarendon-street north-westerly to Park-street, along Park-street north-easterly to Heather-street, along Heather-street northerly to Eastern-road, along Eastern-road north-westerly to Sturt-street, and along Sturt-street northerly to the boundary of the Cities of South Melbourne and Melbourne.

##### GAUGE.

That the gauge of the said tramway shall be four feet eight and one-half inches (4 ft. 8½ in.), and that the said tramway shall be constructed in the manner set out and described in the working plans and specifications numbered from 1 to 8 inclusive, now deposited in the Public Works Department, and which plans and specifications are indorsed with a memorandum of the Minister of Public Works identifying the said plans and specifications so deposited as the plans and specifications referred to in this Order, and which plans and specifications are to be deemed to be incorporated in this Order, and to be as much part of the same as if they were set out in detail in this Order. That so much of the tramway between the corner of Aikman-street and Sturt-street and St. Kilda-road shall be constructed to the satisfaction of the Council of the City of Melbourne.

**MOTIVE POWER.**

That the motive power to be used upon the said tramway shall be electricity.

**MAXIMUM SPEED.**

That the maximum speed of the progression of the cars upon the said tramway, with hand-brake equipments on the cars, shall be at the rate of 15 miles per hour, and with magnetic, air, or other approved power brakes and life guards the maximum speed shall be at the rate of 20 miles per hour.

**TIME OF COMPLETION.**

That the tramway shall be completed and open for traffic within a period of three years from the date of the Order in Council authorizing the construction of the tramway.

**TRAFFIC.**

That the tramway shall be used for the carriage of passengers and such parcels or packages as they may have in their possession.

**NECESSARY PRECAUTIONS FOR SAFETY OF PASSENGERS AND PUBLIC TO BE OBSERVED.**

That every precaution necessary to secure the safety of the passengers upon the said tramway, and also to secure the safety of passengers passing along the streets upon the route of such tramway, shall be taken and ordered by the said Council of the said municipality.

**STOPPAGES FOR TAKING UP AND SETTING DOWN PASSENGERS.**

That for the convenience of the public the cars shall stop for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers at the intersection of such streets as are indicated by notice boards or other sufficient devices erected at such intersections to be stopping points, and at such other points upon the route of the tramway as may be convenient, and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic of the streets or the safety of the passengers in the cars.

**TOLLS AND CHARGES.**

That the charges to be made upon the said tramway shall be One penny for each passenger on each of the following sections, or part thereof:—

- (a) From the corner of Fraser and Patterson streets to corner of Kerferd-road and Richardson-street.
- (b) From the corner of Armstrong and Danks streets to the corner of Kerferd-road and Canterbury-road.
- (c) From the corner of Wright and Danks streets to the corner of Albert-road and Clarendon-street.
- (d) From the corner of Kerferd-road and Danks-street to corner of Park and Clarendon streets.
- (e) From the corner of Kerferd-road and Canterbury-road to Hanna-street.
- (f) From the corner of Albert-road and Clarendon-street to corner of Sturt-street and Grant-street.
- (g) From the corner of Park and Clarendon streets to terminus at St. Kilda-road.

For each child under twelve years of age (other than children under four years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free), One penny for any one of the above sections, or for any two continuous sections, provided, however, that for any one or more sections the fare to be charged for two children travelling together under the age of twelve years shall not exceed the fare charged for one adult.

**THROUGH FARES.**

That the charges to be made upon the said tramway for each passenger from St. Kilda-road to Fraser-street shall be Threepence, and for each child under twelve years of age (other than children under four years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free), Twopence.

With power also to run cars at minimum or through fares upon the said tramway for any specified distance, provided that the amount of such minimum or through fare shall not exceed the total sum of the sectional fares upon such tramway, or such parts of such tramway over which the cars shall be run. Every such car shall have a notice or notices plainly exhibited on the outside of such car indicating its destination and the minimum fare chargeable thereon.

**SPECIAL CARS.**

That the charge to be made—

- (1) For the hire of a special car, with a seating capacity not exceeding thirty-six persons, 1s. 6d. per car mile between the hours of 6 a.m. and midnight, and 2s. 6d. per car mile after midnight.
- (2) For the hire of a special car, with a seating capacity exceeding thirty-six persons, 2s. 6d. per car mile between 6 a.m. and midnight, and 3s. 6d. per car mile after midnight. The car mileage shall be the mileage run by the car from the time of its leaving the depot until its return thereto. Provided always, however, that a minimum charge of £1 1s. may be made for the hiring of any special car between 6.30 a.m. and midnight, and £2 2s. between midnight and 1 a.m., and the sum of 5s. per hour per car for detention during the journey for which such special car is hired.

