WHEREAS by the Resolution set out below and dated the seventh day of December One thousand nine hundred and fourteen the Country Roads Board incorporated under the *Country Roads Act 1912* (Act No. 2415) being of opinion that the highways in the State of Victoria set out or described in the Schedule to the same were of sufficient importance to be main roads and acting under the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the said Act declared such highways to be main roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the Act aforesaid. And whereas the said Act among other things provides that the Governor in Council might by order published in the *Government Gazette* confirm such Resolution whereupon any road mentioned in such Resolution should be a main road. And whereas it is deemed desirable to confirm the Resolution so made and passed by the said Country Roads Board. Now therefore I the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the same do hereby confirm such Resolution and declare upon the publication of this Order in the *Government Gazette* the roads mentioned in the Schedule to such Resolution of the Country Roads Board main roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the *Country Roads Act 1912*.

RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTRY ROADS BOARD ABOVE
REFERRED TO.

The Country Roads Board incorporated by the *Country Roads Act 1912* (Act No. 2415) at a meeting now holden being of opinion that the highways within the State of Victoria set out or described in the Schedule hereunder written are of sufficient importance to be main roads, acting under the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the said Act doth by this Resolution hereby declare such highways to be main roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the said *Country Roads Act 1912*.

SCHEDULE.

Shire of Birchip.

1. *Donald-Birchip-Sea Lake road*.—Commencing at the north-eastern angle of allotment 26, parish of Warmur, on the southern boundary of the Shire, thence north-easterly along the boundary between the Shires of Birchip and Donald to the north-eastern angle of allotment 27 of the same parish, thence continuing north-easterly and north-westerly following the Donald-Birchip railway line to the north-eastern angle of allotment 22 of the parish aforesaid, thence further north-westerly, north-easterly and generally northerly, again following the said railway line to its intersection with the Beulah-Birchip-Wycheproof road at the township of Birchip, thence further northerly through the said township and continuing north-westerly and northerly to the north-eastern angle of allotment 1, parish of Towma, thence westerly, north-westerly and northerly to the most northerly angle of allotment 3, parish of Maribed, thence westerly and northerly to the north-eastern angle of allotment 14 of the same parish, thence north-westerly and northerly to the north-eastern angle of allotment 33 of the parish last-named, thence westerly along the boundary between the Shires of Birchip and Wycheproof to the south-eastern angle of allotment 63, parish of Willangie.

2. *Beulah-Birchip-Wycheproof road*.—Commencing at the north-western angle of allotment 30, parish of Bal-lapur, on the western boundary of the Shire, thence easterly and southerly to the north-western angle of allotment 63, parish of Wimbirchip, thence continuing easterly to its intersection with the Donald-Birchip-Sea Lake road at Birchip, thence further easterly to the south-western angle of allotment 7, parish of Karyrie on the eastern boundary of the Shire.

Note.—The route of the portion of this road between the Shires of Birchip and Karkarooc is already set out in the description of road routes in the Shire of Karkarooc.

3. *Hopetoun-Rainbow road*.—Commencing at its junction with the Hopetoun-Warracknabeal road, south of the township of Hopetoun, thence south-westerly to the north-eastern angle of allotment 50, parish of Goyura, thence westerly, generally south-westerly and southerly to the south-eastern angle of allotment 9, parish of Nandemarriman, thence westerly to the north-western angle of allotment 34, parish of Yaapeet, thence southerly along the boundary between the Shires of Karkaroc and Dimboola to its junction with the Dimboola-Rainbow road at the south-eastern angle of allotment 8, parish of Werrap.

4. *Rainbow-Beulah-Birchip road*.—Commencing at its junction with the Dimboola-Rainbow road, at the north-western angle of allotment 25, parish of Pullat, on the western boundary of the Shire, thence easterly through Kenmore to the north-eastern angle of allotment 15, parish of Kenmore, thence southerly and easterly to the north-eastern angle of allotment 37, parish of Beulah, thence southerly, easterly and northerly, crossing the Warracknabeal-Hopetoun railway line at Beulah to the north-western angle of allotment 35, parish of Galaquil, thence easterly to the north-eastern angle of allotment 30, parish of Kurdweechee, thence southerly along the boundary between the Shires of Karkaroc and Birchip to the north-western angle of allotment 30, parish of Ballapur.

