PUBLIC SERVICE OF VICTORIA.

IMPROPER INFLUENCE.

T having come under notice that there is a growing tendency on the part of certain officers in the Public Service to use influence in respect to matters affecting their remuneration or position in the Service, the attention of officers is invited to the fact that this is a distinct violation of the provisions of section 4 of The Constitution Act 1906, No. 2075, which reads as follows:—

- 4. (1) In order that all officers may be enabled to render loyal and efficient service to the State, it is hereby enacted that no person or class of persons employed in any capacity (whether permanently or temporarily) in the Public Service (including the Railway Service, the Police Force, the State Rivers and Water Supply Department, and the Lunacy Department) shall either directly or indirectly take any part whatsoever in or in relation to election of Members of the Legislative Council or the Legislative Assembly, or directly or indirectly in any way take part in the political affairs of the State of Victoria otherwise than by recording a vote at a parliamentary election; and no person or class of persons so employed shall directly or indirectly use or attempt to use any influence in respect to any matter affecting the remuneration or position in the Public Service of either himself or any other person.
- (2) If any person so employed is guilty of any contravention of this section, then on proof thereof to the satisfaction of the Public Service Commissioner, the Commissioners of Railways, the Chief Commissioner of Police, or the State Rivers and Water Supply Commissioners, or the Inspector-General of Insane (as the case may be), such person may by the said authority—

be fined any sum not exceeding Ten pounds;

may be reduced in class, subdivision, grade, or status and salary; or he may be dismissed; or his services may be dispensed with:

Provided that such person shall not be dismissed or have his services dispensed with for any contravention of this section without the


consent of the Governor in Council.

(3) This section shall apply to every person employed as aforesaid notwithstanding that he may not be subject to the Public Service Acts or the Railways Acts or the Police Regulations Acts, or Part I. of the Lunacy Act 1903.

(4) This section shall not apply to officers in the service of Parliament, but the Governor in Council on the recommendation of the President of the Legislative Council, the Speaker of the Legislative Assembly, and the Joint Library Committee respectively, may make regulations applying to such officers in relation to the matters referred to herein.

The Cabinet has given instructions that a copy of this notice is to be posted and kept posted in all rooms to which officers of the Public Service commonly have access, and also that action is to be taken in every case in which the provisions of the section in question are contravened.

The section applies to both permanent and temporary officers.

SHIRE OF BAIRNSDALE.

BY-LAW NO. 33.

In pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Act 1890, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Bairnsdale, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

(1) All former By-laws, so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law, are hereby repealed.

(2) This By-law shall come into full force and opera-tion on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the Govern-

(3) This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the area in Schedule numbered 1 hereto.

(4) The occupier of any premises on which there is a closet or privy shall cause the space under the seat of each closet or privy on such premises to be prepared, and shall permit the same to be used, for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service.

(5) The Council shall cause every closet or privy to be supplied and kept supplied with two pans for the reception of night-soil, and a lid to closely fit the same, and shall cause one or other of such pans to be kept under the seat aforesaid.

under the seat aforesaid.

(6) The occupier aforesaid or other person having the control or management of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan in such closet or privy to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

(7) The Council shall at least once a week cause the

(7) The Council shall at least once a week cause the pan in use to be closed with a lid and removed with its contents from the premises in the day-time, and the other pan to be left in its place.

(8) Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy the Council shall cause the same to be cleansed by superheated steam, and tar-painted inside, or by some equally

(9) The occupier aforesaid or other person shall not contract for the removal of night-soil, nor remove nor cause to be removed night-soil from such premises except in accordance with this By-law.

(10) The Council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate, to make a charge on each occupier for the pans supplied, and for the removal of night-soil and the other work herein directed, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any Court of Petry Sessions.

(11) If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued. or continued.

LETTER OF REQUEST: SUPREME COURT ACT 1912 (ACT No. 2437).

RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT.

Under the powers conferred by the Supreme Court Act 1890, as extended by the Supreme Court Act 1912, it is ordered as follows:—

CHAPTER I.—ORDER XI.

