



SHIRE OF WINCHELSEA.

BY-LAW No. 21.

A By-law to prevent pollution of certain rivers or streams within the Shire.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution, the Council of the Shire of Winchelsea, in the names and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers thereof, doth hereby order and enact as follows:—

1. Whosoever bathes in any of the rivers or streams mentioned in the Schedule hereto, the same being within the municipal district of the said shire, or washes, cleanses, throws, or causes to enter therein any animal, whether alive or dead, or any cloth, wool, leather, or skin of any animal or any clothes or any rubbish, filth, stuff, or thing of any kind whatsoever, or causes or permits or suffers to run or be brought therein the water of any sink, sewer, drain, engine, or boiler, or other filthy, unwholesome, or impure water, or does anything whatsoever whereby any water in the said rivers or streams is fouled, polluted, obstructed, or damaged, shall, for every such offence, be liable on conviction to a penalty of Ten pounds. Provided nevertheless that the Justices or Court before whom any complaint may be made or

proceedings taken in respect of any such offence may order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid.

BY-LAW NO. 30 (under the *Health Act* 1890).

A By-law of the City of Bendigo, made under the provisions of Sections 31, 32, 33, and 253 of the *Health Act* 1890, and numbered 30, for regulating the removal of refuse and garbage from buildings and premises, and generally for the abatement and prevention of nuisances, and for securing the healthfulness of the city and of its inhabitants.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act* 1890, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Bendigo make the following By-law:—

1. That clauses 5, 6, 7, and 8 of By-law No. 3 under the *Health Act* 1890 be and are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into force on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*, and it shall apply to and have operation within the municipal boundaries of the City of Bendigo.

3. In the construction of this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter:—

"Inspector" means the Health Inspector for the City of Bendigo, and shall include any acting or assistant inspector.

"Lands" includes yards, lanes, rights-of-way, messuages, lands, and hereditaments of every tenure, also Crown lands and streets.

"Occupier" shall include all owners or tenants of every description who occupy land or premises for the purposes of residence or business.

"Premises" shall include dwelling-houses, shops, offices, hotels, coffee palaces, refreshment rooms, cafes, warehouses, factories, work-rooms, halls, theatres, picture shows, stables, garages, and all other buildings used for the purposes of residence or business.

"Rubbish" shall include house refuse, sweepings, garbage, garden refuse, litter, trade refuse, cases, straw, packing paper, ashes, chips, cuttings, small dead animals such as cats, small dogs, and fowls, and also all waste material or refuse of any kind whatsoever.

4. The Inspector shall keep at his office, at the Town Hall, Bendigo, three patterns of receptacles for holding rubbish, each receptacle not exceeding two and one-half cubic feet in content, and corresponding with one of the following:—

5. "Pattern A" shall be rectangular in shape, having vertical corners rounded and constructed of galvanized iron of 24 gauge, coated inside with tar and pitch, strengthened round top with a wire bead or wrought-iron band 1 inch by 3-16 inch, and around bottom with a galvanized iron band 2 inches wide by 1-16 inch thick, or 1½ inches wide by ½ inch thick, to keep bottom off ground, and protected, if ordered, by a wooden batten of 2 in. x ½ in. approved hardwood, secured vertically outside at 1½ inches distant from each corner with three copper or galvanized rivets equally spaced. Such receptacle to measure internally 18 inches long, 18 inches wide, and 17 inches deep, and be fitted with handles and loose-hinged, free-fitting, perforated lid.

6. "Pattern B" shall be cylindrical in shape, of galvanized iron of 24 gauge, coated inside with tar and pitch, strengthened round top with a wrought-iron band 1 inch wide by 3-16 inch thick, and around bottom with a galvanized hoop iron band 2 inches wide by 1-16 inch thick, or 1½ inches by ½ inch thick to keep bottom— which shall be disbed—well clear of ground, and protected, if ordered, with eight vertical hardwood battens 2 inches x ½ inch secured at regular intervals round the outside with three copper or galvanized iron rivets evenly spaced, such receptacle to measure internally 16 inches in diameter and 19½ inches or 25½ inches in depth at centre, and fitted with handles and loose, free-fitting, perforated lid.

"Pattern C" shall be of stout metal, and have loose fitting perforated metal lid of approved pattern, and shall not exceed 2½ cubic feet capacity, but otherwise may be of any shape or kind approved by the Inspector as sufficient and suitable for the requirements of the premises it serves. Oil drums, carbide drums, or nail cans to be included among approved receptacles where allowed by the Inspector. Lids to conform generally to sample; pattern C lid also lodged for inspection at the Town Hall, at Inspector's Office.

7. The occupier of any land or premises within the City of Bendigo shall—

(a) Provide and keep in use as many receptacles as may, in the opinion of the Inspector, be necessary to properly contain the rubbish accumulating on such premises between each time of regular clearance by the rubbish cart provided by the Council.

(b) Cause every such receptacle, whether for rubbish removed by rubbish carts or for kitchen or other refuse removed by private persons,

to conform to either pattern "A" or pattern "B" described in this By-law, as the Inspector may, in writing, to such occupier, direct.

(c) Cause all rubbish that may accumulate on such premises to be from time to time placed in such approved receptacle as required under this By-law.

(d) Cause such receptacle to be constantly kept covered with the proper lid, except at such times as the same may be or shall be opened for the deposit therein of refuse as aforesaid.

(e) Upon the day or days upon which collection is usually made place such receptacle within ten feet of, but inside, the gate adjoining the street or right-of-way from which the collection is usually made by the rubbish cart provided by the Council, except as otherwise specially allowed by the Inspector.

(f) He shall not place any receptacle for rubbish outside the premises of such occupier, or upon any street, lane, or public thoroughfare within the city.

(g) He shall immediately after such receptacle has been emptied into the rubbish cart, cleanse the same, and, if required by the Inspector, disinfect the same.

(h) He shall, if ordered by the Inspector, keep coated with a tar composition such receptacle.

(i) He shall, if ordered by the Inspector, at least once in every twelve months re-tar each such receptacle.

(j) He shall keep clean every such receptacle, and maintain it in good order, repair, and condition to the satisfaction of the Inspector.

(k) He shall, upon notice from the Inspector, replace or repair such receptacle to the satisfaction of the Inspector, or the Inspector may, if he thinks fit, cause it to be taken away by the rubbish cart.

