Particulars regarding members of the A.I.F.—

- (i) Name.
- (ii) Age.
- (iii) Calling.
- (iv) Whether married or single.
- (v) Number of dependants.
- (vi) Address at date of enlistment.

2. To obtain particulars respecting employers of labour—

- (i) Name.
- (ii) Nature of employment available.
- (iii) (a) Number of employees who have joined A.I.F.
(b) Names and units in which serving.
- (iv) If willing to reinstate or employ on return.

In some cases employers will have vacancies through the death or injury on service of some of their employees.

3. To classify the men under their respective avocations.

4. To ascertain Crown and other lands available for farming and settlement purposes.

5. To prepare particulars of public and municipal works available for employment.

6. To establish a Soldiers' Employment Bureau.

7. To arrange for securing employment for returned soldiers whose injuries prevent them following their former occupations.

REGULATIONS FOR EXAMINATIONS FOR LAND SURVEYORS AND ISSUE OF LICENCES TO SURVEY.

REGULATIONS approved by the Governor in Council, 8th November, 1910, are hereby rescinded, and the following Regulations are substituted therefor:—

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.

(b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

NOTE.—Applies only to candidates whose articles or other similar agreements were entered into prior to 1st March, 1910.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement in the field for a period of (w) years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

(d) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at the Melbourne University on examination in which a representative of the Surveyors Board acted as co-examiner, and shall have been at some time professionally employed in the field for a period of eighteen months on work satisfactory to the Board.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys:—

Form of Certificate for presentation to the Board of Examiners.

I, A.B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as _____, in the practice of land surveying, for the period of _____, viz., from _____, or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of _____ years (_____ of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

[Here describe the survey work on which C.D. was engaged.]

(Date.) (Signed) A.B.

NOTE.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Regulations.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road, and also a plan, field notes, and description of a survey of a town lot built upon, as made for the purpose of an application under the provisions of the Real Property Act or Land Transfer Act.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

9. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

Mathematics.

(a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

(b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practice of Surveying.

(c) Detail of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, and underground surveying, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting by co-ordinates and from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Act, writing descriptions of boundaries.

Candidates may be required to effect surveys under supervision.

Engineering Surveys.

(d) Levelling and contouring; grading; setting-out, and measurement of earthworks, including practical tests.

Use of Instruments.

(e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, tachometer, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer and steel band.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

(f) Determination (including practical tests) of time, latitude, and azimuth; the use of ephemerides; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

Drawing.

(g) Plan-drawing, drawing of sections and contours, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

Miscellaneous.

(h) Elementary physics, elementary geology, elementary forestry.

[The scope of the examination in elementary physics will be that covered by "Balfour Stewart's Elementary Physics," Fourth Edition, omitting chapters 8, 10, and 11, and the scope of the examination in elementary geology will be that covered by "Geikie's Class-book of Geology," Fourth Edition.]

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having passed the matriculation or senior examination at a University, or of having completed a course of the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers. Candidates holding satisfactory certificates or diplomas from any University recognised by an Australasian University or from recognised public technical schools may be exempted from working out papers in physics and geology, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates admitted under clause 5(d) may be exempted from working out papers other than those prescribed in clause 10(c), and from such portion of the practical examination as the Board may determine.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate qualifying and passing the examination held under these regulations shall be entitled to a certificate that he is qualified for the position of a land surveyor in Victoria.

13. A surveyor applying to the Board for a certificate of competency without examination on the grounds of his holding a licence and certificate entitling him to practise in any of the other Australian States or in the Dominion of New Zealand, shall produce such licence or certificate of competency from the Board of the State or Dominion in which he is licensed or

authorized to survey, together with satisfactory evidence as to character; provided that, should such licence or certificate have been issued upon examination held prior to September, 1895, or in virtue of a certificate issued prior to September, 1895, he shall further produce a written recommendation or a certificate, dated not more than twelve months previously, from such Board; provided also, that any surveyor prevented by absence from the State or Dominion in which he obtained his licence or certificate from obtaining the recommendation of the Board of that State or Dominion, may be granted a certificate on passing such examination under these regulations as the Board may require. Each application shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

14. The Board may grant a certificate of competency or a letter of recommendation to any surveyor holding a Victorian certificate dated prior to September, 1895, and desiring to be registered in another State or the Dominion of New Zealand, either without examination or on such *viva voce* examination as in the opinion of the Board may be necessary. Application for such certificate shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

REGISTRATION OF ARTICLES OF INDENTURE.

15. Articles of indenture or other similar agreement for the tuition of surveying by a qualified surveyor shall be forwarded to the secretary for registration within three months of the date of commencement of service thereunder. Applications for registration shall be accompanied by evidence of the pupil having passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto. The fee for each registration shall be Five shillings. Transfers of articles or agreements shall be registered within three months of such transfers.

16. On and after March, 1913 (except as hereinafter provided), no candidate shall be eligible for examination unless he shall have passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause; provided that, subject to his passing a special examination prescribed by the Board which shall include English, arithmetic, geometry, and algebra, a candidate who has not passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause may be admitted to examination if—

- (a) He failed at an examination held prior to March, 1913; or
- (b) He produces certificates of six years' satisfactory field service.

LICENCES TO SURVEY.

17. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 1s.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act 1895*, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

Marine Acts 1890, 1896, and 1905.

REGULATIONS FOR THE LICENSING OF SAILING AND MOTOR BOATS AND OF PERSONS IN CHARGE THEREOF, AND FOR THE EQUIPMENT THEREOF WHEN PLYING FOR HIRE OR LET OUT FOR HIRE FOR THE CARRIAGE OF PASSENGERS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the *Marine Act 1890*, and the Acts amending the same, the Marine Board of Victoria, with the approval of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

GENERAL.

1. *Short Title.*—These Regulations may be cited as "The Passenger (Sailing and Motor) Boat Regulations 1915."

2. *Commencement and Repeal.*—These Regulations shall take effect on and from the date of publication hereof in the *Government Gazette*, from which date all previous regulations relating to the licensing of boats and boatmen and the equipment of boats plying for hire or let out for hire for the carriage of passengers shall be and stand repealed.

3. *Definitions.*—For the purposes of these Regulations the words following shall have the meaning set opposite to each:—

"Boat" shall include any craft or vessel of any kind whatsoever which may be used for or engaged in the carriage of any passenger or passengers for hire or reward of any kind, but shall not include a boat exclusively propelled by oars, or by steam power, and for the purposes of these regulations the boats to which such regulations apply shall be divided into three classes, namely:—

- (a) Boats propelled by sails only hereinafter referred to as "Sailing Boats."
- (b) Boats propelled only by power generated by gas, oil, fluid, electricity, or other mechanical power other than steam, hereinafter referred to as "Motor Boats."
- (c) Sailing Boats fitted with auxiliary motor engines hereinafter referred to as "Motor Sailing Boats."

