Meat Supervision Acts.

REGULATIONS FOR THE BRANDING OF CARCASSES OR MEAT IN THE BALLARAT EAST MEAT AREA.

THE Board of Public Health in and for the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by virtue of the powers conferred by the Meat Supervision Acts, doth hereby make the following addition to the Regulations made by the said Board on the 26th day of September, 1907, which are applicable to the Meat Area, consisting of the town of Ballarat East, constituted under the said Acts on the 27th day of April, 1911, that is to say :—

In the case of the carcasses or meat being branded by or under the direction of a meat inspector of the Ballarat East Town Council, the letters of the brand shall be B E T C.

CITY OF COLLINGWOOD.

The Health Act 1890.

A BY-LAW OF THE CITY OF COLLINGWOOD MADE UNDER THE HEALTH ACT 1890, AND NUMBERED 58.

IN pursuance of the power conferred by the Health Act 1890 and of every other power and authority enabling them in this behalf, the Council of the city of Collingwood, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the city of Collingwood, do hereby make a By-law, and do hereby order and direct as follows :—

1. The occupier of every house, building, tenement, or premises shall provide and keep or cause to be provided and kept thereon a covered receptacle or receptacles made of non-absorbent material not exceeding two cubic feet in content, so that the same may, with the contents thereof when full, be readily and conveniently removable by the public scavenger or such person or persons as the Council may appoint for that purpose, and shall cause all dust, ashes, rubbish,

or other house refuse produced, collected, or accumulated on such premises to be from time to time placed in such receptacle, which receptacle shall be kept constantly covered except at such times as the same may be or shall be opened for the deposit therein of dust, ashes, rubbish, or house refuse as aforesaid, and such receptacle shall be kept in a clean and inoffensive condition, and shall be placed in the yard of such tenement or premises, close to the entrance thereof from the street, lane, or right-of-way on such day in each week as may be specified in any notice to that effect given by the Council, in order that the contents of such receptacle may be readily and conveniently discharged and removed by the public scavengers or other person or persons authorized or appointed by the Council.

2. No dust-box or receptacle shall be placed in or on any street, lane, or right-of-way, but will be removed from inside the yards or premises.
3. For every offence against any provisions of this By-law the offender shall, upon conviction before any two or more Justices of the Peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Two pounds nor less than Five shillings.
4. This By-law shall apply and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the city of Collingwood.

Education Act 1890.

REGULATIONS RESCINDED AND REGULATION SUBSTITUTED.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-eighth day of September, 1915.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.

Sir A. J. Peacock	Mr. Hazethorn

WHEREAS by section 23 of the *Education Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1086), it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind Regulation III.—Inspection and Examination—of the Regulations under the *Education Act 1890*, and make the following in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

REGULATION III.

Inspection of Primary Schools.

1. So far as practicable two visits shall be paid by an inspector to each school during the year.

2. (a) The head teacher will examine his school fully at least twice each year—before the end of May and in December—and will record the results in detail, with his comments, in the Examination Register:

(b) The examination papers of the pupils and a copy of the questions are to be kept in the school for reference for twelve months, or for such period as the inspector may direct.

3. Pupils should be classified in the grades according to their attainment and mental development. As a general rule pupils will be expected to advance through a grade in each year. The system of promotions and general organization of the school should be sufficiently elastic to allow of the promotion of pupils at other than yearly intervals, so as to avoid either premature promotion or undue retardation. The classification of pupils (especially of those whose ages are equal to or above the average age for children of their grade) should be based mainly upon their capacity and attainments in English and arithmetic.

4. In considering the character of the organization of a school the inspector will, particularly in the larger schools, take into account the distribution of the staff, the amount of actual teaching done by the head teacher, the allotment of duties to assistant teachers, the methods of grading pupils, the measures adopted to prevent retardation of pupils, the means for dealing with backward pupils, the training of junior teachers, and, generally, the arrangements of the head teacher to secure concerted and progressive effort throughout the school. The inspector will also give consideration, with due regard to the circumstances of each school, to the classroom and school environment and to the acquisition by pupils of habits of prompt and cheerful obedience, regularity, punctuality, neatness, and cleanliness.

