NOTICE OF INTENTION TO ALTER THE CLOSE SEASON FOR NETTING IN SYDENHAM, TAMBOON, WINGAN, AND MALLACOOTA INLETS, AND TO RESTRICT THE USE OF NETS IN SUCH INLETS.

It is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this Notice in the *Victoria Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to revoke the Proclamation dated the sixteenth day of May, 1911, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of the twenty-fourth day of May, 1911, re Netting in Sydenham, Tamboon, Wingan, and Mallacoota Inlets, and to make a Proclamation to the following effect, viz. :-

- (1) Prohibiting the use of trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing in Sydenham Inlet, Tamboon Inlet, Wingan Inlet, and Mallacoota (sometimes called Mallagoota) Inlet, within in each case an imaginary line running from the extreme seaward or outward point of either bank or side to the opposite extreme seaward or outward point where the waters of such inlets enter the ocean, from the first day of October in each year to the thirty-first day of March in the following year.
- (2) Restricting the use of nets to be used in fishing in the above-mentioned inlets as follows :-
  - (a) No person shall use a "seine" or "hauling" net exceeding in length four hundred fathoms.
  - (b) No person shall use at the same time a total length of more than seven hundred fathoms of "mesh" or "set" net (or nets); provided that, in the case of "mesh" or "set" nets, every mesh of which measures four and a quarter inches or over, the total length of net (or nets) permissible under this condition shall be twelve hundred fathoms. Provided further that in case of two or more persons working together in a boat each shall be allowed to use his complement of "mesh" or "set" net as prescribed herein.
  - (c) No person shall use at the same time a "seine" or "hauling" net and a "mesh" or "set" net.

## NOTICE OF INTENTION TO ALTER THE RESTRICTIONS ON NETTING, ETC., IN THE GIPPSLAND LAKES.

It is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this Notice in the *Victoria Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to revoke the Proclamation dated the eleventh day of June, 1913, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of the eighteenth day of June, 1913, re Restrictions on Netting, &c., in the

Gippsland Lakes, and to make a Proclamation restricting the use of nets to be used in fishing in the waters known as the Gippsland Lakes, as follows:—

- (1) Prohibiting the use of any trammel, trawl, or other net or engine, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing, between ten o'clock in the morning of any Friday and sunrise on the following Sunday.
- (2) Prohibiting the use by any person of a "seine" or "hauling" net exceeding in length four hundred fathoms; provided that eastward of a line running through Ludrick or Tyers Point and the Tambo Bluff the process of hauling nets known as "fireballing" may be carried on with a net up to seven hundred fathoms in length.
- (3) Prohibiting the use, at the same time, by any person of a total length of more than seven hundred fathoms of "mesh" or "set" net (or nets); provided that, in the case of "mesh" or "set" nets, every mesh of which measures four and a quarter inches or over, the total length of net (or nets) permissible under this condition shall be twelve hundred fathoms. Provided further that in case of two or more persons working together in a boat each shall be allowed to use his complement of "mesh" or "set" net as prescribed herein.
- (4) Prohibiting the use, at the same time, by any person of a "seine" or "hauling" net and a "mesh" or "set" net.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION,  
AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE IN THE  
TOWN OF BALLAARAT EAST KNOWN AS THE  
"EUREKA GARDEN."

THE Council of the Town of Ballaarat East, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserves for a Public Garden in the Town of Ballaarat East, known as "The Eureka Garden," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserves shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserves may be set apart for cricket or football matches, sports, fêtes or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding One shilling (1s.) may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserves.

2. No person shall damage in any way the buildings, fences, or trees in the Reserves, nor, except in properly constructed fireplaces, shall fires be lighted therein, and then for heating water only.

3. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates in or around the Reserves, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, seats, buildings, or gates in the Reserves, or roll or throw sticks, stones, or other missiles therein, or remove therefrom any soil or gravel.