"Boatman" shall mean any person who may be engaged in the navigation of any sailing boat.
 "Motor Boatman" shall mean any person having the control and management of a Motor Boat not exceeding fifteen (15) tons gross tonnage.
 "Marine Motor Driver" shall mean any person having charge of the propelling machinery of any Motor Boat or Motor Sailing Boat.

4. *Licence-fees.*—Every application for any licence to be granted under these Regulations shall be accompanied by the amount of the appropriate fee as prescribed by Schedule I. hereto.

5. *Licences.*—Licences issued under these Regulations shall be in the forms respectively prescribed in Schedules XIV. to XIX. hereto inclusive.

6. *Refusal of Licence.*—The Board may refuse to issue a licence under these Regulations without assigning any cause for such refusal.

7. *Suspension or Cancellation of Licence.*—The Board may at any time suspend or cancel any licence issued under any regulations heretofore in force or under these Regulations without assigning any cause for such suspension or cancellation, and when such suspension or cancellation is in respect of any boat licensed under these Regulations, or under regulations repealed as hereinafter provided, the owner thereof shall forthwith remove from the boat any marks purporting to imply that such boat is licensed.

Any licence which has been suspended or cancelled shall be delivered by the holder to any officer of police, or of the Board, on demand being made therefor.

8. *Licence Lost or Destroyed.*—When any licence issued by the Board has been lost or destroyed, and satisfactory proof of such loss or destruction has been furnished, a duplicate may be issued on payment of a fee of One shilling. A statutory declaration as to such loss or destruction must be made by the applicant, and forwarded to the Secretary to the Marine Board.

9. *Penalty.*—Any breach of these Regulations shall be punishable by a fine not exceeding Fifty pounds.

BOATS.

10. *Boat to be Licensed.*—No boat in Victoria outside the Port of Melbourne, as defined in the Second Schedule to the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1890*, or

outside the Port of Geelong, as defined in the First Schedule (Part I.), of the *Geelong Harbor Trust Act 1905*, shall in any waters ply for hire for the carriage of passengers, or shall be let out on hire unless such boat be duly licensed by the Board in accordance with these Regulations to ply or be let out within such waters.

11. *Duration of Licence.*—A licence issued in respect of any boat, whether a Sailing Boat, Motor Boat, or Motor Sailing Boat, shall, unless sooner suspended or cancelled by the Marine Board, continue in force from the date of the issue of the same until the 30th day of September then next and no longer.

12. *Application for Licence.*—Any person desiring to obtain a licence under these Regulations for any boat shall make application to the Secretary to the Board on the form appropriate thereto as prescribed in Schedules II., IV., and X. to these Regulations, as the case may be.

13. *Inspection of Boat before Issue of Licence.*—Before any boat can be licensed, the same must be inspected by such officer or person as the Board may appoint for the purpose, and such officer or person shall, if he considers any boat suitable for the purpose of carrying passengers, within the port or limits named, and properly equipped therefor, give his certificate accordingly in the form appropriate thereto, as provided in Schedules III., V., and XI. to these Regulations, as the case may require.

14. *Inspection of Boat from time to time.*—Any officer or person appointed by the Board for that purpose may, from time to time, inspect any boat licensed under any Regulations heretofore in force or under these Regulations, and shall be afforded every facility by the owner or person in charge to make such inspection.

15. *Number of Passengers—How Determined.*—Before being licensed every boat shall be measured by an officer of the Board or person appointed for the purpose, and the number of adults which the said boat may carry shall be determined as follows:—

(1) Sailing Boats, Motor Sailing Boats, and Motor Boats, the latter being open boats or partially decked and fitted with cockpits, shall be permitted to carry adults in the proportion of one to each eighteen (18) inches of seating accommodation furnished, provided that such seating accommodation shall be clear of all interference with the proper working of the boat.

(2) Motor Boats which are entirely decked—

(a) If plying on rivers or land-locked lakes only shall be permitted to carry adults in the proportion of one for every three (3) square feet of the clear deck area and one for every nine (9) feet of the superficial area of the tops of saloon houses or of bridge decks, or of any one saloon or cabin under the main deck.

(b) If plying in waters other than on rivers or land-locked lakes only, the number of adults which may be carried shall be ascertained in the same manner as prescribed in (a) hereof, with the exception that the divisor for ascertaining the number of adults in respect of the clear deck area shall be six (6) instead of three (3).

The foregoing procedure is subject to the measuring officer or other person as aforesaid being satisfied that the boat will be sufficiently stable with the full number of passengers on board; if the officer or such other person has any doubt on this point he shall submit full particulars, in writing, to the Board, which may determine the number of passengers in respect of which a licence may be issued. For the purpose of this Regulation two (2) children under twelve (12) years of age shall be reckoned as equal to one (1) adult.

16. *Particulars to be Painted on Boat.*—Each boat licensed under these Regulations shall be assigned a number by the Secretary, which number the owner of such boat shall cause to be painted upon the bows thereof, in figures of not less than 4 inches in height. Each boat, whether licensed under any Regulations heretofore in force or under these Regulations, shall have the name thereof painted plainly on the outside of the stern, and, subject to the exception hereinafter contained, on the inside thereof there shall be painted in letters or figures of not less than 2 inches in height the maximum number of passengers such boat is licensed to carry. Provided that where the number of

passengers which may be carried cannot be conveniently painted on the inside of the stern, then in lieu thereof the licence issued by the Board shall be put up by the owner or person in charge in some conspicuous part of the boat where it will be visible to all persons on board, and such licence, being a licence then in force, shall be so exhibited at all times when carrying passengers; provided that in the case of a double-ended boat the name thereof shall be painted on each side of the outside of the stern. The particulars herein required shall not be altered during the currency of any licence except with the sanction of the Marine Board duly applied for and obtained.

17. *Particulars—How to be Painted.*—All letters or figures required to be painted shall be painted in white paint on a dark ground, or in black paint on a light ground.

18. *Certificate of Officer.*—No licence in respect of any boat shall be issued until a certificate appropriate thereto as prescribed in Schedules III., V., and XI. to these Regulations, as the case may require, has been forwarded to the Board by the proper officer, that the requirements of these Regulations have been fully complied with.

19. *Condition of Boats.*—If any owner or person having charge of any boat shall permit such boat to be used in the conveyance of any passengers for hire or reward of any kind, or to be let out on hire, such boat not being in good order and condition in respect of hull or hull and machinery, as the case may be, or without being properly fitted or equipped in every respect for the carriage of passengers as required by these Regulations, he shall be deemed guilty of a breach of these Regulations, and punishable accordingly, and the licence for such boat may be suspended or cancelled.