5. In gauging the progress of pupils the inspector will attach much importance to the half-yearly examinations conducted by the head teacher and recorded in the Examination Register. At either of his visits the inspector may, at his discretion, examine the whole or any portion of the school in order to obtain sufficient data for his estimate of the progress of the pupils, and the general efficiency of the instruction. Such examination will be based upon the work as set out in the work-programs of the school, and will take into account the amount, the order of development, and the character of the work presented.

6. When assessing the value of the work of any teacher the inspector will take into account the length of time such teacher has been in charge of a school, or of a grade, or of a group of subjects, and will make such allowance as he may consider necessary.

7. In estimating the efficiency of the instruction the inspector will have regard to the class lessons observed by him, the part taken by pupils in the work of instruction, their responsiveness and capacity to think for themselves, their power of expression and interest in their work, and their ability to apply what they learn to the affairs of every-day life. The inspector will also examine the recorded work to discover its standard and quality as shown from day to day. He will ascertain further whether a taste for reading is being cultivated through books obtained from the school library or other source, and whether one of the aims of the school is to encourage the growth of special interests among the pupils.

8. At each visit of inspection the inspector will report upon the conditions of the school buildings and their suitability for the proper carrying out of the work of the school. He will also ascertain whether the physical training of the pupils is receiving adequate attention, whether, in their school work, pupils are required to assume bodily positions conducive to health, and whether the hygienic conditions of the class rooms and premises, so far as they are within the teacher's control, are satisfactory.

9. During his visit the inspector will take note of any educational agencies connected with the school, such as the school garden, the school library, the school museum, the school swimming club, organized games, &c., and will give due weight to their value in promoting the well-being of the school.

10. At the close of his examination of any subject the inspector will assign to it the term "very good," "good," "fair," or "inefficient," or the numerical equivalent, and this mark will be regarded as the measure of the efficiency of the instruction in that subject.

11. In his estimate of the work of a school as a whole the inspector will take into account the number of pupils presented by the school for the qualification examination, for the certificate of merit, and for scholarships respectively. He will in his estimate give credit to a teacher who has successfully encouraged his senior pupils to take up courses of technical or secondary education. At the same time, he will take into consideration the surroundings of each school so far as they are likely to affect the number of pupils presenting for qualifications for these higher courses.

12. During his first visit to a school in any school year the inspector may take what steps he considers necessary to satisfy himself that the work of the school has been conducted systematically in accordance with the work-program during the period between the previous visit and the close of the school year. To enable this to be done, the work-program covering this period and all the recorded work must be preserved and made available for inspection.

13. District inspectors will from time to time meet the school committees of their district to discuss with them projects for the well-being of the schools of their district.

To take effect from the 1st January, 1916.

And the Honorable T. Livingston, His Majesty's Minister of Public Instruction for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by a Resolution set out below and dated the twentieth day of September One thousand nine hundred and fifteen the Country Roads Board incorporated under the *Country Roads Act 1912* (Act No. 2415) being of opinion that the highways within the State of Victoria set out or described in the Schedule to the same are of sufficient importance to be main roads and acting under the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the said Act declared such highways to be main roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the Act aforesaid. And whereas the said Act among other things provides that the Governor in Council might by Order published in the *Government Gazette* confirm such Resolution whereupon any road mentioned in such Resolution should be a main road. And whereas it is deemed desirable to confirm the Resolution so made and passed by the said Country Roads Board. Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the same doth hereby confirm such Resolution and declare upon the publication of this Order in the *Government Gazette* the roads mentioned in the Schedule to such Resolution of the Country Roads Board to be main roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the *Country Roads Act 1912*.