Shire of North Ovens.

1c. *Sydney-road*.—NOTE.—The route of the portion of this road between the Shire of North Ovens and the Borough of Wangaratta, is already set out in the description of road routes in the Borough of Wangaratta.

Shire of Walpeup.

1. *Ouyen-Pinnaroo road*.—Commencing at the south-eastern angle of allotment 1, section 1, township of Ouyen, thence westerly, south-westerly and generally westerly to the Galah railway station, thence south-westerly and westerly, crossing the railway line to the south-eastern angle of allotment 5, parish of Paigue, thence south-westerly and crossing the railway line near the railway station of Walpeup, thence continuing south-westerly following generally the railway line through Underbool, Boinku, and Cowangie to Murrayville, and thence generally westerly through the parish of Carina to Panitya, and continuing further westerly to the South Australian border on the western boundary of the Shire.

2. *Sea Lake road*.—Commencing at its junction with the Mildura road at the south-western angle of allotment 1, section 5, township of Ouyen, thence southerly and south-easterly following the Melbourne-Mildura railway line to the south-western angle of allotment 20, parish of Boulka, thence generally easterly to and along the northern boundary of allotment 36, parish of Woomack to the eastern boundary of the Shire.

angle of allotment 39, parish of Tutye, thence north-easterly and north-westerly to its junction with the Ouyen-Pinnaroo road at Cowangie, thence northerly across the railway line, thence easterly, north-easterly and northerly to the most northerly angle of allotment 19, parish of Tyalla, thence north-easterly and generally northerly to the north-eastern angle of allotment 21, parish of Koonda.

Shire of Wycheproof.

1. *Wycheproof-Sea Lake road*.—Commencing at the south-eastern angle of allotment 1, section 3, parish of Wycheproof, on the southern boundary of the Shire, thence northerly along the boundary between the Shires of Wycheproof and Charlton, to the south-western angle of allotment 1A, of the same parish, thence continuing northerly, westerly and north-westerly to the south-eastern angle of allotment 17, section 4, of the parish aforesaid, thence generally northerly, westerly and northerly to and through the township of Wycheproof, and continuing northerly and north-westerly, generally following the Wycheproof-Sea Lake railway line, through the township of Kaneira and Berriwillock to the township of Sea Lake.

2a. *Birchip-Wycheproof road*.—Commencing at the south-western angle of allotment 7, parish of Karyrie, thence easterly and southerly to the south-eastern angle of allotment 18 of the same parish, thence south-easterly, southerly and easterly to the north-eastern angle of allotment 86, parish of Thalia, thence south-westerly and easterly to the south-eastern angle of allotment 13, of the said parish, thence southerly and easterly to its junction with the Wycheproof-Sea Lake road at the south-eastern angle of allotment 44, section A, parish of Bunguluke.

Borough of Wangaratta.

1. *Sydney-road*.—Commencing at the north-eastern angle of allotment 22, section 31, parish of Wangaratta South, thence northerly and north-easterly to the most northerly angle of allotment 1, section 3, township of Wangaratta, thence continuing north-easterly, crossing One Mile Creek, to and across the bridge over the Ovens River, near the intersection of Faithful and Murphy streets, thence further north-easterly to the south-eastern angle of allotment 13A, section 20, thence northerly, north-easterly and northerly to and across the Reedy Creek, thence north-easterly to the most easterly angle of allotment 2A, section "B," parish of Wangaratta North, thence north-westerly along the boundary between the Borough of Wangaratta and the Shire of North Ovens to the most northerly angle of allotment 1, section "B" of the parish last-named.

In computing the period of 12 months all time worked as overtime shall be allowed as a set-off against any absence during the said period.

ANNUAL HOLIDAY FOR DAIRY PRODUCE AND COOKED MEAT (OTHER THAN TINNED MEAT) SHOPS.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition certified by the Assistant Chief Inspector of Factories and Shops, as signed by a majority of the employers and a majority of the employees to be affected, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

The third Monday in February in each year shall, in the Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, be an Annual Holiday for persons employed in the business carried on in a Dairy Produce or a Cooked Meat (other than Tinned Meat) shop, and all shops in which such business is carried on in the said Metropolitan District shall be closed for the whole of that day in each year.