20. *Boat to be in Charge of Licensed or Certificated Person.*—Every boat used in the conveyance of passengers for hire or reward of any kind must be in charge of a duly licensed or certificated person, as follows:—

(a) A Sailing Boat in charge of a boatman.

(b) A Motor Sailing Boat in charge of a boatman, who must also be in possession of a licence as a motor boatman appropriate to the class of engine installed in such boat, provided that if the boatman-in-charge be not also the holder of such a licence then the machinery of any such boat shall be in charge of a person possessing the requisite licence.

(c) A Motor Boat not exceeding fifteen (15) tons gross tonnage in charge of a motor boatman holding a licence appropriate to the class of engine installed in any such boat, and when carrying passengers in excess of fifteen (15) a competent assistant must also be on board, whose age must not be less than fifteen (15) years on his last birthday.

(d) A Motor Boat exceeding fifteen (15) tons gross tonnage in charge of a duly certificated master in accordance with the provisions of subsection 2(a) of section 65 of the *Marine Act 1890*, and for the purpose of these Regulations the holder of a certificate of competency as a master applicable to steamships in the river and bay service shall be deemed to be duly certificated. In addition, the propelling machinery thereof must be in charge of a marine motor driver.

21. *Exemption.*—The Regulation next preceding (No. 20) shall not apply in cases where a boat, being a boat not exceeding fifteen (15) tons gross tonnage, is specially engaged by one or more persons who is or are willing to undertake the whole charge and responsibility of the same; provided that no owner or other person in charge shall let any boat out for hire unless he is satisfied that the applicant or applicants is or are capable of navigating or controlling the said boat, either as a Sailing Boat or as a Motor Boat, as the case may be. A book is also to be kept, in which is to be recorded the name and address of the hirer.

22. *Equipments.*—No boat shall be licensed under these Regulations unless such boat is furnished to the satisfaction of the certifying officer with the equipments appropriate thereto, as set out hereunder, that is to say:—

(a) A Sailing Boat or a Motor Sailing Boat must be furnished with an approved life belt for every person licensed to be carried on board, a full complement of masts, sails, oars, seats, and all other gear necessary for the safe navigation of the boat, including a lantern with a green glass on one side and a red glass on the other for exhibition in sufficient time to prevent collision on approaching or being approached by another vessel, so that the green light shall not be seen on the port side nor the red light on the starboard side.

- (b) A Motor Boat plying on any river or on any land-locked lake only must be furnished with two (2) approved life buoys, and with a lantern similar to that described in subdivision (a) hereof.
- (c) A Motor Boat plying in waters other than on rivers or land-locked lakes only must be furnished with an approved life belt for every person licensed to be carried on board, two (2) approved life buoys, a suitable anchor and cable, a sea anchor with fifteen (15) fathoms of line attached thereto, one (1) oil bag, and one (1) gallon of oil for same, one (1) fog-horn, one (1) efficient bell, four (4) approved oars, four (4) rowlocks, and apparatus necessary for the proper exhibition of lights between sunset and sunrise in accordance with the requirements of Article 7 of the "Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea" for the time being in force under the provisions of section 133 of the *Marine Act 1890*.
- (d) A Motor Boat plying in waters other than on rivers or land-locked lakes only, must for the purpose of making signals of distress in emergency, be also furnished with, and at all times carry in a position approved by the inspecting officer, six (6) self-igniting red marine signal lights, effectively water proofed, and so constructed that the part containing the composition shall be 6 inches in length and firmly secured to a wooden handle 6 inches long with igniting surface fitted in the end; the six signals shall be enclosed in a water-tight zinc case so constructed as to prevent friction of the signals even should one or more be removed.

No owner or person in charge of any licensed boat shall allow her to be used in the carriage of passengers, or be let out for hire or valuable consideration when not carrying the furniture and equipment required by these Regulations.

23. *Extinguishing Fire*.—Every Motor Boat and every Motor Sailing Boat fitted with an engine generating power by petrol or other oil, and in respect of which application is made for the granting of a licence under these Regulations, shall, for the purpose of extinguishing fire, be furnished with and at all times carry, in a position approved by the inspecting officer—

- (a) a proportionate quantity of dry sand, equal to one-half of a cubic foot for every complete 12 feet in length of the hull; such sand, together with a suitable scoop or shovel, shall be kept in a box readily accessible for use in case of emergency;
- (b) a fire bucket, painted red, with a suitable lanyard attached, to be used only in case of fire.

24. *Position of Life Buoys and Life Belts*.—All life buoys and life belts shall be so placed as to be readily accessible to all persons on board, so that their position may be known to those for whom they are intended in case of emergency.

25. *Boat, &c., to be Maintained in Good Order*.—The hull, gear, equipments, and machinery, if any, of every licensed boat shall, while she continues to be licensed, be kept in good order and condition by the owner or person in charge thereof; and if at any time the officer appointed by the Board to make an inspection of such boat shall report to the Board that this Regulation has not been complied with, the licence may be immediately suspended or cancelled.

26. *Boat to be Ballasted*.—Every boat in respect of which application may be made for the granting of a licence under these Regulations shall, as a condition precedent to the issue of such licence, be ballasted to the satisfaction of the officer or person appointed by the Board for that purpose, and such ballast shall be properly secured to prevent the same from shifting, and shall be maintained in position whenever such boat is engaged in the carriage of any passenger or passengers.

27. *Property of Passengers left in Boat*.—All goods and property left in any licensed boat shall be handed over by the person in charge thereof to the nearest officer of police as soon as practicable after such has been found.

28. *Care of Boats let out on Hire*.—The person or persons to whom a boat licensed under any Regulations heretofore in force or under these Regulations is let on hire shall be held responsible for such boat, and also for the observance of these Regulations until such boat is taken back and returned to the owner or other person from whom hired.

29. *Change of Ownership*.—In all cases change of ownership of any boat licensed under any Regulations heretofore in force or under these Regulations shall be immediately reported, in writing, to the Secretary to the Marine Board by the owner whose name appears

upon the licence issued in respect of such boat, and if he fail to comply with this requirement he shall be deemed to have committed a breach of these Regulations, and shall be punishable accordingly.

30. *Change of Name of Boat*.—Any owner desirous of changing the name of any licensed boat shall transmit the licence of such boat to the Secretary to the Marine Board, accompanied by a fee of Two shillings and sixpence, and shall notify the name which he desires inserted upon such licence in lieu of the name recorded thereon, whereupon, if approved by the Board, such alteration shall be duly made and recorded by the Secretary, and the said licence shall thereupon be returned to the owner.

