REGULATIONS.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Mental Treatment Act 1915, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth make the Regulations following:—

- I. Interpretation.—In these Regulations unless the context otherwise requires "Inspector-General" means the Inspector-General of the Insane for the State of Victoria or his deputy.
- "Commanding Officer" means the officer in charge of the Base Hospital, St. Kilda-rond, or the officer in charge of the regiment for the time being to which the person for whom treatment is required belongs.
- "Institution" means any institution, home, house, private or public hospital or part thereof approved by the Inspector-General of the Insane and set aside exclusively for the reception of persons in the Naval or Military Service requiring mental treatment.
- "Superintendent" means the Superintendent, owner, manager or individual in charge of any institution approved under these Regulations.
- II. Schedule No. 1.—Any person in the Naval or Military Service having been on active service and requiring mental treatment may be received into any institution approved under these Regulations on production of a request and statement in the form attached (Schedule No. 1), duly signed by his Commanding Officer and may be detained for any period not exceeding six months. The period of detention may be extended for any further period or periods by certificate under the hand of the Inspector-General.
- III. Schedules Nos. 2, 3, and 4.—The Superintendent of any institution shall forthwith after his or her admission enter or cause to be entered the names and particulars of every person admitted for treatment under the Mental Treatment Act 1915 in a book in accordance with the form in Schedule No. 2 to these Regulations and shall forward a notice of every admission, death, discharge or removal within 24 hours of such admission, death, discharge or removal to the Inspector-General in accordance with as the case may require the form in Schedules No. 3 or 4 to these Regulations. Escapes and recaptures shall also be promptly notified to the Inspector-General in the form in Schedule No. 4 hereto.
- IV. Schedules Nos. 5 and 6.—The Inspector General may at any time order or on the receipt of a certificate in the form in Schedule No. 5 approve of the discharge in the form in Schedule No. 6 of any person admitted to any institution or the transfer of such person to any other institution. He may also direct that any person under treatment under the provisions of the Mental Treatment Act 1915 be committed to a hospital for the insane.
- V. Every institution shall be open at all times to visitation and inspection by the Inspector-General.
- VI. The Inspector-General with the sanction of the Honorable the Chief Secretary may withdraw the approval given to any institution to receive persons under

the Mental Treatment Act 1915 and all persons under treatment in such institution shall be removed within fourteen days of the Superintendent having been notified of such withdrawal of approval.

DEATH DUTIES RULES.

RULES UNDER PART VI. OF THE ADMINISTRATION AND PROBATE ACT 1915 (6 GEO. V., No. 2611).

PROBATE ACT 1915 (6 GEO. V., No. 2611).

Rule 1. The Rules framed under the Administration and Probate Act 1890, and published in the Government Gazette on the 16th day of April, 1913, are hereby repealed.

Rule 2. The time referred to in section 122 of the Administration and Probate Act 1915 as "the prescribed time," shall be two calendar months.

Rule 3. In cases of probate or letters of administration, limited to any particular property of a testator or intestate, the executor or administrator shall, within two calendar months from the grant of probate or letters of administration to him, file the statement mentioned in section 122 of the said Act.

Rule 4. The statement required by section 122 of the said Act shall be in the form contained in the Schedule hereto, and every such statement shall be verified by the affidavit or statutory declaration of the person by the said section required to file the same, and if there shall be more than one such person, then of every such person. Such affidavit or statutory declaration shall be in the form in the Schedule hereto, and shall contain the other particulars set out therein.

Rule 5. The time referred to in section 131 of the said

Rule 5. The time referred to in section 131 of the said Act, after which the duty payable must be paid, shall be one calendar month from the date of the certificate of the Commissioner of the final balance appearing in



Standing Orders for regulating and appointing the place and hour of meetings of the Winchelsea Waterworks Trust, and providing for the management and conduct of business thereat.

