ROYAL COMMISSION TO INQUIRE INTO AND REPORT AS TO THE EXPEDIENCY OF CONSTRUCTING THE FOLLOWING NEW SOUTH WALES AND VICTORIA BORDER RAILWAYS.

to be a Royal Commission to inquire into and report as to the question of the expediency of the construction of the following lines of railway, namely:—

1. A railway from Yelta, in the State of Victoria, to Wentworth, in the State of New South Wales, and thence northerly for a distance of about 40 miles in the State of New South Wales;

2. A railway from Manangatang, in the State of Victoria, to Euston, or alternatively, Meilman, in the State of New South Wales, and thence northerly for a distance of about 40 miles in the State of New South Wales;

3. A railway from Moulamein, in the State of New South Wales, to a point on the Echuca, Moama, and Deniliquin railway, at or about Moama, in the same State;

4. A railway from Balranald, in the State of New South Wales, to some point on the railway system in the State of Victoria, between Echuca and Piangil, or to some point between Piangil and Narrung, on a proposed extension of the Swan Hill to Piangil railway, in the same State;

5. A railway in the State of Victoria, starting from a point on the existing railways between Rutherglen and Barnawartha, and crossing the Murray River into the State of New South Wales, to the township of Howlong, together with a cross line through either Brocksby or Burrumbuttock, to the terminal point at Howlong, in the State of New South Wales; and

6. An extension on uniform gauge of the existing railway from Culcairn to Corowa, in the State of New South Wales to Williamstown, on Port Phillip, in the State of Victoria.

And to also inquire into and report concerning the matter as to which of the four first-mentioned lines of railway, and numbered respectively 1, 2, 3, and 4, above, but not exceeding three, it is most advantageous to construct in the interests of the two States.

And His Excellency has, by the same Order, further directed that Samuel Barnes, Esquire, M.L.A., Victoria, shall be the President of the said Commission.

## IN THE SUPREME COURT.—RULES OF COURT UNDER PART V. OF THE CRIMES ACT 1915.

EVERY gaoler having at the time of conviction the custody of any person convicted on indictment shall forthwith inform such person that he has the right to appeal to the Full Court on any ground of appeal which involves a question of law alone and that if such person wishes to appeal on any other ground he may do so provided that he obtains the leave of the Full Court or a certificate from the Judge or Chairman of General Sessions before whom he was tried and also that if he desires to appeal or to obtain leave of the Full Court he should give notice of his application within ten days of the date of conviction and that any such certificate must be obtained within the said ten days and before giving such notice.

2. Such gaoler shall also inform such person that he may be present if he desires it on the hearing of his appeal except where the appeal is on some ground involving a question of law alone and whenever any such person so desires to be present at the hearing of the appeal any gaoler in whose custody such person then is shall inform the Prothonotary of such desire who shall thereupon obtain the necessary order.

3. Every gaoler in whose custody any appellant may be shall furnish to such appellant on request forms of notice and shall also inform such appellant that he may present his case and his argument in writing instead of by oral argument if he so desires.

## Education Act 1890

## REGULATIONS RESCINDED AND REGULATION SUBSTITUTED.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fifth day of October, 1915.

## PRESENT:

WHEREAS by section 23 of the Education Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1086), it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind Regulation XIII.—School Hours and Time-table—of the Regulations under the Education Act 1890, and make the following in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

## REGULATION XIII.

## A.—Organization, School Hours and Time-table.

1. (a) Subject to the provisions of the Education Act 1890, the hours of instruction to be observed in each State school shall, unless otherwise directed, be as follow:—

Morning Meeting.—9.15 to 9.20—assemble and inspection.

9.20 to 12.15—instruction (including physical exercises).

Afternoon Meeting.—1.40 to 1.45—assemble.  
1.45 to 4—instruction.

(b) In schools with an average attendance of less than 150 pupils, the afternoon instruction may, subject to the approval of the Director, be given from 1.15 to 3.30.

(c) Provision should be made during the morning meeting for a recess of ten minutes for the elder children, and fifteen minutes for the infants. During the afternoon meeting a short recess should be given.

2. On days on which religious instruction in any school is given before the morning meeting, the school will assemble at the expiration of the time approved for religious instruction.

3. Independently of the provisions of clause 1. all teachers are required to be on duty not later than 9 a.m. Head teachers may assign school duties to members of their staffs to be performed between the hours of 9 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. on school days. Nothing herein contained shall entitle any teacher to take his departure before 4 p.m. on any day, or at 4.30 p.m. in case of special stress or emergency.

4. On days of heavy rain, the midday recess may, at the discretion of the head teacher, be taken from 12.15 p.m. to 12.45 p.m., and the afternoon meeting from 12.45 p.m. to 3 p.m. Whenever this is done (and it should rarely be necessary) the times of opening and closing the afternoon school meeting must be specially noted in the Teachers' Time Book.

5. The conduct of pupils in the playground must be carefully supervised by teachers, and the head teacher will be held responsible for making and carrying out the necessary arrangements for such supervision. A teacher in sole charge of a school will keep the pupils under supervision during the midday recess.

