### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the State of Victoria, and Lieutenant-Governor of the said State and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

- "An Act to provide for the Optional Rating by Municipalities on the basis of the Unimproved Values of Rateable Property."
- "An Act to enable Municipal Councils to provide Workers' Dwellings and for other purposes."
- "An Act to authorize the raising of Money for Railways."
- "An Act to authorize the raising of Money for Railways Public Works and other purposes."
- "An Act to revoke the Permanent Reservation and Crown Grant of portion of certain Land in the City of Geelong as a site for Botanical Gardens."
- "An Act to provide for the Exchange of certain Allotments of Private Lands in the City of South Melbourne for certain Allotments of Crown Lands in the said City and for other purposes."

## RATE, AND CHARGE FOR WATER SUPPLIED.

### BY-LAW No. 428.—URBAN DISTRICT OF WATCHEM WITHIN THE WIMMERA UNITED WATERWORKS DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Urban District of Watchem within the Wimmera United Waterworks District:—

- (1) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Twenty-four pence in the pound of the valuation of such tenement. Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such tenement shall not be less than the sum of Eleven shillings and eight-pence for the period hereinafter set out.
- (2) Of lands on which there is no buildings situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Twenty-four pence in the pound of the valuation of such lands.
- (3) Of any tenement or land on which there is no building situate otherwise than in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down and which tenement or land is not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates, and where such tenement or land is over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the period beginning with the first day of December, 1913, and ending with the thirtieth day of June, 1914, and shall be payable on the 12th day of February, 1914, at the office of the said Commission at Murtoa.

3. For making and levying such rates the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate, shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all the purposes of such rates be determined by a police magistrate.

4. For water supplied by the Commission for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Commission) the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at Eighteenpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Commission in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Eighteenpence per 1,000 gallons.

5. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges for water supplied.

This Regulation shall form portion of "The Regulations for the Equipment of Ships with Life-saving Appliances, 1913," made by the Board on the 27th day of June, 1913, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 19th day of July, 1913 (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations), and shall be read in connexion therewith, and shall take effect from the date of publication hereof in the *Government Gazette*, on and from which date the figures and letters "12 lbs." occurring in the last line of clause 12 of the Principal Regulations under the heading "General Regulations," sub-heading "Life Jackets," shall be repealed and therefor there shall be substituted the figures and letters "10½ lbs."

The foregoing amended Regulation was made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria held this twenty-third day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and fourteen.

## REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR RACING, CRICKET, AND GENERAL RECREATION PURPOSES, AT PYALONG.

WE, John Kenny, Richard Patrick Cooke, William Hayes, Denis Griffin, sen. John Halpin, sen., William Richards, and Alexander Figgins, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Racing, Cricket, and General Recreation purposes, at Pyalong, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 9 of the *Land Act 1901*:—

## REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve (12) in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Ten (10) shillings may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the Reserve.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any horses, cattle, goats, pigs, or other animals, without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

## CITY OF GEELONG.

REGULATION No. 11, TO AMEND REGULATION No. 10, FOR REGULATING BUILDINGS IN THE CITY OF GEELONG.

Regulation of the City of Geelong, made under Part V. of the Thirteenth Schedule to the *Local Government Act* 1890, No. 1112, in force in Geelong by virtue of the provisions of By-law numbered 61 of the said City, adopting sections 1, 2, 3, and 4 of Part V. of the said "Thirteenth Schedule" to the said Act No. 1112.

IN pursuance of the *Local Government Act* 1890, the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Geelong make the Regulation following, that is to say:—

1. That after section 2 of Regulation No. 10, passed by the Council of the City of Geelong on the 26th day of August, 1912, and confirmed by the said Council on the 30th day of September, 1912, the following clauses shall be added:—

Condition: under which additions in wood or iron may be made to wooden buildings which are in existence at the date of the passing of this Regulation:—

- (a) Such additions shall be allowed only to buildings used solely for residential purposes within the area, defined in Regulation No. 10 before referred to, excepting that portion of the City bounded on the south by the north building line of Myers-street, on the west by the east building line of Gheringhap-street, on the north by the south building line of Victoria-terrace, and on the east by the west building line of Yarra-street.
  - (b) No such additions shall be allowed after the expiration of a period of five years, dating from the time when this Regulation comes into force.
  - (c) The buildings shall be only one story in height.
  - (d) The total addition allowable shall not exceed 20 per cent. of the floor area of the buildings as existing at the time of the passing of this Regulation.
  - (e) Plans and notice in writing shall in each case be submitted to the Public Works Committee for its approval before any additions are made.
  - (f) All such additions shall, if detached, be eight feet from any other building, and shall be, and continue to be, four feet from boundaries of the land of any adjoining owner, or from boundaries of land not in the same occupation, and in no case shall the distance between any two buildings be less than eight feet unless one of them be of brick, stone, or concrete, with a parapet on the brick wall at least fifteen inches above its adjoining roof or gutter.
2. Within the brick area, when plans of a completed building are submitted, and it is intended to erect a portion only thereof, permission may be granted by the Public Works Committee for the erection of a temporary wall with wooden framing, and covered with iron, upon a guarantee being given by the owner in writing that such building will be completed within a maximum of two years of such guarantee being given, or, alternatively, that the temporary wall be replaced by a permanent wall in accordance with the Regulations, and to insure this being done—