W HEREAS by the Water Acts power is given to any authority (subject to the approval of the Governor in Council) from time to time, to make, amend, and repeal By-laws relating (inter alia) to the appointment of the place and hour of meetings, whether periodical or special, and providing for the due management and conduct of business thereat:—Be it therefore ordered and directed (subject as aforesaid) by the Commissioners of the Winchelsea Waterworks Trust, such Trust being an authority under the said Acts as follows, viz.: follows, viz.:-

follows, viz.:—

1. In all cases not provided for by Acts of Parliament of Victoria relating to authorities, or by this By-law, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of the Parliament of Victoria, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Trust.

2. Place, Hour and Adjournment of Meetings.—Meetings of the Trust shall be held quarterly at the offices of the Trust on the first Friday in the months of January, April, July, and October, at the hour of One o'clock p.m., and the Commissioners thereof may from time to time by adjournment from any such meeting, or from any subsequent adjournment thereof, meettogether at any convenient place, and at such hour to be from time to time appointed by them for that purpose.

Protest, Gommissioners may.—Many Commissioner may protest against any resolution of the Commissioners and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Commissioners by the protesting Commissioner, in a book to be kept for that purpose in the Trust Secretary's office, and signed by such Commissioner, and shall be also entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Commissioners to be not in accordance with truth or in its terms disrespectful to the Commissioners.

49. Presentation of Petitions.—Every Commissioner presenting a petition to the Commissioners, shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

50. Deputations.—Deputations from the ratepayers wishing to be heard before the Commissioners, in support of any petition, or otherwise, must send in an

application in writing to the Trust Secretary the day before the meeting of the Commissioners at which such petition is intended to be presented.

- 51. Correspondence Committee.—There shall be two permanent committees of the Commissioners, one to be called the Works Committee, and the other the Finance and Correspondence Committee. Each committee shall consist of four Commissioners, three to form a quorum. The Chairman shall be a member of all committees.
- 52. Minutes of Committee.—Minutes of all proceedings of committees, as well as of their reports, numbered in consecutive order, shall be entered in the committees' minute book, being signed by the Chairman, shall be presented to the Commissioners, and the Trust Secretary, when practicable, shall attend all meetings of the committees.
- 53. Committees to be convened.—The Trust Secretary shall convene every committee at any time by order of the Commissioners, or on the written order of the Chairman, or of any two members of a committee.
- 54. Cheques to be signed.—That all cheques shall be signed by three Commissioners, and countersigned by the Secretary.
- 55. Appointment to Permanent Office.—No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the Commissioners shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the town of Winchelsea inviting application from qualified candidates for the same.
- 56. Salaries to be fixed.—The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the Commissioners, shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same.
- 57. Commissioner, dc., not to be Surety.—No Commissioner or officer of the Commissioners, and no assessor or auditor shall be received as a security for any officer appointed by the Commissioners, or for any work to be done for the Commissioners.
- 58. Contracts.—In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any contract, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the person providing the same.
- 59. Plans, &c.—All the plans and specifications for any public work shall be laid before the Commissioners at least six days prior to the same being considered and ordered upon, and be open for inspection by any Commissioner during that time except in cases of emergency.
- 60. Secretary to expend Moneys.—It shall be lawful for the Trust Secretary and a member of the Finance Committee, from time to time, on the written order of the Chairman, to disburse such moneys as shall have been appropriated by the Commissioners for the purposes of this clause, and as shall be required for any necessary occasion, not exceeding in the whole in an interval between two ordinary meetings of the Commissioners for the sum of Ten pounds.
- 61. Common Seal.—The common seal of the Trust shall be kept in a box having two locks, of one of which locks the Chairman shall keep the key, and of the other of which locks the key shall be kept by the Trust Secretary, and the corporate seal shall not be affixed to any document unless the Chairman and one other member of the Commissioners, or in the absence of the Chairman, unless two Commissioners be present.
- 62. Address to the Governor, &c.—All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the Chairman and Trust Secretary, unless otherwise ordered by the Commissioners.
- 63. Suspension of Regulations.—Any one or more of the rules and provisions herein contained may be suspended for a special purpose, on motion upon notice being given, and shall not otherwise be suspended except by a unanimous vote of the Commissioners.
- 64. Penalty.—Every person who shall offend against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each such offence.

