APPOINTMENT OR TRANSFER TO THE CLERICAL DIVISION.
[Act No. 1133, Section 59 (II.) and (III.)]

1. Candidates for appointment or transfer to the Clerical Division will be examined in the following subjects:—

As prescribed for the second year in Victorian High Schools

2. In order to pass the examination a candidate must obtain (a) at least two-thirds of the full marks in handwriting and in spelling; (b) at least three-fifths of the full marks in English and in arithmetic; (c) at least one-half of the aggregate full marks in geography, and English history and civics; (d) at least one-half of the aggregate full marks in the remaining subjects.

No candidate will be credited with any marks in any subject unless he gains at least 25 per cent. of the full marks allotted for the subject.

When making application, candidates must state in which of the optional subjects they desire to be examined.

3. Candidates for appointment or transfer to either of the under-named offices must, prior to registration for examination, comply with one of the following conditions (as the case may be) to the satisfaction of the Commissioner, namely:—

(a) *Assistant in Public Library*.—The production of evidence of having passed the Junior Public (or Senior Public) Examination of the University of Melbourne (or some examination which the Commissioner may judge equivalent) in Greek, in Latin, and in either French or German;

(b) *Clerk and Draughtsman, Department of Lands and Survey*.—The production of a certificate of qualification from the Secretary for Lands, the Surveyor-General, or the Chief Draughtsman of the Department of Lands and Survey.

Registration and Examination of Candidates.

4. The Commissioner shall give, in the *Government Gazette*, six weeks' clear notice of the date of every examination.

5. Every candidate for appointment to the Clerical Division must, on the date of examination, be between the ages of sixteen and twenty-one years, and must forward to the Commissioner an application, in his own handwriting, on the proper form, stating his full name and address, and the date and place of his birth, together with a certificate satisfactory to the Commissioner of his good moral character and industrious habits.

6. Officers of the General Division who are candidates for examination must furnish a certificate by the Permanent Head of their Department of good conduct and health.

7. The names of the candidates who, in the opinion of the Commissioner, have complied with the requirements of the regulations shall be entered in the "Register of Candidates."

8. All applications must be lodged with the Commissioner at least twenty-one clear days before the date fixed for an examination.

9. The Commissioner shall publish in the *Government Gazette*, at least sixteen days before the date of an examination, the list of candidates registered and a statement of the places where the examination will be held.

10. Every candidate named in the list must, within seven days from the publication thereof, forward to the Commissioner a postal note (across which two parallel lines should be drawn) payable to the Secretary to the Commissioner, for Twelve shillings and sixpence, being fee for the examination, and must state at which of the named places he desires to be examined. If a candidate fail to comply with this regulation, he will not be allowed to present himself for examination.

11. The Commissioner may appoint officers in charge, for the purpose of presiding at examinations, and may award them and the examiners appointed by the Governor in Council such remuneration as appears to be reasonable.

12. Candidates shall observe any printed directions or any oral directions of the officer in charge of the examination.

13. Examiners and officers in charge will observe any general directions which may be issued by the Commissioner for the preparation, transmission, and marking of examination papers.

14. After an examination has been held, the examiners shall, as soon as practicable, forward to the Commissioner a return, signed by every examiner, of all persons who have passed the examination, showing also the marks obtained by every candidate in each subject, and—in the case of a candidate who has passed—the total of his marks.

15. Immediately after an examination has been held, all the entries in the "Register of Candidates" shall be cancelled, and a new series of entries shall be commenced.

Registration of Qualified Candidates.

16. Candidates who have passed the examination, and are included in the number to be selected for appointment, shall furnish the Commissioner, within seven days after being required so to do, with a properly certified extract from some official register of births or other evidence of age, satisfactory to the Commissioner, and also a certificate of sound bodily health and freedom from physical defects from the Government medical officer, or from some other medical practitioner registered in Victoria approved by the Commissioner. Provided that in the case of candidates who, pursuant to the provisions of any Act of the Parliament of Victoria, have served in South Africa or in China it shall be sufficient if the said medical certificate sets forth that they are of sound bodily health, and do not suffer from any physical defect which would incapacitate them from the proper performance of the duties of the position for which they are registered. Failure to comply with the provisions of this clause will preclude the registration of a candidate.