8. The Inspector may, in his discretion, modify the patterns hereinbefore referred to, and allow some other stout metal receptacle of such type, shape, or construction as he may, in writing, from time to time permit as suitable and sufficient for the requirements of the particular tenement and locality.

Such modified receptacle may be, in his discretion, an oil drum, nail can, carbide drum, or other similar approved stout metal receptacle free from any internal projections and from rough or jagged edges, and provided with approved handles and loose-fitting, perforated lid.

9. Except in special cases approved of by the Inspector, all rubbish from land or premises within the city shall be placed for removal in approved receptacles, otherwise the Council, by its officers and servants, will not remove the same, and such rubbish shall then be at the risk of the occupier.

10. The foregoing clauses of this By-law shall be limited, and apply only to that particular area or those streets within the city to or from which there may from time to time be a rubbish cart service provided by the said Council, and to all premises outside such area or streets, and within the city from which kitchen refuse may be collected by private individuals.

11. No person shall place or deposit, or cause to be placed or deposited, on any street, lane, lease, reserve, vacant allotment, right-of-way or Crown or freehold lands any rubbish.

12. The Council will provide rubbish depôts or tips, and indicate them by sign-posts or notices to that effect, and any person depositing rubbish thereon shall deposit the same in the lower portions thereof and duly level the same.

13. Any person depositing rubbish consisting of papers or other light material liable to be distributed by wind shall at once cover the same when tipped with sufficient earth or clean, heavy material to prevent such distribution.

14. Every person depositing rubbish that is offensive by smell or liable to become so, shall at once cover the same with fresh unslacked lime, and then with clean earth or soil at least 18 inches deep.

15. The occupier of any premises used for trade or business within the city shall—

(a) Not suffer or allow the accumulation of waste material, such as cases, straw, packing paper, ashes, chips, cuttings, and other material of a like nature on or about such premises or on any land adjacent thereto after having received 48 hours' notice from the Inspector to remove same.

(b) Dispose of the same at a prescribed rubbish tip in the manner hereinbefore required.

(c) Cause all offensive matter or matter likely to become offensive to be completely covered thereat with fresh unslacked lime, and then with at least 18 inches of good clean soil or earth.

- (d) Cause all sweepings from shops and business premises and from footways in front thereof to be placed in a receptacle for removal by rubbish carts.

- (e) Shall not deposit or cause or suffer to be deposited such sweepings in street channels.

16. The Council rubbish carts will collect all dead domestic animals, such as cats, small dogs, fowls, &c., household and kitchen refuse, yard sweepings, and sweepings from business premises, and rights-of-way, but only if placed in proper receptacles in proper positions for collection, as prescribed under this By-law.

17. The Council may, at its option, specially remove rubbish from any premises not supplied with a rubbish-cart service, or rubbish from trade or business premises as in section 15, and charge the cost of such removal to the occupier thereof, and recover the same in the Court of Petty Sessions at Bendigo.

18. Every such occupier or person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, on conviction, forfeit a sum not exceeding £10 for every breach thereof, or not exceeding £5 for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, but the Justices before whom any such penalty is sought to be recovered shall order the whole or part only (not being less than 5s.) of such penalty to be paid.

WAHGUNYAH WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW, No. 1.

Standing Orders.

For regulating and appointing the place and hour of Meetings of the "Wahgunyah Waterworks Trust," and providing for the Management and Conduct of Business thereat.

WHEREAS by the Water Acts power is given to any Authority (subject to the approval of the Governor in Council) from time to time to make, amend, and repeal By-laws relating (*inter alia*) to the appointment of the place and hour of meetings, whether periodical or special, and providing for the due management and conduct of business thereat: Be it therefore ordered and directed (subject as aforesaid) by the Commissioners of the Wahgunyah Waterworks Trust, such Trust being an authority under the said Acts, as follows, viz.:—

1. In all cases not provided for by Acts of Parliament of Victoria relating to Authorities, or by this By-law, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of the Parliament of Victoria, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Trust.

2. *Place, Hour, and Adjournment of Meetings.*—Meetings of the Trust shall be held periodically at the offices of the Trust on the second Wednesday in the month, to date from 13th May, 1914, at the hour of Three o'clock p.m., and the Commissioners thereof may from time to time by adjournment from any such meeting, or from any subsequent adjournment thereof, meet together at any convenient place, and at such hour to be from time to time appointed by them for that purpose.

3. *Meetings, Special.*—A special meeting of the Commissioners may at any time be called by the Chairman or by the Minister, and shall be called by the Chairman if so requested, in writing, under the hands of any two Commissioners. No special meeting shall be held unless four clear days' notice thereof at least be given to each Commissioner. Such notice shall be in writing, and shall specify the time of the meeting and the object thereof, and shall be delivered or sent through the post office or otherwise to the place of abode or the usual place of business (if any) within the Waterworks District of each Commissioner. No business shall be transacted at any special meeting except what is stated in the notice thereof.

4. *Powers Vested in Commissioners.*—All powers vested in a Waterworks Trust may be exercised by a Waterworks Trust at any meeting held in pursuance of the Water Acts at which there is a quorum of the Commissioners present, but not otherwise.

5. *Quorum.*—A quorum of the Commissioners shall consist of one-half of the whole number of Commissioners. If there is not a quorum of Commissioners present within a quarter of an hour after the time appointed for any meeting, the Commissioners present, or the major part of them, or any one Commissioner, if there is only one present, may adjourn the meeting until another hour or another day; if no Commissioner is present the Secretary may so adjourn the meeting. Except where a meeting is so adjourned to a subsequent hour of the same day the Secretary shall forthwith deliver or send through the post office to each Commissioner notice, in writing, of the time to which the meeting has been adjourned.

6. *Who is to Preside at Meetings.*—At any meeting of the Commissioners, the Chairman, if present, shall preside, and if the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding of meeting, the Commissioners present shall choose some one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

7. *Majority to Decide.*—All questions at any meeting of the Commissioners shall be decided by a majority of the votes of the Commissioners present, and in case of an equal division of votes, the Chairman shall have a second or casting vote.

8. *Meetings, Notice of.*—A notice of every regular meeting of the Commissioners shall be by the Trust Secretary, delivered or sent by post, addressed to the usual or last-known place of abode of each Commissioner, three clear days at least prior to the day upon which such intended meeting is to be held, except in cases of emergency, when a special meeting may be called as hereinbefore provided.

