BOROUGH OF DUNOLLY.

BY-LAW UNDER THE WATER ACT 1905.

ACTING under the powers conferred by the Water Act 1905, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Dunolly hereby make the following By-law for the purpose of levying a Water Rate within the Water Supply District of Dunolly as duly defined upon the occupiers or owners of any tenements (other than land on which there is no building) situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down; also for the purpose of determining the charges to be made for the sale of water within such district.

By-law No. 50.

All former regulations so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed as from the 31st December, 1914.

The following are the rates which the occupiers and owners of tenements liable to be rated shall pay in each year, by equal half-yearly instalments, in respect of water supplied by the Council within the aforesaid district:—

1. For every house with or without land of £20 A.M.V. or under	£1 0 0
Above £20 and under £41 A.M.V.	1 5 0
Above £40 and under £101 A.M.V.	1 10 0
Above £100 A.M.V.	2 0 0
2. For every hotel not exceeding £50 A.M.V.	2 0 0
Above £50 and under £101 A.M.V.	3 0 0
Above £100 and under £151 A.M.V.	4 10 0
Above £150 and under £201 A.M.V.	5 10 0
Above £200 A.M.V.	6 10 0

*NOTE.—The letters A.M.V. shall in each case be taken to mean Annual Municipal Valuation.

3. For Government buildings, other than the Railway buildings, and all church, charitable, and other properties not rated, and on any vacant allotments that are rated, requiring to be supplied with water, such may be supplied by entering into a special agreement with the council.

4. Water troughs, with ball tap, connected with hotels and erected on the public highway, £1 per annum.

5. Steam boilers, exceeding two horse-power (excepting for flour mills), £3 per annum.

6. Steam boilers, used only in the manufacture of sausage meat, at the rate of £1 10s. per annum.

7. Water from the stand pipe, for every load of 400 gallons or less, 3d. per load.

8. Flour mills requiring water for milling purposes, a charge of 3d. per 1,000 gallons supplied by meter.

9. Victorian Railways, requiring water, a charge of 1s. per 1,000 gallons supplied by meter.

10. On all tenements (other than land on which there is no building) situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down, and which tenement is not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe, a charge of 5s. per annum.

11. Every garden in connexion with a building having an area of more than two square chains in extent, including footpaths, for any area over the two square chains water may be supplied by entering into a special agreement with the Council.

12. Only iron receptacles that are watertight and fitted with a ball tap in working order will be permitted to be erected on the footwalks for livery and other purposes.

13. All meters that may be required shall be provided and fixed in position at the expense of the occupiers or owners of the property.

14. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial of same is capable of registering one million gallons.

15. The Council reserves to itself the right, if at any time it finds it necessary or expedient to restrict the supply of water for garden purposes; and further, at all times prohibits the use of water for the growing of crops or using land for marketing purposes, other than the two square chains allowed, excepting by agreement.

16. Any person receiving water from the Council who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to carry or take any such water or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

17. Any person who, not having agreed to be supplied by the Council, who shall take or carry away water from any tap, trough, or private or public service pipe shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

18. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Council without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Council, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the direction of a duly

authorized officer of the Council appointed for the purpose, and any person committing a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

19. The service pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Council into the premises of consumers shall be of such size as the Council may in each case approve, but in no case shall they exceed the following diameters:

—For the domestic supply of premises $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch diameter, and for all supplies by measurement, such diameter as the Council shall authorize in each case.

20. If any person shall waste water of the Council by neglecting to repair any service pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Council into or upon the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Council that such service pipe requires repairing, the Council may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service pipe or otherwise as the Council may deem fit until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.

21. No person supplied with water by the Council shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, and any person committing a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

22. No person shall connect any service pipe or branch service pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same where a meter is in use without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

23. Any person requiring to be supplied with water shall give notice to the Council and receive its sanction before opening the ground or interfering with the main.

24. Before such sanction shall be given, the person giving such notice shall satisfy the Council that the person to be employed to carry out the work is a competent workman, and such work shall be done under the supervision and according to the directions of the officer of the Council appointed for that purpose.

25. The entire cost of laying on the service from the main shall be borne by the person requiring the water, excepting where carried to the opposite side of the road to the main, when the length to within four feet of the footwalk will be provided by the Council; also the stop-cocks in every case.

26. The Water Inspector or any other officer of the Council appointed under its seal for such purpose shall have power to enter upon the premises or buildings whether within or without such buildings for the purpose of inspecting all water mains and services at any time when he has reasonable cause to believe that any breach of this By-law is allowed or is taking place.

27. The rate shall be payable half-yearly in advance in each year on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July from the year 1914, and the charges for the supply of water shall also be paid in like manner, or as may be demanded in the case of the service being by meter.

28. Such person or persons as the Council may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

THE GLENROWAN WATERWORKS TRUST.
BY-LAW No. 4.

THE Commissioners of the Glenrowan Waterworks Trust, constituted under the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the By-law following:—

The following are the rates for 1915 which the occupiers or owners of lands, tenements, or vacant allotments within the Waterworks District of the aforesaid Trust and liable to be rated, shall pay to the Trust in respect to every such property.

