RIVER THAMES.—For the purposes of national defence it is considered necessary that certain channels in the approaches to the Thames should be closed.

All the incoming vessels flying foreign flags and all British vessels from all foreign and colonial ports must call at the new pilot station now established in the vicinity of the Tongue Light Vessel, or at one of the established pilot stations, viz., the Sunk Light Vessel, Margate, Deal, and Dover, and be conducted to their destination by a licensed pilot.

All outgoing vessels of the same description must, before sailing, obtain the services of a licensed pilot to conduct them to sea. (Dated 14th September, 1914.)

All traffic into and out of the River Thames must pass through the Edinburgh Channels or through the Black Deep, south of the Knock John and Knob lightbuys, and through the Oaze Deep, until further notice.

No vessels are to remain under weigh in the above-mentioned Channels inside the Sunk Head lightbuoy, or within a line joining the South Long Sand and East Shingles buoys, between the hours of 7 p.m. and 6 a.m.

Vessels at anchor within these limits must not exhibit any lights between the hours of 7 p.m. and 6 a.m. All other Channels are closed to navigation. (Dated 28th October, 1914.)

RIVER MERSEY.—For the purpose of national defence it has been necessary to close certain channels in the approaches to the Port of Liverpool.

All incoming vessels flying foreign flags, and all British vessels from all foreign and colonial ports, must take a licensed Mersey pilot. (Dated 7th November, 1914.)

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO PRESCRIBE MINIMUM LENGTHS IN LIEU OF MINIMUM WEIGHTS FOR CERTAIN SPECIES OF FISH.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this notice in the *Victoria Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation prescribing, for the species of fish mentioned hereunder, the sizes or lengths set opposite the names thereof, less than which it shall be unlawful for any person to take, attempt to take, sell, or consign, or expose for sale, or have in his possession, house or shop, or under his control, fish of such species, in lieu of the weights set opposite the names of such species of fish in the Second Schedule to the *Fisheries Act 1890*, or of the weights substituted for any of such weights by any subsequent Proclamation:—

Bream	8 inches
Crayfish	11 inches
Garfish	9 inches
Mullet	8½ inches
Schnapper	10½ inches
Trout (non-indigenous to Victoria)	11 inches
Whiting	11 inches

The size or length of all such fish (except Garfish and Crayfish) shall be ascertained by measuring them overall, that is, from the point of the snout to the end of the tail; in the case of Garfish the length shall be ascertained by measuring from the tip of the upper jaw to the end of the upper half of the tail; and in the case of Crayfish by measuring from the rostrum or small central horn between the eyes to the end of the telson or central flap of the tail.

On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, or allotment of land by which a main passes, the sum equivalent to a rate of Two shillings and sixpence in the £1 per annum, with a minimum charge of £1 sterling.

Such rate is hereby made payable in equal moieties on the 1st January and 1st July, 1915, and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust shall appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rate.

The charges for water by measure shall be Two shillings and sixpence per one thousand gallons.

SHIRE OF TUNGAMAH WATERWORKS TRUST.**RATING BY-LAW FOR 1915 WITHIN DIVISIONS I., II., AND III. OF THE RURAL DISTRICT OF THE TRUST.***By-law No. 71.*

THE following rates and charges are those which the occupiers and owners of land liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1915 in respect of water supplied by the Trust to windmills, pumps, waterholes, dams, or other excavations within Divisions I., II., and III. of the rural district of the Trust.

1. Every person who has a waterhole, dam, or excavation which has already been supplied, or can be supplied, with water by gravitation from the Trust's channels, shall pay to the Trust the sum of Ten shillings per annum for each such waterhole, dam, or excavation.

2. The occupier or owner of land on which such dam, waterhole, or excavation shall be constructed, shall make and keep in a proper state of repair all offtakes, drains, sub-channels, culverts, and pipes as are necessary to fill such waterhole, dam, or excavation without waste of water, and without danger to the public, to the satisfaction of the officers of the said Shire of Tungamah Waterworks Trust.