REGULATIONS UNDER SECTION 51 OF THE
GAOLS ACT 1890 FOR THE TREATMENT, DUR-
ING THE PENDENCY OF HIS APPEAL, OF
APPELLANTS UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF
THE CRIMINAL APPEAL ACT 1914.

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne,
the fourteenth day of April, 1915.*

PRESENT:

AN appellant shall be subject to the general rules and regulations applicable to convicted prisoners, except so far as they are inconsistent with these special regulations relating to appellants.

2. An appellant shall, as far as possible, be kept apart from other prisoners.

3. An appellant shall not be subjected to the terms of separate confinement provided for in the general regulations for first convicted prisoners, for prisoners in the first class under the mark system, and for prisoners not under the mark system.

4. Pending the determination of his appeal an appellant shall not be photographed or have his finger prints taken except for the purposes of identification.

5. An appellant shall not be subject to be shaved or to have his hair cut unless by his own desire, or unless the Medical Officer deems it necessary on the grounds of health and cleanliness, or it be needful for purposes of identification.

6. Due facilities shall be allowed the appellant for preparing his appeal, and he shall be supplied with paper and writing material for the purpose. He shall be afforded the same facilities for consulting his legal adviser as are allowed under the general prison regulations to prisoners awaiting trial.

7. Relatives or friends with whom the appellant desires to communicate regarding his appeal shall be allowed access to him at proper times and under proper restrictions at the discretion of the gaoler; but such visits shall be limited solely to purposes relating to the preparation of his appeal. Other special visits shall be allowed only on the authority of the Inspector-General.

8. Every written communication from or to the appellant shall be perused by the Officer in Charge, who may withhold the same at his discretion; but shall submit any so withheld for the decision of the Inspector-General.

9. An appellant who, when in custody, is to be brought to any place at which he is entitled to be present for the purposes of the *Criminal Appeal Act 1914*, shall, while absent from the prison, be in the legal custody of the officer or officers directed by the Officer in Charge of the prison to convey him to that place.

10. An appellant when absent from the prison under the foregoing rule shall wear his own clothing.

11. Where the Attorney-General refers the case of a prisoner to the Full Court in terms of section 19 of the *Criminal Appeal Act 1914*, such prisoner shall not be treated under these special regulations unless the Attorney-General so directs.

12. An appellant who abandons an appeal, or intimates that he does not desire to proceed further in connexion with such appeal, or who, after leave to appeal has been refused by a Judge of the Supreme Court, intimates in writing that he does not wish his appeal determined by the Full Court, will be treated in accordance with the general rules and regulations according to classification, and the sentence shall be resumed from the date of such abandonment or intimation.

Provided that any period prior to the date of such abandonment or intimation, during which the appellant was not specially treated as an appellant, shall count as part of the sentence served, subject to any directions which the Court may give to the contrary.

13. Where an appellant's case is determined by the Full Court and such appeal is dismissed or the sentence varied, the sentence shall, subject to any directions

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which the Court may give, be deemed to be resumed or to begin to run, as the case requires, if the appellant is in custody, as from the day on which the appeal is determined, and if he is not in custody, as from the day on which he is received into prison under the sentence.

BY-LAW No. 34.

A By-law of the city of Caulfield, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 34, for regulating traffic along the roads and streets of the city; for regulating or prohibiting the writing, painting, printing, stencilling, placing, or affixing of any letter, figure, device, poster, sign, or advertisement upon any footpath, street or road; for suppressing nuisances; and generally for maintaining the good rule and government of the municipality.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Caulfield order as follows:—

1. In this By-law "vehicle" shall mean and include a bicycle, tricycle, velocipede, motor cycle, motor bus, motor car, cab, carriage, cart, dray, waggon, lorry, or any vehicle of whatsoever kind.

2. Every person driving, riding, or impelling a vehicle, or in charge of a vehicle, standing on any street or roadway within the city of Caulfield during the hours between sunset on any day and sunrise of the following day shall have a good serviceable lamp securely attached to such vehicle, and kept lighted and so constructed and fixed that the light therefrom shall be distinctly visible at the front of such vehicle, and exhibit an adequate light in the direction in which such person is facing, and also that a light therefrom shall be distinctly visible at the rear of such vehicle.