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twelve pounds annual municipal valuation and under, a rate of One pound ten shillings sterling shall be paid.

2. For every house or tenement of more than Twelve pounds annual municipal valuation a rate of Two shillings and sixpence on municipal valuation shall be paid.

3. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied allotments of land fronting a street in which a main shall have been laid shall be Ten shillings.

4. For all lands and tenements, situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are not supplied with water, and being within a quarter of a mile of a main, one half of the before-mentioned rate, and where tenements are over a quarter of a mile and under half a mile from a main, one quarter the before-mentioned rate to be paid.

5. Water supplied by meter shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, and shall be paid for at such time or times as may be demanded by the Trust.

6. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1915.

7. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

By-law for the making of a rate on all rateable property comprised within the boundaries of the district of the Swan Hill Waterworks Trust, such district having been proclaimed an Urban District under Division 9 of Part 2 of the *Water Act 1890*:—

1. A rate of One shilling and threepence (1s. 3d.) in the pound sterling on the annual value of all rateable property within the Swan Hill Waterworks Trust District, according to the valuation for the time being of all tenements for the municipal rates of the Shire of Swan Hill, with a minimum payment of One pound sterling.

2. A rate of One shilling and threepence (1s. 3d.) in the pound sterling on the annual value of all unoccupied land within the Trust District, in all cases where a main is laid, serves, or passes such land, whether connected with such main or not, with a minimum charge of One pound sterling on each allotment having an area of a quarter of an acre and not exceeding half an acre, and for every additional similar area, One pound sterling; or, having an area of less than one-quarter of an acre, Ten shillings sterling, with a minimum charge of Ten shillings.

3. A rate of Six shillings (6s.) per half acre. Three shillings per quarter acre, with a minimum of Three shillings (3s.) on all unoccupied land within the Trust District not served by water nor rated under clause 2 of this By-law. The foregoing rate is hereby made for the year 1915, commencing on the 1st day of January and ending the 31st day of December, 1915.

4. Such rate is hereby made payable in two half-yearly instalments, one half on the 1st day of January and the other half on the 1st day of July, 1915.

5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and sue for the said rate.

MORWELL WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1915.

A BY-LAW for making a rate for the year 1915 on the rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Morwell Waterworks Trust, which district has for the purposes of the *Water Act* 1905 been proclaimed an Urban District, also for dealing with the charges for the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust:—

1. A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound shall be paid on the annual value of all rateable property in the Waterworks District, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of Morwell, but no such rate for tenements shall be less than One pound five shillings (£1 5s.).
2. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land, the municipal value of which does not exceed five pounds per annum, the sum of Seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.). When such value is over five pounds, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound.
3. For every public water trough, the sum of One pound (£1).
4. For every livery, coach, and carriers' stables the sum of Five shillings per annum for the first stall, and Five shillings per annum for each additional stall. In open sheds and for stabling, each 6 feet is to be considered one stall.
5. When water is supplied by measure for domestic or other than domestic purposes, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at the price named, would be equal to the rate payable in respect of such property if water were supplied otherwise than by measure.
6. When water is supplied solely for other than domestic purposes, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be supplied during each year ending on the 31st December, shall be 15,000 gallons. The charge hereby made shall be payable on demand by the Trust.
7. The Trust may, by notice in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier using water for other than domestic purposes solely, that the water supplied is to be charged for by measure, and may, by such notice, require such owner or occupier to provide a meter within one month after the receipt of such notice, and thereupon such owner or occupier shall, within the time specified, at his own expense, provide a meter.
8. In all cases not herein provided for, the Trust shall make such special provision as may be deemed necessary.
9. The foregoing rates are made payable on the first day of February, 1915.
10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1915.

THE Commissioners of the Yea Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act* 1905, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, make the following Rating By-law:—

1. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds annual municipal valuation or under, the sum of Thirty shillings.
2. For every house or tenement of annual municipal valuation exceeding Twenty pounds, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound.
3. For every unoccupied allotment of land and for every allotment of land upon which no house or tenement has been erected, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling of the annual municipal value of such allotment.
4. For every water trough, a charge of Fifteen shillings.
5. For every steam boiler, a charge of Fifteen shillings for every horse-power of such boiler.

6. For stand-pipe or hydrant water, for each load of two hundred gallons or under, a charge of One shilling and sixpence, to be paid on delivery.

7. For water supplied by the Trust by measure (other than stand-pipe or hydrant water), except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, a charge of One shilling and sixpence for every thousand gallons.

8. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by measurement (other than stand-pipe or hydrant water) shall be—

- (1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, a quantity for which the charge of One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons would be equal to the assessed rate which would be payable for the house or tenement so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (2) If solely for other than domestic purposes, thirty thousand gallons per half-year.

9. The above-mentioned rates and charges (except for stand-pipe and hydrant water) shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1915.

10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Yea Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

TRARALGON WATERWORKS TRUST.

THE Commissioners of the Traralgon Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act* 1905, hereby make the following By-law:—

1. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, or who shall use or allow the water to be used in an unauthorized manner, or who is in arrears with the payment of his water rate, the Trust may (without prejudice to any action against him in respect thereof), after one hour's notice, cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which the water is supplied or by any other means that are available, and may cease to supply such premises with water so long as the Trust may think fit.