17. The Commissioner shall cause to be entered in the "Register of Qualified Candidates," in the order of their merit up to but not beyond the published number to be selected for appointment, the names of all candidates who have passed the examination, including those of officers who have served for less than two years* in the General Division, and are between the ages specified in clause 5, and of officers who have served two years in that Division, provided that all such candidates not in the General Division have forwarded evidence as prescribed as to age, health, and freedom from physical defects. They will not be despatched to or from Spencer-street or Flinders-street by passenger or mixed trains, but must be sent by goods trains.

 - On completion of the term herein named hand over to the said apprentice this copy of agreement with a certificate thereon to the effect that the said term has been served.
 - If at any time during the said term he shall die or cease to carry on the business aforesaid as now carried on by him either altogether or within a radius of three miles from his present place of business he or his executors administrators or assigns or one of them will within one month thereafter find and provide some other employer or employers carrying on the business aforesaid within such radius if any there be or if there be none such if the apprentice so require provide some employer carrying on business beyond that radius and will assign and transfer at his or their own expense and cost the said apprentice to such employer or employers upon and subject to the same or the like conditions and stipulations as are hereinbefore provided.
 - If from any cause whatever he is unable to find work for the said apprentice he will transfer such apprentice for a period not exceeding three months to some other employer or employers carrying on the same business within one mile of the original employer's place of business he being held responsible for the due performance of all obligations imposed by this indenture.

Factories and Shops Acts.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Act 1912*, and after due inquiry, I, being the responsible Minister for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of sub-section (1) of section 37 of the said Act in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF THE FLINDERS-LANE UMBRELLA FACTORY, OLIVER'S-LANE, MELBOURNE.

for a period of four weeks from the 26th March, 1914, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than six females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said six females shall not be employed for more than fifty-four hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.

SUNBURY WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1914.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Sunbury Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, make the following By-law:—

By-law for the making of a rate for the year 1914 on the rateable property within the Waterworks District of Sunbury Waterworks Trust also dealing with the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust:—

1. A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the £1 sterling shall be paid on the annual value of the rateable property fronting streets on which a main pipe has been laid, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of Bulla, the minimum amount to be paid in respect of any tenement to be not less than Twenty shillings.
2. For all unoccupied allotments, a minimum sum of Ten shillings shall be paid.
3. For all water supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic purposes, a charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons shall be paid; and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which would be equal to the assessed rate payable for the premises so supplied; and where water is used for other than domestic purposes solely, the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 30,000 gallons, and shall be paid for in advance, or as the Trust may deem necessary.
4. For any public water trough supplied by the Trust the sum of Thirty shillings per annum shall be charged, unless supplied by meter.
5. For water supplied from the stand-pipe or hydrant, for each load of 200 gallons or under, the sum of One shilling, and for each load in excess of 200 gallons *pro rata* on the above scale.
6. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable, in advance, on the 1st May, 1914, and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates.

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

RATE AND CHARGE FOR WATER SUPPLIED.

By-law No. 431.—*Quambatook Urban District within the Avoca Water Trust District.*

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Quambatook Urban District within the Avoca Water Trust District:—

- (1) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down, a rate of Thirty-nine pence in the pound of the valuation of such tenement. Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such tenement shall not be less than the sum of Twenty shillings per year.
- (2) Of lands on which there is no building, situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down, a rate of Thirty-nine pence in the pound of the valuation of such lands.
- (3) Of any tenement or land on which there is no building, situate otherwise than in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down, and which tenement or land is not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenement or land is over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half a mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of January, 1914, and ending with the thirty-first day of December, 1914, and shall be payable on the ninth day of April, 1914, at the office of the Commission's collector at Charlton.

3. For making and levying such rates, the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate, shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all the purposes of such rates be determined by a Police Magistrate.