- 9. Where in any civil or commercial matter pending before a Court or Tribunal of a foreign country a Letter of Request from such Court or Tribunal for service on any person in Victoria of any process or citation in such matter is transmitted to the Supreme Court by His Majesty's Attorney-General for Victoria with an intimation that it is desirable that effect should be given to the same, the following procedure shall be adopted:—
 - (1) The Letter of Request for service shall be accompanied by a translation thereof in the English language, and by two copies of the process or citation to be served, and two copies thereof in the English language.

(2) Service of the process or citation shall be effected through the Sheriff by the process server whom he may appoint from time to time for

the purpose or his authorized agent.

(3) Such service shall be effected by delivering to and leaving with the person to be served one copy of the process to be served and one copy of the translation thereof, in accordance with the Rules and practice of the Victorian Supreme Court regulating service of process.

(4) After service has been effected, the Sheriff shall return to the Prothonotary of the Supreme Court one copy of the process, together with the evidence of service by affidavit, of the person effecting the service, verified by notarial certificate, and particulars

of charges for the cost of effecting such service.

(5) The particulars of charges for the cost of effecting service shall be submitted to the Taxing Master of the Supreme Court, who shall certify the correctness of the charge or such other amount as shall be properly payable for the cost of effecting service. A copy of such charges and certificate shall be forwarded to His Majesty's Attorney-General.

- (6) The Prothonotary shall transmit to His Majesty's Attorney-General for Victoria the Letter of Request for service received from the foreign country, together with the evidence of service, with a certificate appended thereto duly sealed with the seal of the Supreme Court for use out of the jurisdiction. Such certificate shall be in the form in the Schedule to these Rules, which may be cited as Form No. 74A, Appendix K, of the Rules of the Supreme Court.
- 10. Upon the application of the Crown Solicitor, with the consent of His Majesty's Attorney-General, the Court, or a Judge, may make all such orders for substituted service or otherwise as may be necessary to give effect to these Rules.

By-law No. 22.

- 1. A rate of Sixpence in the One pound (£1) sterling on the net annual value of all rateable property situated within the Shire of Shepparton Waterworks Trust District, according to the valuation for the time being of all the lands and tenements for the municipal rates of the Shires of Shepparton and Tungamah, is hereby made for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1914, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1914.
- 2. Such rate is hereby made payable in one instalment, and shall be due and payable on the 1st day of January,
- Such person or persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and collect the said rate.

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wire of the Commissioners, or of prejudicially affecting or interfering, either mechanically or electrically, with the proper use of any such wire.

"(b) The form of any notice or order which may

3. Quorums of meetings.—There shall be present at least three members at such first meeting in order to constitute a quorum, and all future quorums shall consist of two members, exclusive of the Chairman.

4. Chairman.—The Chairman shall be elected at the first meeting of the Trust, or at any adjournment thereof, and thereafter annually, by a majority of votes of those present, and he shall hold office as Chairman for one year if he remain a member of the municipal council of his district, and may be willing to act.

5. Vacancy of Chairman, how filled.—Any vacancy in the position of Chairman shall be filled at the next meeting of the Trust after such vacancy has occurred, or at any adjournment thereof, in the same manner as aforesaid, and such election shall be the first business on the notice-paper for such meeting.

6. Appointment by Minister.—In the event of the Trust failing or neglecting to elect a Chairman the Minister may, by writing under his hand, appoint one of the members of the Trust to be Chairman, who shall hold office for one year if he remain a member of the municipal council of his district, and be willing to act.

7. Vice-Chairman.—In the absence of the Chairman, through illness or otherwise, at any meeting the members shall elect a Vice-Chairman to conduct the business of that meeting.

8. Special meetings.—The Trust may hold special meet-

8. Special meetings.—The Trust may hold special meetings, which may be called upon the requisition of the Chairman, or upon the requisition, in writing under their hands, of any three members, addressed to the Chairman; but no such special meeting shall be held unless three clear days' notice thereof at least be given.