3. Every occupier or owner of land on which any waterhole, dam, or excavation is situated shall, upon receiving written notice from the caretaker of the said Shire of Tungamah Waterworks Trust that water is available, proceed, within twenty-four hours, to fill his waterhole, dam, or excavation, and continue without waste until it is filled, and shall cut the water off at the main channel on completion.

4. A register of all waterholes, dams, and excavations shall be kept by the caretaker of the said Shire of Tungamah Waterworks Trust, and the sum of Ten shillings shall be payable to him in respect of each waterhole, dam, or excavation entered in such register annually, in advance, on the first of January in each year. Notice, in writing, shall be given annually to each ratepayer in respect of the number of waterholes, dams, or excavations for which he is responsible.

Every person having a windmill, pump, or pipe for the purpose of taking water from the Trust's channels, weirs, or watercourses, shall provide same with a valve which may be locked and controlled by the said Trust, and shall pay to the said Trust the sum of One pound annually, in advance, for the use of such windmill, pump, or pipe.

The foregoing By-law No. 71 was made by the Chairman and Commissioners of the Shire of Tungamah Waterworks Trust the 11th day of January, 1915.

AMENDED REGULATIONS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the
twenty-seventh day of January, 1915.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.

Mr. Murray Mr. Gray.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Workers' Compensation Act 1914* (Act No. 2496) to make Regulations for any purpose for which the said Act authorizes Regulations to be made, the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, by the advice of the Executive Council of the same, doth make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

Short Title.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "*Workers' Compensation (Amending) Regulations 1914*."

Certificate of Incapacity due to Age or Infirmary.

2. Where an application is made to a certifying medical practitioner by a worker who is over the age of sixty years, or is suffering from any mental or physical infirmity, the certifying medical practitioner shall, after examination, if he is so satisfied, give a certificate to the effect that the age of the worker, or some mental or physical infirmity or incapacity from which he is suffering, is such as to render him specially liable to accident or to render the result of an accident to him specially serious.

Form of Agreement between Holder of Certificate of Incapacity and Employer.

3. The form of agreement between a worker who has obtained a certificate under the last preceding clause and his employer may be in the form or to the effect of the one contained in the First Schedule hereto.

Amount of Fee for Certificate.

4. For any certificate given under Regulation 2 the certifying medical practitioner shall be entitled to charge a fee not exceeding 2s. 6d., unless in a case where the said practitioner has to visit the worker, where for every mile or portion thereof which the certifying medical practitioner is required to travel (after the first mile) an additional fee of 1s. is to be paid.

Fee for Certificate of Disablement by Accident.

5. The remuneration which the certifying medical practitioner shall be entitled to charge in respect of any certificate of disablement by accident given by him under paragraph 4 of the First Schedule to the *Workers' Compensation Act 1914* shall be a fee of 5s.; and where the worker is unable to present himself for examination at the residence of the said practitioner, an additional fee of 2s. 6d. per mile for every mile or portion thereof (after the first mile) which the certifying medical practitioner is required to travel therefrom is to be paid.

For a copy of any certificate given under the above Regulation a fee of 1s. is to be paid.

Fee Payable by Employer in case of Practitioner under the Act asked to Certify for purposes of Paragraph (13) of First Schedule to Act.

6. Where an employer applies under paragraph (13) of the First Schedule to the *Workers' Compensation Act 1914* for an employé to submit himself for examination by a duly qualified medical practitioner provided and paid by the employer, and such practitioner be one appointed in accordance with the provisions of the Act, a fee of 7s. 6d. shall be paid.

Industries in respect of which Returns to be made under Section 28 of Act.