31. *Indorsement of Licence*.—A licence issued in respect of any Sailing Boat, Motor Boat, or Motor Sailing Boat restricting the carriage of passengers within certain limits, may be indorsed as applicable to other limits upon application being made by the owner of any such boat to the Secretary to the Board, provided that an officer of the Board or other person appointed for the purpose shall report that any such boat is fit in all respects to carry passengers in accordance with these Regulations in such other limits.

32. *Excess of Passengers*.—In the case of a boat plying for hire, or let out for hire or valuable consideration, if the owner or person having charge of the same shall permit such boat to be used in the conveyance of passengers, the number of such passengers being in excess of the number specified in the licence granted in respect of such boat, he shall be deemed guilty of a breach of these Regulations, and punishable accordingly, and the licence for such boat may be suspended or cancelled.

33. *Production of Licence*.—A licence issued in respect of any Sailing Boat, Motor Boat, or Motor Sailing Boat shall, on demand, be produced by the owner of any such boat, or by the person in charge thereof, to any officer of police, or of the Board, or to any passenger or intending passenger who may desire to see the same.

PERSONS IN CHARGE.

34. *Person in Charge to be Licensed*.—No person shall have charge of a boat plying for hire or reward of any kind within the limits of any port or in or on any waters in Victoria outside the Port of Melbourne as defined in the Second Schedule to the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1890*, or outside the Port of Geelong as defined in the First Schedule (Part I.) of the *Geelong Harbor Trust Act 1905*, unless—

- (a) if such boat be a Sailing Boat or a Motor Sailing Boat, or be a Motor Boat not exceeding fifteen (15) tons gross tonnage, he be the holder of a licence issued under these Regulations appropriate to the class of boat of which he may be in charge; or
- (b) if such boat be a Motor Boat exceeding fifteen (15) tons gross tonnage, he be the holder of a certificate of competency as a master in accordance with the provisions of sub-section 2(a) of section 65 of the *Marine Act 1890*; and no person shall have charge of the propelling machinery, if any, of any such boat unless he be the holder of a licence as a Marine Motor Driver.

Any such licence or certificate shall be produced on demand to any officer of police, or of the Board, or to any passenger or intending passenger who may desire to see the same.

35. *Application for Licence*.—Application for a licence to ply as a Boatman, or as a Motor Boatman, or as a Marine Motor Driver must be made to the Secretary to the Board on the form appropriate thereto as prescribed in Schedules VI., VIII., and XII. to these Regulations, as the case may be, and the applicant shall forward, with his application, written evidence as to his good character and sobriety, and as to the extent of his past experience in the handling of Sailing Boats or Motor Boats, as the case may be, or in the case of an applicant for a licence as a Marine Motor Driver, written evidence in support of the qualifying service hereinafter prescribed therefor. Should such evidence not be deemed by the Board satisfactory, the application will be refused.

36. *Age of Applicants*.—An applicant for a licence to ply as a Boatman in charge of any Sailing Boat or of a Motor Boat restricted to ply on a river or land-locked lake only will not be deemed eligible therefor unless he shall have attained the age of 18 years; an applicant for a licence to ply as a Motor Boatman within any port in Victoria generally shall not be deemed eligible therefor unless he shall have attained the age of 19 years; an applicant for a licence to act as a Marine Motor Driver shall not be deemed eligible therefor unless he shall have attained the age of 21 years. Should

any doubt exist as to the age of any applicant he shall be required to produce a certificate of birth or other satisfactory evidence of his age.

37. *Competency of Applicants.*—

- (a) Every applicant for a licence as a "Boatman" must, prior to the issue of a licence, satisfy an officer of the Board or other person appointed thereby for the purpose, that he is competent to have charge of and navigate a Sailing Boat used in the conveyance or passengers.
- (b) Every applicant for a licence as a "Motor Boatman" restricted to ply on a river or land-locked lake only, must satisfy an officer of the Board or other person appointed thereby for the purpose, as to his knowledge of the class of engines for which he desires a licence, and must satisfy such officer or other person that he knows the rule of the road, and that he is capable of taking charge of a Motor Boat restricted to limits as aforesaid.
- (c) Every applicant for a licence to ply as a "Motor Boatman" in any Port in Victoria generally (other than in the ports of Melbourne and Geelong), in addition to satisfying an officer of the Board or other person appointed thereby for the purpose as to his knowledge of the class of engines for which he desires a licence, must be able to explain to the satisfaction of such officer or other person how a temporary repair should be executed in the event of a derangement of any part of the machinery. He must also satisfy an officer of the Board or other person appointed thereby that he has the necessary local knowledge of the waters in respect of which he desires a licence, and that he knows the rule of the road as regards steam-ships, sailing vessels, and boats, and that he understands the use of the equipments required by these Regulations to be carried by Motor Boats.
- (d) Every applicant for a licence as a "Marine Motor Driver" must have had practical experience for a period of not less than twelve (12) months in the making and repairing of any class of engines, or have performed such service which in the opinion of the Board is equal to the service first mentioned, and must satisfy an officer of the Board or other person appointed thereby for the purpose as to his knowledge of the class of engines for which he desires a licence, and must be able to explain to the satisfaction of such officer or other person how a temporary repair should be executed in the event of a derangement of any part of the machinery.
- (e) The holder of a licence issued under subdivisions (b) or (c) hereof shall also be eligible to take charge of the machinery of a Motor Sailing Boat in which is installed an engine of the class for which he may hold a licence.

38. *Indorsement of Licences.*—

- (a) A licence issued to any Boatman or Motor Boatman authorizing him to take charge of a Sailing Boat or a Motor Boat, as the case may be, within certain specified limits, may be indorsed as applicable to other limits upon application being made by the holder of any such licence to the Secretary to the Board, provided that an officer of the Board or other person appointed for the purpose reports, after examination of the applicant, that he has the necessary knowledge as required by these Regulations for such other limits.
- (b) The holder of a licence authorizing him to take charge of machinery propelled by one or more of the following generators, i.e., gas, oil, fluid, electricity, or other mechanical power other than steam, and desirous of having his licence indorsed as applicable to a class or classes of engines other than the class or classes already indicated on his licence, shall make application therefor to the Secretary to the Board, and upon an officer of the Board or other person appointed for the purpose reporting that the applicant has the necessary knowledge of such additional class or classes of engines as required by these Regulations, the same may be indorsed upon the licence held by him.

39. *Certificates of Officers.*—The officers of the Board or other persons appointed thereby for the purpose shall give their certificates to the Board as to the efficiency of every applicant on one or the other of the forms prescribed in Schedules VII., IX., and XIII. hereto, as the case may be, and should any applicant fail to satisfy such officers or persons his application will be rejected.

40. *Failure to pass Examination.*—Should any applicant for a licence under these regulations fail to satisfy the officer of the Board or other person appointed thereby as to his practical knowledge, he may not present himself for re-examination until he produces proof of three months further qualifying service.