4. No person shall camp in the Reserves, nor erect therein any stand, building, enclosure, booth, or other structure without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

5. No person shall bring into the Reserves any horse, carriage, cart, or other vehicle, except on production of a ticket, duly authorizing the admission of such horse, carriage, cart, or other vehicle.

6. No person shall bathe in the lakes in the Reserves.

7. Every person paying for admission to the Reserves, or any part thereof, shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which he shall, upon demand, produce, and, if required, surrender to any gatekeeper or other person having authority to demand the production or surrender of tickets, and no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the day for which it is issued.

8. Any person committing in the Reserves or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences, shall be liable to be removed from the Reserves, notwithstanding such person may have purchased or shall be in possession of a ticket of admission to the Reserves, or any part thereof:—

- (a) Being drunk, or using profane, indecent, or abusive language.
- (b) Assaulting any person, making use of abusive, threatening, or insulting expressions, or behaving in an improper or riotous manner.
- (c) Being found in any part of the Reserves, and not producing upon demand or surrendering, if required, to any gatekeeper or other person duly authorized to demand production or surrender of tickets, a ticket duly authorizing the admission of such person to the part wherein he may be found, unless such person shall forthwith satisfy the Committee of

Management or any one deputed by it, that he has paid the proper charge for admission to such part, and that the ticket of admission has been lost.

- (d) Obtaining permission to any part of the Reserves when not entitled to such admission under these Regulations.

9. No person shall bring into the Reserves any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No person shall put in the Reserves any horses, sheep, cattle, goats, or pigs, and the owners of any horses, sheep, cattle, goats, or pigs trespassing within the Reserves shall be liable to be prosecuted.

11. All persons renting or hiring any stands, buildings, erections, or enclosures in the Reserves for the occasion of any physical recreations, shows, or musical performances shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee of Management in reference to the Reserves, buildings, erections, or enclosures for the time being thereon.

12. All dogs, except as hereinbefore provided, and all goats, pigs, and poultry found trespassing within the Reserves shall be liable to be destroyed.

13. No person, club, or association shall enter or use the Reserves for any cricket, football, or other game, physical recreation, show, musical performance, or other amusement or public or private meeting, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

14. No person shall play, practice, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserves on Sunday.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who, knowingly and wilfully, offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION,  
AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A  
PUBLIC PARK IN THE TOWN OF BALLAARAT  
EAST, KNOWN AS THE "RUSSELL SQUARE."

WHEREAS by section 200 of the *Land Act* 1901, it is enacted that where, under the provisions of any Act relating to Crown lands, the Governor in Council has reserved from sale, permanently, any Crown lands for any public purpose whatsoever, or for any of the purposes specified in section 10 of such Act, and has vested such land in trustees or jointly in the Board of Land and Works and trustees, it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council, to make rules and regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sub-section (1) of section 200 of the *Land Act* 1901. And whereas a Crown grant has issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Ballaarat East in respect of the Reserve for a Public Park in the Town of Ballaarat East, known as and hereinafter designated the "Russell Square." Now, therefore, the Board of Land and Works and the



Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Ballarat East do hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the "Russell Square":—

## REGULATIONS.

1. The Russell Square shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge.

2. No person shall damage in any way the buildings, fences, or trees in the Russell Square, nor shall fires be lighted therein without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained.

3. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates in or around the Russell Square, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats in the Russell Square, or roll or throw sticks, stones, or other missiles therein, or remove therefrom any soil or gravel.

4. No person shall camp in the Russell Square, or erect therein any tent, booth, or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained.

5. Any person committing in the Russell Square or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon any of the following offences shall be liable to be removed therefrom:—

(a) Being drunk or using profane, indecent, or abusive language.

(b) Assaulting any person, making use of any abusive, threatening, or insulting expressions, or behaving in an improper or riotous manner.

6. No person shall bring into the Russell Square any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained.

7. No person shall put in the Russell Square any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs, and the owners of any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs trespassing within the Russell Square shall be liable to be prosecuted according to law.