7. Every employer in any of the industries set out in the Second Schedule hereto (to which industries section 28 of the *Workers' Compensation Act 1914* is hereby directed to apply) shall, on or before the 31st day of December in each and every year, send to the Chief Secretary or other responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the said Act, in the form in the Third Schedule hereto, a correct return of the number of injuries in respect of which compensation has been paid by the employer under the said Act during the twelve months ending on the 6th day of November then next preceding.

or one-quarter of his average weekly earnings,
whichever is the larger, and a total maximum
liability of (c) £50 in the aggregate.

the engagement to be determinable by a week's notice
on either side.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Poisons Acts Amendment Act* 1914 (5 Geo. V. No. 2525), it is among other things enacted that the several articles mentioned in the Schedule to the said Act shall be deemed poisons within the meaning of the Poisons Acts; and on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, amend the said Schedule by adding to any part of such Schedule or removing therefrom any article specified in such Proclamation: Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation declare that the articles set forth in the Schedule hereunder shall be deemed to be poisons within the meaning of the said Acts, in the place of the articles specified in the Second Schedule of the *Poisons Act* 1890, No. 1125, and in the subsequent Proclamations made thereunder, viz.:—

Poisons Act.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

FIRST PART.

Aconite, *aconitine*, and its salts, and all preparations or admixtures thereof.

Alkaloids.—All poisonous vegetable alkaloids and poisonous glucosides not specifically named in this Schedule, and all poisonous derivatives of vegetable alkaloids and glucosides.

Arsenic, and its chemical compounds, and medicinal preparations, containing 0.5 per centum or more of arsenic, or any chemical compound thereof calculated as arsenious oxide (As_2O_3).

Atropine, and its salts, and their preparations.
Belladonna, and all preparations or admixtures (except belladonna plasters) containing 0.1 per centum or more of belladonna alkaloids.

Cantharides, *cantharidine*, and all poisonous vesicating preparations thereof.

Chloral hydrate, and solutions and preparations thereof.

Coca, *cocaine*, and its salts and derivatives, and any preparation or admixture containing 1 per centum or more of coca alkaloids or their salts or derivatives.

Corrosive sublimate.
Cyanide of potassium, all poisonous compounds of cyanogen, and preparations or admixtures thereof.

Emetic tartar, and all preparations or admixtures containing 1 per centum or more of emetic tartar.

Ergot of rye, and preparations of ergots.

Heroin, and its salts, and all preparations or admixtures containing 0.1 per centum or more of heroin.

Morphine, and its salts, and its poisonous derivatives.

Nux vomica, *strychnine*, and its salts, and all preparations or admixtures containing 0.2 per centum or more of strychnine.

Opium, and all preparations or admixtures containing 1 per centum or more of morphine.

Picrotoxin.

Prussic acid, and all preparations or admixtures containing 0.1 per centum or more of prussic acid.

Savin, and its oil, and all preparations or admixtures containing savin or its oil.

Vermin-killers, if preparations of poisons the preparations of which are within this Part of this Schedule.

SECOND PART.

Antimony, *chloride of*.
Arsenical, preparations and compounds, not included in Part I., except paris green and other coloured paints and pigments.

Such other substances or preparations as are added to this Schedule by Proclamation of the Governor in Council.

RESCISSION OF REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE NATIONAL PARK IN THE PARISHES OF WANDILIGONG, TOWAMBA, DONDANGADALE, AND EURANDELONG.

WHEREAS by the 190th section of the *Land Act* 1901, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make rules and regulations or to rescind any rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now, therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby rescind the Regulations made by the said Board on the twenty-fifth day of January, 1915, in respect of 2,880 acres in the parish of Wandiligong, temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 31st October, 1898, as a site for a National Park, and 23,100 acres in the parishes of Wandiligong, Towamba, Dondangadale, and Eurandelong, temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 6th October, 1908, for a National Park.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE NATIONAL PARK, IN THE PARISHES OF WANDILIGONG, TOWAMBA, DONDANGADALE, AND EURANDELONG.