And the Honorable Sir Alexander James Peacock, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Lunacy Acts to make Regulations for the purpose of the same and under all other powers in that behalf him enabling, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. The Regulations Nos. 1, 2, 3, and 4, may be cited as the "Voluntary Boarder (Lunacy Acts) Regulations 1914," and No. 5 as Regulation for the issue of orders for the transfer of insane patients from one institution to another.

2. It shall be a condition governing the lawful reception of a Voluntary Boarder in any Hospital for the Insane, Receiving House, or Licensed House under the provisions of section 8 of the *Lunacy Acts Amendment Act 1914* that the same has available accommodation which has been passed by the Inspector-General of the Insane as being in his opinion suitable for the case and treatment of voluntary boarders of the sex, age, and rank in life of the particular person requested to be received therein.

3. In the event of a person detained as a voluntary boarder being discharged from any Hospital for the Insane, Receiving House, or Licensed House, or of such Boarder being committed therefrom as a patient under the Lunacy Acts, the Medical Superintendent in the case of a Hospital or Receiving House, or the licensee of a Licensed House, or some one on his behalf, shall forthwith notify the Inspector-General of the Insane of that fact in the prescribed form.

4. The Forms numbered from I. to VII. inclusive in the Schedule hereto, or Forms to the like effect, are hereby prescribed as those to be severally used in matters connected with or incidental to Voluntary Boarders in matters under the provisions of the *Lunacy Acts Amendment Act 1914*, according to the circumstances and purposes of the case.

TRANSFER OF PATIENTS.

5. The Forms numbered from VIII. to XII. inclusive in the Schedule hereto, or Forms to the like effect, are the Forms of Order prescribed to be used by the Inspector-General of the Insane when exercising the power conferred by section 91 of the *Lunacy Act* as amended by section 12 of the *Lunacy Acts Amendment Act 1914*, directing the transfer of a patient from any Hospital for the Insane to a Licensed House, or from a Licensed House to a Hospital for the Insane, or from one Hospital for the Insane to another, or from one Licensed House to another.

while such Proclamation is in force Part II. of the said Act should apply accordingly: And whereas by the said Act it is further provided that the Governor in Council on being satisfied that adequate provision has been made by the laws of any British Possession (other than Victoria) for the recognition in such possession of orders and declarations made by the Supreme Court of Victoria in the exercise of its jurisdiction in lunacy may by Proclamation declare that Part III. of the said Act should subject to any exceptions and modifications specified in the Proclamation apply to such possession and thereupon while such Proclamation is in force that Part III. of the said Act should apply accordingly: And whereas I the said Arthur Lyulph Stanley as Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof being satisfied that the laws in force in the State of South Australia (a British Possession in the said Commonwealth) are such as to enable powers to be there exercised in cases of lunatic patients residing in Victoria substantially similar to the powers contained in Part II. of the *Lunacy Acts Amendment Act 1914* in cases of lunatic patients residing in South Australia: And whereas I as such Governor acting as aforesaid being further satisfied that adequate provision has also been made by the laws of the said State of South Australia for the recognition there of orders and declarations made by the Supreme Court of Victoria in the exercise of its jurisdiction in lunacy: Now therefore I the said Governor by and with the advice of the said Executive Council and by virtue of the powers conferred by the hereinbefore recited *Lunacy Acts Amendment Act 1914* do hereby declare that Parts II. and III. respectively of the same shall without exceptions or modifications apply to the State of South Australia.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A PUBLIC PARK AND OTHER PURPOSES OF PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWNSHIP OF FLINDERS, KNOWN AS "BASS PARK."

WE, John Cater Symonds, Andrew Buchanan, Cecil Trevor Cooke, and David Myles Maxwell, a majority of the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 23rd March, 1914, as a site for a Public Park and other purposes of Public Recreation in the township of Flinders, known as "Bass Park," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance-fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. Any person passing through any gate giving access to the Reserve or to any enclosure therein shall immediately close the same.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve (except where stiles have been provided for the purpose), or cut names on the fences, gates, trees, or seats, or stick bills thereon, or roll or throw stones in the Reserve, or remove therefrom any soil or sand.
5. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or plants in the Reserve; nor shall fires be lighted therein.