9. *Meetings, Resolutions at, not to be Revoked.*—No resolution at any meeting of the Commissioners shall be revoked or altered at any subsequent meeting unless notice of the intention to propose such revocation or alteration be given by the Trust Secretary to each of the Commissioners seven days at least before holding the meeting, nor unless such revocation or alteration

be determined upon by a majority consisting of two-thirds of the Commissioners present at such subsequent meeting; if the number of Commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be not greater than the number present when such resolution was come to, or by a majority if the number of Commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be greater than the number present at such former meeting.

10. *Business, &c., Order of—Minutes.*—At every meeting of the Commissioners the first business thereof shall be the reading; and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; and the said minutes of the proceedings at the previous meeting shall then be signed by the Chairman of such meeting; and the rough minutes of the proceedings of the Commissioners at any meeting shall be read at the close of such meeting, if required by any Commissioner present at such meeting.

11. After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the Commissioners at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (1) Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the Commissioners, if called for.
- (2) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (3) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (4) Receiving deputations from the ratepayers.
- (5) Presentations of reports of committees and officers.
- (6) Payments.
- (7) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings, and any business the Chairman may think desirable.
- (8) Other motions of which previous notice had been given.
- (9) Notices of motion and the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

12. *Titles, Official.*—The Commissioners, in meeting, shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of Chairman, or Commissioner, as the case may require.

13. *Who to Speak.*—If two or more Commissioners rise to speak at the same time, the Chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

14. *Chairman to Rise when Addressing Meeting.*—The Chairman shall rise in addressing the Commissioners to discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions.

15. *Commissioners not to Speak Twice on Same Question.*—No Commissioner shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in explanation, when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

16. *Points of Order.*—The Chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting on the same; and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

17. *Commissioners not to Digress or Impute Improper Motives.*—No Commissioner shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other Commissioner in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives, and all personal reflections on Commissioners shall be deemed disorderly; and every Commissioner so doing shall, upon being called to order by the Chairman, apologize for such conduct, and withdraw such imputations or reflections, as the case may be.

18. A Commissioner called to order shall sit down, unless permitted to explain.

19. *Persons not Commissioners to Leave when Requested.*—No person not being a Commissioner who, having been admitted to any meeting of the Commissioners, shall be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, and every such person shall leave such meeting when requested by the Chairman to do so.

20. *Call of the Commissioners.*—No Commissioner shall absent himself from any meeting held in compliance with an order for a call of the whole Commissioners without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof.

21. *Documents to be Produced.*—Any Commissioner may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the Commissioners applying to the question under discussion.

22. *Motions, Amendments, and Notice thereof.*—All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered, and given by the intending mover to the Trust Secretary at the close of the meeting of the Commissioners, or, if not given at a meeting, then four clear days prior to the day upon which the next meeting of Commissioners is to take place; and the Secretary shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received.

23. *No Motion without Notice.*—No member shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion but in pursuance of notice given as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

24. *Motions on Petitions, &c.*—No motion, except that for receiving the same, shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application, until the next ordinary meeting of Commissioners after that at which it has been presented.

25. *Motions to be Moved in Order.*—Except by leave of the Commissioners, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the Trust Secretary in the notice of motion book, and if not so moved or postponed, shall be struck out.

26. *Motions not to be Proceeded with in Absence of Mover.*—No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the Commissioner who gave notice of the same, unless by some other Commissioner producing written authority from him to that effect.

27. No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall, at some previous meeting, have submitted a draft of the same.

28. *Mover of Motion or Amendment not to be Interrupted.*—Any Commissioner desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the Chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the Commissioner calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question or other matter disposed of, when the Commissioner in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

29. *Nature of Motion to be Stated.*—Any Commissioner desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Commissioners thereon.

30. *Leave to be Obtained before Motion withdrawn.*—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the Commissioners.

31. *Motions to be Seconded Prior to Discussion.*—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Commissioners unless it be seconded; but a Commissioner may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Commissioners by directing the Chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

32. *Mover and not the Seconder held to have Spoken.*—A Commissioner moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon; but a Commissioner merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

33. *Motions to be in Writing.*—At every meeting of the Commissioners, all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall, if required by the Chairman, be reduced to writing, signed by the mover, and be delivered to the Chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.

34. *Amendments re Motion in Writing.*—No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

35. *Amendment to become the Question.*—If an amendment be carried, the question or amendment as amended shall become itself the question, whereupon any further amendment upon any portion of the question coming after such first mentioned amendment may be moved.

36. *Second Amendment may be Moved.*—If an amendment be negatived, then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted to the Commissioners for discussion at a time.

37. *Right of Mover to Reply.*—The mover of every original proposition, but of no amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair, but no Commissioner shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

38. *Adjournment, Motion for.*—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the Commissioners, but if on the subject being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or

the next on the notice-paper, shall be discussed, or any other than may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

39. *Protest, Commissioners may.*—Any Commissioner may protest against any resolution of the Commissioners, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Commissioners by the protesting Commissioner, in a book to be kept for that purpose in the Trust Secretary's office, and signed by such Commissioner, and shall also be entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Commissioners to be not in accordance with truth or in its terms disrespectful to the Commissioners.

40. *Legal Questions.*—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of Commissioners present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted on motion upon notice.

41. *Order of the Day to be Restored.*—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice book for a future day, on motion upon notice; and then such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

42. *Voting.*—Whenever a division shall be demanded by any Commissioner, those voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the Chairman. The Chairman shall have a deliberative vote and a casting vote, and every Commissioner present shall vote except he be disabled by law from so doing.

43. *Questions to be Put.*—The Chairman shall, in taking the sense of the Commissioners, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

44. *Contents of Petitions.*—It shall be incumbent on every Commissioner presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Commissioners, and that the contents do not violate any By-law or any provision hereof.

45. *Name at beginning of Petition.*—Every Commissioner presenting a petition to the Commissioners shall write his name at the beginning thereof.

46. *Petitions to be in Writing.*—Every petition shall be in writing, and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioner at the end thereof, and shall be signed by at least one person on every skin or sheet on which it is written.