WHEREAS by the 190th section of the *Land Act* 1901, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make rules and regulations or to rescind any rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now, therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations to be observed and enforced in respect of—

- 2,880 acres, reserved by Order in Council of the 31st October, 1898, in the parish of Wandiligong, as a site for a National Park; and
- 23,100 acres, reserved by Order in Council of the 6th October, 1908, in the parishes of Wandiligong, Towamba, Dondangadale, and Eurandelong, for a National Park, in addition to and adjoining the land temporarily reserved therefor by Order in Council of the 31st October, 1898, both of which are together hereinafter called "The National Park."

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall enter or remain in the National Park who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
2. No person shall, without the permission of the Minister of Lands or duly authorized officer, remove, cut, damage, or deface any rocks, trees, shrubs, ferns, plants, seats, tables, gates, posts, or fences in the National Park, or write or paint, or otherwise mark any rock, tree, bridge, seat, gate, post, fence, wall, table, pillar, railing, or any building or other erection within the National Park.
3. No person (except as hereinafter provided) shall shoot, poison, trap, snare, hook, catch, or otherwise destroy or interfere with or take away any game, wild fowl, or any animal, bird, or fish of any description, or carry any firearms, poison, traps, snares, or gins within the National Park without the permission, in writing, of the Minister of Lands or duly authorized officer first obtained. Provided always that from the first day of October in every year to the thirtieth day of April following any person may take fish from Lake Catani, within the National Park; but such person shall use only a rod and line, and no line shall have more than one hook attached thereto, and no fish of a less weight than eight (8) ounces other than native fish shall be taken or removed from the said lake.
4. No person shall light or maintain any fire within the National Park without the permission of the Minister of Lands or duly authorized officer, and then only in such place as may be directed.
5. No person shall camp in the National Park, or erect therein any dwelling, hut, or other structure without the permission, in writing, of the Minister of Lands or duly authorized officer.

6. No person shall bring into the National Park, or allow to wander therein, any horse, cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs without the permission, in writing, of the Minister of Lands or duly authorized officer.

7. No person shall bathe in the National Park except in the places set apart for the purpose; and every person bathing therein shall be decently clad from the neck to the knees.

8. No dog shall be allowed in the National Park, and all dogs found therein shall be liable to be destroyed, and the owners thereof to prosecution.

9. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the National Park, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

10. No person shall cut in the National Park, or remove therefrom any live or dead timber without the permission, in writing, of the Minister of Lands or duly authorized officer.

11. No timber traffic shall be allowed within the National Park without the permission, in writing, of the Minister of Lands or duly authorized officer.

12. Except as hereinafter provided, no motor, delivery cart, dray, lorry, waggon, truck, van, or other vehicle carrying a load exceeding one (1) ton shall be allowed within the National Park without the permission, in writing, of the Minister of Lands or duly authorized officer.

13. No person, unless duly authorized, in writing, by the Board of Land and Works, shall ply for hire or carry passengers for reward within the boundaries of the National Park.

14. On and after 25th January, 1915, motor cars and motor cycles may travel on the main road in the National Park to Mount Buffalo (hereinafter called the main road) only at such times and in such direction as are set forth in clause 19 of these Regulations.

15. Horses or vehicles drawn by horses or other animals may travel on the main road only at such times and in such direction as are set forth in clause 19 of these Regulations.

16. Motor cars and motor cycles shall not travel on the main road at a greater speed than ten (10) miles an hour, and drivers shall slow down and sound the bell or horn at all turns in the main road.

17. The Bailiff of Crown Lands or other officer controlling traffic on the main road shall have full authority to close it against all motor traffic whenever, in his opinion, the said main road is unfit for such traffic, or whenever for any other reason the closing thereof is considered necessary. A notice, "Closed against motor traffic," and placed on the entrance gate, shall be sufficient evidence that the main road is closed against such traffic.

18. The Bailiff of Crown Lands or other officer controlling traffic on the main road shall have full authority to stop the passage of any type of motor which is considered to be unsafe, or which, in his opinion, would cause undue damage to the road.