6. The Reserve shall be open to motor and other wheel traffic, and to horses driven or ridden; but such traffic shall not encroach upon any ground which has been specially prepared for any form of sport, and shall be confined to such area as may from time to time be directed by the Committee of Management.

7. No person shall put into the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, or pigs without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

8. No person shall tie up or attach any horse or other animal to any gate, stile, or fence (except such as may be set apart for the purpose) on the Reserve.

9. No person shall camp on the Reserve, or erect thereupon any dwelling, bathing-box, booth, or other structure for any purpose whatsoever, or offer for sale therein any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained; and such written permission shall, if required, be produced at any time to any person duly authorized by the Committee of Management to demand production of such permission.

10. The fenced in spring, with the trough attached to the fence, shall be available for the use of the public; but any person taking animals to water there shall do so in such a manner as not to interfere with any animals occupying the Reserve by and with the authority of the Committee of Management.

11. No person shall pollute or by any act cause the pollution of the water in any spring in the Reserve.

12. The owners of all bathing boxes at present erected upon the foreshore of the Reserve shall forthwith register same with the Committee of Management, and no further bathing boxes shall be erected without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management (to whom plans and specifications must be sent) first obtained.

13. The owner of each bathing box shall keep its registered number legibly painted or marked thereon, and shall keep the building in a state of efficient repair. Should he neglect to comply with this regulation the Committee may serve him by post with a notification to that effect, and should the neglect then be continued for a period of thirty days, may order the removal or destruction of such bathing box.

14. An annual fee not exceeding £1 for each bathing box may be charged by the Committee of Management, and any box on which such charge remains in arrears for three months may, after notice to that effect has been posted to the owner, be sold by the Committee of Management, and the proceeds devoted to the maintenance of the Reserve.

15. No person shall bathe upon the foreshore of the Reserve unless decently clad in a costume which extends from neck to knee.

16. The Committee of Management shall have power to arrange with The Flinders Golf Club, whose property abuts on and projects into the Reserve, for the erection of a fence enclosing such property, and the Reserve or portion thereof, and to adjust the fees received for agistment equitably as between the Committee of Management and The Flinders Golf Club.

17. No person shall enter the Reserve on any day set apart for races, cricket, or football matches, sports, shows, fêtes, or holiday amusements, or bring therein any horse or carriage, cart, or other vehicle except on payment of the prescribed fee.

18. No races, cricket, or football matches, sports, shows, fêtes, or holiday amusements shall be held in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

19. The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the Reserve on such days (not exceeding twenty-six in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, races, sports, shows, fêtes, or holiday amusements shall be as follows:—

For the admission to the Reserve of every person over the age of 14 years, such sum as the Committee of Management may from time to time determine, not exceeding 2s.

For the admission to the Reserve of every child not over the age of 14 years, and for every horse, carriage, cart, or other vehicle, such sum as the Committee may from time to time determine, not exceeding 1s.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before

some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

Tenders for supply of forage to more than five separate stations in any one district must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit of 10s. for each and every station tendered for except in the case of the Melbourne District, the preliminary deposit for which shall be £25 with each tender, irrespective of the number of stations tendered for, and the State Plantation at Wail, the preliminary deposit for which shall be £10. Deposits must be in bank notes, or bank drafts payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application; such deposit will be forfeited in the event of the tenderer, after the time fixed for the closing of tenders, withdrawing or attempting to withdraw his tender, or of the successful tenderer failing to complete the necessary bond within a reasonable time after the acceptance is notified.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to hold contracts for Government supplies for a period of two years.

The price must include delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

For police stations, excepting the depôt and institutions other than police, the successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for the sum of £5 per horse per station, and for the depôt and other institutions a bond based on one-quarter of the total amount of the tender accepted, such bonds to be entered into within a reasonable time after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts where the sum stated in the bond is £50 and upwards, and one surety where the sum stated is under £50.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or oats, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oats of the best quality. As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

2. The quantities stated in the schedule are only approximate, and the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned. Should new telegraph stations be formed or additional horses be required at any station, the contractor will be required to supply the extra forage. Unless otherwise specified in the tender form the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station, should the additional number of permanent horses exceed two.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depôt may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, and also forage for any extra horses that may be at any time stabled at the depôt for police purposes, at the same rates. The contract for the supply of forage to the Military Barracks may be terminated by three months' notice being given by the Secretary to the Tender Board to the contractor of such determination.

4. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

5. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

6. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.

7. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue to either party by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, but he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 4.

8. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.

9. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

10. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

11. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.

A Regulation of the City of Melbourne, numbered 2, made under section 4 of Part VI. of the 13th Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1903*, in force in the city by virtue of a By-law of the said city, numbered 126, for appointing the times and hours during or at which respectively any registered hall or other building in the City of Melbourne used for public meetings, or any registered building or any registered ground in the said city in which public amusements are conducted, shall be used for the purpose for which it is registered or shall be closed.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Melbourne make the following Regulation, which shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Melbourne, that is to say:—

1. The times and hours during or at which respectively any registered hall or other building situate in the said City of Melbourne used for public meetings, or any registered building or any registered ground within the said city in which public amusements are conducted, shall be used for the purpose for which it is registered, and the hours at which the same shall be closed shall be as follows, viz.:—On the Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday in each week, from the hour of Eight o'clock in the morning until the hour of Twelve o'clock midnight; when the same shall be closed; and on Saturday in each week from the hour of Eight o'clock in the morning until the hour of half-past Eleven at night, when the same shall be closed. Where the building is used for picture shows, it shall not be used for such purpose between half-past Eleven o'clock on Saturday night and Eight o'clock in the morning of Monday in the week following.

Provided that nothing in this Regulation shall apply to any hall, private party, or social held in any registered building on any Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, or Friday in any week.

Resolution for passing this Regulation agreed to by the Council of the City of Melbourne the twenty-fifth day of May, 1914, and confirmed at a meeting of the said Council held on the eighteenth day of December, 1914.

Firstly.—For comparing weights and measures, including stamping, when necessary:—

Avordupois Weight.

For each 56 lbs.—8d.

For each 28 lbs.—4d.

For each 14 lbs.—3d.

For each under 14 lbs.—2d.

3. That the fees to be charged, received, and taken by the Inspector of Weights and Measures for the Borough of Hamilton for examining and comparing balances, scales, beams, steelyards, and other weighing machines, including stamping when necessary, shall be charged, received, and taken for the actual weight only up to which each balance, scales, beam, or steelyard or other weighing machine may be at the time examined or compared by the Inspector.

4. REGULATION No. 8.

Regulation of the Borough of Queenscliffe, numbered 8, made under Part IX., clause 1. of Thirteenth Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1903*, in force in the Borough of Queenscliffe by virtue of a By-law of the above-named Borough of Queenscliffe, numbered 9.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, and for the purpose of reserving portion of the foreshore hereunder described from beach bathing (bathing dress to be worn on other portion of foreshore), to prohibit any male person from passing or loitering within thirty feet of the Council's Ladies' Baths, and powers to police and municipal officers, in the interests of order and decency, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Queenscliffe make the following Regulation:—

1. No person over the age of (10) ten years shall bathe in the open sea on that part of the foreshore described hereunder, or within three hundred yards thereof, which lies between a point on the Back Beach foreshore due south of the lower lighthouse brick column, and thence northerly along the foreshore to its junction with the Fisherman's Pier, Council's enclosed swimming baths excepted.

2. All bathers, when bathing on other portion of foreshore, or within three hundred yards thereof, shall be clothed in a two-piece costume, known as the Canadian costume.

3. No male person over the age of ten years shall pass or loiter within thirty feet of the Council's Ladies' Baths at any time.

4. Any constable or officer of the police, or any officer of the Council, may require any person who is not dressed when bathing as described in paragraph 2, bathes in the prohibited area, acts in any indecent manner, uses indecent language, or in any way offends against this Regulation, to resume his or her ordinary dress, and he or she shall forthwith do so.

Every person guilty of an offence against this Regulation is liable, on conviction, to the penalty provided for by section 719 of the *Local Government Act 1903*.