47. *How Signed.*—Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto, by their names or marks, and by no one else, except in cases of incapacity by sickness.

48. *No Letters, &c., to be Attached.*—No letters, affidavits, or other documents shall be attached to any petition.

49. *Presentation of Petition.*—Every Commissioner presenting a petition to the Commissioners shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

50. *Deputations.*—Deputations from the ratepayers wishing to be heard before the Commissioners in support of any petition or otherwise must send in an application, in writing, to the Trust Secretary the day before the meeting of the Commissioners at which such petition is intended to be presented.

51. *Correspondence Committee.*—There shall be two permanent Committees of the Commissioners, one to be called the Works Committee, and the other the Finance and Correspondence Committee. Each Committee shall consist of four Commissioners, three to form a quorum. The Chairman shall be a member of all Committees.

52. *Minutes of Committee.*—Minutes of all proceedings of Committees, as well as of their reports, numbered in consecutive order, shall be entered in the Committees' minute book, and being signed by the Chairman, shall be presented to the Commissioners; and the Trust Secretary, when practicable, shall attend all meetings of the Committees.

53. *Committees to be Convened.*—The Trust Secretary shall convene every Committee at any time by order of the Commissioners, or on the written order of the Chairman, or of any two members of a Committee.

54. *Cheques to be Signed.*—That all cheques shall be signed by two Commissioners, and countersigned by the Secretary.

55. *Appointment to Permanent Office.*—No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the Commissioners shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the town of Wahgunyah inviting application from qualified candidates for the same.

56. *Salaries to be Fixed.*—The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the Commissioners shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same.

57. *Commissioner, &c., not to be Surety.*—No Commissioner or officer of the Commissioners, and no assessor or auditor shall be received as a surety for any officer appointed by the Commissioners, or for any work to be done for the Commissioners.

58. *Contracts.*—In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any contract, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the person providing the same.

59. *Plans, &c.*—All the plans and specifications for any public work shall be laid before the Commissioners at least six days prior to the same being considered and ordered upon, and be open for inspection by any Commissioner during that time except in case of emergency.

60. *Secretary to Expend Moneys.*—It shall be lawful for the Trust Secretary and a member of the Finance Committee from time to time, on the written order of the Chairman, to disburse such moneys as shall have been appropriated by the Commissioners for the purposes of this clause, and as shall be required for any necessary occasion, not exceeding in the whole in an interval between two ordinary meetings of the Commissioners the sum of Ten pounds.

61. *Common Seal.*—The common seal of the Trust shall be kept in a box having two locks, of one of which locks the Chairman shall keep the key, and of the other of which locks the key shall be kept by the Trust Secretary, and the corporate seal shall not be affixed to any document unless the Chairman and one other member of the Commissioners, or, in the absence of the Chairman, unless two Commissioners be present.

62. *Addresses to the Governor, &c.*—All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the Chairman and Trust Secretary, unless otherwise ordered by the Commissioners.

63. *Suspension of Regulations.*—Any one or more of the rules and provisions herein contained may be suspended for a special purpose on motion upon notice being given, and shall not otherwise be suspended unless by a unanimous vote of the Commissioners.

64. *Penalty.*—Every person who shall offend against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each such offence.

WAHGUNYAH WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW NO. 2.

THE Commissioners of the Wahgunyah Waterworks Trust do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Water Act 1905*, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following By-laws:—

1. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from the premises to which it is supplied, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

2. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust who shall take or carry away water from any stand-pipe, hydrant, or any public or private service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

3. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be

made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for that purpose; and any person committing a breach of this By-law shall be liable for a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

4. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers shall in no case exceed the following diameters:—For the domestic supply of premises, three-quarters inch ($\frac{3}{4}$ inch); for the supply of water for other than domestic purposes and for all supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case, except when special agreement is made.

5. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water for any livery stables or carriers' stables or manufacturing purposes or irrigation purposes.

6. No person shall apply a hose or pipe to any pipe or tap for the purpose of watering, nor shall any such person water by means of such hose or pipe the ground, trees, plants, or shrubs, or wash any house, walls, or carriage, or use such hose or pipe for any similar purpose unless the water is charged for by meter; and any person committing a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach. To be enforced in case of shortage of water after notice is given.

7. Before any person shall affix any service-pipes to any pipes of the Trust, or alter or repair or in any manner interfere with any pipes or service-pipes, cocks, or fittings connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such work; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, or repairing in any manner, interfering with such pipes, service-pipes, cocks, or fittings as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

8. Before any such licence is granted by the Trust, the person applying shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent person. The Trust shall have the power of cancelling such licence at any time.

9. The quality of material required in laying private services shall be as follows:—

(1) The whole of the pipes, tees, thimbles (excepting those connecting the service-pipes and mains), bends, reducing couplings, plugs, &c., to be of the best galvanized iron.

(2) All pipes and pieces to be true in sectional form, straight longitudinally, and of equal strength and thickness throughout the entire body of same.

(3) All ends of pipes, bends, &c., to be properly and truly threaded and capable of being screwed into thimbles, tees, &c.

(4) The whole of the pipes, tees, bends, &c., to be sound and free from all defects, and capable of hydrostatic pressure equal to a column of water 400 feet.

(5) All delivery cocks and thimbles for connecting the service-pipes and mains to be high pressure, and made of brass of the best quality and workmanship, and of approved pattern, to screw into elbows, bends, &c. All cocks and thimbles to stand the same pressure as the pipes.

(6) No service-pipes shall be laid at a depth below the surface of the ground less than twelve inches on public property and six inches on private property.

10. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by a duly authorized officer of the Trust; each meter must be capable of registering at least one million (1,000,000) gallons.

11. Meters affixed to services shall not be removed or interfered with except upon written application to and with the approval of the Trust. Any person offending against this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

12. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

13. No person shall, without the written permission of the Trust, water streets or thoroughfares by means of a hydrant and hose attached to fire plugs. Any person offending against this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

14. The fire plugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires, unless any other use of them is allowed in writing by the Trust, and they shall at all times be under the control of the officers of the Trust.

15. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of premises, or of any land or tenements, who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied for the provision and laying on of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust, to the boundaries of such land, premises, or tenements abutting on the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

16. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste. Any person committing a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

17. Any person wilfully or carelessly breaking, injuring, or opening any lock, valve, pipe, or other work belonging to the Trust, or turning any tap, or carelessly or wilfully doing any other act whereby the water of the Trust may be wasted, or who carelessly or wilfully does any of the aforementioned acts with the intent that the water of the Trust may be wasted, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

18. The officers of the Trust shall have power at all times between the hours of Ten in the forenoon and Four in the afternoon to enter any house, building, or land through or into which water is supplied by the Trust by measure or otherwise in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for the measuring, conveyance, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, or preventing waste, and to inspect or examine if there be any waste or misuse of such water, and may from time to time enter any house, building, or land for the purpose of removing any meter, instrument, pipe, or apparatus the property of the Trust, and if any person hinder such officer from entering or making such inspection, or effecting such removal, he shall for every offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

19. The water supply in the waterworks district of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with this By-law, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with this By-law and not otherwise.

20. In the construction of these By-laws, the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation or company, whether aggregate or sole. The word "officer" shall be deemed and taken to mean any officer or servant of the Trust duly authorized in that behalf; and the word "Trust" shall be deemed to mean the Wahgunyah Waterworks Trust.

21. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter. Any person offending against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

22. Before any person licensed under clause 7 of this By-law shall break up any road or footpath for the purpose of laying on the water from the main to any house or premises, he shall deposit with the Trust the sum of £4, and in case he shall not proceed with the laying on of such water, or shall not immediately after laying on the water as aforesaid, make good and restore the said road or footpath to the satisfaction of the Trust, then the said sum of £4 shall be absolutely forfeited to the Trust, which shall be at liberty to expend the same in making good or restoring the said road or footpath or otherwise as the Trust may deem best.

23. Any person who, having been served with notice to provide a meter, shall refuse or neglect to supply such meter within one month of receiving such notice, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding two pounds for every day after the expiration of the time mentioned in the notice on which he shall refuse or neglect to comply with the terms of such notice.

24. Any person who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe, the property of the Trust, without the permission in writing of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break open or injure any lock, cock, valve, pipe-work, weir, channel, reservoir, or injure the property of the Trust, and who shall wilfully trespass on the Trust's works or property, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding £5.

RATING BY-LAW NO. 9.

THE Commissioners of the Yatchaw Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, do make the following By-law:—

A rate of Five shillings in the pound sterling on the annual value of all rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Yatchaw Waterworks Trust, according to the value for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rates of the Shire of Dundas and Mt. Rouse is hereby made for the year One thousand nine hundred and fifteen, commencing on the first day of January, One thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and ending on the thirty-first day of December, One thousand nine hundred and fifteen.

Such rate is made payable on the (29th) twenty-ninth day of March, One thousand nine hundred and fifteen.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rate.

The foregoing By-law (No. 9) was made by the Commissioners of the Yatchaw Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of the *Water Act 1905*, on the 1st day of December, One thousand nine hundred and fourteen.

CARISBROOK WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1915.

THE Commissioners of the Carisbrook Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1905*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following By-law, viz.:—

By-law No. 21.

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1915 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said Urban District:—

1. For every house or tenement above Ten pounds and not more than Fifteen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings in the pound, according to such value.

2. For every house or tenement of above Fifteen pounds and not more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.

3. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

4. For every house or tenement of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal value and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

5. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Twenty pounds municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling; over Twenty pounds municipal value, One shilling in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

6. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, a charge of Three shillings per thousand gallons shall be made; and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at the price named, would be equal to the rate payable in respect of the property so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

That the above-named rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance, first payment on the first day of January, 1915, and the second payment on the first day of July, 1915.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Carisbrook Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

DONALD WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 3.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Donald Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, and all the authorities and powers enabling them on this behalf, do make the following By-law No. 3, viz.:—

1. One service pipe will be allowed to each tenement, whether such tenement occupy one or more allotments. A tenement to consist of household dwelling, shop, office, or any building as occupied by a distinct or separate tenant.

2. Where a special service is required for any purpose, except fire, separate application must be made for the same, and such service where granted must be paid for by meter to be supplied by the applicant. If granted for special use in case of fire at any place or tenement, the water from such service pipes shall not be permitted to be used, except for that purpose only.

3. Where the service to a tenement is required each applicant, after his application has been approved of at a meeting of the Trust, must, at his own expense, tap the main, supply approved main tap and cast-iron box on the footpath, placed within 12 inches from the building line. All pipes must be laid at least 18 inches below the surface of the roadway and footpath, and also directly across the same, and must not run along the footpath. The work must be done to the satisfaction of the Trust Engineer, Inspector, or Caretaker, or such other officer as the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose.

4. All internal services to tenements must be made and maintained good and sound throughout, and the supply of water drawn must be economically used to the approval of the Trust Officer or Caretaker. Failing this being done, supply will be cut off at the main.

5. All services must be laid throughout and repaired by a plumber especially licensed by the Trust. Licences may be transferable, but only with the approval of the Trust.

6. Any person affixing any service pipe to any pipe of the Trust shall connect such by lead pipe, three (3) feet in length, with proper brass connexions, unless otherwise directed by the Engineer or Caretaker of the Trust, and before any person in any manner interferes with any service pipe, cock, or fitting up to any building line connected with the pipes of the Trust, unless otherwise directed by the Engineer or Caretaker, he shall give a clear 48 hours' written notice of his intention so to do to the Secretary of the Trust, and shall, before doing such work, obtain a licence from the Trust in that behalf to execute such work; and any person offending against this clause in any way shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five (5) pounds sterling.

7. Such plumber's licence shall be at and during the pleasure of the Trust, and the Trust may at any time cancel such licence in the event of the holder thereof being judged by the Trust to be incompetent or by himself or his employes committing any breach of the Water Acts or of this By-law or any other By-law of the Trust.

8. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust the person applying for the same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber, and shall pay in advance a licence fee of Ten (10) shillings per annum, but the Trust may, if it sees fit, refuse to grant such licence.

9. Before any plumber or firm of plumbers will be permitted to open any roadway or footway within the Trust district, he, or they, shall deposit the sum of Five (£5) pounds sterling, to be held by the Trust as a guarantee for the faithful performance of the work. In the event of the trench of any pipe track opened by him or them not being properly filled in to the satisfaction of the Shire Council, and the proper lights and barriers not being used to protect the public while such trench is open, the Trust will be at liberty to make good any damages, and deduct any expenses that it may incur from the deposit lodged on that behalf.