W HEREAS by section 25 of the Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1893 (No. 1288) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make Regulations relating to any Railway Construction Trust appointed and created under Part I. of the said Act for the purposes following:—

"(a) The mode in which meetings of the members of Trusts under the said Part of the said Act

of Trusts under the said Part of the said Act are to be convened;

"(b) The form of any notice or order which may be required to be given by any Trustees under the said Act; and

"(c) Generally for regulating the conduct of the business and the proceedings of such Trusts and the numbers of members to form quorums thereof, and the appointment of the Chairman of each Trust, and for carrying into effect the provisions of the said Part of the said Act."

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the said provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth for the purposes aforesaid, so far as these may relate to a certain Railway Construction Trust duly appointed and created under the Railway Lands Acquisition Acts, and known as the Hamilton to Cevendish Railway Construction Trust, make the Regulation following, viz.

- 1. First meeting.—The first meeting of the Trust shall be convened by the Minister, at such time and place as he may direct.
- 2. Time and place of meeting.—The subsequent meetings of the Trust shall be held at such time and place as the Trustees may from time to time appoint, or, in default of such appointment, as the Minister may direct.
- 3. Quorums of meetings.—There shall be present at least three members at such first meeting in order to constitute a quorum, and all future quorum shall consist of two members, exclusive of the Chairman.

- 4. Chairman.—The Chairman shall be elected at the first meeting of the Trust, or at any adjournment thereof, and thereafter annually, by a majority of votes of those present, and he shall hold office as Chairman for one year if he remain a member of the municipal council of his district, and may be willing to act.

 5. Vacancy of Chairman, how filled.—Any vacancy in the position of Chairman shall be filled at the next meeting of the Trust after such vacancy has occurred, or at any adjournment thereof, in the same manner as aforesaid, and such election shall be the first business on the notice-paper for such meeting.

 6. Appointment by Minister.—In the event of the

Appointment by Minister.—In the event of the Trust failing or neglecting to elect a Chairman the Minister may, by writing under his hand, appoint one of the members of the Trust to be Chairman, who shall hold office for one year if he remain a member of the municipal council of his district, and be willing to act.

 7. Vice-Chairman.—In the absence of the Chairman, through illness or otherwise, at any meeting the members shall elect a Vice-Chairman to conduct the business of that meeting.

PROTECTION OF NATIVE GAME AT KIRARWA SWAMP AND ADJOINING LANDS IN THE PARISH OF MURNDAL.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of section 14 of the Game Act 1896 (60 Vict. No. 1463), do by this Proclamation direct that the part of Victoria hereunder described shall be a locality in which, from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December (both days inclusive) in each year, it shall be unlawful for any person to kill or destroy any native game included in the Third Schedule to the Game Act 1890.

REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE MINYIP COMMON.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the 8th January, 1902, the Council of the Shire of Dunmunkle, having drafted the following Regulations for management of the Minyip Common submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council:—

REGULATIONS.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, 'business licences, or carriers' licences, and farmers residing within a distance of five miles from the Common, may respectively depasture thereon four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in 'small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on the Common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every 'ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

- 2. No person shall depasture on the Common stock of which he is not the bona fide owner.
- 3. The fees for depasturing stock on the Common shall be as follow, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance on the first day of February and the first day of August in every year, or proportionately for any lesser period:—

For every head of large cattle, and for every head of small cattle, grazed inside the fenced portion of the Common, Sixpence per head per week.

For every head of large cattle, and for every head of small cattle, grazed on the unfenced portion of the Common, Threepence per head per week.

- 4. All cattle grazing on the Common shall be tar branded.
- 5. The brands of all licensed stock shall be registered with the managers, and all stock found upon the Common upon which the prescribed fees shall not have been paid, or of which the brands have not been duly registered, shall be deemed to be trespassing on the Common, and shall be liable to be impounded.
- 6. No bull shall be depastured on the Common without the consent, in writing, of the managers first obtained.
- 7. The managers shall be at liberty to set apart a portion of the Common for the depasturing of small cattle.
- 8. In the event of any infectious disease appearing in the stock on the Common the herdsman shall forward an immediate report to the Inspector of Stock.
- 9. Wherein by these Regulations, or by the Regulations relating to Common, made by the Governor in Council, any act, matter, or thing is required to be done by the managers, it shall be deemed to be effectively and well done under the signature of any two of them.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.