41. *Physical Defects.*—No applicant shall be granted a licence who is suffering from any mental or physical defect which, in the opinion of the Marine Board, is likely to interfere with the efficient discharge of his duties.

42. *Regulations to be Produced on Demand.*—Every person having charge of any boat licensed under these regulations shall keep available a copy of such regulations or any additions to or amendments thereof which will be furnished to him by the Secretary to the Board on application, or on being supplied with the address of such person; and he shall produce the same when required to do so to any person hiring his boat.

The foregoing Regulations were made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria held this twenty-seventh day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and fifteen.

In Schedule 56 to the Regulations made by His Excellency the Governor in Council on 8th January, 1902, where the fee to be paid for obtaining limestone and erecting limekilns on Crown lands within the parish of Merrimu or the parish of Barongarook is £25 per annum, payable quarterly, in advance, after the word "Merrimu," the words "or parish of Barongarook" shall be omitted, and where the fee to be paid for obtaining limestone and erecting limekilns on Crown lands comprising allotments 2 and 3, township and parish of Waratah, is £12 10s. per annum, payable quarterly, in advance, after the word "Waratah" the words "or parish of Barongarook" shall be inserted. These alterations shall be deemed to have effect from and after 30th June, 1909.—(Corr. 1852/145, Geelong.)

Also, that such Special Board may in any regulation, determination, order or instrument, or legal proceedings, be described for all purposes as the Provincial Bread Board.

TRAMWAYS WITHIN THE CITIES OF MELBOURNE AND BRUNSWICK AND THE TOWN OF COBURG.

WHEREAS by the Tramways Act 1890 it is provided that tramways may be constructed in any municipal district (except in the municipal districts of Fitzroy, Collingwood, Prahran, Richmond, South Melbourne, Hotham, St. Kilda, Brunswick, Kew, Hawthorn, and Sandridge), when authorized by an Order of the Governor in Council made in that behalf, upon the application of the council of the municipality in compliance with the provisions of the said Act, and of the Rules and Regulations to be from time to time made by the Governor in Council: **And whereas** the Tramways Act 1890 was amended by Acts Nos. 2484 and 2541 extending the powers contained in the Tramways Act 1890 so as to allow of tramways being constructed within the cities of Melbourne and Brunswick and the town of Coburg: **And whereas** the Melbourne Brunswick and Coburg Tramways Trust, in pursuance of the powers vested in it under the provisions of the *Brunswick and Coburg Tramways Act 1914*, No. 2484, and the *Melbourne Brunswick and Coburg Tramways Act 1914*, No. 2541, has now made application in accordance with the said Acts and of the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder for an Order by the Governor in Council authorizing the construction of tramways in the municipal districts of the municipalities of the cities of Melbourne and Brunswick and town of Coburg: **And whereas** the Governor in Council being satisfied that the requirements of the said Acts and of the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder have been duly complied with by the said Trust, and that notice of the intention of the said Trust to make the said application in which notice the routes proposed to be followed were described, and persons objecting to the same were called on to lodge their objections within the time required by the Regulations, has been duly published as required by the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council, in pursuance of the said Acts in that behalf, and that no objection to the said application has been lodged within the times provided in the said Rules, and being satisfied also that it is expedient and proper that the said application should be granted, has determined to grant the same subject to the restrictions and conditions hereinafter contained: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Acts, doth for the purpose aforesaid make the Order following (that is to say):—

That the Melbourne Brunswick and Coburg Tramways Trust shall be and is hereby authorized to construct tramways in the municipal districts of the cities of Melbourne and Brunswick and the town of Coburg.

ROUTES.

(1) Commencing at Moreland-road at its intersection with Sydney-road, in the municipal district of Coburg, and proceeding northerly along Sydney-road to Baker-street, in the municipal district of Coburg.

(2) Commencing at the intersection of Rathdown and Park streets, in the municipal district of Brunswick, and proceeding westward along Park-street to Lygon-street; and thence northward along Lygon-street to Albion-street; and thence eastward along Albion-street to Holmes-street; thence northerly along Holmes-street and Nicholson-street to Bell-street, in the municipal district of Coburg.

(3) Commencing at the intersection of Holmes-street and Moreland-road, in the municipalities of Brunswick and Coburg, and proceeding westerly along Moreland-road, which forms the boundaries of the said municipalities, to the intersection of Moreland-road and Sydney-road.

(4) Commencing at Queensberry-street and its intersection with Madeline-street, in the municipal district of the city of Melbourne, and proceeding northerly along Madeline-street to Elgin-street; and thence easterly along Elgin-street to Lygon-street; and thence northerly along Lygon-street to Park-street, the boundary between the municipal districts of the cities of Melbourne and Brunswick.

GAUGE.

That the gauge of the said tramways shall be four feet eight and one-half inches (4 ft. 8½ in.), and that the said tramways shall be constructed in the manner set out and described in the working plans and specifications numbered from 1 to 26 inclusive, now deposited in the

Public Works Department, and which plans and specifications are indorsed with a memorandum of the Minister of Public Works identifying the said plans and specifications so deposited as the plans and specifications referred to in this Order, and which plans and specifications, except in so far as the same may be varied by these presents, are to be deemed to be incorporated in this Order, and to be as much part of the same as if they were set out in detail in this Order.

MOTIVE POWER.

That the motive power to be used upon the said tramways shall be electricity.

MAXIMUM SPEED.

That the maximum speed of the progression of the cars upon the said tramways, with hand-brake equipment on the cars, shall be at the rate of 15 miles per hour, and with magnetic, air, or other approved power brakes and life guards, the maximum speed shall be at the rate of 20 miles per hour.

TIME OF COMPLETION.

That the tramways shall be completed and open for traffic within a period of two (2) years from the date of the Order in Council authorizing the construction of the tramways.

TRAFFIC.

That the tramways shall be used for the carriage of passengers and such parcels or packages as they may have in their possession.

NECESSARY PRECAUTIONS FOR SAFETY OF PASSENGERS AND PUBLIC TO BE OBSERVED.

That every precaution necessary to secure the safety of the passengers upon the said tramways, and also to secure the safety of passengers passing along the streets upon the route of such tramways, shall be taken and ordered by the Melbourne Brunswick and Coburg Tramways Trust.

Provided always that all cars shall be stopped at the junction of Moreland-road with Sydney-road and at the junction of Moreland-road with Holmes-road, and that the conductor shall proceed so as to obtain a full view of the curve into which the car is about to enter, and shall signal to the driver to proceed only when he (the conductor) shall have satisfied himself that the road at the curve is clear. It is also provided that not more than one car at a time shall be allowed on the curved tracks, and that the speed of the cars travelling over the said curves shall not exceed four (4) miles per hour.

STOPPAGES FOR TAKING UP AND SETTING DOWN PASSENGERS.