10. The Trust may require a meter to be fixed and used in any case where it is deemed necessary.

11. The bore of any service pipe for the supply of water from the pipes of the Trust shall not exceed the following, that is to say:—

- (a) One half inch in diameter where such service pipe is to any premises valued at the municipal valuation for rating purposes of One hundred (£100) pounds sterling and under.
- (b) Three-quarters of an inch in diameter where such service is to any premises valued as aforesaid at a sum exceeding One hundred (£100) pounds sterling, and this By-law shall

be taken as a consent of the Trust to any such service. Before any such service pipe the bore dimensions of which are contrary to this clause is laid down to any premises, the consent of the Trust must first be obtained.

12. No person shall use or permit to be used, or allow to run on any premises, any water for other than domestic, water troughs as per clause 15 of this By-law, manufacturing, or for fire extinguishing purposes between the hours of nine (9) o'clock p.m. and six (6) o'clock a.m. Any person committing a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five (£5) pounds sterling.

13. Any person who shall allow water to run to waste, or who shall use the same in any manner for irrigation purposes (except where the supply is by meter), shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five (£5) pounds sterling.

14. Any person not having agreed to be supplied with water by the Trust, who shall, or who having agreed, shall, contrary to such agreement, use, take, or carry away or wilfully permit to be used, taken, or carried away water from any drinking tap, water trough, or private or public service pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding the sum of Five (£5) sterling.

15. All water troughs must be provided with ball taps, and must be maintained in good order.

16. For every water trough in a paddock or vacant allotment not exceeding 12 feet in length supplied with water by the Trust, the sum of One pound ten shillings (£1 10s.) sterling per annum, and for every additional five (5) feet in length or fractional part thereof a further sum of Ten shillings (10s.) shall be charged.

17. For every 1,000 bricks laid in a new building or renovations to any building in existence at the time that this By-law comes into operation, and for every 100 square yards of plastering done in any building, the charge of Six (6) pence shall be made, and shall be paid at the office of the Trust before the work is undertaken and the water is supplied by the Trust.

18. No person shall use the water of the Trust, or allow any water to run, for the purpose of watering any garden, plantation, or vegetation wherever growing, or watering any land by means of any pipe or hose or other conduit otherwise in any manner whatever at any time other than between the hours of six (6) o'clock a.m. and nine (9) o'clock p.m., or unless such pipe, hose, or other conduit or other means of watering shall, while such water is being used, be personally attended by some adult person constantly present, and any person committing a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding the sum of Five (£5) pounds sterling.

19. No overflow pipe to private bath will be permitted.

20. Any person, whether licensed or not, who shall offend by opening up any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Trust, except when directed by the Trust Officer, without giving 48 hours' notice to the Trust of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe of the Trust without the permission of the Trust, in writing, first being obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, fence, wind-mill, machinery, pump, engine, tower, and building of the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty (£20) pounds sterling.

21. The Officer or Officers of the Trust, or other persons appointed for the purpose, may, at all lawful times, enter any house, tenement, or land to, through, or into which the water of the Trust is supplied in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for the measuring, conveying, reception, and storage of water and for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water consumed or supplied, or examining if there be any waste of water or misuse of such water, and if any person hinders or prevents examination he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five (£5) pounds. The Trust may turn the water off from such premises or house, and cease to supply same with water until such inspection shall have been permitted and effected.

22. In these regulations the word "Trust" shall mean the Donald Waterworks Trust, and the word "person" shall include any corporation.

23. In the Regulations No. 1 made by the Trust on the 7th November, 1895, clauses 2 and 6 thereof are hereby amended where the charge for water is set out therein as "Two (2) shillings per 1,000 gallons," it shall now read "One (1) shilling per 1,000 gallons," and in clause 6 the minimum where therein set out as "5,000 gallons" shall now read "15,000 gallons." Clauses 3, 4, 5, 8, 9, 11, 12, 13, 15, 16, 17, 18, 22, and 24 of the same Regulations numbered 1 of the 7th day of November, 1895, are hereby repealed.

24. The foregoing By-law No. 3 relating to water supply was made by the Chairman and Commissioners of the Donald Waterworks Trust under and by virtue of the powers contained in the Water Acts on the evening of the 22nd day of December, 1914.

SHIRE OF RIPON.

BY-LAW NO. 15, MAKING AND LEVYING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Ripon do hereby, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the By-law following for the Water Supply District of the Ripon Shire Council:—

Part I.

1. A rate for the year hereinafter mentioned is hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all lands and tenements which are rateable property within the meaning of the *Local Government Act 1903* within the Water Supply District of the Ripon Shire Council according to the valuation for the time being of such land and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipal district of the said Shire within which such lands and tenements are respectively situated for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure, and such rate shall consist of the rates and charges hereinafter specified.

Part II.—The Beaufort Water Supply.

2. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied from The Beaufort Water Supply otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, that is to say:—

- (a) On every house or tenement, save as hereinafter provided, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the net annual value of such house or tenement, but in no case, save as hereinafter provided, shall such rate be less than the minimum sum of Twenty shillings, and in addition to such rate there shall be payable a further sum of Five shillings for each garden upon a tenement and a further sum of Five shillings for each horse kept or usually watered on such tenement.
- (b) On every piece of land not having a building thereon, but having a frontage to any street or road along which there is any main pipe laid for the supply of water from The Beaufort Water Supply, provided such pipe or some portion thereof is laid in the street or road opposite the frontage of such land or opposite some portion of such frontage, the minimum sum of Ten shillings. Nothing in this subsection contained shall be deemed to apply to land adjoining and used in connexion with any other tenement.

3. "The Beaufort Water Supply" means and includes the reservoirs (with their respective systems of reticulation) known as Jackson's Reservoir and The Gold Fields Reservoirs situate to the north and south respectively of the township of Beaufort and the springs and races which feed such reservoirs.

Part III.—The Joint Water Supply.

4. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied from The Joint Water Supply otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, that is to say:—

On every house or tenement being rateable property within the municipal district of the Council, and which is supplied by the Council with water from The Joint Water Supply, the sum of Twenty shillings per annum.

5. "The Joint Water Supply" means the race running from the Springs at Mt. Cole to Jackson's Reservoir.