2. It shall be lawful for any person appointed by the Trust for such purpose to request permission from any owner or occupier to make an inspection of the water service to ascertain if water is being allowed to run to waste, and if such occupier or owner refuse permission for such inspection, the Trust may, if it think fit, refuse to supply such premises with water; and such refusal on their part will in no way relieve the owner or occupier from payment of any rate or rates as may be levied on such property.

3. If the person appointed for such inspection shall ascertain that any owner or occupier is allowing water to run to waste by reason of leaky taps or otherwise, or is using such water for an unauthorized purpose, he shall be empowered to notify such owner or occupier that such waste or unauthorized use must at once cease.

4. No person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter or repair or in any way interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust until he shall have obtained from the Trust permission to execute such works.

5. Any person, whether licensed or permitted as aforesaid or not, who shall require to affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or to make any repairs to pipes under the control of the Trust, shall give notice to the Secretary of his intention so to do.

6. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owner or occupier of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier (if any), and if none, the owner, shall, upon receiving notice that his service-pipe requires repairing, immediately proceed to repair the same, and he shall be responsible for any loss of

water or other damage which shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, and the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises in any way it may seem fit until such repairs have been effected.

7. The Trust may, by notice in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier using water for other than domestic purposes solely, that the water supplied is to be charged for by measure, and may by such notice require such owner or occupier to provide a meter within one month after the receipt of such notice, and thereupon such owner or occupier shall, within the time specified, at his own expense, provide a meter.

8. All water troughs, whether public or private, must be fitted with approved self-acting taps to prevent overflow, such taps to be approved by the inspector appointed by the Trust.

9. If any person, having been notified by the Trust to provide and affix a meter for the purpose of registering the quantity of water supplied to his premises, refuses or delays to comply with such order, the Trust may cut off the supply of water to his premises until such meter shall have been provided.

10. Any person using the water of the Trust for any purpose other than domestic use without the permission of the Trust, or watering any garden or lawn by means of a hose or by the use of an automatic sprinkler, except on such days and during such hours as may from time to time be fixed by resolution of the said Trust, shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

11. All hose taps used for watering gardens or lawns must, except with the special permission of the Trust, be affixed to stand-pipes, standing at least eighteen inches above the level of the ground.

12. Except during the hours when the use of hoses for watering gardens or lawns is permitted, such hoses shall be disconnected from any taps or pipe by or through which water is obtained from the Trust.

13. For any breach of these Regulations a penalty not exceeding £5 shall be imposed.

PUBLIC PARKS, GARDENS, AND OTHER RESERVES.

Regulations in connexion with the vote of Five thousand five hundred pounds (£5,500), for fencing and improving public parks, gardens, and other reserves, under the control of Borough Councils, Trustees, Committees of Management, &c.

A SUM of Four thousand pounds (£4,000) shall be distributed in such manner and on such terms and conditions as the Minister of Lands shall approve, and the remainder (£1,500) shall be dealt with as follows:—

1. A sum not exceeding Five shillings (5s.) may be paid to the treasurer of the managing body of any public park, garden, or other reserve having a claim on the vote for every One pound (£1) expended by such body on fencing, preparation of land, and planting, forming of roads and paths, and such other works as the Minister of Lands may approve, in such park, garden, or other reserve, between 1st January, 1914, and 31st December, 1914, out of the funds locally contributed, provided such claim be received by the Secretary for Lands on or before the 1st day of May, 1915. Every statement of particulars of claim on the vote must be made in Form A, and be accompanied by a declaration in the Form B.

2. The term "locally contributed" shall mean and include all moneys voted by the managing body of any public park, garden, or other reserve from its own funds for the fencing and planting of such park, garden, or other reserve, also all moneys voluntarily contributed for the same purpose, between the 1st January, 1914, and 31st December, 1914; but it shall not mean or include any sums advanced by any bank, nor any subsidy paid by Government between the above-mentioned dates, nor the balance of any subsidy paid by Government at any period prior to the 1st January, 1914.

3. The subsidy or the balance thereof last paid to the managing body of any public park, garden, or other reserve shall be deducted from the return of expenditure for the year 1914 (*vide* Form A), and a sum equal to one-fourth of the balance then remaining, if made of local contributions as above interpreted, shall be paid as subsidy; provided that if the claims are in excess of the sum of One thousand five hundred pounds (£1,500) they shall be reduced *pro rata*.

4. In every case in which a claim is sent in, an officer of the Department may be instructed to make an inspection of the books kept by the managing body, and of the vouchers for the several items of expenditure; and if such inspection be refused the claim shall be disallowed.

5. The foregoing shall not apply to parks, gardens, and other reserves within the limits of the City of Melbourne (except the Royal Park), or to the Edinburgh Gardens, Fitzroy, or to the Darling Gardens, Collingwood, or to Albert Park, South Melbourne and St. Kilda, or to the Richmond Park and Barkly Gardens, Richmond, or to the Botanical Gardens, Geelong.