That for the convenience of the public the cars shall stop for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers at the intersection of such streets as are indicated by notice boards or other sufficient devices erected at such intersections to be stopping points, and at such other points upon the route of the tramways as may be convenient, and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic of the streets or the safety of the passengers in the cars.

TOLLS AND CHARGES.

That the charges to be made upon the said tramways shall be One penny for each passenger on each of the following sections, or part thereof:—

- (a) From Park-street to Albion-street, *via* Lygon-street.
- (b) From Albion-street to Sydney-road, *via* Moreland-road.
- (c) From Moreland-road to Bell-street, in Sydney-road.
- (d) From Bell-street to terminus, at Baker-street.
- (e) From corner of Moreland-road and Holmes-street to Bell-street, *via* Nicholson-street.
- (f) From Queensberry-street to Princes-street, *via* Madeline, Elgin, and Lygon streets.
- (g) From Princes-street to Park-street, *via* Lygon-street.

For each child under twelve years of age (other than children under four years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free), One penny for any one of the above sections, or for any two continuous sections; provided, however, that for any one or more sections the fare to be charged for two children travelling together under the age of twelve years shall not exceed the fare charged for one adult.

CONTINUOUS SECTIONS.

- (a) From Queensberry-street to Albion-street, 2d.
- (b) From Queensberry-street to Bell-street, *via* Moreland-road or Nicholson-street, 3d.
- (c) From Queensberry-street to Baker-street, 4d.

With power to the Trust to make a charge of Twopence (2d.) for a continuous journey over any three continuous sections of the said tramways or *vice versa*, and for each child under twelve (12) years of age (other than children under four years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free), a fare of One penny for any three continuous sections referred to.

With power to the Trust to make a charge of Threepence (3d.) for a continuous journey over any four continuous sections of the said tramways or *vice versa*, and for each child under twelve (12) years of age (other than children under four years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free), a fare of Twopence (2d.) for any four continuous sections referred to.

SPECIAL TICKETS TO SCHOOL CHILDREN.

That the charge to be made for return tickets to school children under the age of eighteen years over any two sections shall be One penny, and for any four sections Twopence, subject to such conditions as to the days on and the hours between which such return tickets shall be available as the Trust may by regulations determine, also in such regulations to limit the right of travel in respect of such return tickets to a portion only of the car.

MINIMUM OR THROUGH FARES FOR ANY SPECIFIED DISTANCE.

That power is hereby given to the Trust to run cars at minimum or through fares upon the said tramways for any specified distance, provided that the amount of such minimum or through fare shall not exceed the total sum of the sectional fares upon such tramways or such parts of such tramways over which the cars shall be run. Every such car shall have a notice or notices plainly exhibited on the outside of such car indicating its destination and the minimum fare chargeable thereon.

SPECIAL CARS.

That the charge to be made—

- (1) For the hire of a special car, with a seating capacity not exceeding thirty-six persons, shall be 1s. 6d. per car mile between the hours of 6 a.m. and midnight, and 2s. 6d. per car mile after midnight.
- (2) For the hire of a special car, with a seating capacity exceeding thirty-six persons, shall be 2s. 6d. per car mile between 6 a.m. and midnight, and 3s. 6d. per car mile after midnight. The car mileage shall be the mileage run by the car from the time of its leaving the depot until its return thereto. Provided always, however, that a minimum charge of £1. 1s. may be made for the hiring of any special car between 6.30 a.m. and midnight, and £2 2s. between midnight and 1 a.m., and the sum of 5s. per hour per car for detention during the journey for which such special car is hired.

BLIND PERSONS TO TRAVEL FREE ON TRAMWAYS.

That power is hereby given to the Trust to allow blind persons to travel free on the said tramways, provided that their attendants pay the ordinary fares chargeable thereon.

TRAMWAY WHERE PASSING OVER ROYAL PARK TO NORTH FITZROY RAILWAY LINE AT LYGON-STREET, BRUNSWICK, TO BE UNDER CONTROL OF RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, ETC.

(a) That in respect of the tramway crossing over the Royal Park to North Fitzroy railway at Lygon-street, Brunswick, the Trust shall defray the whole cost of the tramway crossing over the railway line, and one-half of the cost of the interlocked gates and signals, and of such other interlocking, catch points, and safety appliances as may be necessary in connexion with such crossings.

(b) That the Trust shall reimburse the Commissioners the cost of the maintenance and upkeep of such crossing, and one-half of the cost of the maintenance and upkeep of the gates, signals, interlocking, catch points, and other safety appliances.

(c) That the Trust shall reimburse the Commissioners one-half of the cost of the wages and expense of the signalmen required to operate the gates and signals.

(d) That the tramway shall, so far as regards its use, running, and maintenance on or across the lines of the Commissioners, be under the absolute control of and subject to all such By-laws, Regulations, and Orders as may from time to time be made by the Commissioners, who shall not, however, be in any way liable in respect of any damage or injury which may in any manner occur to any person or to any property in consequence of the said tramway crossing the railway line except such damage or injury arise from the negligence or default of the Commissioners, and the tramway service shall at all times be subordinate to the railway requirements.

(e) That in the event of the regrading of the line between Royal Park and North Fitzroy the Trust shall pay to the Commissioners such sum of money towards the cost of the regrading as may be determined by the Governor in Council, having regard to the benefits which will arise from the abolition of the level crossing; provided that such contribution shall not exceed the capitalized amount of the annual value of the benefits to the Trust occasioned by the abolition of the level crossing; and that, in arriving at the value of such benefits, any expenditure incurred by the municipality in the alteration of road levels as the result of the regrading of the line shall be taken into consideration.

(f) That in the event of the adoption of electric traction for the purpose of operating the trains on the Royal Park and North Fitzroy railway line the Trust, or the authority which operates or controls the tramway, shall bear one-half of the cost of any special work or works in connexion with the electrical plant and equipment of the railways or of the tramway which, in the opinion of the Commissioners, may be necessary in order to provide for the safe working of the railways and tramway traffic over the railway line on the level; but the Trust, or the authority which operates or controls the tramway, shall not be entitled to a reimbursement of the cost of any such special work in the event of the subsequent construction of a bridge to carry the vehicular and tramway traffic over or under the railway line, and in such event the Trust, or the authority which operates or controls the tramway, shall also bear the cost of any other work or works or alterations which may be necessary to the tramway line in consequence thereof.

ELECTRIC WIRES CROSSING LINES OF RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS TO BE CONSTRUCTED SO AS NOT TO INTERFERE.

