SHIRE OF HAMPDEN. BY-LAW NO. 24.

A By-law of the shire of Hampden, for regulating traffic within the shire of Hampden, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 24.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903* the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the shire of Hampden order as follows:—

That from and after the date of this By-law coming into operation—

(1) The owner of any hackney carriage stage carriage or vehicle used in plying for hire or passengers or of any vehicle used for the conveyance of persons only or of persons as well as goods wares or merchandise or of any cart or vehicle traction engine or other locomotive plying for hire or passengers or travelling or being driven or being upon any road street or any public way or place within the shire of Hampden between sunset of any day and sunrise of the following day shall cause the same to be provided with a good and serviceable lamp securely fixed and lighted at the off side of the front of such carriage vehicle or locomotive so constructed and placed as to exhibit a white light visible in the direction to which such carriage vehicle or locomotive is travelling or being driven or facing within such a distance as to adequately signal the approach or position of such carriage vehicle or locomotive and so that the light therefrom shall be distinctly visible from the rear of the same and every such owner who shall fail to comply with this section shall for every such offence forfeit and pay upon conviction a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings.

(2) The driver of any hackney carriage or stage carriage or vehicle used in plying for hire or passengers or of any vehicle used for the conveyance of persons only or of persons as well as goods wares or merchandise or of any cart or vehicle traction engine or other locomotive travelling or being driven or being in or upon any road street or public way or place within the shire of Hampden between sunset of any day and sunrise of the following day shall keep such carriage vehicle or locomotive properly lighted with a good and serviceable lamp securely fixed and lighted at the off side of the front of such carriage vehicle or locomotive so as to exhibit a white light visible in the direction to which such carriage vehicle or locomotive is travelling or being driven or facing within such a distance as to adequately signal the approach or position of such carriage vehicle or locomotive and so that the light therefrom shall be distinctly visible from the rear of the same and every

such driver who shall fail to comply with the section shall for every such offence forfeit and pay upon conviction a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings.

(3) (a) Throughout this section the expression "machine" shall mean a bicycle tricycle or other velocipede.

(b) The following provisions shall apply with regard to the driving riding or impelling of any machine in or upon any road street or public way or place within the shire of Hampden.

(c) A person shall not drive ride or impel a machine upon any footway within the shire of Hampden made or set apart for the use of foot passengers provided however that a machine may be taken across any footway direct to or from any premises abutting thereon.

(d) Every person driving riding or impelling a machine during the hours between sunset of any day and sunrise of the following day shall carry a lamp which shall be attached to the machine and shall be so constructed and placed as to exhibit a light in the direction in which such person is proceeding and such lamp shall be so lighted and kept lighted as to afford adequate means of signalling the approach and position of such machine.

(e) Every person driving riding or impelling a machine shall keep the same upon the near or left-hand side of the road or carriage-way and whenever any such person shall overtake with such machine any waggon cart carriage or other vehicle or any horse or other beast of burden such person shall keep such machine to the right or off-side of such vehicle or horse or other beast of burden and any person overtaking with such machine any waggon cart carriage or other vehicle or any horse or other beast of burden or any foot passenger proceeding along the road or carriage-way shall within a reasonable distance from and before passing such waggon cart carriage or other vehicle or such horse or other beast of burden or foot passenger by sounding a bell give audible and sufficient warning of the approach of such machine.

(f) In every case where a person driving or riding a machine meets any horse or other beast of burden and where such horse or other beast of burden shall on such meeting become restive or alarmed or shall cease to be under due control of the person for the time being in charge of such horse or other beast of burden the person driving or riding such machine shall dismount as speedily as possible and shall continue dismounted so long as may be reasonably necessary.

(g) No person shall drive ride or impel a machine along or across any street or public thoroughfare furiously or negligently or at such a rate of speed as to endanger the safety of or injure any person vehicle or property in the street or thoroughfare along or across which such machine is being driven or impelled.

(h) No person shall ride drive or impel any machine along any street or any other public thoroughfare in such manner or in such order that more than two machines shall be travelling side by side in the same direction except when such machines shall form part of a duly authorized parade or procession.

(i) Every person offending against any of the provisions of this section shall be liable on conviction thereof to a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings.