Part IV.—The Waterloo Supply.

6. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements

shall pay in respect of water supplied from The Waterloo Supply otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, that is to say:—

On every house or tenement being rateable property within the municipal district of the Council, and having a frontage to any street or road along which there is any pipe laid for the supply of water from The Waterloo Supply, provided such pipe or some portion thereof is laid in the street or road opposite the frontage of such house or tenement or opposite some portion of such frontage, the sum of One pound per annum.

7. "The Waterloo Supply" means "The Waterloo Reservoir" (with reticulation therefrom) situated on or near the boundaries of the parishes of Raglan and Beaufort, and being about five miles in a northerly direction from the township of Beaufort.

Part V.

8. Such rate as aforesaid is made, and shall be levied for the year beginning on the 1st day of October, 1914, and ending on the 30th day of September, 1915, and shall be payable at the office of the said President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Ripon, at the Shire Hall, Beaufort, immediately after the expiration of one month from the publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of the notice required by the Water Acts.

9. Such person or persons as the said President, Councillors, and Ratepayers may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, sue for, and recover the said rate.

THE BOROUGH OF HORSHAM WATERWORKS TRUST BY-LAW.

THE following By-law is made by the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust, pursuant to the provisions of the above Act:—

1. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary provided in any existing Regulation or By-law, the Trust shall have power by resolution whenever it may consider it necessary and for such times as may be determined by the said resolution:—

- (a) To prohibit the use of water for other than domestic purposes either altogether or within such hours as the Trust shall determine.
- (b) To restrict the use of water for other than domestic purposes within such hours as the Trust may fix for the supply of water for other than domestic purposes.
- (c) To restrict the use of water within such hours and for such purposes as the Trust shall determine.
- (d) To prohibit the use of hoses for watering gardens or for other purposes either entirely or within such hours as the Trust shall determine.

(II.) For every occupied or unoccupied allotment or vacant lot situate in any street or road where pipes have been laid, the rate to be paid shall be One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling, according to the municipal valuation of such allotment; provided that in no case shall a less rate than Ten shillings each be payable, except where the municipal valuation is less than Three pounds each, in which case the said rate shall not be less than Seven shillings and sixpence.

(III.) For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in the streets or roads in which pipes are laid down, and which are within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe of the Trust, there shall be paid one-half of the above rates; and for all such lands and tenements being over a quarter of a mile, but within half-a-mile from such stand-pipe, one-quarter of the full rate shall be paid.

3. The rates herein made are for the year ending 31st December, 1915, and shall be due and payable, in advance, on the 27th day of February, 1915.

4. Such persons as the Commissioners shall appoint from time to time for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover such rates.

The following are the rates for 1915 which the occupiers or owners of lands, tenements, and vacant or unoccupied allotments within the aforesaid Urban District, and liable to be rated, shall pay to the Trust in respect of such property:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twenty pounds (£20) annual municipal value and under, a rate of One pound sterling shall be paid.

2. For every house or tenement of more than Twenty pounds (£20) annual municipal value, and not exceeding Thirty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.

3. For every house or tenement of more than Thirty pounds (£30) annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling in the pound shall be paid.

4. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied allotments of land if not more than Five pounds annual municipal valuation, a rate of Five shillings for each and every separate allotment by which a main passes.

5. For all lands and tenements, situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and being within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe, one-half of the before-mentioned rate, and where lands and tenements are over a quarter of a mile and under half a mile from a stand-pipe, one-quarter of the before mentioned rate.

6. Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly, where the water is used for domestic and other than domestic purposes, shall be the quantity which at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the assessed rate for the half-year which would be payable in respect of the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. In cases where water is sold by measure for other than domestic use solely, the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly shall be 27,000 gallons.

7. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties on the first of January and the first of July, 1915.

8. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

WHEREAS by section 17 of the *Seed Advances Act* 1914 (5 Geo. V. No. 2568) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations prescribing the mode and form of making applications for advances of seed, and whether by statutory declaration or otherwise, the form of orders to persons to supply seed to cultivators and the conditions on which such orders shall be honoured, and any other matters not inconsistent with the said Act necessary or convenient to give effect to the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS.

Applicants for seed or fodder or seed and fodder must fill up form prescribed in Schedule I., and duly sign and declare same before a justice of the peace or a commissioner for taking affidavits, and shall forthwith return such form to the Secretary for Lands, Melbourne.

For the purpose of investigating applications local boards shall be appointed, and shall consist of such person or persons as the Minister may appoint.

It shall be the duty of every board so appointed to investigate all applications delivered to it by the Secretary for Lands, and report to the Minister thereon.

Upon approval of any application and on the applicant giving to The Board of Land and Works a mortgage over his farm or a licence lien over the improvements thereon or a preferable lien or liens on all crops, or, if required, two or more of such securities, he shall receive an order as prescribed in Schedule II., enabling the said applicant to purchase seed or fodder or seed and fodder to the amount shown on such order.

On production of the order, seed or fodder or seed and fodder to the value mentioned therein may be supplied to, and a receipt obtained for same from the cultivator, and on such order and receipt, with declaration at back thereof duly declared, being forwarded to the Secretary for Lands, the amount of claim will be remitted.

Any renewal of a preferable lien on crops shall be in the form or to the effect prescribed in Schedule III., and any request for entry of satisfaction of a preferable lien on crops shall be in the form or to the effect prescribed in Schedule IV., and any consent of mortgagee or encumbrancer to any mortgage or encumbrance being given by any cultivator to The Board of Land and Works shall be in the form or to the effect prescribed in Schedule V.

RESCISSION OF REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE NATIONAL PARK, IN THE PARISHES OF WAN- DILIGONG, TOWAMBA, DONDANGADALE, AND EURANDELONG.

WHEREAS by the 199th section of the *Land Act* 1901, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make rules and regulations or to rescind any rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance-fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby rescind the Regulations made by the said Board on the 31st October, 1908; 11th December, 1912; 24th February, 1913; and 11th December, 1914, respectively, in respect of 2,880 acres in the parish of Wandiligong, temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 31st October, 1898, as a site for a National Park, and 23,100 acres in the parishes of Wandiligong, Towamba, Dondangadale, and Eurandelong, temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 6th October, 1908, for a National Park.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE NATIONAL PARK, IN THE PARISHES OF WANDILIGONG, TO- WAMBA, DONDANGADALE, AND EURANDE- LONG.

