




PROPOSED ADDITIONS TO STATE FORESTS.—DIAGRAMS TO ACCOMPANY SCHEDULE No. 14.





Factories and Shops Act.

## DETERMINATION OF THE ELECTRICAL SUPPLY BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Act, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to see the special board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in—

(a) the generation or distribution of electricity,
 (b) the manufacture, repair, or maintenance of electrical appliances when such work is done by generators, distributers, or installers,

has made the following Determination, namely :-

1. That previous Determinations of this Board are hereby amended, and such amendments shall come into force and be operative on and after the 22nd day of November, 1915. The Determination and amendments are printed hereunder. WAGES.

#### APPRENTICES AND IMPROVERS.

The Electrical Supply Board has prescribed a form of apprenticeship agreement. Section 187

requires that the indentures must be in that form.

"Apprentice" means any person under 21 years of age bound by indentures of apprenticeship, or any person over 21 years of age who, with the sanction of the Minister, is bound by indentures of

apprenticeship. (Act 2650, Sec. 3.)

"Improver" means any person (other than an apprentice) who does not receive a piece-work price

"Improver" means any person (other than an apprentice) who does not receive a piece-work price or a wages rate fixed by any Special Board for persons other than apprentices or improvers, and who is not over 21 years of age, or who, being over 21 years of age, holds a licence from the Minister to be paid as an improver. (Act 2650, Sec. 3.)