Any electric line or lines in connexion with the said tramway which would cross under or over any wire of the Commissioners, or which would, in the opinion of the Commissioners, be in a position likely, if special precautions be not taken, to prejudicially affect the operation of the trains when electrified, or the maintenance of telegraphic or telephonic communication, or the transmission of signals on adjacent wires of the Commissioners, shall, to the satisfaction of and without any expense to the Commissioners, be so placed, constructed, guarded, and maintained as not to be capable, in the opinion of the Commissioners, of injuring or coming into contact with any wire of the Commissioners, or of prejudicially affecting or interfering either mechanically or electrically with the proper use of any such wire.

COST OF ALTERATION TO POSTAL WIRES INCIDENTAL TO USE OF ELECTRICITY.

In the event of the Postal Department demanding any special alteration of its wires in consequence of the introduction of a high-tension or other electrical current in connexion with the tramway, the cost of any special arrangement of or provision for the wires because of such current shall be paid and borne by the Trust.

FARES IN CASE OF COMBINED TRAMWAY AND RAILWAY PASSENGERS.

Nothing herein contained shall prevent the Trust from entering into any arrangement with the Railways Commissioners to sell through tickets to travel over both tramway and railway, and in that case charging or providing for the payment of fares at a lower rate than those specified in this Order in respect of passengers travelling over both tramway and railway.

GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL TO BE SOLE JUDGE OF BREACH OF ORDER.

That the Governor in Council shall be sole judge of the compliance with, or of the breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order, and for the purpose of enabling the Governor in Council to arrive at a just decision, an inquiry into the facts of each case shall be conducted in the manner provided in clause 25 of the Regulations contained in the Second Schedule to the *Tramways Act 1890*, before an officer to be appointed in that behalf by the Governor in Council, as provided in the Regulations in the said Schedule.

If upon report to the Governor in Council by the referee, made under the said clause 25 of the Regulations in the Second Schedule of the said Act, the Governor in Council shall, as such sole judge, determine that there has been any failure of or non-compliance with, or that any breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order has occurred by way either of commission or omission, then the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall cease and determine, or shall be suspended, as the Governor in Council shall direct; and in the case of the Governor in Council ordering a suspension only of such powers, then the Governor in Council shall, in his adjudication, state for what period such suspension shall take effect.

If in such adjudication the Governor in Council shall determine that the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall wholly cease and determine, then the Melbourne Brunswick and Coburg Tramways Trust shall forthwith proceed to restore the streets along which the said route is laid out to their condition previous to the construction of such tramway, unless the Governor in Council otherwise order.

That in the event of the Trust finding it necessary to provide work of a more substantial or expensive character than that provided for in this Order, the said Trust shall take upon itself all such additional expenditure, and no claim whatever shall be made upon the Government, or upon the Board of Land and Works, for any pecuniary assistance or aid in respect of such expenditure, or to provide funds therefor.

And the Honorable James George Membrey, for and on behalf of His Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

ORDER APPROVING OF A DEVIATION FROM A
MAIN ROAD IN THE SHIRE OF TRARALGON.

WHEREAS the Country Roads Board constituted under the *Country Roads Act 1912 (Act No. 2415)* has represented to the Governor in Council that it appears to it desirable that the deviation hereinafter referred to from the existing Callignee-road in the shire of Traralgon (declared to be a main road under the said Act which declaration was confirmed by the Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* of the fourteenth day of January One thousand nine hundred and fourteen on page ninety-three) should be made by the said Board. And whereas the said Board in accordance with the requirements of section 19 of the said Act has caused to be prepared a map, two plan-marked A and B respectively, and estimate showing the points between which and on and through what land the said deviation is proposed to be made and the cost of acquiring the land and constructing the said deviation. And whereas on an inspection of the said map and plans and a consideration of the said estimate the Governor in Council is satisfied that there are funds legally available for acquiring the land and constructing the said deviation. Now therefore be it known by this present Order that the Governor of the State of Victoria with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby approve of the said road being made, that is to say:—

All those pieces of land being parts of Crown allotments 7, 6, 4, 2, 1, 1A, and 1B, in the parish of Callignee, and Crown allotment 60, in the parish of Loy Yang, in the county of Buln Buln, and more particularly described hereunder, namely:—

SHIRE OF SOUTH BARWON.

BY-LAW NO. 12.

A By-law of the Shire of South Barwon, made under the provisions of the Health Act 1890, and numbered 12, for the prevention of the pollution of the Barwon River or its tributaries within the limits of the Shire of South Barwon.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1890 and any other powers enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of South Barwon, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, doth hereby order and direct as follows:—

1. No person shall discharge, or cause or allow to be discharged, any offensive matter or drainage into any part of the Barwon River, and included within the limits of the district of the Council of the Shire of South Barwon, nor within those limits into any tributary of the aforesaid Barwon River.

2. Any person who by any act or default shall be guilty of any breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of Five pounds for every such breach, or if such breach be a continuing act or default, he shall be liable to a penalty of One pound for every day during which

such breach shall be committed or continued unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order portion only of either of the said penalties (such portion not to be less than Five shillings) to be paid.

SHIRE OF FLINDERS.

BY-LAW No. 18.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890* and of every power and authority enabling them in that behalf the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Flinders in the name of and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire hereby resolves, orders, and directs as follows: That—

1. This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the area (being parts of the said shire) hereinafter described that is to say:—

First.—Commencing at north-west corner of allotment 3, parish of Nepean; thence along western boundary of allotment three for a distance of 12 chains; thence easterly to eastern boundary of allotment 7 of said parish in a line parallel with the northern boundary of allotment 7; thence northerly by the eastern boundaries of allotments 7 and 6 to the north-east corner of allotment 6; thence westerly along northern boundaries of allotments 6, 5 and 3 to the starting point.

Second.—Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7, township of Rye.

Third.—Allotment 1, parish of Nepean.

Fourth.—Commencing at the north-west corner of allotment 14, section A, parish of Wannaeue; thence southerly along the western boundary of that allotment for a distance of 18 chains; thence easterly to eastern boundary of same allotment at a point 28 chains south of north-eastern corner of same allotment; thence along the eastern boundary to north-east corner; thence along northern boundary to the starting point.

Fifth.—Allotments 15, 16, 17, parish of Wannaeue.

Sixth.—The whole of the village of Rosebud.

Seventh.—Commencing at the north-west corner of allotment 19, section A, parish of Wannaeue; thence southerly along the western boundary of the same allotment for a distance of 15 chains; thence to a point on the eastern boundary 15 chains south of the north-east corner of the same allotment; thence along eastern boundary to the north-east corner; thence along the northern boundary to the starting point.

Eighth.—The whole of allotment 20, parish of Wannaeue.

Twelfth.—Allotments 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, and 13, section 1, parish of Kangerong.

2. All former By-laws or Regulations on the matters and things hereinafter provided are hereby repealed excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this By-law coming into operation.

