For water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust, Two shillings and sixpence for every 1000 gallons, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure (and except in cases where the Trust has made special arrangements).
8. A minimum of Ten shillings and a maximum of Two pounds to every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year.
9. Such rates and charges are hereby made payable yearly, in advance, on the first day of January, 1915.
10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

4. A rate of Five shillings (5s.) each on every other allotment or piece of land vacant or not built upon.

For water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust, Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) for every 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure (and except in cases where the Trust has made special arrangements).

7. A minimum of Ten shillings (10s.) and a maximum of Two pounds (£2) for every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year.

- (c) On every house or tenement above the net annual value of £300, and not exceeding £500, the sum of £4 10s. per centum on the amount of the valuation.
- (d) On every house or tenement above the net annual value of £500, the sum of £4 per centum on the amount of the valuation.
- (e) On every warehouse and wholesale store used exclusively for such purposes, the sum of £3 10s. per centum on the amount of the valuation.

2. Such rate is made and shall be levied for the year beginning on the first day of January, 1915, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1915, and shall be payable on the 31st day of March, 1915, at the office of the Ballarat Water Commissioners, in Grenville-street, Ballarat.

3. Such persons as the Ballarat Water Commissioners may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be, and are, hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate.

ALEXANDRA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1915.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1905*, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Urban District of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust shall pay for water supplied by the said Trust:—

For every house, tenement, or allotment of the annual value of Seventeen pounds or over, according to the municipal valuation, an amount of One shilling and sixpence in the pound of such valuation.

For every house, tenement, or allotment under Seventeen pounds sterling annual valuation, according to the municipal valuation, an amount of One pound five shillings sterling per annum.

For all tenements in the said district in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation by such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the above-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within a mile thereof, one-fourth of the above-mentioned rates.

The charge for water supplied from and after the first day of January, 1915, shall be as follows:—

- (a) For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust—Fifteen shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam boiler.
- (b) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust)—One shilling for every 1,000 gallons.

The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be:—

- (a) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (b) If for other than domestic purposes solely, 30,000 gallons per half-year.

For water supplied to the Government Departments, police stations, churches, court-house, post-office, State school, show ground, cricket ground, bowling green, shire hall, and similar properties, shall be charged by measurement or special agreement.

For water supplied to livery and carriers' stables by the Trust, the charge shall be Five shillings per annum for each stall or loose-box.

In open sheds used for stabling, each space of five feet shall be charged as a stall.

The before-mentioned rates and charges are made for the year 1915. Such rates shall be payable by equal moieties, half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July of such year, and such charges shall be payable half-yearly, on the first day of July and the thirty-first day of December of such year.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and collect the said rates and charges.

All water troughs to be fitted with approved self-acting ball taps to prevent overflow.

The minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 20,000 (twenty thousand) gallons per half-year, or a quantity which, at the price named, would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the occupier or owner would be entitled to receive, according to his assessed rate for the year, if supplied otherwise than by measure.

AVOCA TOWNSHIP WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 5.

THE Avoca Township Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts (and whose Waterworks District has for the purposes of the said Acts been proclaimed an Urban District), make the By-law following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1915 in respect of water supplied by the Trust (that is to say):—

(1) On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, a rate of Two shillings for each pound sterling on the amount of the municipal value thereof; but the minimum amount to be paid shall be One pound ten shillings sterling.

(2) Unoccupied lands where no water is laid on shall be charged Ten pounds per centum on the amount of the municipal valuation.

(3) Private water troughs shall be charged at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each, except when the Trust shall order a meter to be used, in which case the minimum quantity of water to be charged for half-yearly shall be 10,000 gallons.

(4) For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or otherwise provided for in this By-law, the rate shall be Fifteen pence per 1,000 gallons.

(5) Water for gas-engines shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each engine, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.

(6) For steam boilers the rate shall be Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse-power of each boiler, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.

(7) On buildings in course of erection where water is required for building purposes the charge shall be Five shillings per 1,000 gallons, and the contractor, owner, or occupier of such premises shall provide and fix the water meter and all necessary fittings for same, otherwise the contractor, owners, or occupiers of such premises may, by special agreement with the Trust, pay a minimum charge of Ten shillings per centum on the total cost of the work for stone buildings, or Two shillings and sixpence per cent. for wooden buildings, when a meter will not be required to be provided; or they may by special agreement with the Trust pay the cost of the labour of laying and removing the necessary pipes, fittings, and a meter, and the hire of a meter, at the rate of Ten shillings per annum, with a minimum charge of Five shillings, and for water at the rate of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons, payments in either case to be made in advance.

(8) Supplies of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken or used.

(9) In the event of any dispute as to which sub-section applies to any particular case, the Trust shall have power to decide or make a special charge.

(10) For water supplied to public gardens, parks, and show-grounds, the charge shall be Ninepence per 1,000 gallons, and the supply must be taken through a meter.

(11) A minimum rate of Ten shillings and a maximum rate of Four pounds sterling, as the Commissioners may determine, shall be charged every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year, in addition to the assessed rate payable for the premises on which such hose is used.