8. All dogs, except as hereinbefore provided, and all goats, pigs, and poultry found trespassing within the Russell Square shall be liable to be destroyed.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 200 of the *Land Act* 1901, on conviction before any justice, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who so offends, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or officer or servant of the Trustees, or by any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

## SHIRE OF BORUNG.

## BY-LAW No. 14.

A By-law of the Shire of Borung, made under section 635 of the *Local Government Act* 1903, and numbered fourteen, for regulating the market-place, and the buildings, stalls, pens, and standings therein, and for preventing nuisances or obstructions therein or in the immediate approaches thereto, and for fixing the days and the hours during each day in which the market shall be held, and for licensing yards and premises for the sale of cattle within the municipal district, and for fixing (subject to the limitation mentioned in the said Act) the dues to be paid for such licences.

**I**n pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1903, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Borung order as follows:—

1. In the construction and for the purpose of this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires—

“Cattle Market” means and includes the market, yards, buildings, and pens situated upon allotment 1, section 41, township of Warracknabeal, county of Borung, to be hereafter known as the “Shire Corporation Sale Yards.”

“Council” means and includes the Council of the Shire of Borung.

“Inspector” means and includes the officer appointed by the Council of the Shire of Borung to act as Inspector of the Shire Corporation Sale Yards, and to act as collector of stallages, rents, tolls, and dues.

“Cattle” shall include horses, mares, fillies, foals, geldings, colts, bulls, bullocks, cows, heifers, steers, calves, asses, mules, sheep, ewes, wethers, rams, lambs, goats, and swine.

“Fat Cattle” shall mean cattle fit for slaughtering for human consumption.

“Store Cattle” shall mean cattle not so fit.

## I. Duties of Inspector.

2. The Inspector's duties shall be as follows:—

(a) To see that this By-law and the provisions of all Acts and regulations relating to markets are duly observed.

(b) To demand and receive all market stallages, rents, tolls, and dues.

(c) To allot the principal and drafting yards to the use of the parties bringing stock to the cattle market for sale in such manner as in each particular case may seem to such Inspector to be most convenient.

(d) To preserve order and cleanliness within such cattle market, and to summarily eject therefrom any person creating a disturbance or using any profane, indecent, or obscene language, or being guilty of indecent conduct therein.

## II. Market—When Open.

3. The cattle market, hereinafter referred to as the “Market,” shall be open for the reception and delivery of cattle for the conducting of special stock sales on every day except Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday from sunrise to sunset.

4. The said market shall be open for the sale of cattle on every Friday from sunrise to sunset, and no cattle shall be received at the said market after the hour of Twelve o'clock noon except horses and swine, which must be in the market not later than Two o'clock in the afternoon. Provided, nevertheless, that should any cattle arrive in Warracknabeal by train on any sale day, such cattle may be admitted after Twelve o'clock noon if notice, in writing, of such intended arrival shall have been previously given to the Inspector.

## III. Order of Sales.

5. On every market day the sales of sheep and lambs shall be commenced not later than One o'clock in the afternoon. The sales of other cattle shall follow, and all such sales shall be conducted in the order following:—

First—Fat sheep and fat lambs.

Second—Store sheep and store lambs.

Third—Fat cattle.

Fourth—Store cattle.

Fifth—Horses.

Sixth—Pigs.

6. The owner of stock intended to be brought to the market for sale on a Friday, or his agent, shall notify, in writing, the number of such stock to the Inspector before Four o'clock p.m. on the preceding Thursday, and shall be responsible for the dues payable in respect of the number of stock so notified.

7. All owners of stock intended for sale, or their agents, desiring to have the privilege of drawing lots for priority of sale shall notify, in writing, the number

of such stock to the Inspector by Four o'clock p.m. on the preceding Thursday, and shall be responsible for the dues payable in respect of the number of stock so notified. Provided always that if, from accident or some other good and sufficient cause, a delay should arise in bringing any stock to market the Inspector shall have the power to forego payment of such dues.

