## QUARTERLY STATISTICAL ABSTRACT, 31st DECEMBER, 1913.

*Population.*—The estimated population on 30th September, 1913, was 1,399,325 ; on 31st December, 1913, it was 1,412,119—thus showing an increase of 12,794 persons. The natural increase in the population was 5,178, and the excess of immigration was 7,616. During the quarter the net gain by Victoria from the United Kingdom was 4,744 persons, from New South Wales 3,710 persons, from South Australia 2,521 persons, and from Western Australia 777 persons ; but in the same period the net loss to Tasmania was 3,804 persons.

*Vital Statistics.*—For the whole State there were 11,324 marriages, 35,978 births, and 15,475 deaths for the year 1913, as compared with 11,738, 35,817, and 16,595 respectively for the previous year. Of the total deaths 1,053 were due to phthisis, 217 to other tubercular diseases, 1,168 to cancer, 95 to typhoid fever, and 245 to diphtheria, as against 1,087, 209, 1,225, 98, and 257 respectively in 1912. In Melbourne and suburbs the births were 17,397, or 518 more, and the deaths were 7,960, or 662 fewer than in the previous year. Of the metropolitan deaths, 563 occurred from phthisis, 141 from other tubercular diseases, 674 from cancer, 29 from typhoid fever, 122 from diphtheria, and 27 from whooping cough, as compared with 616, 124, 695, 29, 130, and 117 respectively in 1912. The deaths of infants under one year of age numbered 1,328, which was equivalent to a death rate of 7·63 per 100 births, as against a rate of 9·02 for the preceding year.

*State Revenue and Expenditure.*—The total revenue for the quarter was £2,482,300, which represents an increase of £99,614 on that for the corresponding quarter of the previous year. The principal items of revenue were—Railways, £1,435,169, Interest, £127,556, and Probate Duty, £112,232. The total expenditure was £2,857,630, a decrease of £100,885 on that for the corresponding quarter of 1912.

*Railways.*—Compared with the corresponding quarter of the preceding year, the revenue increased by £119,761, the expenditure by £116,127, the tonnage of goods and live stock carried by 218,903, train miles run by 279,983, and passengers carried by 1,210,676.

*Victorian Banking Returns.*—On the 31st December the total liabilities of the associated and Commonwealth banks were £48,714,500 and the assets £49,828,030, as against £47,836,052 and £49,543,884, on the 31st December, 1912. The reserves of the associated banks amounted to £9,924,068, and their paid up capital to £15,592,252. The ratio of coin, bullion, and notes to the liabilities of all the banks was 20·38 per cent.

*Savings Banks.*—On the 31st December the amount at credit of the 725,348 depositors in the State and Commonwealth Savings Banks was £22,926,607. During the quarter 33,425 accounts were opened, and 25,023 were closed ; the deposits made were £5,012,781, and the withdrawals £4,587,153.

*Gold Yield.*—The total yield of gold up to the end of December, 1913, is 73,515,268 ounces.

*Imports and Exports.*—The total value of oversea imports into Victoria during the quarter under review was £6,723,969, and the total oversea exports during the same period were valued at £8,205,996, as compared with £6,498,193 and £6,950,203 respectively in the corresponding quarter of the previous year. The oversea imports for the year 1913 were valued at £24,449,495, and the oversea exports at £17,819,110 ; these figures represent decreases of £631,579 and £1,294,011 respectively below those for 1912.

*Exports of Frozen, Preserved, and Perishable Products.*—For the quarter ended 31st December, 1913, the total value of these exports oversea through Cool Stores was £1,647,537, of which £1,587,138 went to the United Kingdom, £18,708 to South Africa, and £41,691 to Eastern and other ports. The principal exports were—Butter, valued at £1,048,560 ; Mutton and Lamb, £497,783 ; Beef, £67,840 ; and Milk and Cream, £16,637.
