# DETERMINATION OF THE STONE CUTTERS BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of cutting, carving, polishing, and letter cutting in marble and stone has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That the previous Determination of this Board is hereby amended, and such amendments shall come into force and be operative on and after the 13th day of April, 1914.

#### JUVENILE WORKERS.

- (3) That the lowest rates of payment payable to persons under 21 years of age (other than apprentices or improvers) engaged in the following work, viz.:—
  - (a) Attending to granite polishing lathes or saws used for cutting stone (including slate);

(b) Feeding such saws with sand or shot

## APPRENTICES.

"Apprentice" means any person under 21 years of age bound by indentures of apprenticeship, or any person over 21 years of age who with the sanction of the Minister is bound by indentures of apprenticeship. (Act 2386, Section 5.)

(Indentures of apprenticeship must be in the form prescribed by the Board.)

#### NUMBER.

(4) (a) That the number of apprentices who may be employed in any factory or place shall be one apprentice to every three or fraction of three workers receiving not less than 58s. 8d. per week of 44 hours.

#### WAGES.

(b) That the lowest rates of payment payable to apprentices shall be :--

Apprentices shall be paid ½d. per hour in addition to above rates unless all tools except mash hammer, square mallet, and straightedge are provided by the employer.

## IMPROVERS. .

"Improver" means any person (other than an apprentice) who does not receive a piece-work price or a wages rate fixed by any Special Board for persons other than apprentices or improvers, and who is not over 21 years of age, or who being over 21 years of age holds a licence from the Minister to be paid as an improver. (Act 2386, Section 5.)

# NUMBER.

(5) (a) That the number of improvers who may be employed in any factory or place shall be one improver to eight persons, and thereafter one improver to every eight or fraction of eight persons employed and receiving not less than 64s. 2d. per week of 44 hours.

Provided that if only eight-persons are employed not more than two polishers shall be included in the proportion to which an improver is allowed.

## WAGES

(b) That the lowest rates of payment payable to improvers shall be :--

# RATES WHERE TOOLS ARE NOT SHARPENED BY EMPLOYER.

(6) That 2d. per hour in addition to above rates shall be paid in all cases mentioned in Clauses 2, 4, and 5, unless all tools are sharpened by the employer.

## OVERTIME

(7) That any employé who works for any time in excess of 44 hours in any week shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a third.

# DEFINITION.

(8) That wherever occurring in this Determination, the term "monumental" shall mean pertaining to monuments erected in cemeteries.
