DISAPPEARANCE OF JESSIE STIRLING.

ONE HUNDRED POUNDS REWARD.

WHEREAS Jessie Stirling, daughter of Mr. Walter George Stirling, of Footscray, who left Melbourne on the 12th day of August, 1915, in the company of a man, name unknown, who had engaged her, to proceed to a situation at Sale, has mysteriously disappeared, and hitherto the police have been unable to discover the whereabouts of either of the parties, a description of whom is hereunder supplied: Notice is hereby given that a reward of One hundred pounds will be paid by the Government for such information as may lead to the discovery of the whereabouts of the girl and the arrest and conviction of the man on a charge of abduction.

Description of Jessie Stirling.

Sixteen years of age, about 5 ft. 6 in. high, fair complexion, fair wavy hair, blue eyes, slight build, has a gold filling in one front tooth; when last seen wore a navy-blue serge costume with pleated basque and tartan collar and cuffs, black velvet hat, with three posies of flowers, lace-up boots, squirrel necklet, carried a rain-proof coat.

Description of Man, Name Unknown.

About 40 years of age, 5 ft. 8 in. high, medium build, fair complexion, very light blue eyes, dark-brown hair, clean shaven, medium nose, has one tooth in front of upper jaw chipped and has a decayed appearance, scar on right side of upper lip like an old wound, and when speaking that side of the upper lip is elevated more than the other side; dressed in a grey cloth or tweed overcoat, grey felt hat, with a black band around it, new pair of patent-leather lace-up boots, polo collar, dark tie; wore a single gold chain, curb pattern, attached to which was an engraved round gold medal, carried a brown leather kit-bag.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Poisons Act 1915 (6 Geo. V. No. 2707) it is among other things enacted that the several articles mentioned in the Second Schedule to the said Act shall be deemed poisons within the meaning of the Poisons Act; and on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, amend the said Schedule by adding to any part of such Schedule or removing therefrom any article specified in such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and pursuant to section 4 of the above-named Act, do by this my Proclamation declare that the articles set forth hereunder shall be deemed to be poisons under the second part of the Second Schedule, in addition to those specified therein, viz.:-

Croton oil, its admixtures and preparations.

Iodine, and solutions thereof.

Strychnine, and all preparations or admixtures containing less than 0.2 per centum of strychnine.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this twenty-seventh day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and in the sixth year of the reign of His Majesty King George V.:

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION,
AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A
PUBLIC PARK IN THE TOWNSHIP OF BIRREGURRA.

WE, William Ennis, Thomas Griffin, Charles Henry Hayes, John Francis Darcy, and Archibald George Campbell, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 9th August, 1886, as a site for a Public Park in the town of Birregurra, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915* :—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein, except in the pavilion, where provision is made for same.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates in or around the Reserve, or cut or write names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the Reserve.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
9. No sports or games shall be played in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

A By-law of the City of Essendon made under the provisions of the Local Government Acts, and numbered 37, for suppressing nuisances and for compelling residents or occupiers of premises to keep them free from offensive or unwholesome matters.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Essendon order as follows:—

1. Every occupier of premises shall cause to be provided and kept therein a rat-proof and fly-proof receptacle, made of some non-absorbent material, and the content of such receptacle shall not be less than one and a half cubic feet, nor more than four and a half cubic feet.

2. Every such occupier shall cause the refuse or garbage receptacle and cover in use on his premises to be kept as clean as possible, and shall cause such receptacle to be sufficiently disinfected with some efficient disinfectant and deodorant when necessary, and shall also cause such receptacle and cover to be maintained in good order and condition, and all refuse and garbage arising from or upon such premises from time to time shall be deposited in such receptacle and such occupier shall cause such receptacle to be continuously covered save when refuse or garbage is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom, and on the day or days appointed by the Council for the removal of the contents thereof, such occupier shall cause such receptacle to be placed conveniently accessible for removal by the person or persons employed by the Council for that purpose.