8. Stock for sale shall be offered in the order of the drawing, and the offering of all stock drawn for shall precede the offering of stock not drawn for.

9. All owners or agents or their deputies on every sale day shall, not later than the hour of Ten o'clock in the forenoon, in the presence of the Inspector at the market, draw lots for priority of order of selling such cattle of which the Inspector shall have been notified in terms of clause seven hereof; such drawings shall take place in the order set out in clause five hereof.

10. The Inspector shall at the hour appointed for the commencement of the auction sale publicly give out at the market the order of auction sales.

11. The auctioneer or salesman first entitled to sell shall sell or otherwise dispose of fat sheep and fat lambs for a period of not longer than five minutes for each pen, and he shall not exceed fifteen minutes from the time when he shall be entitled to start such sales before finishing the same. At the expiration of such fifteen minutes or earlier, if the salesman first in order shall have earlier concluded his sale of fat sheep or fat lambs, the salesman next in order of priority shall proceed to sell upon the like conditions as those hereinbefore mentioned with regard to the salesman first entitled to sell, and so on until all the salesmen entitled to sell shall, according to their right of priority, have disposed of the fat sheep or fat lambs in respect of which they may respectively have given to the said Inspector notice of their desire to have the privilege of drawing lots for priority of sale. The first salesman shall be entitled to summon his customers ten minutes before the time appointed for commencing the sale, each succeeding salesman shall commence to sell as soon as the salesman immediately preceding him shall have concluded his sale, or, if the preceding salesman shall not have concluded his sale at the expiration of fifteen minutes from the time at which he was entitled to commence such sale, then at the expiration of such fifteen minutes. Should any auctioneer or salesman not be able to complete his sale in the time allowed to him by this clause the stock remaining unsold shall not be sold by him at auction until the completion of all other auction sales of fat sheep and fat lambs listed in the drawing for priority on that day, but he shall forthwith thereafter in the order of such priority of drawing for lots be entitled to continue the sale by auction of the remainder of the fat sheep and fat lambs listed by him for such drawing.

12. At the conclusion of such auction of fat sheep and fat lambs listed for such drawing the salesman first named in the order of auction sales announced by the Inspector of fat sheep and fat lambs not so listed for priority of drawing, shall be entitled to offer for sale such fat sheep and fat lambs entered by him or his principal for sale in the said market, but subject to the same conditions as hereinbefore set out, and thereafter such other salesman in the order named until the submitting to auction of all fat sheep and fat lambs listed for sale as aforesaid in the said market on that day shall be completed.

13. In all cases time limits under this By-law shall be fixed by the Inspector.

14. After the time limited for the disposal of fat sheep and fat lambs by the auctioneer or salesman last entitled to sell shall have expired the sale of store sheep and other cattle shall be proceeded with in the order named in clause five hereof upon the like conditions as are hereinbefore prescribed with regard to the sale of fat sheep and fat lambs, except that the limit of time allowed to each auctioneer or salesman in selling or disposing of the various cattle shall be as follows:—

Store sheep not to exceed five minutes per pen, or a total of twenty-five minutes in all.

Fat cattle not to exceed ten minutes in all.

Store cattle not to exceed five minutes per pen, or twenty minutes in all.

Horses, mares, fillies, foals, geldings, and colts, not to exceed twenty minutes in all.

Pigs and cattle not otherwise enumerated, not to exceed twenty minutes in all.

15. Any auctioneer or salesman who shall have sold his lots before the expiration of the time limit shall at once give place to the person next entitled to sell, who shall forthwith proceed to offer his lots.

16. Any owner or agent withdrawing his fat sheep or fat lambs from auction sales, or not being present by his auctioneer punctually to commence his auction sale, shall not be allowed to sell by auction until the remaining auction sales of fat sheep or fat lambs shall be completed. A corresponding rotation shall be observed with regard to any other cattle to be auctioned.

