RATE, AND CHARGE FOR WATER SUPPLIED. BY-LAW NO. 429.—URBAN DISTRICT OF BERRIWILLOCK WITHIN THE SEA LAKE WATERWORKS DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:-

- 1. The following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Urban District of Berriwillock within the Sea Lake Waterworks District.
 - (1) Of any tenement (other than land on which Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Twenty-four pence in the pound of the valuation of such tenement. Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such tenement shall not be less than the sum of Ten shillings for the period hereinsfter set out.
 Of lands on which there is no building situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Twenty-four pence in the pound of the valuation of such lands.
 Of any tenement or land on which there is no

- such lands.

 Of any tenement or land on which there is no building situate otherwise than in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down and which tenement or land is not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates, and where such tenement or land is over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half-amile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.
- 2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the period beginning with the first day of January, 1914, and ending with the thirtieth day of June, 1914, and shall be payable on the 26th day of February, 1914, at the office of the said Commission at Birchip.

- 3. For making and levying such rates the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate, shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all the purposes of such rates be determined by a police magistrate.
- 4. For water supplied by the Commission for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Commission) the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at Eighteenpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Commission in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Eighteenpence per 1,000 gallons.
- 5. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges for water supplied.

Where water is supplied for other than domestic use solely, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly shall be 10,000 gallons. Charges for water shall be due and payable on the 1st January and 1st July, 1914.

REGULATIONS FOR EXAMINATIONS FOR LAND SURVEYORS AND ISSUE OF LICENCES. TO SURVEY.

REGULATIONS approved by the Governor in Council, 8th November, 1910, are hereby rescinded, and the following Regulations are substituted therefor:—

- 1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.
 - 2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board-
 - (a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examina-tion, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the Government Gazette.
 - (b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

- 3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

- (c) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.
- (d) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at the Melbourne University on examination in which a representative of the Surveyors Board acted as co-examiner, and shall have been at some time professionally employed in the field for a period of eighteen months on work satisfactory to the Board.
- 6. In addition to evidence of service, a caudidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys:—

Nors.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by those opinion of th Regulations.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road, and also a plan, field notes, and description of a survey of a town lot built upon, as made for the purpose of an application under the provisions of the Real Property Act or Land Transfer Act.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

9. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plandrawing, except paper.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

Mathematics.

(a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

(b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practice of Surveying.

(r) Detail of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, and underground surveying, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting by co-ordinates and from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Act, writing descriptions of boundaries.

Candidates may be required to effect surveys under supervision.

Engineering Surveys.

(d) Levelling and contouring; grading; setting-out, and measurement of earthworks, including practical tests.

Use of Instruments.

(e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sex-tant, tacheometer, level, compass, clinometer, baro-meter, thermometer and steel band.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

(f) Determination (including practical tests) of time, latitude, and azimuth; the use of ephemerides; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

Drawing.

(a) Plan-drawing, drawing of sections and contours, compila-tion of plans, projection of maps and charts.

Miscellaneous.

(h) Elementary physics, elementary geology, elementary

forestry.

[The scope of the examination in elementary physics will be that covered by "Balfour Stewart's Elementary Physics," Fourth Edition, omitting chapters 8, 10, and 11, and the scope of the examination in elementary geology will be that covered by "Geike's Class-book of Geology," Fourth Edition.]

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having passed the matriculation or senior examination at a University, or of having completed a course of the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers. Candidatos holding satisfactory certificates or diplomas from any University recognised by an Australasian University or from recognised public technical schools may be exempted from working out papers in physics and geology, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates admitted under clause 5(d) may be exempted from working out papers other than those prescribed in clause 10(c), and from such portion of the practical examination as the Board may determine.

SHIRE OF PRESTON. BY-LAW No. 18.

- BY-LAW No. 18.

 A By-law of the Shire of Preston made under section 197 of the Local Government Act 1903, and, with the approval of the Governor in Council, under section 198 of the Local Government Act 1903, and numbered eighteen, for the purpose of carrying out certain of the purposes provided for in Part V. of the Thirteenth Schedule to the Local Government Act 1903, and for regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings and erections, and for requiring the pulling down and removal of buildings and erections, and anthorizing the Council to pull down and remove buildings and erections erected or constructed contrary to this By-law, or not pulled down or removed as required by or under this By-law, and to sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such buildings and erections, and in paying into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof, and for appointing fees which may be charged and received by the Council for any act done or to be done by any of its officers under this By-law, and for any permit or licence to be issued by the Council.

 In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local
- IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1903, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Preston order as fol-
- 1. By-law No, 17 of the Shire of Preston is hereby

- 2. No person shall erect, build, or construct, or cause to be erected, built, or constructed, any building or erection contrary to the provisions of this By-law.
- 3. No person shall erect, build, or construct, or cause to be erected, built, or constructed, any building or erection without first obtaining written permission from the Council so to do, and without first submitting to the Council, its secretary, or surveyor, the plans and specifications of the proposed building or crection.
- 4. No person shall make any alteration or addition to any building or erection within the Shire of Preston (except that of necessary repairs not affecting its construction, or any external or party walls) without first obtaining the written permission of the Council so to
- do.