3. Every person who shall by any wilful act or default be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law, shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding £2.

4. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

CITY OF ST. KILDA.

REGULATION No. 21.

A Regulation of the City of St. Kilda, No. 21, made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1903*, for the purpose of repealing Regulation No. 15, By-law No. 32, and By-law No. 52 (as far as not already repealed), and to regulate bathing.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of St. Kilda order as follows:—

1. Regulation No. 15, By-law No. 32 and By-law No. 52, as far as not already repealed are hereby respectively repealed.

2. No male person shall, between the hours of Eight p.m. and half-past Ten p.m. bathe or undress for the purpose of bathing, except within the areas set forth in Schedule 1 to this Regulation, which areas are specially set apart for the bathing of males, or in the baths built and provided for the purpose of bathing.

3. No female person shall, between the hours of Eight p.m. and half-past Ten p.m. bathe or undress for the purpose of bathing, except within the areas set forth in Schedule 2 to this Regulation, which areas are specially set apart for the bathing of female, or in baths built and provided for the purpose of bathing.

4. The above provisions shall not apply to the portion of the foreshore between Dickens-street and the southern boundary of the municipality, where mixed bathing shall be permitted between Four a.m. and half-past Ten p.m.

5. No person over the age of 10 years shall bathe between the western drain (Cowderoy-street) and the main drain (Shakespeare-grove) except within the baths built and provided for the purpose of bathing.

6. The provisions of this Regulation shall not apply to children of the age of 10 years or under.

7. No person shall bathe between the hours of half-past Ten p.m. and Four a.m. except at baths built and provided for that purpose.

8. On Sundays, no person shall bathe or undress for the purpose of bathing on any portion of the beach between the hours of One o'clock p.m. and Five o'clock p.m. nor after the hour of Ten o'clock p.m.

9. No person shall bathe in the open sea at any part of the foreshore within the municipal district of St. Kilda, unless effectively and decently clothed from neck to knee in a bathing costume, kilted or similar to that known as the Canadian costume.

10. Every person bathing shall, on leaving the water, forthwith resume ordinary clothing. No person shall loiter upon, or, save as far as is necessary to enable him or her to dress, run, or walk about on, or in, the vicinity of the beach in bathing costume or without having resumed ordinary clothing.

11. As, to the scheduled areas, no person shall dress or undress or remove any part of his or her bathing costume in any place other than the dressing shelters provided.

12. The Council may, by resolution, fix, from time to time, alter or abolish fees for the use of dressing shelters, and also for the safe custody of clothes and valuables.

13. No male over the age of 10 years shall enter any dressing-shed reserved for the use of females, nor bathe in any area during the hours that such area is reserved for exclusive use by females; and no female over the age of six years shall enter any dressing-shed reserved for the use of males, nor bathe in any area during the hours which such area is reserved for exclusive use by males, except for the purpose of rendering assistance in case of accident.

14. Any constable or officer of police or any officer of the Council may require any person who, in his opinion, is not sufficiently or decently dressed, bathes in any prohibited part, acts in indecent manner, uses indecent language or in any way offends against this Regulation, to resume his or her ordinary dress and he or she shall forthwith do so.

15. This Regulation shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of St. Kilda, which is on the foreshore of Hobson's Bay, and within three hundred yards seawards of the boundary of the city.

Bathing Areas for Males.

A. Commencing at the intersection of the south-west building line of the Beaconsfield-parade, with a line, being the continuation of a line along the centre of Fraser-street, thence by the south-west boundary of the Beaconsfield-parade south-easterly 9 chains to a point on the foreshore to be indicated by a board, thence by a line at right angles to the last line from high-water mark south-westerly 300 yards, thence by a line at right angles to the last line north-westerly 9 chains, thence by a line at right angles to the last line north-easterly 300 yards to the high-water mark (to meet a line being the continuation of a line along the centre of Fraser-street).