3. This By-law shall come into force upon its allowance and confirmation by the Board of Public Health in and for the State of Victoria, and the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

4. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall once at least in every week cause to be emptied or cleansed every earth-closet, privy, or place for the deposit of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

5. The Council of the said Shire of Flinders may at any time and from time to time licence or authorize any person to remove night-soil from premises in the above-described area, and may at any time revoke such licence or authority.

6. When any person is licensed or authorized as aforesaid, such person shall be employed to remove all night-soil, and no occupier or person having the management or control of any premises shall contract for the removal of night-soil with, or permit or cause the same to be removed by any unlicensed or unauthorized person.

7. On and after this By-law coming into operation every closet shall be furnished with a double-pan service to be provided by the said Council under which at least once a week the pan in use in every closet shall be closed with a tight fitting lid and removed in the daytime in a suitable cart, and a pan cleansed by super-heated steam or some equally efficient means approved by the Council shall be left in its place.

8. The Council may on the recommendation of the Health Officer or Inspector of Nuisances exempt any premises from the operation of this By-law.

9. All cesspans shall be removed in a cart or other conveyance having springs, and so constructed that the pans shall be properly covered from observation, and so as to prevent the escape therefrom of any noxious or offensive effluvia.

10. All night-soil when removed shall be re-deposited only at such place or places and in such manner as the Health Officer or Inspector of Nuisances shall approve.

11. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall provide and keep in use in every closet a suitable disinfectant or deodorant.

12. No person shall deposit in any pan any ashes.

13. To provide for the proper removal of night-soil the occupier or person having the control or management of every house or tenement on any premises shall pay to the Council such sum annually as may from time to time be fixed by resolution of the Council for emptying and removing night-soil, and such annual charge shall be payable and paid by each occupier or person having the control of any premises in one payment in advance. The amount in default to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

14. If any person commit a breach, or fail to observe, or perform any of the provisions of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence, and such person for every such offence shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds or less than Five shillings for each day, during which such breach or failure is committed or continued, such penalty to be recovered as the law provides.

The total area of Mallee land which may be selected is 640 acres if in the first class, or 1,000 acres if in the second class, or 1,280 acres if in the third class. Any further area (limited as by the next succeeding paragraph) can be obtained only by purchase from other persons.

That a special condition shall be inserted in the lease and the Crown Grant, providing that the land referred to therein shall at all times be maintained and used for the purpose of residence or agriculture and grazing, and that no person will be permitted to subsequently acquire or hold, or have an interest in, more than 1,000 acres, if the land be in the first class, or more than 1,600 acres if the land be in any other class.

That the lessee or grantee or owner shall preserve the timber on, or plant an area of, not less than 3 per cent. of the total extent of his holding. (N.B.—Along the exposed boundary lines, viz., the western and southern, would be preferable.)

No person, unless specially authorized, will be permitted to clear timber from any portion of areas retained for the purposes of roads and windbreaks.

GENERAL CONDITIONS.

1. No offer will necessarily be accepted.
2. The deposit mentioned in each case must accompany each tender.
3. Offers must be AT A PRICE PER TON, IRRESPECTIVE OF THE SPECIES OF WATTLE, and the bark must be weighed at the weighbridge named in each case, or at a weighbridge approved by the officer in charge and at the expense of the licensee. Duplicate weighbridge tickets must be provided, and, if so directed by him, the bark must be weighed in the presence of the officer in charge.
4. Royalty must be paid in two instalments, the first payment covering all bark removed by 2nd December, 1915, and the second payment covering all bark removed by 28th February, 1916, by which latter date all work must cease, and all bark, stripped or otherwise, remaining on the area after that date shall be the property of the Crown.
5. No tree shall be felled or stripped on any beauty spot, picnic ground, or on any portion of any area which the officer in charge points out as not to be operated upon, and no particular tree, specially marked by him to remain standing, shall be felled or stripped, wherever situated.
6. No tree shall be felled so to fall into any water-course, or so as to obstruct any road or track.
7. Printed forms of tender, showing estimates of requirements and conditions of contract, may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge of police at any of the above-mentioned places, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per ton of 40 cubic feet for firewood, including delivery at the offices and all charges. Prices should only be quoted for requirements where estimates are shown above.

Tenders, which must be upon the printed form, will be received for either one or more of the above-mentioned places, and tenders for such places may be accepted or rejected separately; but if all lengths of firewood be included in one tender it may be accepted for one length only, if advisable.

Where the kind or kinds of wood is not mentioned in the tender form, tenderers must specify the kind or kinds of firewood they offer to supply.

Telegrams, or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement, will not be entertained. The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for £10, with two approved sureties for the due performance of the contract, within ten days after the acceptance is notified.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Firewood at _____" as the case may be, and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender. The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of firewood which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.
2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must be split out of large timber, and must be perfectly sound, dry, and of the kind or kinds specified in the tender; neither burnt wood, heartwood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. The billets must be not less than 4 inches nor more than 6 inches in diameter. The long wood to be not less than 9 inches nor more than 18 inches in diameter. Delivery to be made on the written order of the chief officer of the Department requiring the supply. The ton of firewood consists of 40 cubic feet. If the firewood is obtained from a State-forest timber reserve, or ordinary Crown lands, persons cutting or removing same must be provided with a licence or permit from the State Forests Department.
3. Orders will be issued half-yearly (except in cases where the storage is small, when they will be issued quarterly); but the contractor must have 24 hours' notice before purchases are made at his risk.
4. The contractor will be bound to place the firewood in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. The stacks are to be 2 feet wide (or 4 feet 6 inches for long wood) by 5 feet high, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets (or lengths) are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. In the event of any inconvenience being felt, either through delay in delivery or of stacking the wood, the Department concerned will purchase the same or re-stack that delivered, at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense incurred thereby will be deducted.
5. The officer receiving the supply shall have full power to reject any wood which he may consider not in accordance with the contract, notice of which will be given to the contractor in writing, stating the reason. The contractor may, however, claim a survey; but in that case he must, within 48 hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the wood.
6. The board of survey will be composed of persons appointed by the Honorable the Treasurer, and the decision of the board of survey is to be considered as final.
7. If the board of survey shall decide that the supply is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.
8. Accounts for firewood to be rendered to the Department receiving the supply immediately upon completion of the order, which must be attached to the account. Payment will be made at the receipt and pay office of the district, or at the Treasury, Melbourne, as the contractor may desire.
9. In the event of any irregularity on the part of the contractor being repeated, it will be competent for the Government, in case such irregularity should be established to the satisfaction of the Tender Board, to cancel the contract forthwith.

The Contractor shall, before any account is passed for payment for supplies made, furnish a statutory declaration that all the workmen under this contract have been employed in accordance with clause 12 of these Conditions, and have been paid not less than the minimum rate of wages for such workmen as is provided for under that clause.