 5. No person shall erect, build, or construct, or cause to be erected, built, or constructed, any building or erection to be used as a dwelling house only within the Shire of Preston unless the whole of the said building or erection of whatever material constructed shall cover an area of five hundred (500) square feet at least in cases where the building or erection consists of less than four (4) rooms, and six hundred (600) square feet at least in cases where the building or erection consists of four (4) or more rooms, and if such building or erection be of wood the external walls thereof shall be covered with new sound boards, and the roof or roofs thereof shall be covered on the outside with incombustible roof coverings, and the height between the floors and the ceilings of the main rooms shall be eleven (11) feet at least. feet at least.
- 6. No person shall remove or transport, or cause to be o. No person shall remove or transport, or cause to be removed or transported, any building or erection, either in whole or in part, into any part of the Shire of Preston, or from any part of the said Shire to another part of the same, unless such building or erection when completed shall comply with all the provisions of this Regulation, and unless six (6) days' notice, in writing, of the intention to remove same be first given to the Council, its secretary, or surveyor.
- of the intention to remove same be first given to the Council, its secretary, or surveyor.

 7. If any building or erection shall hereafter be partly or wholly erected, built, or constructed contrary to the provisions of this By-law, the Council may give to the owner or builder, or leave upon the site of such building or erection fourteen (14) days' notice, in writing, to bring such building or erection into conformity with the said provisions, or to pull down or remove such building or erection, and if default shall be made in complying with such notice, and, notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty, it shall be lawful for the said Council to enter upon such building or erection, and on the site thereof, with a sufficient number of workmen, and to pull down the said building or erection, or any part or parts thereof, and to do any other act that may be necessary for the purpose, and to remove the materials thereof to some convenient place; and if the Council in its discretion thinks fit, to sell the same in such a manner as it thinks fit, and all expenses incurred by the Council, pulling down the said building or erection, or any part thereof, or of removing the materials thereof and selling the same, and in doing such other acts as aforesaid; and all fees or penalties due by the owner or builder thereof may be deducted and retained by the Council out of the proceeds of such sale; and the Council shall restore any surplus arising from such sale to such owner or builder or other person proving himself to be legally entitled thereto.

 8. This By-law shall not apply to any fence green.
- 8. This By-law shall not apply to any fence, green-house, or aviary, or other separate outbuilding approved of by the Council, or to any Government buildings, works, or operations.
- 9. No building may have an external wall of wood (a) within four (4) feet, measured borizontally, of land not in the same possession or occupation, unless the latter be a public way or public drain at least eight (8) feet wide; or (b) within eight (8) feet of another building or crection with an external wall of wood built on land in the same possession or occupation.
- 10. No two or more houses may be built together unless they have not less than nine (9) inch brick or stone party walls projecting, in case of wooden houses, at least one inch through the woodwork (front and back), and in all cases projecting one foot at least through every part of the roof, whether belonging to the same owner or not.
- 11. The external wall of any building or erection within four (4) feet, measured horizontally, of land not in the same possession or occupation, or within eight (8) feet, measured horizontally, of another building or erection with an external wall-of wood built on land in the same possession or occupation, must be built of brick or stone at least nine inches thick, and be carried up and remain at least one foot higher than the nearest part of the adjoining gutter or roof.





12. Every wall (other than wood) shall have a damp proof course above the surface of the ground throughout its whole thickness of asphalt or other material impervious to moisture, and in cases where it is not desirable to place the same throughout the building at one uniform level, then the said damp-proof course must be laid in horizontal layers, connected at the ends by a vertical course of the same material.

13. The space under the ground floor of every build ing shall have a sufficiency of openings through all walls underfloor to thoroughly ventilate the same.

underfloor to thoroughly ventilate the same.

14. The sum of One pound (£1) shall be charged and received on account of the municipal fund for the inspection or superintendence of each new building or erection, and the sum of Five shillings (5s.) for the inspection or superintendence of each alteration or addition of a value of Fifty (£50) and not exceeding One hundred pounds (£100), and Ten shillings (10s.) for the inspection or superintendence of each alteration or addition exceeding in value One hundred pounds (£100) approved of by the Council.

approved of by the Council.

15. The following words or expressions wherever used in this By-law shall have the meaning hereby assigned them respectively so far as such meanings are not excluded by context, that is to say:—"Council" shall mean the Council of the municipality of the Shire of Preston. "Secretary" shall mean the Shire Secretary for the time being of the Shire of Preston. "Surveyor" shall mean the surveyor for the time being of the Shire of Preston. The expression "dwelling house" means a building used or constructed or adapted to be used wholly or principally for human habitation.
