SHIRE OF KOWREE.

BY-LAW No. 12.

Sanitation of Edenhope, Harrow, and Apsley.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, and any other power thereunto enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Kowree, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within its jurisdiction, makes the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. *Repeal of former By-laws.*—All former By-laws, so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law, are hereby repealed.

2. *Date of Operation.*—This By-law shall come into operation and full force immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. *Area Affected.*—This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the Townships of Harrow, Edenhope, and Apsley, and for a distance of forty chains east of the Township of Apsley.

4. *Erection of Closets.*—Every occupier of any house, in connexion with which there is no properly-constructed closet, must have one such erected, with a door or opening sufficiently large to admit of the removal of the pans, and the space under the seat suitably prepared, and shall permit such closet to be used for a double pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause the same to be put in a fit state for such service.

5. *Abolition of Present Methods.*—The present methods for the reception and disposal of night-soil are hereby abolished.

6. *Initiation of Double Pan System.*—Instead of the present methods every closet shall be furnished forthwith with a double pan service.

7. *Provision of Pans.*—The pan for such service shall be supplied by the Council.

8. *Deodorization of Night-soil.*—Every occupier aforesaid, or other person, having control or management of any house, shall cause to be kept in every closet belonging thereto, a sufficient supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil to be covered, immediately on deposit thereof in the pan, with sufficient such material to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

9. *Removal of Pans.*—The Council shall, at such times or intervals as it shall, from time to time, determine, cause the pan, with the contents thereof, to be removed in the day time.

10. *Cleaning Pans.*—Before leaving such pan, the Council shall cause the same to be thoroughly cleansed and disinfected.

11. *Person Authorized to Remove Night-soil.*—No person, unless duly authorized by the Council, shall be allowed to remove any night-soil, nor shall the occupier of any house contract with any person whatsoever for the removal of night-soil.

12. *Charge for the Supply and Removal of Pans, &c.*—The Council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate, to make a charge on each occupier for the pans supplied, and for the removal of the night-soil, and the other work herein directed, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions. Such charge shall be paid in advance.

13. *Penalties.*—If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law, he or it shall, for every such breach, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

AMENDMENT OF THE REGULATIONS RELATING
TO THE LICENSING OF MOTOR BOATS, ETC.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the *Marine Act 1890*, the Marine Board of Victoria, with the consent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulation following, that is to say:—

1. This Regulation shall form portion of "The Passenger (Sailing and Motor) Boat Regulations, 1908," made by the Board on the seventh day of September, 1908, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the thirtieth day of September, 1908, and shall be read in connexion therewith, and shall come into operation on the first day of October, 1914, on which date the words and figure "one (1) light inextinguishable in water" in sub-paragraph (c) of paragraph 22 of the aforesaid Regulations shall be repealed.

2. After sub-clause (c) of paragraph 22 of "The Passenger (Sailing and Motor) Boat Regulations, 1908," there shall be added the following sub-clause:—

"(d) A motor boat plying in waters other than on rivers or land-locked lakes only, must for the purpose of making signals of distress in emergency, be also furnished with, and at all times carry in a position approved by the inspecting officer, six (6) self-igniting red marine signal lights, effectively water proofed, and so constructed that the part containing the composition shall be six inches in length and firmly secured to a wooden handle six inches long with igniting surface fitted in the end; the six signals shall be enclosed in a watertight zinc case so constructed as to prevent friction of the signals even should one or more be removed."

The foregoing amended Regulation was made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria held this twelfth day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and fourteen.

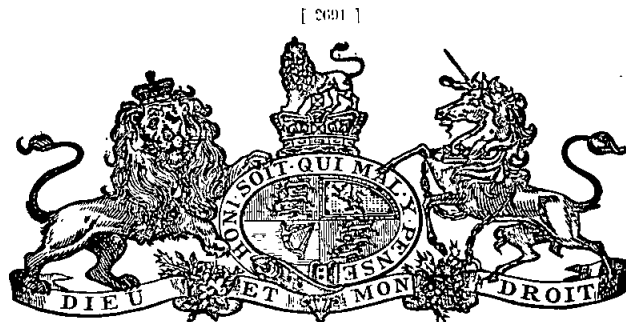

Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE WHOLESALE GROCERS BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the business of a wholesale grocer, including a seller of tea, has made the following Determination, namely:—

NOTE.—On the 23rd December, 1912, the powers of the Wholesale Grocers Board were extended to enable it to fix rates for persons employed in the business of a wine and spirit merchant.

(1) That the previous Determination of this Board is hereby amended, and such amendments shall come into force and be operative on and after the 29th August, 1914.

The Determination and amendments are printed hereunder.

(2) That the lowest rates of wages to be paid to the following persons shall be—

Storeman in charge of 10 or more storemen	80s. per week of 48 hours.
Storeman in charge of 6, 7, 8, or 9 storemen	70s. " "
Storeman in charge of 1, 2, 3, 4, or 5 storemen	60s. " "
Storeman employed singly	57s. 6d. " "
Head cellarman, i.e., the principal employed engaged in testing, blending, reducing, or fining wines or spirits	70s. " "
Packers in charge of 10 or more persons	70s. " "
Packers in charge of 6, 7, 8, or 9 persons	60s. " "
Packers in charge of 1, 2, 3, 4, or 5 persons	55s. " "
All others	50s. " "

APPRENTICES AND IMPROVERS.

"Apprentice" means any person under twenty-one years of age bound by indentures of apprenticeship, or any person over twenty-one years of age who, with the sanction of the Minister, is bound by indentures of apprenticeship. (Act 2386, Section 5.)

"Improver" means any person (other than an apprentice) who does not receive a piece-work price or a wages rate fixed by any Special Board for persons other than apprentices or improvers, and who is not over twenty-one years of age, or who, being over twenty-one years of age, holds a licence from the Minister to be paid as an improver. (Act 2386, Section 5.)

APPRENTICES AND IMPROVERS—*continued*.

(3) That—

- (a) the lowest rates which may be paid to an apprentice or an improver; and
 (b) the proportionate number of apprentices and improvers who may be employed by any employer

shall be as shown in the following table :—

6th „	40s.	

TIME OF BEGINNING AND ENDING WORK.

(4) That the time of beginning and ending work shall be—

Time of Beginning.		Time of Ending.
7.30 a.m.	12.30 p.m. on the day on which the half-holiday is observed, and
8 a.m.	5.30 p.m. on the other working days of the week.

OVERTIME.

(5) That the following rate shall be paid for all work done—

- (a) Outside the hours fixed in Clause (4) Time and a half.
 (b) Within the hours fixed in Clause (4) in excess of 48 hours in any week

CASUAL LABOUR.

(6) That any person employed for less than one week shall be paid at the rate of time and a half, but no such payment shall in any case exceed the ordinary weekly wage as fixed by this Determination.

SPECIAL RATES.

(7) That time and a half shall be the special rate for all work done on—

Sunday,
 26th January (Foundation Day)
 Good Friday,
 Easter Monday,
 21st April (Eight Hours Day),
 King's Birthday,
 Christmas Day,
 Boxing Day,
 New Year's Day;

but, if any other day be by Act of Parliament or proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