RATING BY-LAW NO. 2 FOR YEAR 1915.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Winchelsea Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed a Waterworks District for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by such Acts, make the following By-law, viz.:—

By-LAW No. 2.

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1915 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said Waterworks District:—

- 1. For every house and tenement up to £16 annual municipal value and under, the sum of £2 (Two pounds) per annum.
- 2. For every house and tenement of £17 annual municipal value and upwards, an amount of Two shillings and supence in the £1 upon the annual municipal value of such property.
- 3. Houses unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months commencing on the first day of January or the first day of July, shall be charged two-third rates.
- 4. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land unsupplied or supplied with water from the works of the Trust of Six pounds annual municipal value and under, the sum of Fifteen shillings sterling per annum.
- 5. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land unsupplied or supplied with water from the works of the Trust of Seven pounds annual municipal value and upwards, an amount of Two shillings and sixpence in the £1 upon the annual municipal value of such property.
- 6. Water supplied to cricket, tennis, or bowling clubs and to Government Departments, mechanics' institutes, churches, show grounds, and similar properties shall be charged for by measurement at 1s. 6d. (One shilling and sixpence) per 1,000 gallons.
- 7. For water supplied from stand-pipe or hydrant there shall be a charge for every 200 gallons or under, the sum of Sixpence.
- 8. For a supply during the erection of new buildings, there shall be a charge of Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of the contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or, if there be no contract, then upon the value or of the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, or plastering.
- work, brickwork, or plastering.

 9. Except hereinbefore otherwise provided, the minimum quantity of water to be charged for where water is supplied by the Trust by measurement shall be the quantity which, at One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, equals the amount of the assessed rates which would be payable for the premises so supplied and for such minimum quantity of water there shall be a charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, and for water in excess of such minimum there shall be a charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon.

 10. The fee to be paid for a plumber's licence shall be
- 10. The fee to be paid for a plumber's licence shall be $\pounds 1$; renewals, 5s.

That the before-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable quarterly in advance and the first payment be made on 1st October, 1915, for three months ending 31st December, 1915. This is owing to the works not being completed before that date.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Winchelsea Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand receive, collect and recover the said rafes and charges.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Winchelsea Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which Trust has been proclaimed a Waterworks District for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the following By-law for such Waterworks District:—

1. Each house or tenement must be supplied by a 1. Each house or tenement must be supplied by a separate service from the Trust's main, and if so required by the Trust the whole service shall be subjected to a test pressure of 200 lbs. to the square inch after it has been laid. The portions of the service-pipe laid along or across any public street, lane, or right-of-way, or where it may be exposed to wheel traffic, shall be laid not less than 9 inches below the surface. All

laid not less than 9 inches below the surface. All trenches cut for the purpose of laying service-pipes in streets, lanes, or right-of-ways must be properly filled in and made good to the satisfaction of the Trust and Municipal Council and their officers.

2. Connexions with the Trust's mains must (except where otherwise directed) be made with proper stop-cock ferrules. One service-pipe only for domestic supply to each tenement will be permitted, and for all houses in the Trust area the bore of such service-pipe must not exceed 2 inch unless permission for a larger service shall have been received in writing from the Trust, and the supply be taken through a meter.

3. The maximum tapping that will be allowed (except by special permit from the Trust) for each size of main is as follows:—

For 3-in. and 4-in. pipes, 4-in. tapping. For 5-in., 6-in. pipes, 1-in. tapping.

For 3-in. and 4-in. pipes, 4-in. tapping.

For 5-in., 6-in., pipes, 1-in. tapping.

4. Galvanized-iron piping of approved quality will be allowed for external and internal services, all such piping must have a bursting pressure of not less than 600 lbs. per square inch, and, if required, shall be tested to 300 lbs. per square inch.

5. No person shall use any tap, stop-cock, bib-cock, ball-cock, valve, closet cistern, service box, waste-not regulator, bath tap, or valve, or other fitting in connexion with a supply of water of the Trust which is not of the best quality, and approved by the Trust.