4. For water supplied by the Commission for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Commission), the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at Fifteen pence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Commission in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Fifteen pence per 1,000 gallons.

5. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be, and is, or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges for water supplied.

- any person whatsoever under the age of eighteen years at any circular saw used for cutting wood,
- any male under the age of sixteen years and any female under the age of eighteen years at any guillotine machine moved by mechanical power,
- any person whatsoever under the age of eighteen years at any surface planing machine,

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedule, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. Substantial and effective preference will, however, be given to goods of Commonwealth manufacture, provided the quality is satisfactory and is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule. Preference will also be given to articles of British manufacture as against those of foreign manufacture.

3. Except where otherwise stated in the schedule, the value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williamstown are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office, and Williamstown district will include the Town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra. Supplies for a.s. John Murray must be delivered at the Railway Pier, Port Melbourne.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officers ordering the goods.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in Clause 6, or the head of the Department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

8. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form at the time of the delivery of the goods, and the account shall be accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

10. All goods forwarded under these contracts shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor or contractors by whom consigned, on a legibly written business label.

11. When the contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any department except the Commonwealth Departments, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the Railways to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Department or such other department as shall be named therein. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be forwarded to consignee in accordance with Clause 12. (In the case of the Commonwealth Departments, however, the Commonwealth consignment note only which accompanies the order must be used.) Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under Clause 16 of these conditions.

12. Immediately after the consignment of the goods the officer to whom they are forwarded shall be notified by the contractor, on the duplicate consignment note provided for the purpose, that the goods have been forwarded. On receipt of this document the officer to whom it has been forwarded shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the goods without delay, to the Stores and Transport Office. In the event of loss through failure on the part of the contractor to comply with this condition he will be held responsible, and the amount of the loss incurred for same will be deducted, as in Clause 7.

13. Should the order on the contractor specially provide that goods of a fragile character, or such as are liable to suffer loss by leakage, shall be consigned at the risk of the Railways Commissioners under special freight conditions, the contractor shall in such instance provide, in writing, on the consignment note an intimation to that effect, failing which, in the event of loss, he shall bear the whole cost of replacing the goods, the amount being deducted from the contractor's account or the security money.

14. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in Clause 7.

15. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the State for the time being, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in Clause 7.

16. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, delay in delivering or replacing them when required, or non-compliance with the terms of Clauses 11 and 12 of these conditions respecting the forwarding of consignment notes, &c., will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in Clause 7. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and declare forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of twelve months from the date of such disqualification.

17. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government. If it is found during the currency of the contract that the contractor has not conformed to the condition of advertisement—which stipulates that if a tenderer be a member of a firm, and such firm be interested in the contract, then the tender is to be in the name of the firm, and not in that of the individual—then the Honorable the Treasurer may, on the recommendation of the Tender Board, determine the contract, and forfeit the security money.

18. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Imperial Commissariat or Agent-General for Victoria, or by any contracts or agreements made for any works or supplies by the Department of Public Works, or State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, or on account of the Federal Government, or for the Railway Department, or for supplies for Technical High or Higher Elementary Schools, or for the Metropolitan Parks and Gardens, or for supplies to the Aborigines, or for connexions and fittings for Diamond Drills and Batteries; or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment, or by the consumption of the surplus stock of any Government establishment.

19. For the purpose of the contracts entered into under these conditions, it is hereby expressly provided that in the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in these contracts, the Government or the contractor (as the case may be) may give two months' notice, through the Secretary to the Tender Board, of the termination of the contract for the particular item or items so affected to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made. The contract for the unaffected items to remain in full force and effect. Any notice to be served under this condition shall be deemed to have been duly served if sent to the contractor in a registered letter at his last-known place of business or abode.

20. As regards Contracts for Supplies used expressly for the Defence Department, however, it will be competent either for the contractor, on his own behalf, or for the Secretary of the Tender Board, on behalf of the Government, to terminate the whole or any item of the contract by giving three full calendar months' notice, in writing, to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given as in Clause 19.
