QUARTERLY STATISTICAL ABSTRACT

TO 30TH SEPTEMBER, 1914.

QUARTERLY STATISTICAL ABSTRACT, 30TH SEPTEMBER, 1914.

Population.—The estimated population on the 30th June, 1914, was 1,421,985; on 30th September, 1914, it was 1,430,878—thus showing an increase of 8,893 persons. The natural increase in the population was 5,193, and the excess of immigration was 3,700. During the quarter Victoria gained from the United Kingdom 2,436 persons, from South Australia 2,824 persons, and from Tasmania 976 persons, but lost 1,967 of population to New South Wales, and 302 to Queensland.

Vital Statistics of the State.—The marriages—2,892—were 279 more, the births—9,450—were 87 more, the deaths—4,257—were 120 more, and the excess of births over deaths was less by 33 than in the corresponding quarter of the previous year. Of the total number of deaths, 295 were due to phthisis, and 50 to other tubercular diseases, 303 to cancer, 8 to typhoid fever, 58 to diphtheria and croup, and 21 to whooping cough.

Vital Statistics of Melbourne, &c.—The births during the quarter numbered 4,621. These include 41 cases of twins, 1 case of triplets, and 388 illegitimate births. The deaths numbered 2,317, and the excess of births over deaths was 2,304. The deaths from diphtheria and croup numbered 37, from whooping cough 17, and from tubercular diseases 200, as against 45, 3, and 195 respectively in the third quarter of 1913. In Melbourne the deaths of infants under twelve months of age were 327. In Ballarat, of 185 deaths, 16 were of infants; in Bendigo, of 154 deaths, 20 were of infants; and in Geelong, of 119 deaths, 13 were of infants. In the four places mentioned there were 1,004 deaths of people aged 65 years and upwards—or 36 per cent. of the total.

State Revenue and Expenditure.—The total revenue for the quarter was £2,090,219, which represents an increase of £80,776 on that for the corresponding quarter of the previous year. The principal items of revenue were—Railways, £1,183,129, and Probate Duty, £100,025. The total expenditure was £1,876,711, a decrease of £117,093 on that for the corresponding quarter of 1913.

Railways.—Compared with the corresponding quarter of the preceding year the revenue increased by £33,057, the expenditure by £80,306, train miles run by 231,604, passengers carried by 1,201,582, and the tonnage of goods and live stock traffic by 50,023.

Victorian Banking Returns.—On the 30th September the liabilities to the public of the Associated and Commonwealth Banks were £51,573,876, and the assets £50,685,281, as against £47,358,919 and £49,447,206 respectively on the 30th September, 1913. The reserves of the Associated Banks amounted to £10,964,575, and paid-up capital to £17,502,753. The ratio of coin, bullion and notes to liabilities of all the banks was 18·92 per cent.

Saving Bank.—On the 30th September the amount at credit of the 708,178 depositors in the Ordinary department of the State Savings Bank was £23,298,924. During the quarter 30,636 accounts were opened, and 27,487 were closed; the deposits made totalled £5,208,666, and the withdrawals £5,164,892.

Gold Yield.—The total yield of gold up to the end of September, 1914, was 73,853,708 ounces.

Imports and Exports.—The total value of oversea imports into Victoria during the quarter under review was £5,776,219, and the total oversea exports during the same period were valued at £1,567,678, as compared with £6,070,213 and £2,737,793 respectively in the corresponding quarter of the previous year.

Exports of Frozen, Preserved, and Perishable Products.—For the quarter ended 30th September, 1914, the total value of these exports oversea through Cool Stores was £272,404, of which £183,196 were destined for the United Kingdom, £3,044 for South Africa, and £86,164 for Eastern and other ports. The principal exports and their value were—Butter, £69,063; Milk and Cream, £46,696; Rabbits and Hares, £52,716; Beef, £22,822; and Mutton and Lamb, £75,426.