(12) For all tenements in the said district situated otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, the rate shall be one-half, and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half-a-mile thereof, shall be one-quarter the amount which would be payable if such tenement were supplied with water from the service-pipes.

(13) The rates and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable in advance on the first day of January, 1915.

(14) Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive and recover such rates and charges.

DONALD WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1915, NO. 21.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Donald Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred upon them by the Water Act 1905, do make the following By-law, viz.:—

A By-law for determining the rates which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the urban district of the aforesaid Trust; that is to say, in regard to houses and tenements fronting any street in which the pipes of the Trust are laid, and which houses and tenements, if not in such street, are supplied with water by the reticulation of such pipes:—

(1) A rate of Two (2) shillings and three (3) pence in the pound sterling on the net annual value of all rateable property of and above Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence (£13 6s. 8d.).

(2) A minimum rate of One (1) pound ten (10) shillings sterling for such properties valued at a net annual value of less than Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence (£13 6s. 8d.).

(3) On each unoccupied or vacant allotment or piece of land a rate of Two shillings and threepence in the pound of the net annual value of such rateable property, provided that no such allotment or piece of land shall pay less than Twelve shillings and sixpence.

(4) Water supplied by measure to be used in private domiciles or other premises for domestic use, or for watering gardens or distribution otherwise on or about such premises, shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons up to the amount of the water rate assessment of such land or premises for the time being, provided that the said assessment shall be the minimum charge for the year 1915, and at a charge or rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons for any quantity of water used for the before-mentioned purposes beyond such an amount aforesaid.

(5) For all lands and tenements in the said Urban District situate otherwise than on the streets in which the pipes of the water supply are laid, and which lands and tenements are not supplied with water by the reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter (¼) of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such lands and tenements are over a quarter (¼) of a mile and within a half (½) of a mile thereof, a quarter of the before-mentioned rates.

Such before-mentioned rates shall be based upon the municipal valuation for the time being.

Such rates are hereby made for the year 1915, commencing upon the first (1st) day of January, 1915, and terminating upon the thirty-first (31st) day of December, 1915, and shall be due and payable, in advance, on the first (1st) day of January, 1915.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates.

MARYBOROUGH WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1915.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Act 1905, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by such Act, make the following By-law, viz. :—

By-law No. 35.

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1915 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said Urban District:—

1. For every house or tenement of Fifteen pounds annual municipal value and under, the sum of One pound ten shillings sterling.
2. For every house and tenement of Sixteen pounds annual municipal value and upwards, an amount of Two shillings in the One pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.
3. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land unsupplied with water from the works of the Trust, of Ten pounds annual municipal value and under, the sum of One pound sterling.
4. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land unsupplied with water from the works of the Trust of more than Ten pounds annual municipal value, an amount of Two shillings in the One pound upon the annual municipal value of such property.
5. For every water-trough, Twelve shillings per annum will be charged, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of troughs supplied by measurement shall be 12,000 gallons.
6. For water supplied by measurement by the Trust, One shilling per 1,000 gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon), and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens (except market gardens) and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust by measurement for the purpose of irrigation or for ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half-an-acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons; exceeding half-an-acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 60,000 gallons; for every additional acre and proportionately according to the foregoing scale for any fractional part of an acre.

In livery, bait, and carriers' stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 5,000 gallons per stall used for stabling horses. In open sheds used for the above purpose, each space of 5 feet shall be charged as a stall.

7. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by meter where water is supplied for domestic purposes, as well as for purposes other than domestic, shall be the quantity which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons (or Sixpence per 1,000 gallons for market gardens), equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.
8. The Trust will, if it so think fit, but not otherwise, let for hire water meters, the rent for which shall be at the rate of Five shillings each per annum, which rent shall be exclusive of and in addition to the amount or rate charged for the recorded consumption of water, and shall be due and must be paid half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July in each year.
9. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering; or if there be no contract, then upon the value of the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, or plastering.
10. For water supplied to market gardens, the charge shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons. The minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 200,000 gallons per acre, and proportionately for every fractional part of an acre. The supply is to be by meter only.

11. For water supplied to breweries, the charge shall be Ten pounds per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.
12. For water supplied to cricket or bowling clubs, Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.
13. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the engine cylinder.
14. For water supplied to syphon pumps, Twenty shillings each per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.
15. For water supplied to private fountains, Twenty shillings each per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

That the before-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1915, excepting the charge for water supplied by measure, which shall be paid quarterly.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

No. 6. For water supplied by a meter, a charge of One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons shall be made, provided that no person pays less than the preceding regulations, and 1s. per 1,000 for all in excess.

No. 7. The foregoing rates are made payable in equal moieties on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1915.