6. The time-table must be kept hung in a conspicuous place in the school-room, and shall set forth the hours of opening and closing school, the employment of the several grades at any time, the teachers thereof in charge respectively, the time set apart for the instruction of the junior teachers, and the arrangements made for the supervision of children in the playground.

7. The time-table should be so arranged that female teachers and junior teachers may not be required to stand continuously for a longer period than one hour and a half.

## B.—Duties of Head Teachers and Assistants.

1. The head teacher shall be responsible for the whole of the work of his school and for compliance with the regulations, but the district inspector, in reporting on the school, will take into consideration any adverse circumstances affecting the work.

2. In every school in which the head teacher has not the direct charge of one or more grades, he shall, by class teaching, by observance of lessons, by systematic supervision and by frequent conferences with members of his staff, endeavour to unify and stimulate the whole of the work in the school. In all such cases the head teacher will keep a diary of his work.

3. In all schools where there are one or more assistants and more than one junior teacher, the head teacher should divide the school into departments.

4. In charge of each department he should place an assistant, to whom he should allot a staff, one or more members of which should be a junior teacher. Except in cases sanctioned by the Director, the teachers placed in charge of departments should be the senior assistants of the school. The senior male assistant should, as a rule, be placed in charge of the supplementary classes, and the senior female assistant in charge of the junior department.

5. Under the general direction of the head teacher the duties of each assistant in charge of a department will be:—(1) to confer regularly with the members of his staff; (2) to guide them in planning their lessons and in preparing their work programs; (3) to give the members of his staff such supervision and direct aid as the circumstances of the school will permit; (4) to assist in training in the art of teaching the junior teachers in his department; and (5) to undertake the keeping of records and the preparation of returns for his department.

And the Honorable T. Livingston, His Majesty's Minister of Public Instruction for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

**REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION,  
AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR  
PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF  
CARDIGAN KNOWN AS THE GOLF LINKS.**

THE Council of the City of Ballarat and the Council of the Shire of Ballarat, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the reserve for Public Recreation in the parish of Cardigan known as the Golf Links having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915* :—

**REGULATIONS.**

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling shall be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who shall offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, putting greens, teeing grounds, hedges, bunkers, boxes, or other fixtures, or fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

**REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION,  
AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A  
CHILDREN'S PLAYGROUND IN THE CITY OF  
COLLINGWOOD, KNOWN AS THE CORNFOT  
CHILDREN'S PLAYGROUND.**

WE, William Hardinge Gregson, William Fleming Gates, Herbert Brookes, Alice Baker, James Cornfoot, Patrick John McNamara, and Arthur Collins, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 16th November, 1914, as a site for a Children's Playground in the city of Collingwood, known as the Cornfoot Children's Playground, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915* :—

**REGULATIONS.**

1. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

2. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve; nor shall fires be lighted therein.

3. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any trees or any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or other property in the Reserve; nor leave therein any glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones in the Reserve.

4. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, or other animals.

5. No person shall put into the Reserve any dog; and any dog found in the Reserve shall be liable to be destroyed.

6. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, nor suffer nor offer for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall play on any instrument or perform in any band of music, or take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or in any structure or erection in the Reserve.

9. No person shall in the Reserve interfere with the Supervisor, who may be duly appointed by the Committee of Management, for the control of games and exercises therein; nor shall any person interfere with any games or exercises organized by such Supervisor in the Reserve.

10. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

TENDERS will be received on or before Tuesday, 26th October, 1915, for the right to depasture stock on the following unappropriated portions of land subject to the Regulations approved by the Governor in Council and also the subjoined Special Conditions.

Every licence granted under section 187 of the Land Act 1901 shall be subject to the conditions set forth in the schedule hereto and to such special conditions and payment in advance of such fee as the Minister may determine, and shall be issued by an officer of the Department of Lands and Survey duly authorized in that behalf.

## Conditions.

1. The issue of this licence shall not prevent the land comprised therein, or any part or parts thereof, being sold, leased, licensed, alienated, or dealt with under any of the provisions of the Land Acts, except under the 187th section of the Land Act 1901, or being resumed by order of the Governor or Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, for any of the purposes for which land may be reserved under section 10 of the Land Act 1901, or for mining purposes.

2. 3. This licence is subject to the rights of the holders of miners' rights or of mining leases now issued or hereafter to be issued to enter upon the allotment hereby licensed, and to search for gold, and to mine thereon, and to erect and occupy mining plant and machinery, without making any compensation to the licensee, his executors, administrators, or assigns, for surface or other damage.

4. Subject to these conditions, the licensee shall be entitled to use the land for the purpose for which this licence has been granted, until such land, or any part thereof, has been sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid, and thereupon all the interest of the licensee therein shall cease and be determined.

5. No land comprised in roads from time to time surveyed and marked out within the boundaries of the land comprised in this licence shall be deemed within its operation.

6. This licence shall entitle the holder thereof, during the period for which it is granted, to use the land therein comprised for depasturing purposes only, but shall not confer any right to build thereon, or to cultivate or, without the permission of the Minister, fence any portion thereof, or construct a dam or tank.

8. That in the event of the Minister granting permission to fence the whole or any part of this area, the licensee shall provide gates or slip panels in suitable places for the convenience of the public.