19. The time-table for the regulation of motor and other vehicular traffic on the Government road to Mount Buffalo shall be as set forth in the Schedule hereto:—

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 190 of the *Land Act* 1901, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some

Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF PORTIONS OF RESERVES FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES AND WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES RESPECTIVELY IN THE PARISH OF WERRIGAR, AT AND NEAR THE TOWNSHIP OF WARRACKNABEAL, COUNTY OF BORUNG, KNOWN AS "ASQUITH RESERVE."

THE Council of the Shire of Borung, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the portions of the reserves for Public Purposes and Water Supply purposes respectively, in the parish of Werrigar, at and near the township of Warracknabeal, county of Borung, known as "Asquith Reserve," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act 1901* :—

REGULATIONS.

1. Asquith Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding 20 in any one year) as the Reserve may be set aside for sports, fêtes, entertainments, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding 1s., may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the reserve.

2. The Committee of Management may allow any club, association, or person to hold or conduct entertainments, musical performances, sports, meetings, pastimes, or other gatherings of a like nature in Asquith Reserve, and to charge for admission thereto, provided however that such club, association, or person shall, during its or his hire or occupancy of the Reserve, be subject to any direction made or given by the Committee of Management.

3. No person shall enter or remain in Asquith Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct.

4. No person shall pluck or damage in any way the trees, shrubs, and flowers, nor remove any tallies nor damage in any way the buildings or fixtures in Asquith Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

5. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates in or around Asquith Reserve, or cut names on the fences, gates, trees, or seats, or stick bills thereon, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

6. No person shall put into Asquith Reserve any cattle, sheep, or pigs.

7. All dogs, goats, and poultry found in Asquith Reserve shall be liable to be destroyed, and the owner shall make compensation for any damage done by such dogs, coats, and poultry.

8. No person shall hawk, or offer for sale any goods or articles, or bring in, erect, or set up any vehicle, booth, tent, gallery, stand, or other structure for exhibition purposes, or for conducting any game of skill or chance, or for the purpose of offering for sale any article in Asquith Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall carry firearms through Asquith Reserve, or shoot, snare, or destroy any wild fowl either in the Reserve or in or on any water adjacent thereto.

10. No cart or other vehicle used for the conveyance of goods shall, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained be driven through Asquith Reserve.

11. Such plants, seeds, or cuttings as are commonly purchasable at nurseries in Victoria shall not be supplied from Asquith Reserve to any person unless in exchange or for public institutions or for benevolent purposes.

12. No visitor shall interrupt the gardeners or labourers in Asquith Reserve by conversation or otherwise.

13. Children under the age of 10 years not being under the control of some competent person may be removed from Asquith Reserve.

14. Any person committing in Asquith Reserve or in any of the buildings, erections, or enclosures for the time being thereon any of the following offences shall, together with any horses, cattle, sheep, dogs, pigs, or other animals, or any poultry, or any carriages, vehicles, machinery, goods or chattels in his possession or care, be liable to be removed therefrom—

- (a) Assaulting any other person.
- (b) Being in an intoxicated condition.
- (c) Using profane, indecent, or obscene language.
- (d) Using any threatening, abusive, or insulting language.
- (e) Behaving improperly or riotously.
- (f) Wilfully interfering with or disturbing any entertainment, performance, sport, game, pastime, or amusement, to the annoyance, detriment, or discomfort of any person or persons engaged in such entertainment, performance, sport, game, pastime, or amusement.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

3. No driver of a vehicle, or person driving any cattle, or any person riding any animal, in an easterly direction shall proceed along the said portion of Dandenong-road between the centre of Orrong-road and the centre of Glenferrie-road, except when proceeding by the most direct route to some premises on either side of the said Dandenong-road.

4. The expression "vehicle" in this regulation shall include a vehicle propelled by mechanical power and bicycle.