WHEREAS by the *Tramways Act 1890*, it is provided that tramways may be constructed in any municipal district (except in the municipal districts of Fitzroy, Collingwood, Prahran, Richmond, South Melbourne, Hotham, St. Kilda, Brunswick, Kew, Hawthorn, and Sandridge), when authorized by an Order of the Governor in Council made in that behalf, upon the application of the Council of the municipality in compliance with the provisions of the said Act, and of the Rules and Regulations to be from time to time made by the Governor in Council: And whereas the *Tramways Act 1890* was amended by Acts numbers 1218, 1764, 2298, 2299, and 2337 extending the powers contained in the *Tramways Act 1890* so as to allow of tramways being constructed within the boundaries of the Cities of Hawthorn, Melbourne, Prahran, St. Kilda, and the Town of Kew: And whereas by Orders in Council dated respectively the 6th July 1908, 6th July 1908, 14th September 1910, 28th July 1911, 1st September 1911, 13th December 1911, 29th July 1912, 23rd July 1912, 29th July 1912, 24th September 1912, 19th February 1913, 19th February 1913, 30th June 1913, 30th June 1913, 20th January 1914, 16th March

1914, and the 23rd March 1914, under the provisions of the *Tramways Act* and the amending Acts above referred to the Councils of the Cities of Caulfield, Hawthorn, Malvern, Melbourne, Prahran, and St. Kilda, and the Town of Kew were authorized to construct tramways within the municipal districts of the Cities of Caulfield, Hawthorn, Malvern, Melbourne, Prahran, St. Kilda, and the Town of Kew: And whereas the Prahran and Malvern Tramways Trust, in pursuance of the powers vested in it, under the provisions of the Prahran and Malvern Tramways Trust Acts, and under the provisions of the *Tramways Act 1890*, No. 1148, has now made application to have the said Orders in Council amended and extended in the manner hereinafter referred to; and the said Prahran and Malvern Tramways Trust having duly complied with the requirements of the said Acts and the Regulations made thereunder, with regard to the publication of its intention to so apply, and no objection having been lodged thereto within the time provided by such rules, the Governor in Council being satisfied that it is expedient and proper that the said application should be granted, has determined to grant the same, subject to the restrictions and conditions set out in the Orders in Council before referred to.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Acts, doth for the purpose aforesaid make the Order following, that is to say:—

SPECIAL TICKETS TO SCHOOL CHILDREN.

That the age under which school children are allowed to travel on the tramways specified in the said Orders in Council under "Special Tickets to School Children" shall be and is hereby increased so as to allow of school children or scholars up to the age of eighteen years travelling on such tickets.

FARES FOR CHILDREN UNDER TWELVE YEARS OF AGE.

That for any single section on the said tramways the fare for two children travelling together under the age of twelve (12) years (other than children under four years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free) shall be One penny, provided that for any one or more sections the fare to be charged for two children travelling together under the age of twelve years shall not exceed the fare charged for one adult.

MINIMUM OR THROUGH FARES FOR ANY SPECIFIED DISTANCE.

That power is hereby given to the Prahran and Malvern Tramways Trust to run cars at minimum or through fares upon the said tramways for any specified distance, provided that the amount of such minimum or through fare shall not exceed the total sum of the sectional fares upon such tramways or such parts of such tramways over which the cars shall be run. Every such car shall have a notice or notices plainly exhibited on the outside of such car indicating its destination and the minimum fare chargeable thereon.

And the Honorable Frederick Hagelthorn, His Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

MALLEE LANDS AVAILABLE FOR APPLICATION AS SELECTION PURCHASE ALLOTMENTS.

THE land is situated on the South Australian Border, between Pinnaroo and Panitya, and was formerly known as the "Disputed Territory." It is from 4 to 11 miles from Pinnaroo Railway Station, and from 10 to 15 miles from Murrayville Railway Station.

Tenders for supply of forage to more than five separate stations in any one district must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit of 10s. for each and every station tendered for except in the case of the Melbourne District, the preliminary deposit for which shall be £25 with each tender, irrespective of the number of stations tendered for, and the State Plantation at Wail, the preliminary deposit for which shall be £10. Deposits must be in bank notes, or bank drafts payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application; such deposit will be forfeited in the event of the tenderer, after the time fixed for the closing of tenders, withdrawing or attempting to withdraw his tender, or of the successful tenderer failing to complete the necessary bond within a reasonable time after the acceptance is notified.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to hold contracts for Government supplies for a period of two years.

The price must include delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

For police stations, excepting the depot and institutions other than police, the successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for the sum of £5 per horse per station, and for the depot and other institutions a bond based on one-quarter of the total amount of the tender accepted, such bonds to be entered into within a reasonable time after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts where the sum stated in the bond is £50 and upwards, and one surety where the sum stated is under £50.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

- The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or oaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality. As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.
- The quantities stated in the schedule are only approximate, and the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned. Should new telegraph stations be formed or additional horses be required at any station, the contractor will be required to supply the extra forage. Unless otherwise specified in the tender form the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station, should the additional number of permanent horses exceed two.
- Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, and also forage for any extra horses that may be at any time stabled at the depot for police purposes, at the same rates. The contract for the supply of forage to the Military Barracks may be terminated by three months' notice being given by the Secretary to the Tender Board to the contractor of such determination.
- Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.
- In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.
- If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.
- When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue to either party by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, but he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 4.
- A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.
- Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.
- Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.
- The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.