17. Each agent shall hand to the Inspector prior to starting the sale a list, in writing, showing the number of fat sheep and fat lambs penned by him for sale by auction that day.

18. No store stock shall be offered for sale in the fat stock sales, and the Inspector shall have full power to decide whether stock is to be offered in fat or store class. His decision shall be final.

#### IV. All Cattle at Risk of Owner or Agent.

19. All cattle brought to the market and or placed in the yards or pens thereof by the owner of such cattle or by his agent, shall be at the sole risk of such owner or agent, and neither the Council nor any employé of the Council shall in any circumstances incur any liability or responsibility in connexion therewith.

#### V. Removing or Releasing Stock.

20. All cattle brought to the market shall be placed in pens. No person shall release any cattle from the market or remove the same from one part thereof to another without the authority of the Inspector. In case of any dispute arising as to overcrowding of pens or as to priority of occupancy, the Inspector shall have authority to decide such disputes, and the disputants shall be bound by his decision. The Inspector shall have authority to remove or order to be removed cattle from one pen to another, and any orders he may give in that respect shall be promptly carried out.

21. No cattle which have been placed in any auctioneer's hands for sale shall be permitted to leave the market without the production of a pass from the auctioneers in whose hands they were placed for sale.

22. Horses and fat and dairy cattle for sale by auction shall be paraded in the ring in front of the rostrum in the said market, unless in exceptional cases by permission of the Inspector.

23. All cattle not removed from the said market by the hour of Nine o'clock in the afternoon of the day upon which any sale shall have been held in the said market may be removed by the Inspector at the expense and risk of the owner of any such cattle.

#### VI. Offences and Penalties.

24. No person shall sell or offer for sale by auction any cattle in the market before the opening or after the closing of the market. Penalty: Forty shillings.

25. No auctioneer or salesman shall continue to sell cattle, or offer cattle for sale after the expiry of the time allowed as provided by this By-law. Penalty: Forty shillings. Provided that the Inspector shall give notice of such expiry by the ringing of a bell or otherwise.

26. No person shall (1) obstruct the Inspector of the said market in the execution of his duty; or (2) wilfully break down or damage any of the gates, fences, buildings, or appurtenances of the said market; or (3) cause any disturbance therein; or (4) use any obscene or indecent or offensive language, or be guilty of any indecent conduct within the said market or upon the approaches thereto. Penalty: Five pounds.

#### VII. Licences for Yards for Sale of Cattle.

27. Every person desirous of having his yard or premises licensed for the sale of cattle must deliver to the Shire Secretary an application in writing for such licence, containing an accurate description of such yard and premises. Such person shall deposit with such application the sum of Ten pounds.

28. The fee for every such licence shall be Ten pounds per annum. All licences shall expire on the thirty-first day of December in each year.

29. The Council shall have power to grant or refuse any such licence. If it be refused the said sum of Ten pounds will be returned to the applicant. If it be granted such sum will be retained in payment of the fee for such licence.

30. Every such licence shall be in the following form or to the like effect:—

#### Shire of Borung.

Whereas \_\_\_\_\_ has applied for a licence for the sale of cattle within the shire at the yards and premises described by him in such application, and situate (fill in description). Now therefore the Council of the Shire of Borung doth hereby license the said yards and premises for the sale of cattle until the end of this present year, at which time this licence shall expire.

Given under the seal of the Shire of Borung this \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_ 1914.

31. On or before the expiration of any such licence the licensee may apply in the manner provided in paragraph 27 hereof for a new licence.

32. The Council shall have the same power to grant or refuse any such new licence as in the case of an original application.

33. If any licence be granted after the month of January in any year, one-twelfth part of such deposit shall be returned by the Council in respect of every calendar month which shall have elapsed before such licence is granted.

34. Every auctioneer or firm of auctioneers paying a yearly rent of Twenty pounds shall be entitled to the use of an office at the said market, such rent to be paid half-yearly in advance.