**SPECIAL TICKETS TO SCHOOL CHILDREN.**

That the charge to be made for return tickets to school children under the age of eighteen years over any two sections shall be One Penny, and for any four sections Twopence, subject to such conditions as to the days on and the hours between which such return tickets shall be available as the Council may by regulations determine, also in such regulations to limit the right of travel in respect of such return tickets to a portion only of the car.

**ELECTRIC WIRES CROSSING LINES OF RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS TO BE CONSTRUCTED SO AS NOT TO INTERFERE.**

Any electric line or lines in connexion with the said tramway which would cross under or over any wire of the Commissioners, or which would, in the opinion of the Commissioners, be in a position likely, if special precautions be not taken, to prejudicially affect the operation of the trains when electrified, or the maintenance of telegraphic or telephonic communication, or the transmission of signals on adjacent wires of the Commissioners, shall, to the satisfaction of and without any expense to the Commissioners, be so placed, constructed, guarded, and maintained as not to be capable, in the opinion of the Commissioners, of injuring or coming into contact with any wire of the Commissioners, or of prejudicially affecting or interfering, either mechanically or electrically with the proper use of any such wire.

**TRAMWAY WHERE PASSING UNDER THE ST. KILDA RAILWAY LINE AT KERFERD-ROAD.**

That in respect of the tramway passing under the St. Kilda railway line at Kerferd-road, the Council shall defray the actual cost, whether more or less than the estimated cost of £3,216, which will be necessary in providing an additional opening and raising the railway line at Kerferd-road, and that the wires and other attachments be fixed to the bridge, and subsequently maintained to the satisfaction of the Railways Commissioners, and that, in addition, the Council shall also pay to the Railways Commissioners the sum of £10 per annum to cover the cost of the future maintenance of the additional opening referred to.

**COST OF ALTERATION TO POSTAL WIRES INCIDENTAL TO USE OF ELECTRICITY.**

In the event of the Postal Department demanding any special alteration of its wires in consequence of the introduction of a high-tension or other electrical current in connexion with the tramway, the cost of any special arrangement of or provision for the wires because of such current shall be paid and borne by the Council.

**FARES IN CASE OF COMBINED TRAM AND RAILWAY PASSENGERS.**

Nothing herein contained shall prevent the Council from entering into any arrangement with the Railways Commissioners to sell through tickets to travel over both tramway and railway, and in that case charging or providing for the payment of fares at a lower rate than those specified in this Order in respect of passengers travelling over both tramway and railway.

**COUNCIL NOT TO ENTER INTO CERTAIN ARRANGEMENTS WITH MELBOURNE TRAMWAY AND OMNIBUS COMPANY LIMITED.**

It is a condition of this Order that the Council shall not enter into any arrangement with the Melbourne Tramway and Omnibus Company Limited, or other, the authority for the time being concerned in the tramways now controlled by that company, nor be a party, directly or indirectly, to any arrangement whereby through passengers, that is, passengers travelling over both the tramway now so controlled as aforesaid (hereinafter called the "Melbourne Tramway"), and the Council's tramway, may travel for lower fares than the sum of the local fares on both tramways, nor shall the Council sell Melbourne tramway tickets or furnish passengers intending to travel by the Melbourne tramway with transfer tickets, or any means of identification or in any way assist or facilitate passengers travelling over both tramways to travel for lower fares than the sum of the local fares on both tramways.

**COUNCIL NOT TO RUN OVER LINES CONTROLLED BY MELBOURNE TRAMWAY AND OMNIBUS COMPANY LIMITED.**

It is a further condition of this Order that the Council shall not acquire the right to run, nor shall it run any of its cars or other vehicles on or along any or any part of the lines now controlled by the Melbourne Tramway and Omnibus Company Limited, or on or along any extension of any such lines, or any part of the same, nor give a better service in connexion with the trams of the Melbourne Tramway and Omnibus Company Limited than the service connecting with the trains of the Commissioners, nor shall the Council permit the cars or other vehicles of the Melbourne Tramway and Omnibus Company Limited or other, the authority for the time being concerned in the tramways now controlled by that company, to run over the tramways of the Council, nor shall such cars be so run.

**GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL TO BE SOLE JUDGE OF BREACH OF ORDER.**

That the Governor in Council shall be sole judge of the compliance with, or of the breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order, and for the purpose of enabling the Governor in Council to arrive at a just decision, an inquiry into the facts of each case shall be conducted in the manner provided in clause 25 of the regulations contained in the second schedule to the said Act, before an officer to be appointed in that behalf by the Governor in Council, as provided in the regulations in the said schedule.

If upon report to the Governor in Council by the referee, made under the said clause 25 of the regulations in the second schedule of the said Act, the Governor in Council shall, as such sole judge, determine that there has been any failure of or non-compliance with, or that any breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order has occurred by way either of commission or omission, then the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall cease and determine, or shall be suspended, as the Governor in Council shall direct, and in the case of the Governor in Council ordering a suspension only of such powers, then the Governor in Council shall, in his adjudication, state for what period such suspension shall take effect.