6. No person shall use any stop or bib-cocks which are not screwdown, high pressure cocks, made of hard brass or gun metal, and in every respect of best quality and workmanship and approved by the Trust.

7. A high pressure screwdown stop-cock, properly secured and covered with an approved cast-iron box, shall be fixed on each water service between the main and the building line.

8. All cocks and fittings must have a bursting pressure of not less than 600 lbs. per square inch, and, if required, shall be tested to 200 lbs. per square inch.

9. No bath shall be allowed which has a holding capacity when full of more than 100 gallons, except with the special permission of the Trust. Overflow pipes to baths will not be permitted except where the supply is by measure.

10. Any person, whether licensed as hereafter set out.

by measure.

10. Any person, whether licensed as hereafter set out, or not, who shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice from the Trust of the offence has been given.

11 No person shall use any eightern or tank that is

the Trust of the offence has been given.

11. No person shall use any cistern or tank that is not provided with an equilibrium bail valve, and the overflow pipe laid and fixed in a suitable manner, open to inspection and in a position approved by the Trust.

12. No person shall construct or use any urinal or water-closet fitting not approved by the Trust, nor unless the same be supplied with water from the service pertaining to a tenement through a proper closet cistern or service-box fitted with approved water-preventing apparatus. No person shall fix or use any service-pipe which communicates directly or indirectly with the basin or trap, or otherwise than with the cistern of a urinal or water-closet. Urinals shall be provided with a two-gallon, and closets with three-gallon cisterns.

13. All baths, sinks, lavatory, and other basins, closets, and urinals served from the Trust's mains must be of approved sanitary construction and mounted to the satisfaction of the Trust.

14. Upon any person giving notice of his desire to

Upon any person giving notice of his desire to lay a pipe to connect with and tap the pipes of the Trust, he shall be informed on behalf of the Trust whether it is or is not desired that such tapping should be made by an officer of the Trust, and if it be so desired, such person shall not tap any such pipe, but shall provide for and be at the cost of all labour and material necessary for such connexion, and for the restoration

of the ground to the satisfaction of the local authority, and be liable for the consequences of failure in so doing, and shall pay in advance to the Trust the expense of such tapping, including the stop-cock and ferrule as follows, viz.: For \$\frac{3}{2}\$-inch pipe, Ten shillings; 1-inch pipe, Fifteen shillings lows, viz.: For ; Fifteen shillings.

such tapping, including the stop-cock and ferrule as follows, viz.: For \(\frac{4}{2} \)-inch pipe, Ten shillings; 1-inch pipe, Fifteen shillings.

15. Any person, whether licensed as hereafter set out or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the Trust, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipes to communicate with the pipes of the Trust of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Trust, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

16. Any person, whether licensed as hereafter set out or not, who shall offend by opening any ground, so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Trust, without giving two days' notice to the Trust of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

17. No extension of private services will be allowed except by consent of the Trust.

18. The service pipes from 3 feet on street from building line being the property of owners, or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service pipes, the occupier (if any) and if none, the owner, shall upon receiving notice that his service pipe requires repairing immediately proceed to repair the same, and he shall be responsible for any loss of water or other damage which shall be caused by reason of such service pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, and in default be liable to a penalty

proper officers.

20. No hose or pipe shall be attached to any pipe or tap for the purpose of watering ground, or trees or plants or washing house walls or carriages or horses, stock or for any similar purpose, except where the water is charged for by measure. Syphon pumps will not be allowed except where the water is supplied by measure.

21. No meter shall be affixed puttil it shall have been

allowed except where the water is supplied by measure.

21. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by a duly authorized officer of the Trust, and each meter must be capable of registering at least 1,000,000 gallons, and each 4-inch and 1-inch meter must be capable of registering any flow not less than 15 and 20 gallons per hour respectively and each meter must be fixed with approved connexions above ground in a conveniently accessible position and properly protected.

properly protected.

22. If any meter in use cease registering, or be reported by a duly authorized officer of the Trust as out of repair or registering inaccurately, the Trust will estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order, and until it is repaired and refixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the previous year, or the Trust may insert a check-meter on the service pipe and charge upon estimates from the registering thereof.