- (a) a sum of money 25 per cent. in excess of the value of the permanent wall shall be lodged in the Council's name in the Savings Bank (interest thereof being payable to the owner), such money to be used to carry out the work if the owner fail to fulfil his guarantee; or
- (b) a guarantee shall be furnished to meet with the approval of the Public Works Committee.

3. In no case, within the area defined in section 1 of the said Regulation No. 10, shall any building or roof be constructed upon wooden pillars, nor upon iron or steel pillars, except for internal supports, unless these iron or steel pillars are completely encased in reinforced concrete, and the said building or roof shall be carried on steel bressummers, properly attached to the pillars and encased in reinforced concrete to the satisfaction of the City Surveyor.

4. All parapets facing any street shall be built of brick, stone, or concrete, supported on steel bressummers, encased in reinforced concrete, to the satisfaction of the City Surveyor.

## CITY OF GEELONG.

## BY-LAW No. 80.

By-law of the City of Geelong, made under the provisions of section 197 of the *Local Government Act* 1903, and numbered 80, for suppressing nuisances and preventing the making of noises in the streets of the said City.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1903, the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Geelong do hereby order as follows:—

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipality of the City of Geelong.

3. Any person offending against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence.

## CITY OF RICHMOND.

Parapet and internal walls of brick to have a band of 24-gauge galvanized iron to take bearing of ceiling joists. Ceiling joists on brick walls to break joints for not less than 4½ in. Front parapet walls to be in cement mortar above the damp courses of parapet." (d) After the words and figures "rafters up to 12 ft. long, 4 in. x 1½ in., 3 ft. centres; over 12 ft. long, 4 in. x 2 in.," add "or 5 in. x 1½ in." (e) Omit the words "iron roof," and substitute "roof to be of new iron." Omit "in" before the words "corrugation side lap." (f) Omit words in sub-clauses 2 and 5, "or within 6 ft. (measured horizontally) of another building with an external wall or wood," after the word "occupation." (g) Omit in sub-clause 5, the word "adjoining" before the words "gutter or roof." (h) Insert after the word "specified" the words "projecting in case of wooden houses at least 1 in. through the wood-work front and back."

2. Insert new sub-clause in clause 36, as follows:—

- (6) Where a building, whether of brick, stone, concrete, reinforced concrete, or wood, has been erected on the boundary or dividing-line, or within 3 ft. thereof of land (whether in the same possession or occupation or not), no external wall of any new building shall be built of wood on the adjoining land, unless it be distant at least 3 ft. (measured horizontally) from such dividing or boundary line.

3. Alter numbers of sub-clauses 6 and 7 to 8 and 9 respectively.

4. Insert new sub-clause in clause 36 as follows:—

- (7) A wash-house, bathroom, vehicle shelter-shed, or such like building may be built on the boundary in all cases, provided the boundary wall and room be in all cases sheathed with new galvanized iron not less than 26-gauge, properly secured with screws or spring-head nails. Iron of walls to be fixed vertically. The roof and wall angles on boundary to be finished off with not less than 12-in. ridging and not less than 26-gauge.

5. In clause 42 (a) alter the words "two courses of asphaltum" to "three courses of asphaltum." (b) Alter the words "and such courses shall be placed one at plate level and the other at floor level," to "and such courses shall be placed at bottom plate level, floor level, and the third two courses from the top." (c) At end of clause insert "brick-work above the damp course to be built in cement mortar with rounded coping of cement."

The word "benefaction" shall mean a sum of money raised from the public by church or other collections, by fêtes and entertainments, or contributed by mining or other companies, societies, or associations, and the bodies under the Local Government Act. The nomination of benefactors as life-governors to be made by the minister or governing body of churches, the collector or collectors, the committee of the said fêtes or entertainments, or the giver or givers thereof, the directors of mining or other companies, societies, or associations, and the councils of the local government bodies respectively. The word "contribution" shall mean a personal gift. Life-governors shall have the privilege of voting at all meetings of subscribers, and of nominating five patients in each year. Other contributors shall be entitled to nominate one patient in any one hospital financial year for every pound of their contribution within the year of such contribution, provided that the funds and accommodation of the hospital will permit of the reception and treatment of such patients. Members of the board are not to be limited to the number of patients they may recommend. Any person subscribing Ten shillings shall have the privilege of recommending one outdoor patient, but shall not be entitled to vote.
