

Electoral Act 1910, Section 18.

APPOINTMENT OF TIMES FOR PURIFICATION AND REVISION OF THE SPECIAL GENERAL LISTS, 1914, FOR THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY.

Before or on the 22nd July, 1914.—Registrars to certify and sign Special General Rolls, and transmit signed copies to Returning Officers.

ELMORE WATERWORKS TRUST.

THE Commissioners of the Elmore Waterworks Trust, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, hereby make the following additional By-laws:—

1. A meter shall be affixed to every new service-pipe (other than a renewal) which shall hereafter supply water from the mains of the Trust.

2. Every existing service-pipe to vacant land shall, on the same being extended or utilized so as to supply water from the mains of the Trust to any new building or buildings erected on such land, have a meter affixed thereto.

3. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined and approved, and a certificate from the Board of Works or other authorized person, be produced for the inspection of the Secretary of the Trust for the time being, that such meter is in proper order.

5. Every meter must be fixed truly level with connexions above ground, in any easily accessible position and properly protected, on a proper foundation of timber, stone, brick, or concrete, which must, wherever practicable, be level with the surface of the ground, and within three feet of the building line of the property. Two wrought-iron bends must be fixed on each side of the meter, or lead connexions used. The use of elbows will not be permitted.

6. The Trust will, upon application, supply a meter at cost price for cash on delivery.

7. These By-laws shall be in force after approval by the Governor in Council, and immediately after publication in the *Government Gazette*.