WHEREAS by the 199th section of the *Land Act* 1901, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make rules and regulations or to rescind any rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance-fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations to be observed and enforced in respect of—

2,880 acres, reserved by Order in Council of the 31st October, 1898, in the parish of Wandiligong, as a site for a National Park; and

23,100 acres, reserved by Order in Council of the 6th October, 1908, in the parishes of Wandiligong, Towamba, Dondangadale, and Eurandelong, for a National Park, in addition to and adjoining the land temporarily reserved therefor by Order in Council of the 31st October, 1898, both of which are together hereinafter called "The National Park."

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall enter or remain in the National Park who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

2. No person shall, without the permission of the Minister of Lands or duly authorized officer, remove, cut, damage, or deface any rocks, trees, shrubs, ferns, plants, seats, tables, gates, posts, or fences in the National Park, or write or paint, or otherwise mark

any rock, tree, bridge, seat, gate, post, fence, wall, table, pillar, railing, or any building or other erection within the National Park.

3. No person (except as hereinafter provided) shall shoot, poison, trap, snare, hook, catch, or otherwise destroy or interfere with or take away any game, wild fowl, or any animal, bird, or fish of any description, or carry any firearms, poison, traps, snares, or gins within the National Park without the permission, in writing, of the Minister of Lands or duly authorized officer first obtained. Provided always that from the first day of October in every year to the thirtieth day of April following any person may take fish from Lake Catani, within the National Park; but such person shall use only a rod and line, and no line shall have more than one hook attached thereto, and no fish of a less weight than eight (8) ounces other than native fish shall be taken or removed from the said lake.

4. No person shall light or maintain any fire within the National Park without the permission of the Minister of Lands or duly authorized officer, and then only in such place as may be directed.

5. No person shall camp in the National Park, or erect therein any dwelling, hut, or other structure without the permission, in writing, of the Minister of Lands or duly authorized officer.

6. No person shall bring into the National Park, or allow to wander therein, any horse, cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs without the permission, in writing, of the Minister of Lands or duly authorized officer.

7. No person shall bathe in the National Park except in the places set apart for the purpose; and every person bathing therein shall be decently clad from the neck to the knees.

8. No dog shall be allowed in the National Park, and all dogs found therein shall be liable to be destroyed, and the owners thereof to prosecution.

9. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the National Park, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

10. No person shall cut in the National Park, or remove therefrom any live or dead timber without the permission, in writing, of the Minister of Lands or duly authorized officer.

11. No timber traffic shall be allowed within the National Park without the permission, in writing, of the Minister of Lands or duly authorized officer.

12. Except as hereinafter provided, no motor, delivery cart, dray, lorry, waggon, van, truck, or other vehicle carrying a load exceeding one (1) ton shall be allowed within the National Park without the permission, in writing, of the Minister of Lands or duly authorized officer.

13. No person, unless duly authorized, in writing, by the Minister of Lands, shall ply for hire or carry passengers for reward within the boundaries of the National Park.

14. On and after 25th January, 1915, motor cars and motor cycles may travel on the main road in the National Park to Mount Buffalo (hereinafter called the main road) only at such times and in such direction as are set forth in clause 19 of these Regulations.

15. Horses or vehicles drawn by horses or other animals may travel on the main road only at such times and in such direction as are set forth in clause 19 of these Regulations.

16. Motor cars and motor cycles shall not travel on the main road at a greater speed than ten (10) miles an hour, and drivers shall slow down and sound the bell or horn at all turns in the main road.

17. The Bailiff of Crown Lands or other officer controlling traffic on the main road shall have full authority to close it against all motor traffic whenever, in his opinion, the said main road is unfit for such traffic, or whenever for any other reason the closing thereof is considered necessary. A notice, "Closed against motor traffic," and placed on the entrance gate, shall be sufficient evidence that the main road is closed against such traffic.

18. The Bailiff of Crown Lands or other officer controlling traffic on the main road shall have full authority to stop the passage of any type of motor which is considered to be unsafe, or which, in his opinion, would cause undue damage to the road.

19. The time-table for the regulation of motor and other vehicular traffic on the Government road to Mount Buffalo shall be as set forth in the Schedule hereto:—

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Alberton order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall have operation in the gazetted area of the Township of Yarram Yarram.

2. For the purpose of this By-law the following terms shall have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them, that is to say:—

- (a) The "Building Surveyor" mentioned in this Regulation shall be the Engineer or Clerk of Works of the Shire of Alberton, or such officer as the Council shall from time to time appoint for the purposes of this Regulation.
- (b) "Person Building" shall be either or all of the following:—Owner, lessee, architect, builder, or contractor.
- (c) "Square" applied to the measurement of any area means the space of one hundred square feet.

3. No person building shall commence any building or any addition or alteration to any building, or move, place, or raise any building, or do any building operation referred to or provided for in this Regulation without delivering at the Building Surveyor's Office a written notice thereof seven days before commencing, and lodging at the same time plans and specifications of such building, addition, or alteration, or other operation hereinafter mentioned in this Regulation which will show to scale the boundaries of and the positions of the buildings existing and proposed on such land, and details of construction referred to in this Regulation.

4. Any building in the undermentioned area of the said township shall have its walls, generally speaking, built in brick, stone, or a combination of both, or reinforced concrete, or any other approved incombustible material, laid or set in lime or cement mortar in such manner as to produce solid work. The area above referred to shall be all allotments facing Commercial-road, from King-street to James-street on the east side, and from Rodgers-street to the Yarram Old Cemetery on the west side. Such area for the purposes of these Regulations to be termed the "brick area."

5. Every house hereafter built or rebuilt must have an enclosed back yard or open space of at least six squares, exclusive of any building therein, and exclusive of any passage way at side of such house.

6. With regard to buildings and works so far as relates to the entry thereon for the supervision thereof, at all times during the progress thereof, within the meaning of these Regulations, it shall be lawful for the Building Surveyor, or any other person or persons duly authorized by him on that behalf, and they are hereby respectively authorized to enter upon the premises upon which such operations have been commenced or are in progress.

7. The provisions of this By-law shall not apply to or have operation in respect of Government buildings of any kind.