3. Every person driving, riding, or impelling a motor cycle, motor car, motor lorry, motor bus, or any other vehicle impelled by mechanical power, shall within a reasonable distance from and before passing any person or any tram car or vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, give audible and sufficient warning of the approach of such motor cycle, motor car, motor lorry, motor bus, or other vehicle impelled by mechanical power by sounding a bell or horn or other suitable mechanical appliance.

4. No person shall drive, ride, or impel any bicycle, tricycle, velocipede, motor cycle, or motor car upon any footway made or set apart for the use of foot passengers; provided, however, that such bicycle, tricycle, velocipede, motor cycle, and motor car may be taken across any footway direct to or from any premises abutting thereon.

5. No person shall drive, ride, or impel any bicycle, tricycle, velocipede, motor cycle, or motor car along or across any street or public thoroughfare furiously or negligently or at such a rate of speed as to endanger the safety of or injure any person, vehicle, or property in the street or thoroughfare along or across which such bicycle, tricycle, velocipede, motor cycle, or motor car is being driven, ridden, or impelled.

6. (a) Every person driving any animal or vehicle whatever, or riding or leading any animal, shall keep to the left or near side of the carriage-way of the street or road, and when passing any other vehicle or animal going in the same direction shall go or pass on the right or off side of such other vehicle or animal, and shall allow any person desirous so to do to pass on the right or off-side.

(b) No person shall drive, ride, or impel any vehicle or ride any animal on the right-hand or wrong side of the road without justifiable cause, and every person driving, riding, or impelling any vehicle, or riding or leading any animal, shall keep as near as practicable to the footpath on his left side, so as to permit other persons going in the same direction to pass freely on the right-hand or off side.

7. No person shall leave any cart or other vehicle in or on any street without any horse or other animal being harnessed thereto unless in consequence of some accident having occurred for which he is not responsible.

8. No driver of a vehicle shall be away from his horse or cattle so as to be unable to have full control of it or them unless one of the wheels of such vehicle be securely fastened by a chain or strap so as to effectually prevent the rotation thereof.

9. No person shall, without the previous consent of the Council in writing, write, paint, print, stencil, place, or affix any letter, figure, device, poster, sign, or advertisement upon any footpath, street, or road within the city, or upon any building, fence, or other property vested in the municipality or under the control and management of the Council.

10. (a) No person shall sweep or otherwise remove from any shop, house, or vehicle over or into any street any dust, waste paper, shavings, or other refuse, or being a hawker of rabbits, fish, fruit, or vegetables, or a news vendor or other street trader, or any other person not being a street trader, throw down and leave in any street any offal, skins, waste paper, shavings, feathers, or other refuse.

(b) No person shall throw down and leave in any street any bill, placard, or other substance intended, or apparently intended, for the purpose of advertising.

(c) No person shall throw down or leave in any street any bill, placard, or other paper which shall have been torn off or removed from any bill-posting station.

11. No person shall sweep the footpath in front of his premises between the hours of 8 a.m. and 9 p.m.

12. No person shall, without the consent of the Council, sound or play upon any musical or noisy instrument, ring any bell, cry any goods, bawl, or sing in any street or road within fifty yards of any dwelling-house or place of business after being required by any inmate or occupier of any house, or by any member of the police force, to desist.

13. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the city of Caulfield.

14. Every person who shall by any wilful act or default offend against any of the provisions of this By-law shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty of not less than 5s. and not more than £5.

“This bag contains not less than _____ lbs. net weight of charcoal.”

3. Any person selling, or keeping or exposing charcoal for sale in any quantity otherwise than in one or more tons, hundredweights, or quarters, or all or some of them, or in any manner contrary to the provisions of this By-law, shall be liable in each case to a penalty of Forty shillings.