23. The Trust will, if it so think fit, but not otherwise, let for hire water meters, the rent for which shall be at the rate per annum of:—

For 3-inch Eight shillings

For 4-inch, Eight shillings. For 1-inch, Ten'shillings.

For I-inch, Ten'shillings.

which rent shall be exclusive of, and in addition to the amount or rate chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall be due, and must be paid half-yearly in advance, on the first day of the months of January and July in each year, the first payment to date and be made as from the commencement of the then current half-year, and the occupier of the premises shall, at his own cost, cause such meter to be fixed and kept in proper repair, and when required on behalf of the Trust so to do, shall cause such meter to be removed to the office of the Trust to be tested, and when it shall have been so tested, shall cause it, or such other meter as may be furnished to him in lieu of it, to be replaced

at his own cost, and shall be in like manner responsible for the same. Any person so hiring a meter from the Trust, who shall leave the premises on which such meter shall be fixed, without having previously given, in writing, at least six days' notice to the Trust of his intention to leave the premises, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding.

ing, at least six days' notice to the Trust of his intention to leave the premises, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

24. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

25. Any person receiving water from the Trust, who, without the written permission of the Trust shall take or carry away such water from the premises, or allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty of not exceeding Five pounds.

26. Any person, not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust, who shall take or carry away water from the premises of any other person so supplied, or from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

27. Before any person shall affix any service pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

28. Any person of the Trust, or any service pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

29. Before any person shall affix any service pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds. aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five

affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

28. Each licence shall be for the period ending on the 31st December next ensuing after the issue thereof, but may be renewed by the Trust at its discretion from time to time in each case to the following 31st December. The Trust shall have power at any time to cancel a licence in the event of the holder thereof performing his work in an unsatisfactory manner, or committing any breach of the Water Acts or of this By-law, and in such matters the Trust shall be sole judge. For each original licence the licensee shall pay to the Trust a fee of One pound and for each renewal Five shillings.

29. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust that he is a competent plumber, and that he is thoroughly conversant with the provisions of the By-laws of the Trust relating to Water supply with the Water Acts, so far as they apply to town supplies. The Trust may, if it so sees fit, refuse to grant such licence.

30. Each licensed plumber must report to the Trust Secretary the completion of any new work, extensions, or repair in connexion with any service within twenty-four hours of affecting the same.

31. No person, other than an employee of the municipal council, shall, without the written permission of the Trust, water streets or thoroughfares by means of hydrants and hose attached to fire plugs. Any person offending against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

32. The water supply of all public parks and gardens shall be exclusively under the control and direction of the Officers of the Trust, and any person not duly authorized who shall turn on the water or otherwise interfere with such water supply of all public parks and gardens shall be exclusively under the control and direction of the Officers of the Trust, and any person of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

33. F

35. In the construction of this By-law the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the meaning which in the Water Acts is assigned to any word, shall

be the meaning of the same word where occurring in this By-law, unless inconsistent with the subject-matter or context.

36. No prosecution shall be commenced in connexion with any violation or infringement of this By-law except by the specific direction of the Trust, conveyed by a motion or of the Chairman, such direction in the latter case being in writing.

WHEREAS by the Poisons Act 1915 (6 Geo. V. No. 2707) it is among other things enacted that the several articles mentioned in the Second Schedule to the said Act shall be deemed poisons within the

meaning of the Poisons Act; and on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, amend the said Schedule by adding to any part of such Schedule or removing therefrom any article specified in such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and pursuant to section 4 of Part I. of the above-named Act, do by this my Proclamation declare that the articles set forth hereunder shall be deemed to be poisons in addition to those specified in the said Schedule within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

Croton oil, its admixtures and preparations.
Iodine, and solutions thereof.
Strychnine, and all preparations or admixtures containing less than 0.2 per centum of strychnine.




PROPOSED ADDITIONS TO STATE FORESTS,—DIAGRAMS TO ACCOMPANY SCHEDULE No. 14.




Proposed Additions to State Forests.—Diagrams to accompany Schiedule No. 14.—continued.