If in such adjudication the Governor in Council shall determine that the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall wholly cease and determine, then the Council of the said municipality of the City of South Melbourne shall forthwith proceed to restore the streets along which the said route is laid out to their condition previous to the construction of such tramway, unless the Governor in Council otherwise order.

That in the event of the Council of the said municipality finding it necessary to provide work of a more substantial or expensive character than that provided for in this Order, the Council of the said municipality shall take upon itself all such additional expenditure, and no claim whatever shall be made upon the Government, or upon the Board of Land and Works, for any pecuniary assistance or aid in respect of such expenditure, or to provide funds therefor.

And the Honorable Frederick Hagelthorn, His Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

**W**HEREAS by the *Land Act 1901* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1901*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 7) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 113 and 132 of the *Land Act 1901* aforesaid, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 1, 2, 3, 7, 8, and 11 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1901* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules (that is to say):—

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

**I** THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of section 63 of the *Land Act 1911* (2 Geo. V. No. 2332), do by this Order direct that the unused and unmade road in the township of Gunbower, and the portion of an unused and unmade road in the township of Metcalfe, as defined by descriptions hereunder, be closed, that is to say:—

## UNUSED AND UNMADE ROAD IN THE TOWNSHIP OF GUNBOWER CLOSED.

County of Gunbower, township of Gunbower: The road forming the north-west, north-east, and south-east boundaries of the site formerly reserved for a State School.—(14.C.63921.)

## PORTION OF AN UNUSED AND UNMADE ROAD IN THE TOWNSHIP OF METCALFE CLOSED.

County of Dalhousie, township of Metcalfe: The portion of the road forming the south-west boundary of section C, situated south-east of the road which forms, for part of its length, the north-west boundary of the State School reserve.—(14.C.63889.)

## Land Act 1911, Section 22.

MALLEE LANDS AVAILABLE FOR APPLICATION  
AS SELECTION PURCHASE ALLOTMENTS.

THE land is situated on the South Australian Border, between Pinnaroo and Panitya, and was formerly known as the "Disputed Territory." It is from 4 to 11 miles from Pinnaroo Railway Station, and from 10 to 15 miles from Murrayville Railway Station.

The survey fee must be paid within 28 days of demand, and will range from £9 to £11 per allotment.

The amount of loading (3s. per acre) is to be collected in instalments, therefore its cash value, about 1s. 11d. per acre only, will be the limit of expenditure for road and water improvements.

The half-yearly payment on each allotment, set out in Schedule hereto, includes the amount of loading.

It is intended to roll down the mallee on a portion of each allotment up to 400 acres. A condition of the recommendation in favour of an applicant will be that he must go into occupation not later than 1st February, 1915, burn off, and pick up, and crop the area for next season.

The cost of rolling will be made a charge on the land.

Where necessary, assistance may be given in providing seed wheat.

The lease will contain (*inter alia*) conditions to the effect as follows:—

That substantial and permanent improvements shall be made on the land—if in the first class, to the value of 3s. 4d. per acre before the end of the second year from the date of the lease, another 3s. 4d. per acre before the end of the third and fourth years, and the balance of 10s. per acre before the end of the sixth year of the lease. Tenders for supply of forage to more than five separate stations in any one district must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit of 10s. for each and every station tendered for except in the case of the Melbourne District, the preliminary deposit for which shall be £25 with each tender, irrespective of the number of stations tendered for, and the State Plantation at Wail, the preliminary deposit for which shall be £10. Deposits must be in bank notes, or bank drafts payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application; such deposit will be forfeited in the event of the tenderer, after the time fixed for the closing of tenders, withdrawing or attempting to withdraw his tender, or of the successful tenderer failing to complete the necessary bond within a reasonable time after the acceptance is notified.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to hold contracts for Government supplies for a period of two years.

The price must include delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

For police stations, excepting the depot and institutions other than police, the successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for the sum of £5 per horse per station, and for the depot and other institutions a bond based on one-quarter of the total amount of the tender accepted, such bonds to be entered into within a reasonable time after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts where the sum stated in the bond is £50 and upwards, and one surety where the sum stated is under £50.

## CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or oat, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oat hay of the best quality. As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

2. The quantities stated in the schedule are only approximate, and the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned. Should new telegraph stations be formed or additional horses be required at any station, the contractor will be required to supply the extra forage. Unless otherwise specified in the tender form the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station, should the additional number of permanent horses exceed two.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, and also forage for any extra horses that may be at any time stabled at the depot for police purposes, at the same rates. The contract for the supply of forage to the Military Barracks may be terminated by three months' notice being given by the Secretary to the Tender Board to the contractor of such determination.

4. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

5. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

6. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.

7. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue to either party by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, but he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 4.

8. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.

9. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

10. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

11. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.
